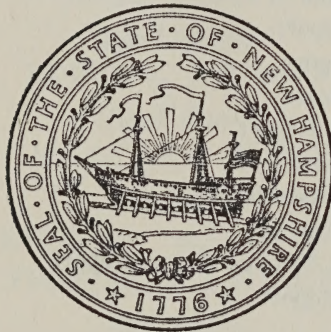

TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the
County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in
Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, the polls to close not later than the end of the transacting of business on said day.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Business meeting on all other articles to begin at 8:00 P.M.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs and maintenance of Highways and Bridges.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$873.66 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute the sum of \$5,824.41.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance and tarring of Class V Roads.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract for the purchase of new fire fighting equipment at a gross purchase price not to exceed the sum of \$12,500.00 and to further see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 as down payment on said equipment, the balance of \$10,000.00 to be defrayed in four annual payments of \$2,500.00, plus accrued interest.

7. (*Petition*) To see if the Town will vote to expend the sum of \$6,000.00 to complete the highway running from the Fiske Schoolhouse to the point that is already completed on the road between New Hampton and Bristol, and to see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$3,000.00 from the capital reserve fund, and \$3,000.00 by general appropriation to pay such completion.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,578.50 for the payment of principal and interest on the Grader note.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the village cemetery.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Tax Collector and Town Clerk, rather than to elect them.

16. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road crossing the New Hampton School Campus, beginning at 3B and ending at the Doherty Road, so-called.

17. (*Request*) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to construct a tomb for the New Hampton Cemetery.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for Civil Defense equipment and supplies and provide storage for the same.

19. (*Petition*) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the purpose of building a sidewalk from the Fish Hatchery Bridge to the Community School, and to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to retain, for the purpose of building this sidewalk, the sum of \$1,000.00 which was appropriated at the Annual Town Meeting in 1960.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of hospitals.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, \$400.00, for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.

22. (*Request*) To see if the Town will vote to consider the removal of hazardous pines bordering the property of Nelson Huckins.

23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the reconstruction of the bridge across the brook, between the property of Arnold and Marianne Nelson and Donald Kelley, in the Plaisted District.

24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the reconstruction of the bridge located between the property of Frederick Robbins and Ethelind Munroe, on the back road to Bristol.

25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to have the necessary repairs and improvements made to the foundation of the Town House, and pay over to the Trustees of the Trust Funds any unexpended funds not needed for the said purpose.

26. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five (or seven) members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15, Chapter 36, N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board shall consist of one Selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

27. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

PREVENTION IS YOUR BUSINESS

This represents 5 percent of our nation's woodlands being wasted each year. Every fire takes its toll. Floods follow; stream flow is affected; timber, buildings, grazing and wildlife are destroyed - all because *many* are *careless* with fire in and near woodland. This can be remedied. *You* can put an end to this shameful waste! *Prevention* is *your* business!

You, whether *you* be a farmer, homemaker, business or professional man or woman, municipal, state or federal official, clerk or woodsman can play an important part in the continuing and vital prevention program.

First - by setting a good example *yourself*-being sensible and complying with the necessary laws and regulations governing the use of fire in and near woodlands.

Second - by using *your* individual influence in your community and valued council with others in insisting and encouraging them to do likewise.

1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden - the law requires it.

2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning - don't leave it.

3. Make certain your fire, camp or debris, is *dead out* before leaving it.

4. Don't throw down lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes or from moving vehicles - make sure they are out - use your ash tray.

5. Don't burn at home - use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Board of Education and Citizens of the New Hampton School District:

I herewith submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

Personnel

The Community School is fortunate in having such an excellent staff attending to the educational needs of the children of New Hampton.

Since my last report, Mr. York, Mrs. Zampiere, and Mrs. Hall have accepted teaching positions elsewhere. Replacing them are Mr. Raymond Edwards, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire. Mr. Edwards taught in Sanbornville prior to coming to New Hampton. Mrs. Ruth Bicknell, who replaced Mrs. Zampiere formerly taught in New York, California, Arizona and Meredith, New Hampshire. She is a graduate of Boston University. Miss Helen Anderson replaced Mrs. Hall. Miss Anderson graduated from Columbia Bible College and formerly taught in North Woodstock, New Hampshire.

Enrollment

The past year has seen the enrollment at the Community School climb steadily from 126 to 150. Toward the end of last year we had one classroom housing the seventh and eighth grades climb to thirty-four in May. Since it was close to the end of the year this large class was left intact. However, in September when school opened we were confronted with three rooms each housing over thirty pupils. These were grades 2 - 3, 6 - 7, and 7 - 8. Rather than permit this to continue, Mrs. Joyce who had been teaching half-time was placed on full time. This permitted a reorganization of room assignments which left grades 7 and 8 as single units and where double grades were necessary the number of pupils in one room is below thirty.

To fill the vacancy left by Mrs. Joyce, Mrs. Barbara Fitzpatrick, a graduate of Marywood College was hired.

Curriculum

I believe anyone associated with or familiar with the daily operation of the Community School would agree that the children attending school are being offered a substantial education.

The charge so often heard these days; "Schools are not doing a good academic job" cannot be leveled at our school. It is the children themselves who are going to be the beneficiaries of a good academic program.

We are continuing to use the New Hampshire History, Science and French program from Channel 11 located at the University of New Hampshire. In addition this year we have incorporated their new music tele-cast into our program.

The budget is up substantially over last year. Tuitions, an item over which we have no control, have increased considerably and the increase in staff are the major items causing the increase. The appropriation recommended by the School Board and Superintendent is felt to be necessary for effective operation of the New Hampton Community School.

It has been a pleasure to have been associated with education in New Hampton this past year.
