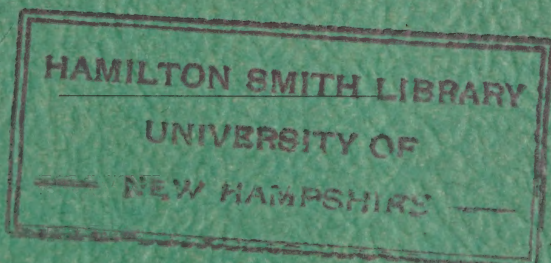

## TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Lisbon, in the county of Grafton and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

Art. 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to make appropriations for the same.

Art. 3. To see if the town will fix and determine the compensation to be paid each of the town officers.

Art. 4. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and special committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

Art. 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to issue druggists' permits to any druggist who is a registered pharmacist doing business in Lisbon to sell liquor for medicinal use upon a prescription under the provisions of Chapter 51, Section 1, of the laws of 1929.

Art. 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how the same shall be divided.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to discount all taxes paid on or before such time as the town may vote.

Art. 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries in the town of Lisbon.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200 for the Pine Blister Rust Control.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to light the streets of Lisbon Village District all night during the entire year ; Sugar Hill from the dwelling of H. J. Field to Hotel Lookoff, from the Baptist Church through Lovers' Lane to the Franconia line, from the Goodnow school house to the Homestead, and from the Lisbon and Franconia town line to the dwelling of Joseph Pelletier ; Sugar Hill and vicinity to be lighted the entire year until midnight, and from 5 a. m. until daylight, excepting the lights from the Homestead to Hotel Lookoff for six months of the year ; all the above premises to be lighted with electricity, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nursing Association.

Art. 13. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Art. 14. To see if the town will accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$914.25.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to plow the town roads, and, if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to oil such roads in the town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to construct and repair cement and other sidewalks at Sugar Hill, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the purpose of advertising the town of Lisbon.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to adjust, compromise and settle any interest the town may have arising out of tax sales, liens, or otherwise, on any real estate acquired by the town, whether the same has been deeded to the town or not, and to execute any necessary papers relating thereto, including deeds and releases.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to aid in the construction and maintenance of a community skating rink for use during the winter season of 1939-1940, the money, if raised, to be expended by a committee of three appointed by the moderator.

Art. 21. To see how much money the town will raise for the support of the poor, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 22. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance, and to appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to dredge the river at the Harry Young meadow cut-off, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate not exceeding \$150 for the purpose of holding band concerts.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for forest fire fighting equipment, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to annex the Town School District of Lisbon and the Special School District of Sugar Hill to School District No. 1 of said Lisbon, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 215 of the Session laws of 1907, and pass any vote necessary in relation thereto.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums as they deem necessary, in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 28. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The net direct cost to the taxpayers of Lisbon of relief disbursements for the year 1938 was \$715.06 less than that of 1937. This reflects a slight improvement in the relief situation over the preceding year because this decrease is only in part compensated by an increase in gross reimbursements (\$176.23 more in reimbursements received in 1938 than in 1937).

## CHAPTER 215

**An Act to Equalize School Privileges in the town of Lisbon**

## Section

1. Consolidation of districts.
2. Transfer of property to village district.
3. Deposit of records with village district.
4. Repealing clause.
5. Takes effect on approval by popular vote.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court convened :

(Districts consolidated.)

SECTION 1. The town school district of Lisbon and the special school district of Sugar Hill, so called, are hereby annexed to the village school district of said Lisbon.

(Transfer of property.)

Sect. 2. All of the school-houses, sites, appliances, apparatus, books, supplies, and other property belonging to said town and special district shall be vested in said village district upon the passage of this act, and shall be delivered by the school boards of said town and special district to the board of education of said village district. And all debts and obligations of said town and special district shall be assumed by said village district.

(Deposits of records.)

Sect. 3. The school boards, clerks, and treasurers of said town and special district shall forthwith deposit all records of said district with the town clerk of Lisbon for preservation.

(Repealing clause.)

Sect. 4. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

(Takes effect on approval.)

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect upon the approval of the voters of the town at any annual town meeting.

(Approved February 28, 1907.)

## REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN OF

**THE LISBON PUBLIC LIBRARY**

The circulation for the Lisbon Public Library during 1938 was 23,395, an average of a little over 449 books for each week. About one-fourth of this was non-fiction, a good deal of which was used in connection with school work, in addition to that which was done in the reference room — the books of which were much used for this purpose during the year. In answering the reference demands, few were turned aside without some material, but much more would have been useful. The deficiencies were noted and it is hoped that during the coming year some of the greatest needs can at least be partially filled.

A small increase in the town's appropriation for library work made it possible to buy more new books during the year and more nearly to keep abreast of those which were in most demand throughout the country. This doubtless accounts in part for an increase of some over 1800 in the year's circulation.

Because of a leave kindly granted by the trustees your librarian was able to attend the summer library school which was held during July at New Hampshire University. This, with her former attendance, entitled her to one of the state certificates of librarianship which were awarded at the close of the session.

During the summer Dr. Erdmann loaned to the town library a collection of books from his own private library and kindly allowed them to be circulated. A good number took advantage of this opportunity and the books were much enjoyed.

Magazines were given to the library by Mrs. W. W. Oliver, Mrs. H. B. Moulton, Mrs. Fred Parker, Mrs. Kate Deming, Mrs. Raymond Lang, Mr. B. S. Webb, Mr. William Bailey, and Mr. Frank Buck. A year's subscription was given to The American Legion, and the D. A. R. donated a year's subscription to the National Historical Magazine. Books were given by Mr. Holmes, Mr. Rothenberger, Mr. O'Gara, Mrs. Sumner Moulton and Friends in Council. All of the above donors are thanked for their contributions.

### TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES :

The library contains approximately 6,193 volumes, not including government reports and bound magazines. During the past year one hundred and one books have been added by appropriation, and by gift sixty-six.

Periodicals for the reading room and circulation include *McCalls*, *Cosmopolitan*, *American*, *Pictorial Review*, *Saturday Evening Post*, *Readers' Digest*, *Ladies' Home Journal*, *Hygeia*, *Better Homes and Gardens*, *News Week*, and by gift *Country Home*, *Watchman*, *Troubadour*.

Donors to the library include Miss Dorothy Cornell, Miss Ethel B. Osborn, Mrs. J. Warner Fobes, Mrs. Arthur S. Walcott, Dr. Stuart Paton, Mrs. Louis Pazolt, Miss Helen I. Tefft and Alexander Barbour.

Total number of books and periodicals loaned, 6,813: fiction, 2,708; non-fiction, 1,839; periodicals, 2,266. Attendance, 2,358.

The marked increase in the non-fiction over last year's figures is due to the intensive work in the Sugar Hill school and the university students who summer on Sugar Hill. A study corner has been especially arranged with adequate lighting for the benefit of those who wish to do reference work.

The special fund has enabled us to add twenty-nine books. Among these are books on religion, poetry, biography, and Hammond's *New World Atlas* and *Doubleday's Encyclopedia* in eleven volumes.

Mrs. Louis Pazolt has given twenty-five volumes by F. Marion Crawford.

Much appreciation is extended to the Woolson & Clough Insurance Agency for the bookmarks given us.

The librarian attended the regional meeting held at Lincoln in September. The next meeting will be held at our Library, the date to be announced.

Present plans for improving the library this spring include a project to be carried out by the children of the grammar room of the Sugar Hill school. They will do interior decorating in the children's room, and landscaping in the way of flower gardens. The project will be executed under the community civics unit.

To everyone who in any way has contributed to the welfare of the library I extend my sincere appreciation.
