## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the Eleventh day of March, next at seven of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To vote on the following question: shall sweepstakes be sold in this Town.
- 4. To vote on the following question: shall the provisions of Chapter 171A of the revised Laws relative to the playing games of beano be adopted in this Town, in accordance with the provisions of the Session Laws of 1949.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Snow Removal for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the Highway Department, for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundreds Fifty One Dollars and Eighty Seven cents (\$351.87) for T. R. A. so called.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of public landings.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Police Department for the ensuing year.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Eighty Seven Dollars (\$187.00) in support of the operating costs of the Elliot Community Hospital for the year 1969.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Sixty Six Dollars (\$266.00) for the Monadnock Region Association.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights, for the ensuing year.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Public Library.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Dump.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to take any action on having a Reappraisal of land and buildings made and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, or take any action thereon.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to sell to the Stoddard Historical and Village Improvement Society, the Hearse House, two Hearses and other contents for the sum of One Dollar (1.00)

- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 for preliminary expense to be incurred by the forthcoming Bi-Centennial, and to appoint a committee for the same.
- 23. To see if the Town will take any action on restraining dogs.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$43.00, to support the services of the Community Health Clinic of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service, said services operating under the provisions of the Community Mental Health Services Act of New Hampshire, with State Grant-In-Aid. This Act requires local support to qualify for continued State Grant-In-Aid. Local request for financial support is based on a .30 per capita formula.
- 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

As has been the custom during the last few years, we herewith submit our Annual Report which we have tried to make as brief as possible.

During the year 1968, as approved by the 1967 Town Meeting, we had a new heating system installed in the Town Hall.

In the spring of 1968, we received notice from the new owner of the land where the dump is located, to close this dump site. We looked over many locations, but no one was willing to sell us any land for this purpose.

A dump site has to be approved by the Health Department, the Water Pollution Board, the State Forestry Department, and the State Highway Department, and we cannot locate a dump site without this approval.

In November 1968, we had an appointment with these Department heads to look over several prospective sites to see which one they would approve, but the snow came too soon, and we were unable to check the sites.

The present owner of the dump has given us a time extension to use the dump until spring, at which time we have to have a new location.

Under the new law, in a new dump there will be no burning allowed, which means that no brush can be deposited there, and the remaining refuse will have to be kept covered, thus greatly increasing the expense of maintaining a dump.

We still see need in the very near future, to have the entire town reappraised, in order to keep the assessment on an equal basis, as assessments are bound to get out of line over the years, no matter whom the assessing officials are. There is also a great need to establish a more modern method of keeping the property records. With our growing tax list, this need becomes greater each year.

## REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

Library hours are planned for 2:15 to 4:15 p.m. on Wednesday of every school week and Thursday evenings from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. during July and August at the Louise Davis Public Library.

During July and August when the summer population of Stoddard is greater, more books go out. We wish more interest would be shown from the resident population both summer and winter.

The State Bookmobile visits the library every three months leaving three hundred to three hundred and fifty books. With a greater demand for requests on by half of the Junior High students the bookmobile is very cooperative.

"The History of Keene" was purchased along with seventeen new adult books in the year 1968. A collection of forty-five LPM records were sent to the library as a gift from the RCA Victor Company. A generous gift of four volumes containing "Town Reports of Stoddard" were donated by Mr. and Mrs. William Lane and Dr. and Mrs. James Faulkner. ## ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

It is probably one of the least debatable issues in education to say that schools cost money. The debatable aspect of this, however, is: does the quality of education correspond to the rise in cost. This is a question to which there is no easy answer. Many of the costs of schools are the kind that have little direct effect on quality per se' and would rise regardless simply because of inflation. Also, the increased push by teachers to bring about substantial increases in salary levels certainly affects cost and probably does little to affect quality. Although this report is not aimed at a discussion of quality education it is perhaps a fair question to ask what kind of education can your children receive in a small multi-graded school. If we believe in providing for each child the kind of program that best meets his particular needs and is one that best prepares him for the future then we must ask ourselves if such is possible through the multi-graded school. For the teacher this is a most difficult problem, and no matter what the cost will not result, necessarily, in a greatly improved system.

