To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wilmot in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Wilmot on Tuesday, the fourteenth (14th) day of March, next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

You are hereby further notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wilmot the fourteenth (14th) day of March, next at seven of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to negotiate the extension or renewal of the notes securing such loans when it is necessary.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$933.00 (Nine hundred thirty-three dollars and no cents) for the Kearsarge Visiting Nurse Association.
- 5. (Requested) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 (Three thousand five hundred dollars and no cents) for the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Company, Inc.
- 6. (Requested) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the New London Hospital.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any material or equipment deemed to be surplus to the Town needs; the sale of highway material or equipment to be made with the approval of the Road Agent.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to be a member of the regional planning commission, organized and named the Upper Valley-Lake Sunapee Council, and to appropriate the sum of \$429.00 (Four hundred twenty-nine dollars and no cents) as the Town's share of the annual operating expenses of the regional planning commission to be used in conjunction with other state and federal funds available for planning purposes.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$648.30 (Six hundred forty-eight and thirty cents) for the continuation of services to the low income residents of Wilmot through the Kearsarge Valley Area center of the Community Action Program, Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the following property acquired by Tax Deeds:
 - 1. Smith property on Campground Road.

- 2. Beulah Randlett property in North Wilmot.
- 3. Fulton Mining rights.
- 4. Kimball Mining rights.
- 5. Weatherbee Mining rights.
- 6. Warren Mfg. Co. Mining rights.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 (One thousand five hundred dollars and no cents) to set up fallen headstones and monuments in cemeteries.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$29,000.00 (Twenty-nine thousand dollars and no cents) for the purchase of a new highway truck and sander and authorize the withdrawal of \$17,500 (Seventeen thousand five hundred dollars and no cents) from Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, the balance to be obtained by removing \$9,300.00 (Nine thousand three hundred dollars and no cents) from the Capital Reserve Equipment Fund and raising \$2,200.00 (Two thousand two hundred dollars and no cents) by taxation.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to close that section of "Lee Pedrick" Road that starts at the intersection of the Kimpton Brook and Route 4-A and runs uphill in a southwesterly direction approximately 1,000 feet to a corner where the road intersects with the newly gravelled road that continues in a southeasterly direction through the former Newell Grace property.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Russell Jewell Road, in "Rocky Acres" so-called, as a Town road.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to remove the funds from the Frank P. Sargent Trust Fund and use these funds to make improvements at the ballfield, said Trust Fund having been left for use of the Town as the voters wish.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to accept a gift of a parcel of land between Pine Hill Road Ext. and Route 11, from Myrtle T. Newcomb; said parcel to be an addition to the present park, with the complete parcel to be known as the John G. Newcomb Park.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

RSA 76:11 provides for delivery of the list (warrant) to the collector within thirty days of receipt of approval of the tax rate unless for good cause the time is extended by the department. The collector shall within thirty days after receipt of the warrant from the selectmen (assessors) send out the tax bills unless for good cause the time is extended by this department.

RSA 76:11-a Information Required. The tax bill which is sent to every person taxed, or his agent, if known, as provided in section 11, shall show the rate of municipal, school and county taxes separately, and each bill shall also show the assessed valuation of all lands and buildings for which said person is being taxed. The 1977 rate breakdown reflects a proportionate share of the Reimbursement a/c Property Exempted by 1970 Special Session for each unit of government.

RSA 76:13 provides that interest at 9% per annum shall be charged on all taxes except resident taxes not paid on or before December 1, except that in the case where a tax bill was sent to a taxpayer on or after November 2 and before April 1st, interest shall not be charged until 30 days after the bills are mailed. The collector shall state on the bill the date from which interest will be charged.

The tax bill which you mail must contain the date from which interest will be charged and this date is determined by the date you send the last bill on the list committed to you. It is also required by statute that you notify this department in writing of the date on which you send the last tax bill. We enclose a form for this purpose.

