THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hinsdale qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, 1978 at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

- Article 1. To cast your ballots for all necessary Town Officers.
- Article 2. "Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:43-b and 43-c for expanded exemptions on real estate which provide for a resident 65 years of age up to 75, a \$5,000. exemption; a resident 75 years of age up to 80, a \$10,000. exemption; a resident 80 years of age or older, a \$20,000. exemption, provided that the resident owns the real estate individually or jointly with another or his spouse with whom he has been living for at least 5 years as man and wife; said resident had a net income of less than \$7,000. or combined income with spouse of less than \$9,000 and owns assests of any kind, tangible or intangible, less bona fide encumbrances, not in excess of the value specified in RSA 72;43-c, lll*; provided that the exemptions shall be based upon the assessed value of the real estate?"
- Article 3. To see if the provisions of Charter 171-A of the revised laws relative to playing games of beano shall be adopted at this time.

Polls open on the above Articles at 10:00 A.M. and shall not be closed earlier than 7:00 pm

The following part of the Town Meeting will be adjourned until Monday, March 20, 1978 at 7:30~p.m.

- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$623.76 (Six hundred twenty three dollars and seventy six cents) in addition to which the State will contribute \$4,158.43 to be expended on Class IV and Class V road construction, or act in any manner thereon.

 Recommended by Budget Comm.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,173.

 (One thousand one hundred seventy three dollars) for the support of the Monadnock Region Association or take any other action relating thereto. This sum is based on the formula of five percent (5%) of the Rooms & Meals tax fund distributed to the Town by the State of New Hampshire in 1977 (\$23,475).

- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to allow a 3% discount for the first 30 days after the tax bills are mailed and a subsequent 2% discount for the next 30 days on the payment of taxes in full, or act in any manner thereon.
- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,781.00 (One thousand seven hundred eighty one dollars) for the support of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Services. This is .50 per capita based on population figures from the Southwestern Regional Planning Comm. for the Town of Hinsdale, or act in any manner thereon.

- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,700. (Two thousand seven hundred dollars) for Crossing Guards, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000. (Six thousand dollars) for the purchase of a Police Cruiser to replace the 1974 cruiser. The 1974 cruiser will be sold to the highest bidder, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 10. To see if the Town will give the Water Dept. the authority to pay the sum of \$9,400. (Nine thousand four hundred dollars) for the preparation of final engineering design and contract documents for additional water supply facilities.

- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen and the Board of Water & Sewer Commissioners to apply for, and accept federal aid not to exceed \$390,000. (Three hundred ninety thousand dollars) for the construction of additional water supply facilities.

 Inserted by Water Dept. Recommended by Budget Comm.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$17,500. (Seventeen thousand five hundred dollars) to tar the following roads; Tower Hill (7,500 ft) Meetinghouse Road (6,774 ft.) Cottage St. (750 ft.) High St. (2,575 ft.) and Old Northfield Rd. (1,201 ft.) or act in any manner thereon.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000. (One thousand dollars) for the removal of four (4) trees at the Pike Cemetery, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$32,000. (Thirty two thousand dollars) to complete the multi-purpose area at the Hinsdale Recreation Area, known as Heritage Park. Fifty percent of the sum expended will be reimbursed to the Town from the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation.

- Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to appoint a Deputy Treasurer. Said Deputy shall be sworn, shall have powers of the Treasurer, may be removed at the pleasure of the Treasurer, and shall before entering upon the duties of the office give bond as provided in section 6 of chapter 41.

- Article 16. To allow the Town to accept pre-payments on all taxes, or act in any manner thereon.
- Article 17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to contract for and accept aid relative to disasters, or act in any manner thereon.
- Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,599. (One thousand five hundred ninety nine dollars) for the Hinsdale Volunteer Fire Dept. to purchase two self contained breathing units with four extra tanks, or act in any manner thereon.

- Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,000. (One thousand dollars) for the Hinsdale Volunteer Fire Dept. to purchase one portable water pump, or act in any manner thereon.

- Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,513. (One thousand five hundred thirteen dollars) for the Hinsdale Volunteer Fire Dept. to purchase two portable radios, or act in any manner thereon.

- Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$700. (Seven hundred dollars) to fund the delivery of meals to elderly shutin citizens of Hinsdale sponsored by the Hinsdale Senior Meals Program through Cheshire Senior Services.

 Inserted by petition Recommended by Budget Comm.
- Article 22. To see if the voters will approve to abolish the Planning Board and their rules and regulations submitted after the "1970" ordiance came into effect or act in any manner thereon. Inserted by petition

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$500. (Five hundred dollars) to re-write the Zoning Ordinances of the Town of Hinsdale, N. H. and update and/or correct and change ordinances to better promote the health, safety, convenience and general welfare of the community, or act in any manner thereon.

Inserted by Selectmen Requested by Planning Board Without recommendation by Budget Comm.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to remove the Road Agent's position from the Hinsdale Town Ballot and commencing in March, 1979 be appointed at the pleasure and discretion of the Board of Selectmen, or act in any manner thereon.

- Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to abolish all forms of racing, including dog and harness racing on Sundays in the Town of Hinsdale.

- Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to close the track at Hinsdale Raceway, until such time as all back taxes due the Town are paid in full, as the State Legislature gave them a great deal of financial help this past year plus the Town of Hinsdale decreased their taxes by the rate on more than one million dollars in the valuation of their property, and we feel there was no real need to let the payment of their taxes fall so far behind.

- Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000. (one thousand dollars) to authorize the Selectmen to have the State Assessors or members of a private assessing company re-evalute the property owned by the Hinsdale Raceway, Inc. due to the fact the property was decreased in value of over one million dollars this past year, while the majority of the home owners in Hinsdale had an increase of an average of 30% or more in their valuations, and we feel a very big error had to be made in the assessment.

- Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the total amount necessary to ,pay the above voted articles and budget, or act in any manner thereon.
- Article 33. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Board of Selectmen Town Office Hinsdale, New Hampshire 03451

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Hinsdale for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1976, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audits must be given to the Town Clerk for retention as part of the Town's permanent records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Water and Sewer Departments, Public Library, Municipal Court, Cemetery Lot Fund, Public Health Nursing Association and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

General Fund:

Comparative Balance Sheets - As of December 31, 1975 and December 31, 1976: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets of the General Fund as of December 31, 1975 and December 31, 1976 are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the current surplus of the Town increased by \$5.467 from \$81,770 to \$87,237 during the fiscal year.

Analysis of Change in Current Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in current financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1976 are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$33,983, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$9,809 resulted in a net budget surplus of \$24,174.

Long-Term Indebtedness:

Comparative Balance Sheets - As of December 31, 1975 and December 31, 1976: (Exhibit A-5)

Comparative balance sheets of the outstanding long-term indebtedness of the Town as of December 31, 1975 and December 31, 1976 are contained in Exhibit A-5. During the fiscal year, the long-term debt decreased by \$15,873, from \$241,000 to \$225,127.

A statement of debt service requirements, showing annual maturities of principal and interest is presented in Exhibit A-6.

A statement showing revenue, encumbrances, expenditures and fund balance as of December 31, 1976 is showin in Exhibit B-2.

Water Department:

Statement of Treasurer's Account: (Exhibit E-3)

A statement of Water Department receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1976, is included in Exhibit E-3.

Sewer Department:

Statement of Treasurer's Account: (Exhibit F-2)

A statement of Sewer Department receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1976, is included in Exhibit F-2.

WATER DEPARTMENT

Comparative Balance Sheets - As of December 31, 1975 and December 31, 1976: (Exhibit E-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets which disclose the financial condition of the Water Department as of December 31, 1975 and December 31, 1976, are presented in Exhibit E-1. As indicated therein, the current deficit decreased by \$2,905, from \$107,157 to \$104,252, during the fiscal year.

Statement of Income and Expenses: (Exhibit E-2)

The results of operations of the Water Department for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1976 is presented in Exhibit E-2. As indicated therein, the net profit for the year amounted to \$2,908.

