FOREWORD

Following this Foreword are the reports and summaries of the several departments of the Town of Derry. As will be noticed by these reports a close scrutiny has been maintained by all departments. Any overdraft of expenditure has been very slight, while others have been slightly under estimated expenditure.

Last annual meeting did not change the Budget Estimates in any amount. The Selectmen and department heads have tried to reflect this confidence by tightly controlled expenditures.

Our Sewer System is now completed. We have a balance in the Construction Account which by vote at annual meeting will be used for extension purposes and will not reflect any additional cost to the taxpayer. A coverage report on this project will be found in the following pages.

The Sewer System has been inspected and approved by Federal and State authorities. Many visitors from other towns have also viewed this project. The remarks from these visitors have been very gratifying. The Board of Selectmen wish to publicly compliment the Engineers for a very complete and efficient System. The Contractors also deserve much credit for completing this large project in record time.


Ross's Corner has become the site of a new modern Shoe Factory of considerable size. We expect to see this factory ready for occupancy by early August. We believe this will afford attractive employment for many workers both in and around Derry.

We trust the following report will explain to the Taxpayer the operation of the Town and cover all items which may be of interest to you.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Derry which was made by this Division, acting under authority of Chapter 71, Section 27, of the Revised Statutes Annotated, which provides in part as follows:

"Audit on Motion of Commission. The (Tax) Commission may cause an audit to be made of the accounts of any city, town, school district, village district or precinct, as often as once in two years, or whenever conditions appear to it to warrant such audit. xxxxxxxxxx"

This audit covered the fiscal year ended December 31, 1958, and the period from January 1st to October 31st, 1959. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report. Also included is a Statistical Table presenting a Ten Year Statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Water Department. A separate report is submitted for the Water Department.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets - December 31, 1957-December 31, 1958: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1957 and December 31, 1958, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt of the Town (exclusive of Water Debt) increased from \$38,947.23 to \$1,162,853.99 during the year 1958.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1958, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$4,881.63, plus a revenue surplus of \$5,823.69, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$10,705.32.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1958, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of October 31, 1959, is shown in Exhibit F.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit E)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1958, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit E.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

GENERAL COMMENTSIndebtedness, Valuation and Taxes:

Table I presents a ten year statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes. It will be noted that during the period from December 31, 1948 to December 31, 1958, the financial condition of the Town changed from a Surplus of \$33,145.66 to a Net Debt of \$1,173,267.99. These figures reflect the water debt as well as the other town indebtedness.

During the same period the assessed valuation of taxable property increased from \$5,936,911.00 to \$7,200,663.00, or 21%. The amount of the annual tax levy increased from \$284,879.62 to \$582,312.04, or 104%.

The average local tax rate increased from \$4.80 to \$8.04 per hundred, compared to the average tax rate for the State which increased from \$4.06 to \$5.15 during this period.

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased from \$36,164.88 to \$23,646.01 during 1958, as shown herewith:

Tax Records:

(Commitment of Poll and Head Taxes)

It was noted that the only record of poll and head taxes consisted of file cards on which the names and amounts due from taxpayers were recorded. The law specifically provides that tax lists and warrants shall be made by the Selectmen and delivered to the Tax Collector in the case of both poll and head taxes. (RSA 76:12 and Laws of 1959 - Chapter 8: Section 4)

In conformance with these provisions of the law, poll and head tax lists should be made out on suitable forms indicating the name of taxpayer and amount of tax, with provision for the Collector's entries of tax payments. Proper warrants should be given the Collector at the time of commitment.

It was not possible for the Auditors to prove the poll and head tax warrants or the uncollected taxes because of the card system and the absence of tax lists.

(Added Poll and Head Taxes)

Poll and head taxes which are assessed subsequent to the commitment of the original warrant should be recorded separately in the Collector's warrant book and the Collector given a supplemental warrant for such added taxes.