- Patrick J. Cloffl passed away September 2, 1977. Pat was a respected member of our community and took an active interest in making our town a better place to live. He was a member of our first Planning Board and served many years. He leaves his wife Eleanor and sons John and Andrew, a fine family.
- 1. The tax map was completed during the 1977 fiscal year. The job was done by Kear-Wood Inc., a local company, and at a savings of \$1,000 less than our estimates. This map will be maintained each year to show ownership changes during the year. There were not many surprises on ownership but some acreages were affected.
- 2. The town continues to improve its road system although it is a slow process with big increases in costs and very little added funds. Our biggest project this year was completion of the Shindakin Road.
- 3. More home building permits were issued in 1977 than in any previous year. Not all of these were built in 1977 but no doubt will be during 1978.

March 8, 1977 7:00 P. M.

The polls were opened for voting at 1:00 p m by Moderator Peter Allen. The Town Meeting was opened by Moderator, Peter Allen at 7:00.

ARTICLE 1. 120 ballots were cast out of 389.

ARTICLE 2. The amount voted to defray town charges for the ensuing year is \$53,006.29, amendments made to this article by Earle Chandler to be included in the above amount are:

- 1. Raise Selectmen's Salary \$200.00 each
- 2. Raise Tax Collector's Salary \$300.00
- Raise appropriation for Town Hall & Other Buildings \$300.00 to renovate the Wilmot Library.
- 4. Delete contingency fund \$500.00
- 5. Raise the amount for Civil Defense \$250.00
- 6. Remove \$14,000 from surplus
- 7. Raise Road Maintenance \$8,000.00
- 8. Raise Town Poor Fund \$3,000.00

After discussion and motions seconded by John Morse the above amendments carried.

The Selectmen recommended that \$3,166.00 not be spent from Revenue Sharing this year and moved to have it come before the meeting next year. The motion was carried.

ARTICLE 3. The motion was made by Ernest Patten to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to negotiate the extension of renewal of the notes securing such loans when it is necessary. Motion was seconded by R. Bacon and carried.

ARTICLE 4. Motion made by Alice Chandler to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$915.00 for the Kearsarge Visiting Nurse Assoc. The motion was seconded by Frances Wilcox and carried.

Article 5. (Requested) Motion was made by Henry Stevens to see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sume of \$3,500.00 for the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Co., Inc. Motion was seconded by John Borelli and carried.

ARTICLE 6. (Requested) Motion was made by Alice Chandler to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the New London Hospital. Motion was seconded by Frances Wilcox and carried to raise \$1,000.00.

ARTICLE 7. Motion was made by John Morse to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell any material or equipment deemed to be surplus to the Town needs.

The motion was seconded by R. Bacon and carried.

ARTICLE 8 Motion was made by John Madden to see if the Town will vote to be a member of the regional planning commission, organized and named the Upper-Valley Lake Sunapee Council, and to appropriate the sum of \$420.00 as the Town's share of the annual operating expenses of the regional planning commission to be used in conjunction with other state and federal funds available for planning purposes. Motion was seconded by Robert Minard and was carried.

ARTICLE 9. Motion was made by Sandy Brownell to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$622.19 for the continuation of services to the low-income residents of Wilmot through the Kearsarge Valley Area center of the Community Action Program, Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc. The motion was seconded by Alice Chandler and carried.

ARTICLE 10. Other business to be transacted before the meeting.

- 1. To have the Selectmen look into and locate a feasible site for brush and leaves to be dumped in the Town.
- Phyllis Robichaud presented a Certificate of Award to Margaret Loomer for 12 years of Library service. There was a standing ovation of appreciation.

Motion made by Jackie Rayno to adjourn the meeting was seconded by R. Bacon. The meeting adjourned at 9:05 p m.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

The work of the Planning Board changes little from year to year - namely the review of subdivision applications and the effort to revise and update the Planning Ordinance and Subdivision Regulations with the aim of clarifying them and making them more responsive to the Town's needs. In the first category we approved six subdivision applications and reviewed several others which are still in the preliminary stage. No amendments or additions to the Ordinance were proposed in 1977, but discussions were held during the year on this subject and hopefully we will be prepared to put forth our proposals in time for the 1978 Town Meeting.

Progress on the Master Plan has been disappointly slow. It is to be hoped that the Inventory Committees can complete their work in early 1978 and allow the Goals Committee to get started on its task. As required by HUD, the Upper Valley - Lake Sunapee Council has prepared a Regional Land Use Plan which should be of great help to this committee. Under New Hampshire statutes this plan does not have the force of law, it is simply advisory; no town is required to adopt any of its provisions unless it so desires.

