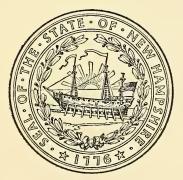

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Groton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Groton on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next at three o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same in accordance with the budget herewith attached.

3. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount for prompt payment of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell or dispose of all highway equipment and contract out snow removal and highway maintenance. 6. To see if the Town will vote to use \$600 of the total highway appropriation to contract for tarring and sealing the unfinished portion of the Cheever Road.

7. To see if the Town will take over the operation and management of the Library Annex.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of or administer any real estate acquired by Tax Collector deeds.

Other articles may be added before warrant is posted.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

To the Citizens of the Town of Groton:

The fiscal year has ended with a cash balance of \$4,724.56 and liabilities (chiefly due the school district) of \$4,977.93, or a cash deficit of \$253.37. This deficit however will be converted to a surplus when the cash due from the state for flood damage is received.

Based on the proposed appropriations and assuming no appreciable increase in assessments, the tax rate for 1960 shall be in the neighborhood of \$3.00 per \$100 of assessed valuation.

The flood damage has cost the town the sum of \$3,880.14 of which amount the State of New Hampshire is expected to contribute the sum of \$2,587.31 which will result in a net cost to the town of \$1,292.83.

Serious consideration should be given Article 5 in the warrant relative to the disposal of the highway department equipment. General expense of the highway department was \$1,293.41 in 1958 and \$1,025.26 in 1959, the major portion of which was repairs to the town truck.

Your selectmen feel that snow removal and road maintenance could be contracted for, at a considerable saving to the town. The cost of snow removal in 1959 was the sum of \$2,344.91 less the amounts received from the state and from plowing driveways of \$1,357.90 or a net cost of \$987.01. However the general highway expense was \$1,025.26, which is more than the amounts spent for labor, etc., in plowing snow, and this sum does not include any depreciation on the equipment.

In conclusion your retiring selectmen extend their best wishes to the new board.
