## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

---

Members of the Fitzwilliam School Board:

I herewith submit my tenth annual report as Superintendent of Schools, the twenty-eighth in the series under union supervision.

There were six changes in the teaching force of the Fitzwilliam schools at the close of the school year in June, 1927. We were able to retain Principal Wetmore of the Junior High School, Miss Helena Brown at the Columbian primary school and Miss Blodgett at District Number 10.

Miss Abbott, who had given two years of splendid service at the Junior High School as assistant declined to accept a re-election. Her position was filled by the election of Miss Theda L. Learned, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire, who had done very acceptable work while a student teacher in the high school at Madison.

Miss Doris A. Lord, a graduate of Keene, who substituted in the Village Intermediate school for several weeks during the spring term, was secured to succeed Miss Hale in that school, and Miss Betsy M. Kimball, also a Keene graduate was chosen to succeed Miss Goodhue in the primary room as Miss Goodhue declined to accept a re-election and secured a position in Claremont.

At the Columbian Intermediate school Miss Marion Flanders, a graduate of Keene was elected to succeed Miss Watson, who was not a candidate for re-election. Miss Flanders, as a cadet teacher had taught nine weeks in one of the rural schools in Jaffrey.

Miss Evelyn Bolton, who had taught very successfully at State Line for four years declined to return, and considerable difficulty was experienced in securing a teacher for this school.

The long distance between the boarding place and the school seems to be the greatest difficulty to overcome in interesting a candidate in this school. Near the close of the vacation Miss Mildred Quint of Keene was secured for this school. Miss Quint is a graduate of Keene, Class of 1926, and taught last year in the schools of Croydon.

Miss Cutler, who served as music supervisor last year, declined to continue in this position, but we were fortunate in securing Miss Geneva Jean Howe, who for the past two years has been music supervisor in Troy, and during the past year has also taken charge of the Rindge schools. Miss Howe is a graduate of Keene Normal School, and has met with marked success as a music teacher in these towns.

The enrollment at the Junior High School is slightly smaller than last year, being 49 while last year it was 53. As there are twelve in grade nine, and as eighteen are expected to enter grade seven next year the enrollment will doubtless considerably pass fifty another year.

The total enrollment for all the schools shows a decrease of four from last year, the figures being 187 this year and 191 last year.

At the opening of the school year the program for the Junior High School was somewhat modified from that adopted several years ago. It seemed advisable to drop French in grade seven and substitute commercial geography, and to revise the program in both grades seven and eight so that four periods of English are now given per week in each grade.

It is planned another year to drop French in grade eight.

We believe that this change will give more practical training to those who do not continue their high school course, and at the same time the French given in grade nine will be sufficient for the work required at Keene High School.

The work of all the schools has been encouraging during the past term.

I am glad to note that the interest in the Parent-Teacher

Association continues. If parents and teachers co-operate for the welfare of our schools we shall have better schools and parents will understand and appreciate more keenly the task of our teachers.

The budget submitted in the town report calls for a slightly smaller appropriation this year than last. With practically the same number of pupils as last year and with no special appropriations, except for music, called for, practically the same amount will be required to carry on the schools another year as was needed for the present year.

Among the important items of school interest should be mentioned the Toxin-Anti-Toxin clinic held during the fall term.

I desire at this time to sincerely thank all who have so generously co-operated in the work of our schools during the past year.

Art. 1. To hear and act upon the reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen.

Art. 2. To allow accounts against the Town.

Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote for one or more road agents for the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year, to choose one trustee to have charge of the trust fund.

Art. 5. To elect one Selectman for three years.

Art. 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary

to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 8. To see what action the Town will take in regard to lighting the streets and Town Hall, and raise and appropriate money therefor.

Art. 9. To raise and appropriate money for repair of Town Highways and Bridges and determine the amount.

Art. 10. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for Trunk Line maintenance, the State to give \$3,300.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for State Aid maintenance, the State to give \$500.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500 for Trunk Line construction, the State to give \$3,000.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for crushed stone and oil to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen.

Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to resurface the lower Troy road from the Tavern corner toward the Gap Mt. corner.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for the extermination of white pine blister rust.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50 for a police uniform.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to give the Fitzwilliam Grange free use of the Town Hall for its regular meetings.

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the salary of the Town Hall agent from \$200 to \$300.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money to help maintain a District Nurse for the ensuing year and determine the amount, the same to be expended under the direction of the sub committee of the Fitzwilliam District nursing association.