The only personnel change in 1977 was the appointment to the Board of Clayton Nowell.

As I complete my term of office I would like to express my thanks to all those who have served with me, particularly to our Secretary, Barbara Sanborn, whose faithful attendance and thorough minutes have enabled us to maintain proper records of our activities.

REPORT OF CEMETERY TRUSTEES

Progress has been made this year in putting some of the cemeteries in better condition. Eagle Pond Cemetery was kept mowed, clipped, raked, and fertilizer applied. The gate was painted, and at the suggestion of this year's caretaker, the road agent made better near-by parking facilities available.

In addition to mowing the Bunker Hill Cemetery, the overall appearance was improved by filling in sunken graves and replacing the fallen headstones. At least ten of these had to be set in cement, and at the present time there is no stone in this cemetery which is down. About twenty small stones were righted. Two or three lots built up with curbing were filled in and seeded. This means they can now be mowed with the rest of the cemetery. Bushes were sprayed to kill their future growth. Thanks are due Lawrence Rowe for his interest and work in making these improvements. Other than mowing, the priority of work in this cemetery should be straightening all stones and monuments.

Late in the summer the North Road Cemetery was mowed and raked. Hopefully, this would put it in condition for mowing with a power mower next season.

Little could be done in the Tewksbury, White-Pond and Carr Hill Cemeteries. The last two mentioned are in a deplorable state. After the White Pond Cemetery was raked this fall it was discovered that there were seven stones flat on the ground in this small cemetery. There are also fallen headstones in the other two cemeteries mentioned. Unless this condition is remedied the site of these graves will be lost. Much work needs to be done, which will all mean a larger expenditure of money. Hopefully the citizens of Wilmot will say "We care".

REPORT OF THE WILMOT LIBRARY TRUSTEES

We are pleased to note the continued growth of the Wilmot Town Library, particularly as measured by the increased circulation of books at both the main library in the Center and the branch room in Wilmot Flat. A total of 3,423 books were checked out during the year. The trustees purchased 202 books, and received 185 volumes as gifts to be added to our permanent collection. 4,452 books were made available through the State Library Bookmobile.

During March, and with the consent of the Selectmen, we remodelled the bathroom area at the Center Library. One set of fixtures was removed and the space opened up to make a useful cataloging area with built-in desk and shelves. Upon completion of carpentry work and insulation, the trustees painted walls and floor. Thus, the cataloging activities are all in one location and we were able to rearrange the bookshelves in the library to give more room and better organization of our book, magazine and record collection. A rack to display paperback books was salvaged and painted by Mr. Alfred Schoeler and is now in use.

In June we had another successful evening of Barbershop Quartet singing. The Town Hall was again filled to capacity. In September, Tomie de Paola gave us an evening of "Looking at the Pictures". About 50 people enjoyed his excellent artwork and his humorous talk. Currently, we are having a series of Film Nights which will continue until June. Films, obtained free of charge from the State Library, are shown in the Center Library each second and fourth Friday at 7:30 PM. These are open to the public and everyone is welcome to attend. There is no charge.

We accepted with regret the resignation of Phyllis Robichaud as Library Trustee. Gary Rayno was appointed by the Selectmen to fill out her term of office.

The biggest problem the trustees faced this year came in the fall when Judy Romanoff found it necessary to resign as librarian at the Wilmot Flat branch. We were unsuccessful in finding anyone to take over these duties despite numerous phone calls and newspaper coverage and advertising. The consensus seems to be that the room should be kept open as a convenience to townspeople who live in Wilmot Flat, however no one wants the full responsibility for it. At present, the room is open on Friday afternoon from 2 to 4, with Mary Wragg, Betty Cave, Phyllis Robichaud and Myrt Newcomb acting as volunteers. We thank them for their help.

We wish to thank also the volunteers who work so dependably at the Center Library: Frances Wilcox, Clara Langley, Florence Langley and Doris Languenau. Since the State Library requires us to be open a minimum of 12 hours a week, these ladies were agreeable to taking on extra hours on Saturday morning to make up for the time lost at the branch library.

Reed Berkey and Mary Jane Schoeler, librarian, have continued their work with cataloging and will soon be at a point where only new acquisitions will need attention.

