THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Boscawen in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Boscawen on Tuesday, the 12th *** day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town changes for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
 - a. Town Officers' Salaries
 - b. Town Officers' Expenses
 - c. Election & Registration
 - d. Expenses Town Hall & Other Town Buildings
 - e. Employees' Social Security
 - f. Police Department
 - g. Fire Departments
 - h. Blister Rust & Care of Trees
 - i. Insurance
 - i. Civil Defense
 - k. Health Officer, Hospitals Art. 4 & 5
 - 1. Vital Statistics
 - m. Sewer Maintenance
 - n. Town Dump & Rubbish Removal
 - o. Highways & Bridges
 - p. Street Lighting
 - q. Town Road Aid
 - r. Libraries
 - s. Town Poor & Old Age Assistance
 - t. Memorial Day & Old Home Day
 - u. Parks & Playgrounds Art. 6, 7 & 8
 - v. Cemeteries
 - w. Interest
 - x. Sidewalks
- ***Business meeting for Appropriations only will be called for 7:30 o'clock in the evening.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to empower the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expense of the Town until the taxes are paid to the Treasurer.
 - 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate

for Concord Hospital.

- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Franklin Hospital.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for use at Rolfe Park.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Penacook Youth Center.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Community Park. (Balance \$111.53)
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to transfer or sell property taken by Town in default of redemption from Tax Sales.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the purchase of the Cook land for site of a new Much-I-Do-Fire Station.
- 11. To amend the vote of the Town establishing a Planning Board at the annual Town Meeting held on March 8, 1960, so as to specify that the Town Clerk shall be the municipal officer who shall issue on behalf of the Town a certificate of failure on the part of the Planning Board to take action on approval or disapproval of a plat submitted to it within the time allowed, as provided by RSA 36:23.
- 12. To approve in principle the construction of the following sewage treatment and disposal facilities in accordance with the Report On Sewerage and Sewage Treatment by Camp, Dresser & McKee, Consulting Engineers, dated January, 1966, as revised:
 - (a) A sewage treatment and disposal system to be constructed by the Town of Boscawen to serve the Boscawen Plains section of the Town, consisting of a sewage disposal pond in the intervale along the Merrimack River and the necessary intercepting sewers leading from the Daniel Webster Highway; and
 - (b) A joint Boscawen-Concord sewage treatment and disposal system to serve the Penacook sections of the Town of Boscawen and the City of Concord, consisting of a combined intercepting sewer extending along the North side of the Contoocook River and located partly in the City of Concord and partly in the Town of Boscawen to intercept waste from both municipalities which now discharge into the

Contoocook River from the North, an intercepting sewer located in Concord to intercept waste from the Penacook section of Concord which now discharges into the Contoocook River from the South, and a joint treatment plant located in Concord for treating the wastes from both of these interceptors; each municipality to construct and maintain the facilities of such joint systems located within its limits; and the Town of Boscawen to reimburse the City of Concord on an equitable basis for the facilities and additional treatment plant capacity constructed by the City of Concord for the Town's benefit (less Concord's fair share of the cost of the additional flow capacity provided for its benefit in the combined intercepting sewer constructed in Boscawen), and also to reimburse the City of Concord annually for the Town's proportionate share of the cost of maintaining and operating the treatment plant, the amount of such reimbursements to be determined by agreement of the Town and City.

- 13. To raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding Twenty Six Thousand Dollars (\$26,000.00) for the preparation of final engineering plans, specifications and contract documents for (a) the construction of a sewage treatment and disposal system to serve the Boscawen Plains area, and (b) the construction of those facilities of the joint Boscawen-Concord sewage treatment and disposal system (to serve the Penacook sections of the Town of Boscawen and City of Concord) which are to be constructed within the Town of Boscawen, such appropriation to be contingent upon an appropriation made by the governing body of the City of Concord on or before July 1, 1968 for the preparation of final engineering plans, specifications and contract documents for the construction of those facilities of said joint Boscawen-Concord sewage treatment and disposal system which are to be constructed within said City of Concord; to determine what part of such appropriation shall be raised by taxation in the current year; to borrow in the name of the Town by the issuance of a note or notes maturing not more than one year from the date of issue in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act and amendments thereto and any other statute thereto enabling, the balance of such appropriation not to be raised by taxation in the current year, and to authorize the Selectmen to fix the date, interest rate and other details of such note or notes and to do whatever may be necessary for the issuance and sale thereof; and to authorize the Selectmen to employ engineers and to do and perform such further acts and things as may be necessary to carry the foregoing into effect.
- 14. To authorize the Selectmen to employ legal counsel to represent the Town in negotiating an agreement with the City of Concord for the construction, maintenance and operation of a joint sewage treatment and disposal system to serve the Penacook sections of the Town of Boscawen and

