## The State of New Hampshire

---

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

[L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall (Polls to close at 6 P. M.) in said Northwood on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town highways.
5. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the construction of Class II roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1498.09 therefor.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the care of cemeteries.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1028.00 for Street Lighting.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Northwood Public Library.
10. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue allowing a discount on taxes.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Interest on Temporary Loans.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Pine Blister Rust Control.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the use of Merrimack Valley Regional Association.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for the use of the Recreation Commission.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$505.00 for the purpose of Town Road Aid.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$684.00 for the use of Concord Hospitals.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to install a street light at skating pond in back of George Richardson's home.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3000.00 plus the old Grader, to buy a new Huber Grader.

19. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws, relative to playing games of Beano, be adopted in this Town?

20. To recognize the gifts of the late Alice L. Tasker, to the Town of Northwood for the building of a library at East Northwood, for the purchase of books for the same, and for the erecting of a gate at the East Northwood Cemetery, and to cooperate with Edward A. Tasker, her executor, in the planning, construction and erection of the same.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Zoning Commission of three members, with duties as set forth in Chapter 51, Sec-



tions 50-71, Revised Laws of New Hampshire 1942, to study and recommend to a special town meeting appropriate regulations to be enforced in the area around Pleasant Lake.

22. To transact any business to come before said meeting.

## LAWS RELATING TO TRUST FUNDS

## Chapter 51, Revised Laws of New Hampshire

19. In General. Towns may take and hold in trust gifts, legacies and devises made to them for the establishment, maintenance and care of libraries, reading-rooms, schools and other educational facilities, parks, cemeteries and burial lots, the planting and care of shade and ornamental trees upon their highways and other public places, and for any other public purpose that is not foreign to their institution or incompatible with the objects of their organization.

---

We would suggest that persons desiring to leave a sum of money, the income of which is to be used for the care of cemetery lots, should deposit at least \$200.00.

At the present rate of interest, wherever possible, those funds the principle of which is \$100.00 or less, should be increased.

It is likely that in most years the single grade with largest enrollment will require a separate classroom.

Mr. Ernest L. Bucklin of Alexandria, a 1950 graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, has replaced Mrs. Shirla Smith as teacher of the two upper grades. Mr. Walter Leskowitz came from Sanborn Seminary to succeed Mr. Arthur E. Toll as Headmaster at the Academy, or Principal the designation now given to heads of public secondary schools in New Hampshire. Other academy changes included Mr. Charles Sumner Allen, Miss Mabel Priestly, and Miss Shirley Taylor instead of Mr. Fitts, Miss McVann, and Miss Fox, respectively. Conferences between the Academy Trustees, Northwood School Board, and Superintendent of Schools have increased in frequency during the past year. A very enjoyable reception under Academy auspices was given this fall to all Northwood teachers, both elementary and high school.

The old "legal rate", or state average per pupil

cost of high school instruction only (for the previous year) is no longer deemed an adequate charge for sending districts to pay to receiving high schools. This rate, which has been the contract rate between Northwood and Coe-Brown Northwood Academy was \$181.02 last year and is \$186.17 this year. The legislature has recognized this situation by establishing a new "legal rate" of district liability in the absence of a contract, which rate, based on the *total* state average per pupil high school cost of current expenses, was \$233.70 last year and is \$252.04 this year.

The Academy has given notice to terminate the present tuition contract June 30, 1951, and has proposed a new agreement as follows:

- 1) The contract to be for the duration of one year hereafter.
- 2) The rate for the school year 1951-52 to be \$252.00 per pupil, and thereafter to be announced early in January so that it may be available for the district budget estimate.
- 3) The charge for pupils attending five days or more to be a minimum of one-half the yearly rate.

The district at its annual meeting should act on authorizing the School Board to accept these terms.

In view of the fact the Academy's actual per pupil cost of instruction for last year was \$281.00 and their total current expense per pupil \$345.00, as compared with \$181.02 per pupil received from the district, with an even greater difference estimated this year between the contract rate of \$186.17 and the Academy's cost, it has been suggested that the district vote an adjustment on this year's contract rate, up to \$210.00 per pupil as estimated in advance by the school board's



budget.

The new state-aid equalization formula, proposed by the State Board of Education at the direction of the Legislature, is based on the difference between what the district spends toward a "foundation program" established to meet the minimum needs of good schools in general, and a local "fair share" of effort, reckoned as 18 mills on \$1 of equalized valuation. This formula, which is being generally accepted as a good one, fortunately does well by Northwood, allowing (on the basis of preliminary calculation) the sum of \$14,028.63, as compared with \$10,095.97 received in 1947-49 and \$3262.00 for the current year.

The elementary and high school lunch programs in Northwood have been combined this year, with a central kitchen at the Academy. This arrangement has the approval of the state lunch supervisor and should result in increased economy and convenience.

The School Nurse, Miss Myrtle Fletcher examined 131 pupils, including tests of vision and hearing. Other special cases were referred to physicians. Twenty-four pupils had an average of over four corrections each at the Dental Clinic. This was sponsored by the Harvey Lake Women's Club, but was self-sustaining to a considerable degree.