Mrs. Schoeler will take her final courses in Library Techniques this summer at UNH -

also a requirement of the N.H. State Library. She has given much time and effort to making the library a useful, interesting and pleasant place for all who wish to avail themselves of it. The trustees felt it was incumbent upon us to raise her token salary as a measure of appreciation.

All Wilmot residents are welcome at either the main library in Wilmot Center or at the branch room in the Community Center building in Wilmot Flat. Trustees' meetings are held on the first Wednesday of each month at 7:30 PM at the Center. Anyone is welcome to attend. We would be appreciative of your new ideas and constructive criticism.

To the Townspeople of Wilmot, New Hampshire:

This is a Financial Report of the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Company, Inc., including the Town of Wilmot 1977 Appropriation and money raised by the Members of the Fire Company in 1977.

During 1977 we accomplished some needed improvements and repairs on our trucks. Two new sets of bunkers, boots, helmets, and pants were purchased; along with a Scott Air Pac and some additional oxygen tanks.

We were fortunate in being able to obtain three used army vehicles through government surplus — a Jeep, 4X4 Carrier, and a 10 wheel GMC Truck. Our only expense was the cost of transportation. The Fire Company is presently converting these trucks to usable fire vehicles.

Civil Defense also provided us with a van type vehicle which we will use to replace our aging rescue wagon.

We reponded to 12 alarms in Wilmot during the year, and most were of a minor nature. We were called out for 5 Mutual-Aid fires including the Proctor Academy dining hall fire. In addition, 10 fire drills and numerous work parties were held during the year. Our mutual-aid radio check with the 14 towns in the Kearsarge Mutual-Aid District is still conducted weekly along with the check of our fire phones.

The Fire Company hosted a testimonial supper for Dave Geogan, who retired after 30 years service manning the fire tower on Mt. Kearsarge. Dave was an asset to the State of New Hampshire, and our area in particular.

John McFadden, our treasurer of 24 years, passed away in February. He served the Fire Company, and community, with loyalty and distinction. We shall deeply miss him and his guidance.

The members of the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Company, Inc. wish to thank the Selectmen, Police Department, Director of Civil Defense, townspeople, and everyone who assisted in our various projects for their generous cooperation and assistance.

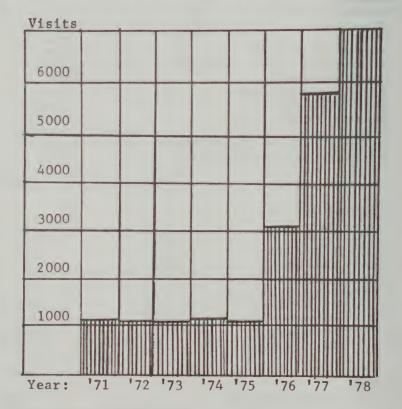

COMMUNITY ACTION ANNUAL REPORT

Over the past four years, the Kearsarge Valley Community Action Program has been the focal point of social services delivery in this area. It has provided through its staff and facilities, assistance to the community as a whole, as well as to low income families. With the renovation of our multi-purpose center we have been able to expand our capacity to serve the needs of local residents.

In addition to maintaining "Outreach" office hours at the Community Center from 2 p. m. to 4 p. m. on the first Thursday of the month, we have also provided the following programs and services:

Rural Bus Transportation for Senior Citizens, Meals-on-Wheels in co-operation with community volunteers, Winterization, Operation Green Thumb, Food Stamp Assistance, Fuel Loans, Oil Burner Efficiency Testing, Adult and Well Child Clinics in conjunction with the Visiting Nurses, Manpower/Job Assistance and Information and Referral Services. We have initiated a Thrift Shop and a Food Co-op, featuring produce that is available to all Kearsarge Valley residents, at Community Action in Warner.

Your financial support is needed for the continued operation of the area center, rather than for specific programs, which receive their funding from various sources. The share of our total operating budget for which we ask the town of Wilmot to contribute is based upon the percentage of local resident participation in Community Action programs or services. This is the most equitable procedure for dividing the costs among the eight area towns.

The Kearsarge Valley Community Action Staff appreciates the interest and support from the volunteers and residents of Wilmot and anticipates working on behalf of your community again this year.
