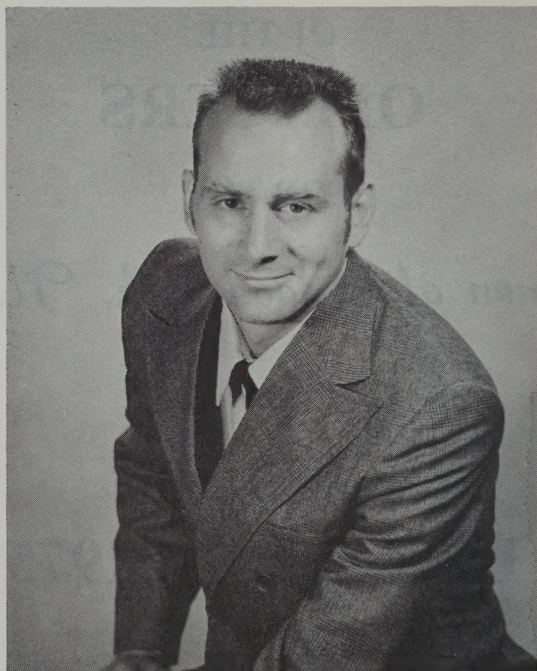

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Woodstock in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Woodstock Town Hall in said Woodstock on Tuesday, the 2nd day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects: **BUSINESS MEETING STARTS AT 7:30 P.M.**

POLLS CLOSE AT 6:00 P.M.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget as posted.
4. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to sell property on tax titles.
6. To see if a discount of 3% will be allowed on taxes paid on or before the first of October or a later date to be set by the selectmen.
7. To see if the town will vote to allow the Tax Collector to receive part payments of taxes in any year in the sum of ten dollars or a multiple of ten.
8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Funds in cases of emergency.
9. To see if the town will vote to authorize selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Federal Funds coming.
10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the use of \$15,-000.00 of the Revenue Sharing Funds for the reconstruction of Mirror Lake Road.
11. To see if the town will vote to ratify, approve and confirm the Warranty Deed from the Town of Woodstock to Saulnier Oil Company, Inc. dated November 8, 1971, and recorded in Grafton County Registry of Deeds, Book 1154, Page 276, conveying

the site of the Saulnier Oil Company bulk fuel plant on the east bank of the Pemigewasset River and to authorize the Selectmen, upon payment to the Town of the agreed consideration of \$2,-000.00, to execute, acknowledge and deliver to Saulnier Oil Co., Inc., (same as Saulnier Oil Company, Inc.) a corrective confirmatory Quitclaim Deed of the same premises which shall correct the erroneous title reference contained in aforementioned deed recorded in Book 1154, Page 276.

12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend the \$282,000.00 Housing and Urban Development grant to install a new water system for the town.

13. To see if the town will vote to purchase a new Police Cruiser.

14. To see if the town will vote to purchase a new 2 ton, 2 wheel drive Dump Truck.

15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enroll in the Assistance Program under Section 8 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1974.

16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Deputy Tax Collector.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

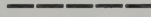

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDENS AND DISTRICT CHIEF



Upon the recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey Bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.

REPORT OF WOODSTOCK PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board welcomed as a new member William J. Waterhouse. Mr. Waterhouse was confirmed by selectmen as a replacement on the Board for Robert Keating who was elected as Selectman at the March Town Meeting. Fortunately Mr. Keating will continue on as ex-officio member as liason to the selectmen.

The Planning Board had many meetings during the year. The most important were those concerning the Proposed Zoning Ordinance which was voted on at the March Town Meeting. The results of the vote were 158 against and 98 for zoning with only 40% of the registered voters participating.

The Board put in many hours in an attempt to present a Zoning Ordinance which would be acceptable to the townspeople. However, the vote would indicate more work must be done to make an ordinance which would make it more palatable to the townspeople who rejected it.

The Board will continue to work on it in the year 1976 and hope we can come up with something more acceptable to the majority of the voters. We fully realize some of our shortcomings and will do our best to overcome them.

The Board realizes that many regulations, be they national, state, or local, have been put upon the public. However, some must be established as a guide to the future of our town, otherwise, we may be obliged to accept regulations not of our own making which could conceivably be less acceptable than those which our Zoning Ordinance presents.

The Board would like to thank those who have co-operated with us to bring about a better understanding of the town's problems which are increasing yearly. The North Country Council has been invaluable in giving us of their expertise on Town

Planning. We also say thanks to the selectmen for their co-operation with the Board.

THE MOOSILAUKE PUBLIC LIBRARY

The year 1975 again saw many changes in the Moosilauke Public Library. Perhaps the most visible was the move in September to a pleasant, large, sunny room next to the Selectmen's Office. Registration of active library patrons is now approximately ten per cent of the town population not including the schoolchildren who walk to the library from the North Woodstock Elementary School each week with their classes. In the spring, the Friends of the Library had a May Day Book Sale and Fair complete with a Maypole and Painted Clown Faces for the children. During the summer, two more successful book sales were held at the summer fairs on the Common and at the Woodstock Town Hall.