SEWER DEPARTMENT

Comparative Balance Sheets - As of December 31, 1975 and December 31, 1976: (Exhibit F-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets which disclose the financial condition of the Sewer Department as of December 31, 1975 and December 31, 1976, are presented in Exhibit F-1. Since there are no fixed asset records maintained and likewise no depreciation expense charged against current revenues, we are unable to express an opinion as to the fairness of the balance sheet and retained earnings of the Sewer Department as of December 31, 1976.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all Town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted autiting standards and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of the uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Tax Collector's records. Consequently, the amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of the verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Water and Sewer Departments:

The audit disclosed several variances from statutory provisions of law regarding the Water and Sewer Departments. At the present time one Commissioner serves as Commissioner, Rents Collector, Accountant and Treasurer. Warrants are not issued by the Commission to the Collector. No formal abatement procedure is used regarding abatement of rent charges.

The following statutes covering the above variances are quoted as follows:

"R.S.A. 252:19 Establishment. Duties, any town or village district which adopts the provisions of this chapter may, at the time of such adoption or afterwards, vote to establish a board of sewer commissioners, consisting of three members, which board shall perform all the duties and possess all the powers in the town or district otherwise hereby conferred upon the Selectmen."

"R.S.A. 41:4 Incompatibility of Offices. No person shall at the same time hold any two of the following offices: selectman, treasurer, moderator, trustee of trust funds, collector of taxes, auditor...."

From the above statutes it appears that the Commissioner can not serve as Commissioner, Treasurer and Collector of rents at the same time.

Regarding sewer rental collections, the following statute is quoted:

"R.S.A. 252:13 Collection of Assessments or Rentals.
They shall be committed to the collector of taxes, with a warrant under the hands and seal of the mayor and aldermen requiring him to collect them; and he shall

have the same rights and remedies and be subject to the same liabilities in relation thereto as in the collection of taxes."

It is therefore recommended that the Commissioners commit such sewer rents to the tax collector by warrant under their hands and seal as required by the statute.

In reference to abatements of sewer rents the following applies:

- "R.S.A. 252:14 Abatement of Assessment. For good cause shown, the mayor and aldermen may abate any such assessment made by them or by their predecessors."
- "R.S.A. 252:16 Correction of Assessments. If any error is made in any such assessment it may be corrected by the mayor and alderman by making an abatement and a new assessment, or either, as the case may require; and the same lien, rights, libilities and remedies shall attach to the new assessment as to the original."
- "R.S.A. 44:2 Provisions Applicable. All provisions of statutes, now made or hereafter enacted relating to to towns, shall be understood to apply to cities; and all provisions relating to selectmen....shall be construed to apply to the mayor and aldermen... unless a different intention appears."

All sewer and water rental collections must be remitted to the Town Treasurer in accordance with the following statute:

"R.S.A. 41:27 Duties. The town treasurer shall have custody of all monies belonging to the town, and shall pay out the same only upon orders from the selectmen...The town treasurer shall keep in suitable books provided for the purpose, a fair and correct account of all sums received into and paid from the town treasury...."

In view of the above statutes, it is recommended that the Commissioners immediately transfer the duties now performed by one Commissioner to the proper officials as required by statute and appoint a Collector of Water Rents and make proper committment of water rents to said Collector under the hands and seal of the Commissioners.

It is further recommended that all receipts be reported in total and all refunds of overpayments be recorded in order that all transactions of the department be properly recorded.

Town Clerk:

The standard Report of Town Clerk to Treasurer are not used by the Town Clerk as mentioned in previous reports. It was also noted that the monies collected by the Town Clerk are deposited into a personal account along with business and personal monies. Remittances to the Treasurer are made from this account. The Town Clerk was notified of these findings and will deposit Town monies to the General Fund of the Town and report such deposits on the prescribed form immediately.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 71-A, Section 21, require that the Auditors' summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town. REPORT OF THE HINSDALE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

1977

This past year, the Commission has been very active in the planning and the construction of further recreation facilities at Heritage Park.

