#### TOWN WARRANT

#### State of New Hampshire

#### Belknap SS.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Center Harbor in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Center Harbor Town House in said Center Harbor on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at two of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Highway Department which includes care and maintenance of Sidewalks, Wharf Area and Fountain.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$4,-700.00 for the maintenance of the Center Harbor Volunteer Firemen's Association.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in the amount of \$2,500.00 for Welfare and Town Poor.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for Parks and Playgrounds, including Band Concerts, and hiring of a qualified Life Guard at the Town Beach, and if so, how much.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Assistance for Class V Roads, the Town to raise \$303,87 and the State will contribute \$2,025.80.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in the amount of \$100.00 for aid to the Family Service Association.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for aid to the Laconia Hospital and if so, how much.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.47 which is 1/300th of 1% of the net valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region. (By Request)
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the Care of Shade Trees and Blister Rust Control.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the use of Civil Defense.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on taxes paid in full within 15 days after the issue of the tax bills by the Collector.
- 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to negotiate for the purchase of land to be used for a Town Cemetery site and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to make a partial payment toward this land.
- 15. To see if the Town of Center Harbor will vote to participate in the Urban Planning Assistance Program (701), and appropriate \$2,500.00 as a part of the Town's Share of the Total cost.
- 16. To see if the Town of Center Harbor will vote to join with other communities bordering Lake Winnipesaukee in the formation of a Regional Planning Commission to be known as the Lakes Region Planning Commission. The purposes, membership and powers shall be as specified in Chapter 36, Sections 37-44 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, pertaining to Regional Planning Commissions.

The initial goal of the commission shall be to provide coordination and assistance between communities in all planning and development matters affecting the Region.

17. To see if the Town will vote to require that building permits be obtained from the Selectmen for all building construction and all alterations of existing buildings in excess of an estimated cost of \$500.00. Said permits to cost the sum of one dollar. Violators of the above regulations may be fined a sum of not more than ten dollars.

- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$375.00 for new equipment.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to establish By-Laws, Ordinances, or Regulations for controlling signs.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of Taxes.
- 22. To choose agents or committees in relation to any article of the Warrant and to hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen.
- 23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### **Report of the Planning Board**

The Planning Board of Center Harbor is a seven-member board, and at the beginning of 1967 was composed of the following members:

> (Mrs.) Gladys Bickford (Mrs.) Louise de Sousa Rob Roy Macgregor (chairman) Aaron C. Smith (Selectman) Thomas P. Winn Lewis E. Woodaman, Jr. Gaylord Woodworth

In November, 1967, the Board regretfully lost two members who had to resign. Mr. Thomas P. Winn resigned due to the time required of him by other commitments, and Mr. Gaylord Woodworth due to his necessary absence from Center Harbor for about six months of the year. In their stead, the Selectmen has appointed two new members, Mr. Charles G. Borrell, and Dr. Carl R. Marshall.

#### The Year's Activities:

During 1967 the Planning Board held 22 regular meetings and one public hearing. Representatives of the State Department of Resources and Economic Development, Division of Planning and Research, Mr. Randall Raymond and Mr. David Scott met with the Board and its members three times. The Board has been guided by the advice and aid of the State Planning Offices in all of its major activities, particularly in the drawing up of Subdivision Regulations, and more recently in preparing for work on a Comprehensive Plan for the Town. Mr. Ted Kelsey, of the U. S. Soil Conservation Service, has given the Board valuable aid in their search for a suitable site for a Town cemetery. Four field trips were made in this respect. Mr. Leo Kershaw of the Meredith Planning Board has met with the Board to help explain Comprehensive Planning.

The majority of the meetings were concerned with the business of drawing up Subdivision Regulations for the Town. The authority to do this was granted to the Board by vote of the Town at Town Meeting in March 1967. The State Planning Commission assisted in this, and Board members also drew from the regulations of other towns and attended hearings at New Hampton and Sandwich to gain information. The Center Harbor regulations were drawn up by the Board during the Spring and Summer, and presented at a Public Hearing on the 29th of August. After incorporating changes suggested at the hearing, the Subdivision Regulations were voted in by the Board at their next regular meeting.

Other business has included: 1) the search for a Town cemetery site, 2) assisting the Selectmen in plans for a new municipal building, )3 consideration of an ordinance governing signs in the Town, 4) seeking better regulations for the governing of the Town Beach and bathhouses, and 5) preliminary work on a Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Center Harbor. By far the most important business of the Board at this time is the drawing up of a Comprehensive Plan, and the Board is requesting funds for professional aid in this at the March 1968 Town Meeting. The Board is also seeking approval of the voters for Center Harbor's joining the Lakes Region Planning Commission. A member of your Board has attended every preliminary meeting of this group held so far.

#### A Look Ahead

In 1968 the Board will be concerned with many problems of importance to the Town. Some of the principal goals are: 1) a Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Center Harbor, 2) a re-study of zoning, and development of a good zoning ordinance for the Town, 3) cooperation in the development of the Lakes Region Planning Commission, 4) final selection of a cemetery site, and 5) replacement of the shade trees killed by blight in the center of Town, and a program for improving the appearance of the Town.

Recent estimates by many authorities forecast a tripling of New Hampshire's population in the next 50 years. In areas of unusual scenic attractiveness, such as ours, the increase may be greater. Careful planning is a "must" if we are to preserve the area's beauty and maintain an orderly growth. It is hoped that more townspeople will take an interest in town planning, and will freely attend meetings of the Board. Meetings are held on the first and third Wednesday of every month, at 7:30 p. m., in the Nichols Library. The Board will be glad to discuss any problems, receive new ideas, and accept aid from any who have acquaintance with planning procedures.

- 5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
- 6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.