(Abatement of Poll and Head Taxes)

The Collector should receive an abatement order in writing from the Board of Selectmen authorizing the abatement of any poll or head tax and all such duly authorized abatements should be recorded by the Collector in the warrant books. (RSA 76:16 and Laws of 1959 - Chapter 8: Section 12)

(Record of Invoices and Taxes)

A permanent record of the assessed valuation of the property of each individual taxpayer as well as the taxes assessed should be made annually by the Town Clerk as soon as the inventory has been completed by the Board of Selectmen. This is in accordance with the provisions of RSA Chapter 75: Section 7, as quoted herewith:

"76:7 Record of Invoices and Taxes. A fair record shall be made of every invoice taken by the selectmen, and of all taxes by them assessed, in a book of records of the doings of the selectmen in their office, which shall be the property of the town; and a copy thereof shall within thirty days after said invoice has been completed be left with the town clerk, or the original invoice and assessment shall be so left and recorded by him, and both records shall be open to the inspection of all persons. The record of real estate shall contain the name of the owner, if known; otherwise the name of the original owner, if known; the number of the lot and range, if lotted, otherwise such description as the land may readily be known by; the number of acres, if known; and the amount of taxes assessed thereon."

(Tax Sale Record)

A record of each tax sale held by the Collector should be kept on the prescribed form of tax sale record sheets. These provide columns for all pertinent information relative to the sale of each piece of property and the redemption therefrom.

Town Clerk's Cash Book:

The Town Clerk should keep a record of each motor vehicle permit and dog license issued in the prescribed form of Town Clerk's cash book. This is required by Chapter 260: Section 31, of the RSA, which provides in part as follows:


"260:31. Accounting for Receipts. Each designated city official and town clerk shall keep an account of the money received by him for said permits and deposit the same in the city or town treasury on the last Saturday of each month, to be used for the general purposes of the city or town. xxxxxxxxxxxx"

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Derry for their assistance during the course of the audit.



Persuant to vote of Annual Town Meeting March 12, 1957 to wit: "To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate, and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal, State or other assistance as may be available for the planning and construction of a disposal system as outlined in Article 3 above, and pass any vote relating thereto."

Computing our figures we have an estimated balance over costs of \$1,231.87. The above figures were based on current construction costs under conditions similar to those expected to be encountered in Derry and they include an allowance for engineering and contingencies.

The cost of Y entrances to the subscribers property line was not included in the total estimate. Therefore, an assessment was necessary to finance the cost of the Y entrances. Four (\$4.00) dollars per foot was established to take care of the \$87,000.00 cost of these Y entrances. Further study of the construction program revealed that our actual costs would reflect a substantial reduction from our original estimate. Considering that subscribers living on wider streets would pay more than those living on streets of lesser width, it was considered by the Board of Selectmen and Sewer Committee that an equal assessment to all would be in the best interest to Sewer users. Therefore, an assessment of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) for entrance fee was established. This reflected a total saving to the Sewer subscriber of approximately Thirty Four Thousand Dollars ( \$34,000.00).

We trust this review will help to clear up the apparent controversial issue of the \$60.00 entrance fee.

## TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Veterans Memorial Building in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

By vote of the Selectmen, the polls for this meeting will remain open from ten o'clock, in the forenoon until seven o'clock in the afternoon, and as much longer thereafter as the Town, at the opening of the meeting, may vote.

1. To elect a Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Cemetery Trustee, Auditors and other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.
2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, for building and repairing bridges, for suppression of moths, for police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of Town Officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town Hall, for support of the libraries, for State and County taxes, for the observances of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes and for band concerts, for co-operating with the State and Federal governments in the control of insect pests and white pine blister and for all necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction and convey any real estate acquired through deeds from the Collector of Taxes or as reimbursement for assistance furnished to citizens, providing that in the case of tax deeded real estate the previous owner thereof, if known, shall have the first opportunity to purchase the same, and pass any vote relating thereto.
4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the municipal year in which such debts are incurred and made payable therefrom, by such vote, and pass any vote relating thereto.
5. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of Taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.