The film program continues to be a popular success. The Friends of the Library received a one hundred dollar grant from the New Hampshire Commission on the Arts to show *20,000 Leagues Under the Sea* in February 1976 and presented a Bicentennial film, *These States*, in December 1975. The library has been invited to be a participant in an experimental film project of one hundred fifty public libraries throughout the United States funded by the National Endowment on the Humanities. The underlying purpose of the project, entitled "Films Plus", is to stimulate public interest in the humanities while increasing the circulation of related library books. During the year 1976, the library and Friends will present free, and at no direct cost to the library, three BBC films: *Tom Brown's Schooldays*; *The Search for the Nile*; and *The Six Wives of Henry VIII*. The librarian has also been asked to serve during 1976 as the North Country delegate to the New Hampshire State Library Committee selecting films for the State Library Film Collection.

The library has received several excellent, new books as gifts and also three new magazine subscriptions, National Wildlife and the Smithsonian magazines from Mr. and Mrs. Charles Spaulding, and Cricket magazine for the schoolchildren from the Quest Club. A former North Woodstock resident, Mr. Ervin A. Tappan has given the library a very handsome donation of one hundred dollars for new books in the memory of his wife, Hester Stiles Tappan and his daughter, Mrs. June Stocklinski, has also given a number of new gift books. The library gratefully acknowledges all these gifts and wishes to thank those for their generosity to our small library.

The library is now open daily, Monday through Saturday, from 1:30 — 4:00 PM with evening hours on Wednesday from 6:00 — 8:00 PM. As a result of these increased hours and the new centralized location, circulation and patronage have both increased and improved considerably. Again the library has relied upon the excellent services of both the State Bookmobile and the State Library in Concord which continue to supply our numerous book requests.

In this historic Bicentennial year, the Moosilauke Public Library encourages all our residents to come into the library to re-discover the heritage of their past so that they may gain the knowledge and wisdom necessary for the future.

5088 Skilled Nursing Visits to homes for purposes of: care of the chronically ill; short term care following hospitalization; short term acute care in place of hospitalization; visits to new-borns and mothers; diet and nutrition teaching; prevention, intervention and control of diseases.

4214 hours of Homemaker/Home Health Aide services: keeping patient as independent as possible; maintenance of patient in his own environment as long as he is able to be there; accomplished through assistance with personal care; ancillary nursing procedures; assistance with meal preparation and light housekeeping.

4 Physical Therapy visits by a registered Physical Therapist.

15 immunization clinics for pre-school children.

3 Adult Health Screening clinics for adults over 30 years of age. Follow-ups are done by our nurses.

5 Dental Screening clinics for pre-school children. Follow-ups and referrals done by this office.

6 Well-child clinics providing physical exams for pre-school children of low income families. Follow-ups and referrals made by this office.

3 orthopedic clinics held at Littleton Hospital for all area residents.

1 Expectant Parents course.

1 Diabetic teaching course.

Aims for 1976: 4 orthopedic clinics to be held at Littleton Hospital; increase in Expectant Parents courses; continuation of present clinic schedules with expansion of Well-child clinics.

This Agency is approved by Medicare and the New Hampshire Department of Public Health as a certified provider of Home Care Services.

The Board of Directors of this non-profit agency is composed of volunteer members representing the towns served. New Board Members are elected at the Annual Meeting in January. All monies received are returned in direct services to the residents of the 17 towns.

**TOWN OF WOODSTOCK
TOWN REPORT FROM THE
NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL**

Grant assistance with the preparation of the HUD Community development pre-application and full application for the improvements to the town's water supply, resulting in a \$282,000 grant from HUD, is the major local service provided to the town by the North Country Council. The Council assisted the planning board by commenting on the subdivision regulations. NCC staff attended twelve (12) meetings with town officials in 1975.

On the regional level, the North Country Council prepared a public transportation plan and is working toward the implementation of its recommendations. The Council became the economic development district for northern New Hampshire on July, 1975, and is currently carrying out this function. Several region-wide meetings on Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission regulations, economic development, seminars for planning board members, and recycling of newsprint were sponsored. A recently completed report entitled "The Regulation of Mobile Homes in the Community", prepared by the Council, provides technical information to planning board members and local officials in the area of mobile homes.

In 1975, the Council increased its base of local support from 19 to 29 towns. The Council coordinates its activities with other agencies in order to avoid any possible duplication of effort.

Planning News, the Council's bi-monthly newsletter, disseminates useful information on land use, state legislation, court decisions, and general activities to interested persons in town. A town resident can be placed on the mailing list by contacting the town's NCC representative or the Council office in Franconia, N.H. (Tel. 823-8108)

In performing its duties, the Council attends approximately 200 night meetings a year.

For the future, continued activity in community planning assistance will be emphasized along with major regional efforts in economic development, land use, and housing. Dissemination of planning information will be continued. The Council is working closely with the N.H. Public Utilities Commission in the improvement and upgrading of the North Country's rail lines, especially the Lincoln line and the North Stratford to Beecher Falls line.

The council sincerely appreciates and thanks the town for its support and participation. This support has enabled the Council to provide a good deal of local and regional services.
