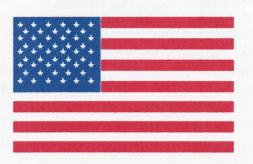

#### THE THOMAS H. HINES SR. SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Thomas H. Hines scholarship Fund was founded in 1974 by Richard Herman. It was organized exclusively for the charitable purpose of providing scholarship assistance for high school graduates who live in Windsor. Funding is for any form of higher education for which a graduate qualifies.

These awards will be given out on the 31st of May each year.

The fund was established in the memory of Thomas Hines Sr., whose clear thinking, good guidance, service to the Town, and generosity, profoundly affected many residents of Windsor.

The current endowment fund balance is \$ 13.011.53

Two scholarships were awarded in 2001. One to Diane Hines, studying for her Masters in Education, through St. MaryCollege in Kansas. The second one to Christopher Davies, studying in the Field of Conservation at Linden College in Vermont.

#### **CERTIFICATE OF AUDIT**

As of the end of the year 2001, the Town of Windsor's audit was incomplete and we have the Dept of Revenue Administration assisting us in completing it at this time. Irene Palmer has generously donated her time as the new Town Auditor and it is expected that we will be completely and accurately audited.

Your local Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department, and the State of New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands cooperate and coordinate to reduce the risk of wildland fires in New Hampshire. To help us assist you, contact your local Forest Fire Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required before doing ALL outside burning. Fire permits are mandatory for any open burning unless the ground where the burning is to be done (and surrounding areas) is completely covered with snow. Violations of RSA 227-L:17, the fire permit law and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines up to \$2,000 and/or a year in jail. Violators are also liable for all fire suppression costs. Open burning is a privilege, NOT a right. Help us to protect you and our forest resource! Build small brush piles that can be quickly burned and extinguished.

New Hampshire experienced over 940 wildland fires in 2001. Most of the fires were human caused. Due to dry conditions fires spread quickly impacting more than 20 structures. Homeowners can help protect their homes by maintaining adequate green space around the house and make sure that the house number is correct and visible. Only You Can Prevent Wildland Fires. 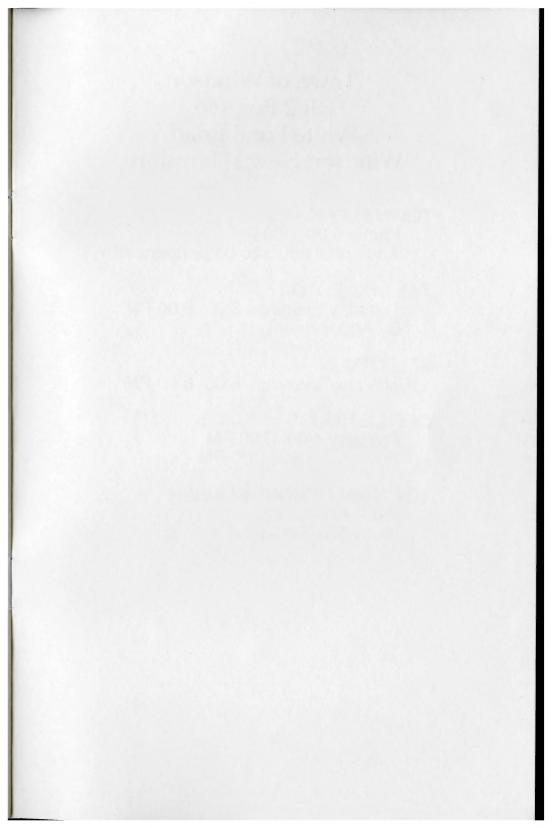