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6. To see if the Town will vote to transfer from the MacGregor Fund in the hands of the Trustees of the Trust Funds the sum of \$500.00, to be expended during the summer of 1960 for band concerts at MacGregor Park, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,498.23 for aid under Apportionment A of Town Road Aid plan to match a State appropriation amounting to \$9,988.21 for the purpose of construction and reconstruction of Class IV and Class V highways, and pass any vote relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,270.00 for aid under Apportionment B of Town Road Aid Plan to match an appropriation by the State of \$6,270.00 for the purpose of construction and reconstruction of Town highways as provided for in said Town Road Aid Plan, and pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town wishes to adopt the recommendation of the Budget Committee that \$5,425.00 be transferred from parking meter receipts to the Police Department for the purpose of patrolling the meters, that the sum of \$2,375.00 from the parking meter receipts be transferred to the Highway Department for the purpose of cleaning about the meters, that the sum of \$1,000.00 for meter maintenance and the sum of \$200.00 for parking lots be transferred to the Selectmen, and that any balance of meter receipts be transferred to the Trustees of Trust Funds to be added to the capital reserve funds, and pass any vote relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to change the water main extension policy of the Town as follows, and pass any vote relating thereto: Any extension of main shall be made in accordance with specifications of the Derry Water Department and said extension shall be completely paid for by persons requesting the extension. In those cases where the person making the extension does not own a lot or lots abutting the extension, he shall be entitled to reimbursement from the owner of said lot or lots, or his successors in title, before water service can be made to said lot or lots. Reimbursement shall be computed on a pro rate basis of total expense using such formula made by the Board of Water Commissioners as the circumstances require, provided no reimbursement shall be made after termination of a six year period from the date of commencement of said installation. The above provided reimbursement shall be paid to the Board of Water Commissioners for transfer to the installer, his heirs, successors, or assigns.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Water Commissioners to allow fifty (50) feet of water main to each customer user on water main extensions made after



April 1, 1960 in accordance with specifications of the Board of Water Commissioners, and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15, Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development, and upon adoption of this article the Board shall consist of one Selectman and four other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove, in its discretion, plats showing new streets, or the widening thereof, or parks or the subdivision of land in accordance with regulations to be adopted by the Planning Board, as provided in Sections 19-29 inclusive, Chapter 36 of N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, and upon adoption of this article it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Registry of Deeds of the County of Rockingham a certificate or note showing that the said Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of authorization, as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 36 of the N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, and pass any vote relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to go on record as favoring a state law authorizing a Public Works Department for the town of Derry, which department would combine the Highway Department, the Water Department and the Sewer Department, which state law would provide that it would only become effective in the Town of Derry upon acceptance of said law at an annual town meeting, and pass any vote relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to purchase a strip of land from the Boston and Maine Railroad, containing seventy-seven hundred (7,700) square feet and lying between the railroad tracks and the American House, so-called, and land of Kenneth Senter, and pass any vote relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell land situated in the Westerly part of Derry, and being land acquired by said town and known as the right of way of the Manchester and Derry Street Railway, leaving it to the discretion of the Selectmen what part, if any, of said land should be sold as not needed for municipal functions, and pass any vote relating thereto.

17. By petition, to appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 which shall be disbursed through the office of the Selectmen of said Town of Derry at the rate of \$30.00 per week, to Mrs. Irene E. Nielsen for her support, care and maintenance, in recognition of

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the services rendered, in the Armed Forces, by her deceased husband.

18. By petition, to see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for the collection and disposal of garbage, said collection to be made in a closed garbage truck, on a weekly basis and that the contract for the collection and disposal of said garbage, in keeping with this petition, be awarded to Mr. Richard Jordan and Mr. Elbridge Garvin.

19. By petition, to see if the Town will vote to authorize the East Derry Fire District to use more space in the East Derry Town Hall for fire district purposes and, in the event such authorization is granted, to set forth the amount of additional space that may be used and authorize the Board of Selectmen to draw up an agreement with said fire district setting forth the space to be used, the structural changes in the building, and other terms pertinent to said use, and pass any vote relating thereto.

20. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

21. To appoint any necessary committees on any article embraced in this warrant.

22. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before such meeting.