Commission members planned and constructed six professional horseshoe courts. They were the scene of, this past fall, the first Annual Horseshoe Tournament. More tournaments are planned for this spring and summer.

The Boccie Courts (lawn bowling) were completed. The Picnic Area finished this past spring and was seeded and equipped with five fireplaces and ten new picnic tables. This area was used by several organizations and businesses. It is hoped that many more groups will consider using these facilities next year.

An asphalt walkway connecting the bridge to the picnic area was added this Spring.

Construction by the High School Industrial Arts students has begun on a storage-bathroom facility located at the rear of the park. This facility will provide bathrooms during daylight hours. It will be especially useful for large picnic groups.

Donations towards the Lena O'Neal Membrial Fund made possible the beginning construction of the Memorial Gardens. Planted and maintained by commission members, these beds contain yews, crabapples and roses. Further donations will be sought this year for continued development of these gardens. The Commission would like to thank those town's people who donated plants.

This year's plans call for the construction of a 100' x 200' multi-use concrete court. Planned for this surface will be shuffle board, street hockey, basketball, volleyball, handball, rollerskating, ice skating etc. The Commission feels this all purpose court will greatly increase the parks useage providing recreation for all ages.

Heritage Park was designed to serve all the people of Hinsdale in the field of recreation and the Commission looks forward to expanding our park along these lines this year.

Your local Civilian Defense Agency is very pleased to present, to you this progressive and affirmative annual report.

One of several highlights of 1977 was the building and establishing of a full-fledged office in the Town Hall for C. D. purposes and furnishing this office with the necessities to carry on a very active C. D. program. The office may be visited by townspeople upon request and you are welcome to do so.

We traveled to Concord on numerous trips and have established a meaningful and effective laison with the State of New Hampshire C. D. Agency and the Federal C. D. Program. Accompanying us on serveral trips were Fire Chief Jim Stanclift and Asst. Chief Michael Wojchick thus strengthing communications between local departments as well as the state and federal levels. Working together we were able to obtain a government surplus auxiliary generator valued at \$13,000.00 for only the cost of transportation. This generator is under the supervision of our water department and is ready for immediate use should any emergency arise.

Thru the State C. D. office many excellent films on safety, emergency prepardness, disaster help, fire fighting, and the like, were obtained. These films were used by both our schools and also shown at fire and police deparment meetings.

The year 1977 has been a very productive and rewarding experience for us and we will strive in 1978 to continue on course. Your C. D. Agency exists for the safety and well being of all our citizens.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REPORT

1977

I have the highest regard for the taxpayers money and therefore it pleases me to report that your highway department lived within the budget the voters of Hinsdale allowed this department.

During the early months of 1977 we experienced a very bitter and severe winter and the highway department did their very best to clear town roads, and sidewalks although some complaints were registered we did the very best we could under the most trying conditions.

The major project of 1977 was the construction of new sidewalks and repair of old and hazardous ones. New sidewalks included 200' on lower Main St. and the full length of Haneock St. Repairs included 65' on High St. and from the corner of Prospect St. 95' west on Brattleboro Rd.

Of interest to conservationists was the cutting and removal of dead and diseased trees in many areas of town. There are still trees needing to be removed and during 1978 we hope to continue progress in removing all dead and diseased trees throughtout Town.

Of unfortunate interest to taxpayers is the high rate of turnover of personnel who leave us for higher paying jobs. During the Fall months we lost 75% of our good and experienced workers.

This creates many problems in training new men and experienced help is difficult to find. Late 1977 produced many early snow storms that caused inexperienced help problems, but they are learning and we are doing the best job we can. I handle complaints just as fast as possible usually the same day.

Your Board of Selectmen is always willing to assist me and the Highway Department when asked and I enjoy a fine repore with them. This, of course, is very beneficial.

The men of your Highway Department will continue to work hard and efficiently to best serve the taxpayers of Hinsdale.

I look forward to many more accomplishments in 1978.
