## TOWN WARRANT.

#### [L.S.] STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the town of Newton, in the county of Rockingham, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- I. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.
- 2. To choose a Town Clerk.
- 3. To choose three Selectmen.
- 4. To choose all other necessary Officers.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges, and for paying the town debt for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 6. To vote how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the support of Schools, in addition to the amount required to be raised by law.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to assume the expense of fitting up the basement of the Town Hall for the engine room of the Fire precinct.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 78 of the General Laws relating to sidewalks.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Memorial purposes.
- 10. To see if the town will grant the use of the lower or basement hall for School purposes.
- 11. Transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## SCHOOL REPORT.

The School Board present the following report for the year ending March 1, 1891:

Early in the school year the residents of the Peaslee District requested that a school might be opened in the school house. As there are nearly as many children of school age within their limits as in another part of the town, where a school was maintained, it seemed reasonable that their request should be complied with. Therefore during the Spring and Fall terms we had five schools in town instead of four as in previous years.

In some of our schools we have been gratified to note at each visit, the existence of a harmonious feeling between teacher and pupils and a constant advancement in the studies pursued. This state of feeling, with orderly conduct, make a successful school.

Of the less successful ones we are aware that the communities in which they were located, need no further enlightenment as to their short-comings.

We feel that those parents who write excuses for their children to be dismissed nearly every day, make a great mistake, and injure not only their own, but every child in school.

For years past the School Board have expressed the conviction, that some of our schools were too large for a teacher to do justice to, and that inadequate provision is made for the education of our youth, therefore we would respectfully call attention to articles 7th and 8th in the warrant of the School District in the town of Khuston viz:

Article 7. "To see if said district in the town of Kingswiton will by a vote of two-thirds of the legal voters at said meeting establish a High school."

Article 8. "To see if said district will vote to raise extra money to support said school, if established, and if so how much."
