TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Belmont in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Hall's Hall in said Bermont on Tuesday the 8th of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
 - 2. To choose one Selectman for three years, Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, and one for one year. One Trustee of Public Library for three years.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray all expenditures as listed in the Budget and make appropriations for the same.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for Laconia Hospital.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for Old Home Day.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to buy a Fire Truck and raise a sum of money for the same.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept the gift of a free Public Library Building with the equipment for the same.
 - To see if the Town will vote to empower the Library Trustees to select a proper location for the new Library Building and to amalgamate the present Library with the one proffered.
- 8. To see what the Town will vote to do with its Parsonage Fund.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute Inventory Blanks at the time they examine the property to be taxed.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on all taxes paid on or before July 1st, 1927, and if so, how much.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to reimburse the Belmont Hosiery Co for part of the expense incurred for a rehearing of the case for abandonment of the Tilton & Belmont Branch of the Boston & Maine R. R.
- 12. To hear reports from Committees, etc.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD

To the Citizens of Belmont:

With the funds you provided last year we have made minor repairs at the Province Road school buildings, painted the Ladd Hill buildings outside and inside and built a septic tank at Gale school. The budget which appears on another page does not provide for many repairs the coming year. We suggest a new ceiling and repairs on hallway at Ladd Hill and additional electric lights at Gale school.

The school houses at Jamestown and Union district have not been used for some time and we see no prospect of scholars enough for a school in either district in the future so we recommend that these buildings be sold.

As this report is written a dental clinic is being held at Gale school under the direction of the Belknap County Demonstration Agent. We believe this to be a fine thing and would recommend a small appropriation for one next year.

While much care has been given in the preparation of a budget we suggest that all voters study the needs of the schools that they may act for the best interests of the same.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Belmont:

I have the pleasure of submitting to you my twelfth annual report as superintendent of schools, the nineteenth in the series of such reports.

Deserved commendation is often forgotten. I wish to commend the boys and girls whose faithfulness and good fortune made it possible for them to have perfect records in attendance during the last school year, and whose names appear on the honor roll.

In addition to the statistics for the individual schools printed elsewhere, the following table should be of interest:

From our records it appears that 98 of these pupils were born in Belmont, 81 elsewhere in New Hamp-

sh.re, 19 elsewhere in the United States, and 2 outside of the United States.

Schools opened in September with but two changes in our corps of teachers, Mrs. Gertrude G. Bartlett replaced Miss Clow at the Lower Province Road School and Miss Agnes Hamilton replaced Miss Ringer at the Plummer School. Mrs. Bartlett is a teacher of several years successful experience. Miss Hamilton is a recent graduate of the Keene Normal School. At the close of the fall term, Miss Helen Gerrish presented her resignation as teacher of Grades V and VI. Since coming to us several years ago, Miss Gerrish had been most successful in the class room, and during the last two years and a half had acted as Principal of the building very efficiently. We were sorry to lose Miss Gerrish. Mrs. Maxwell of Winnisquam has been substituting in these grades since the Christmas vacation.

The September enrollment in the High School was 16. Two pupils have since dropped out. In addition there are nine Belmont pupils attending the Laconia H gh School, and five attending Tilton School.

A third year has been added to the work at the High School. The courses now offered to the pupils are as follows:

By combining the classes in some subjects and by giving both classes in French to Miss Comire, our seventh and eighth grade teacher, it has been found possible to get along this year without an extra teacher. It is not probable that we can so arrange the work another year. An additional High School teacher will be necessary. The work is being carried on with a

reasonable success. We are of course, handicapped in the matter of room and of equipment. Room should somehow be provided so that the Science courses could be given. It is to be hoped that the Fourth year of work will be added this coming year.

Our High School pupils have shown a real pride in their school, and have developed a good school spirit. The Fair conducted last fall was evidence of their enterprise and their ability to carry things through. It should be noted that all the pupils who began work in the High School last year returned in September for the second year's work.

Fifteen pupils completed the eighth grade work last June, and eight of these entered High School in September. We should have a larger per cent of those completing grammar school work taking up High School work. It ought to be the natural thing to pass directly from the eighth grade to the ninth grade.

Our apportionment of the State Equalization Fund this current fiscal year is \$3,220.09. The apportionment for the next fiscal year will be practically the same.

Improvements have been made in the Ladd Hill school building this past year. These were much needed. A septic tank has been built at the Gale school to replace the old cess-pools. This is a worth-while improvement and the cost is comparatively small.

Again I wish to thank the School Board for their cooperation and forbearance, and the teachers for their patience and loyalty.
