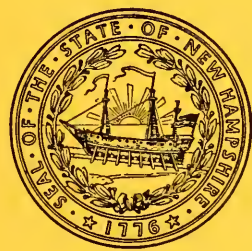

## TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bath qualified to vote in town affairs. You are notified to meet at the Town Hall in Bath on Tuesday, March 9 at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects.

Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years, one Library Trustee for three years, a Treasurer, an Auditor, a Highway Agent, and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear the reports of officers and agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Officers Salaries and expenses, for repairs, maintenance and construction of highways and bridges, for the support of the poor, Town Library, for Old Age Assistance, for the Protection of the Public and all other necessary Town charges and expenses for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the construction of Class 5 roads and to raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of \$1,054.61 and the State to contribute \$7,030.74 for the same.

Article 5. To see what action the Town will take on the following question: Shall the provision of the Laws relative to the playing games of Beano be adopted in this Town?

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to petition the Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deed.

Article 8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town revalued by the Tax Commission, or some other assessment firm; and to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay for the same.

Article 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

For the fifth year we have had the state aid grant of \$100.00 made to affiliated libraries; it enabled us to buy the 12 volume History of the United States, published by Life Magazine, well illustrated and most suitable for use by teenagers, as well as the purchase of eight other reference books on history and ecology. Our special thanks go to Linda Lamarre for conducting the Story Hour for

Six weeks during July and August for 18 children, aged four to ten. Her fine program included poems, songs, records, crafts and games. She gave a party at the final session, an event to which the youngsters look forward each summer. And, finally, we gratefully acknowledge the time and energy Mrs. Bessie Weeks has devoted to maintaining the branch library at Swift-water over a period of many years.

Mrs. Bess Reed is our library's representative to this area's Advisory District Council which holds four meetings each year at Littleton, and additional conferences as the need arises. For the past two years she has served as chairman. The Council has initiated the Common Borrower's Card system, and is currently working out solutions to many problems, some examples of which are: (1) how to make better use of recordings, films, and film strips, (2) how to facilitate inter-library loans, (3) how to improve cooperation between public schools and public libraries, (4) how to help small libraries on limited budgets. Consultants from the State Library are always available for counseling.

**REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE  
WARDEN & DISTRICT CHIEF**

During this past year, the public has shown a great deal of cooperation in the prevention of fires. We wish to express our thanks for a job well done.

Your forest fire warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires, a synopsis of these laws follow.

**FIRE PERMITS**

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning (SUCH BURNING IS RESTRICTED BY REGULATION TO BE PRIOR TO 9:00 A.M. and AFTER 5:00 P.M.).

An Air Pollution regulation forbids the burning of household waste in towns where such rubbish is collected by the town.

**EXCEPTIONS**

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed under normal conditions with permission of the District Fire Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On others' property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National

Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bath qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Bath, New Hampshire on the 10th day of March, polls to be open for the election of District Officers at 3:00 o'clock in the afternoon and to close not earlier than 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon, with action on the remaining articles in this warrant to be taken commencing at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon.

Article 1. To choose, by non-partisan ballot, a Moderator for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose, by non-partisan ballot, a School District Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose, by non-partisan ballot, a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To choose, by non-partisan ballot, an Auditor for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To choose, by non-partisan ballot, one School Board Member for a term of three years.

Article 6. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

Article 7. To hear any reports of the School Board, Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Article 9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or offers for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the State of New Hampshire and/or United States.

Article 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Our budget this year shows a net increase of \$1,875.52 for property tax assessment 1971-72. The item that controls our budget to the greatest degree is tuition. Next year we have budgeted the following for the payment of tuition to other school districts:

## REPORT OF ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

It is with great pleasure that I submit my first annual report as Assistant Superintendent of Schools.

I assumed my present position on July 1, 1970. My main duties consist of general supervision of the elementary schools in the Union as well as helping to develop federally funded programs.

During the first week in September the entire teaching staff of the Supervisory Union attended a two day workshop held at the Woodsville High School. The conference was keynoted by Deputy Commission of Education Robert L. Brunelle and dealt with some of the newer methods, materials and ideas prevalent in education today. We hope to make this an annual activity, one which will serve as a stimulating beginning to the school year.

Periodic meetings are held with all Supervisory Union Elementary Principals. We discuss common problems, share information and suggest ways to improve the operation of our schools. Subjects discussed at these meetings include the New Hampshire minimum standards for elementary schools and the implementation of those standards by the fall of 1972. We have discussed the need for written policies for each elementary school; in-service training for teachers; improved methods of teacher evaluation; more efficient use of standardized test results; curriculum improvement, etc.

In the area of federal funding, we are running a remedial reading program with funds from Title I, Elementary and Secondary Education Act. This program is for children with reading disabilities. These youngsters are given an opportunity to work with Mrs. Kathleen Pancoast, who employs methods and materials especially designed to help children in this category.

A special thanks to Mr. Robert Savoy and his staff for completing information to show how well the Bath Village School compares to the State's minimum standards for elementary schools. Mr. Savoy found that with a few adjustments we will be able to attain minimum standards by September of 1972.

May I take this opportunity to thank the board members, administration and staff of the Bath School District for their fine cooperation.

**SUPERVISORY UNION #23**  
**REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY**

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent.

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union #23, during 1970-1971, will receive a salary of \$17,000.00, which is made up as follows: \$3,000.00 to be paid by the State Department of Education and \$14,000.00 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1,500.00 for travel within the Union is also prorated as stated above.