What does a teacher have to face in a multi-graded system? The most obvious thing is the number of different grades and within them the number of students, each with his or her own capabilities. Within this organization is the variety of courses that must be offered; namely reading, language arts, social studies, arithmetic, science, and spelling. Simple arithmetic reveals the number of preparations required to meet the demands of each grade level. Of course, some subjects do not receive the same emphasis as others, and it is possible to combine some grade levels, but nevertheless the requirement made in preparation is almost monumental. And this is simply to meet everyday requirements. Generally, a conscientious teacher wants to keep up to date in new trends, and have the

opportunity to develop new materials for classroom use. Just doing some professional reading and taking courses is a rather time consuming task, let alone trying to put it to use. This then is the assignment facing the teacher of the multigrade school. Now, if we consider that the foregoing is strictly paperwork, and if we consider that the teacher does have some concern for her students, then we add another dimension to the picture. Unless a teacher is entirely devoid of any compassion for her students then it is rather difficult not to be aware of the needs each individual child has, and to want to meet them in the best possible manner. This makes the matter of preparation more complex, for now instead of planning for a group of three or four the teacher might very well be planning something for each child, or at least planning for each child to proceed at his or her own rate of speed. Children come to us with a wide range of backgrounds, abilities and interests. They each make particular types of demands of us. It is unreasonable to expect that they can all proceed alike in each subject, or can be treated as a part of a group all of the time. They want that bit of time when they and they alone can receive that bit of special attention from the teacher. They also need the social contacts with other children of a similar age and interest group as well as the educational challenge from children of similiar ability levels. This is the challenge that faces your teacher. Often time, because of the complexity of the task not all of this gets done, or even a majority of it. Yet the desire still burns within us because we know that each child deserves his time in the sun.

If there is a message in what I have to say it is this: that just as the cost of schools keep rising, so does the desire of teachers to provide better and better opportunities for your children. This message to you is written simply to say that your teacher faces an enormous task. You can feel sure that she will do her best to meet it. Your continued support can make the road a little smoother.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

For the past few years my reports have attempted to look to the future on the local, state and national level. My prognostications have been reasonably accurate and I probably should continue to press my luck and continue the same format. However, I do not now have the large number of contacts at the state level that I enjoyed while I held office in the School Administrators Association and with changes in the party holding the top offices at both the state and federal level anything that I could predict would be pure "guesstimate" and highly lacking in merit. Therefore, this year, I will confine my report to the local level and I shouldn't find it too difficult to provide a bit of food or thought and hopefully some reaction. The one exception follows:

I alway have a hard time getting people concerned about proposed legislation and regulations at the state level. Reaction after the fact has been more than adequate, but of course, was of little value. The State Board of Education has, in the study stage, regulations, which if adopted, would make a tremendous impact on your school system. The legislative "hopper" is filled with resolutions pertaining to education which if enacted would have a very drastic effect, not only on your school system, but on your school budget as well. Citizens who have a concern in these areas, and I know they are legion, should at least request their representatives to the General Court to keep them advised of proposed school legislation and then, after thoughtful consideration, advise their representatives of their feelings and if possible attend the hearings on the proposed bills. If there is no reaction among the citizenry, the legislature cannot help but assume that the proposal is acceptable to them. If there is no reaction prior to the passage of a bill or regulation, then there should be none when the time for implementation arrives.

I do not submit the following with malicious intent but

rather with a feeling that every once in a while that we should examine the things that we are presently doing and determine in the light of an ever changing world whether what we are doing is the thing to continue to do.

There has not been and there still isn't any real pressure to stop Stoddard's operation of a multiple graded school under one teacher. However, Stoddard should be ever alert to the fast changing direction that education is taking and critically analize the quality of educational experiences they are providing with that being offered in other state school systems.

The community is doing well by its grades 7-12 by placing them on a tuition basis in the Keene school syttem. This is done by signing an annual contract. There is no guarantee that Keene will continue to renew such a contract and this should be of concern to the citizens of Stoddard.

At the present time the Keene School District is interested in expanding its area school concept which would guarantee Stoddard an opportunity to send their youngsters to Keene for long periods of time. I would recommend that Stoddard think seriously about giving their youngsters this protection.

The elementary school is a different problem and much more difficult to solve. I suspect that some long term contract could be worked out for them at Keene also, but I have a tendency to join those who are reluctant to see those primary youngsters bussed that distance each day.

Stoddard has a tremendous growth potential if they ever get around to put in a straight road to Keene. In the meantime there could be considerable merit in sitting down with the Munsonville people to determine what values could be derived from a joint educational endeavor.

The above is an attempt to look ahead and I am sure that most of you do not subscribe to the "Eat, drink, and be merry—" philosophy.