the City of Concord, in accordance with the provisions of RSA 53-A and any other statutes thereto enabling, such agreement not to become effective until approved by the governing bodies of the Town and City.

- 15. To authorize the Selectmen to execute a purchase order in behalf of the Town for a new fire truck to be delivered in 1969, replacing the 1941 LaFrance fire truck, the cost thereof not to exceed \$22,000.00; and to raise by taxation in the current year the sum of \$6,000.00 toward the acquisition of such new fire engine, which sum shall be paid into the capital reserve fund established for such purpose by vote of the Town at its annual meeting held on March 14, 1967.
- 16. To see what action the Town will take to have the town re-evaluated by the State Tax Commission, estimate of \$9.80 per parcel.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of a regional planning agency. This agency will have membership of at least two of the municipalities in the Boscawen area. The objective of this agency will be to plan for and encourage regional planning analysis, provide consensus on major problems of regional concern and to assist in the effectuation of projects which extend beyond the boundaries of a particular town. This agency will have no jurisdiction over any matter of local affairs. It will be primarily advisory. Two members of the regional planning agency shall be from (the town) of Boscawen to be appointed by the Selectmen. A YES vote is in favor of joining the regional planning agency.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to transfer any unexpended balance of money from one appropriation to another.
- 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

BOSCAWEN PUBLIC LIBRARY

Good books are to the young what the warming sun and refreshing rain of spring are to the seeds which have lain dormant in the frosts of winter.

Meetings have been held by the Library Trustees during the year. Many groups interested in town affairs use the Main library building for their meetings. It is also the office of the selectmen.

There has been a definite increase in the use of the Library by the adults the past year.

The trim on the Main building has been newly painted and repaired and is a big improvement. The brick walk and the loose brick on each side of the building are also being repaired.

The annual sum of fifty dollars was received from the Thornton Fund for the purchase of children's books at the Branch.

We are very fortunate in having Bookmobile service from the State Library with a large selection of fiction and non-fiction books. The librarians also borrow books from the State Library upon request of its readers.

Through the kindness of Mrs. Iyla Bartlett collections of books are taken to the Merrimack County Home.

Book Week was observed at both libraries with new books and posters on display.

Two hundred thirty-three new books were purchased last year and two sets of Child Craft Encyclopedias.

The Librarian, Mrs. Edgar Broughton, with the assistance of Mrs. Aldric Forest, has been very busy re-cataloguing the books at the main library; they are doing an excellent job.

A gift of a record player and records was given to the library by a friend to be used in the library or by any interested group. BOSCAWEN PLANNING BOARD

On the recommendation of the Selectmen, the Town Meeting of March 1967 authorized the Planning Board to adopt subdivision regulations. The two required public hearings were held, and a set of rules was published on July 14th. Standards have been set up for streets, water supply and sewage so that they will be in proper condition when accepted by the Town. Developers and sub-dividers will be required to meet the Town's requirements in order to avoid costly rebuilding at the taxpayer's expense.

This proposal was outlined in the General Plan of the Town, and the action is one of the steps needed to meet the problems of our growing community.

Another proposal now before the town is the building of a fire station. We believe that it should be planned with consideration for future needs of other activities in order to avoid costly duplication.

The Town Meeting Warrant contains an article which will pose the question of whether Boscawen desires to become a member of a regional planning agency composed of several neighboring municipalities. Such an agency offers future help in economic development and municipal services. But of immediate importance is the fact that in order to receive Federal grant funds for sewage disposal, a town is required to participate in a regional plan. The purpose is to assure that grant funds will not be used to construct single systems when joint use by two towns would be more economical. Any money spent by the Town on planning would be extremely small when compared with the cost of a sewerage system.

Copies of the General Plan are in the hands of town officials, community organizations, and the two libraries.
