## TOWN WARRANT

---

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the inhabitants of the Town of Litchfield in the county of Hillsborough, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs.*

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Litchfield on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, at 1:30 of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and appropriation of the same.

Art. 3. To see if the town will accept State aid for permanent improvement of highways.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate for the Public Library.

Art. 5. To see what action the town will take in regard to Memorial Day and make appropriation for the same.

Art. 6. To see what action the town will take in regard to White Pine Blister Rust Control.

Art. 7. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

**Art. 8.** To see whether beer or other alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under the laws of 1933, Chapter 99, Section 22.

**Art. 9.** To see if the town will vote to purchase any fire fighting pumpers or other fire fighting equipment, provide for housing and care for the same and raise or appropriate the money necessary for such purchases.

**Art. 10.** To see if the town will vote to petition the court having jurisdiction for permission to use a portion of the Bancroft Highway Fund for the purchase of fire fighting pumpers and equipment described in article 9.

**Art. 11.** To see if the town will vote to raise or appropriate any money for the improvement of its supplies of water for fire fighting purposes.

**Art. 12.** To see if the town will vote to raise or appropriate any money for the celebration of the 200th anniversary of the granting of the Town Charter or pass any other vote relating thereto.

**Art. 13.** To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
