You are hereby notified to meet at the Colebrook School Gymnasium in said Town of Colebrook on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at 6:00 in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- To bring in your ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.

Amendment 1. To remove article IV, 6, A. sentence-The permit application fee shall be ten dollars for single family, residential structures and twenty five dollars for multi-family, commercial, and industrial structures.

To replace article IV, 6, A. sentence-The permit application fee shall be as set forth in the Colebrook Planning Board fee schedule.

DUTIES OF THE TOWN MANAGER RSA 37:6

POWERS AND DUTIES IN PARTICULAR. THE TOWN MANAGER SHALL HAVE THE POWER AND IT SHALL BE HIS\HER DUTY:

- TO ORGANIZE, CONTINUE, OR DISCONTINUE, FROM TIME TO TIME, SUCH DEPARTMENTS AS THE SELECTMEN MAY FROM TIME TO TIME DETERMINE.
- II. TO APPOINT, UPON MERIT AND FITNESS ALONE, AND TO REMOVE, ALL SUBORDINATE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES UNDER HIS/HER CONTROL, AND TO FIX THEIR COMPENSATION.
- III. TO ATTEND SUCH REGULAR OR SPECIAL MEETINGS OF THE
- IV. TO KEEP FULL AND COMPLETE RECORDS OF THE DOINGS OF HIS\MER OFFICE, AND TO RENDER TO THE SELECTMEN AN ITEMIZED MONTHLY REPORT IN WRITING, SHOWING IN DETAIL THE RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS FOR THE PRECEDING MONTH AND ANNUALLY, OR OFTENER AT THE REQUEST OF THE SELECTMEN, TO MAKE A SYNOPSIS OF ALL REPORTS FOR PUBLICATION.
- TO KEEP THE SELECTMEN FULLY ADVISED AS TO THE NEEDS OF THE TOWN, WITHIN THE SCOPE OF HIS\HER DUTIES, AND TO FURNISH THEM ON OR BEFORE THE THIRTY FIRST DAY OF JANUARY OF EACH YEAR A CAREFUL, DETAILED ESTIMATE IN WRITING OF THE PROBABLE EXPENDITURES OF THE TOWN GOVERNMENT FOR THE ENSUING FISCAL YEAR, STATING THE AMOUNT REQUIRED TO MEET THE INTEREST ON MATURING BONDS AND NOTES OR OTHER OUTSTANDING INDEBTEDNESS OF THE TOWN, AND SHOWING SPECIFICALLY THE AMOUNT NECESSARY TO BE PROVIDED FOR EACH FUND AND DEPARTMENT; AND TO SUBMIT AT THE SAME TIME AN ESTIMATE IN WRITING OF THE AMOUNT OF INCOME FROM ALL SOURCES OF REVENUE, EXCLUSIVE OF TAXES UPON PROPERTY, AND OF THE PROBABLE REQUIRED TO BE LEVIED AND RAISED BY TAXATION TO DEFRAY ALL EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE TOWN. FOR THE PURPOSE OF ENABLING THE TOWN MANAGER TO MAKE UP THE ANNUAL ESTIMATE OF EXPENDITURES, ALL BOARDS, OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES OF THE TOWN SHALL, UPON HIS\HER WRITTEN REQUEST, FURNISH ALL INFORMATION IN THEIR POSSESSION AND SUBMIT TO HIM/HER IN WRITING A DETAILED ESTIMATE OF THE APPROPRIATIONS REQUIRED FOR THE EFFICIENT AND PROPER CONDUCT OF THEIR RESPECTIVE DEPARTMENTS DURING THE FISCAL YEAR.

TO EXAMINE OR CAUSE TO BE EXAMINED, WITH OR WITHOUT NOTICE, THE AFFAIRS OF ANY DEPARTMENT UNDER HIS\HER CONTROL, OR THE CONDUCT OF ANY OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE THEREOF; AND FOR THAT PURPOSE HE\SHE SHALL HAVE ACCESS TO ALL TOWN BOOKS AND PAPERS, FOR THE INFORMATION NECESSARY FOR THE PROPER PERFORMANCE OF HIS\HER DUTIES.
- VII. TO HAVE CHARGE, CONTROL, AND SUPERVISION, SUBJECT TO DIRECTION OF THE SELECTMEN AND TO THE BY-LAWS OF THE TOWN, IF ANY, OF THE FOLLOWING MATTERS:
 - (a) THE MANAGEMENT OF MUNICIPAL WATER WORKS, LIGHTING AND POWER SYSTEMS.
 - (b) THE CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, AND REPAIRING OF ALL TOWN BUILDINGS AND OF ALL TOWN ROADS, HIGHWAYS, SIDEWALKS, AND BRIDGES, EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE SPECIALLY VOTED BY THE TOWN.
 - (c) THE PURCHASE OF ALL SUPPLIES FOR THE TOWN.
 - (d) THE POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS OF THE TOWN, IF ANY.
 - (e) THE SYSTEM OF SEWERS AND DRAINAGE, IF ANY.
 - (f) THE LIGHTING OF STREETS, HIGHWAYS, AND BRIDGES.
 - (g) THE SPRINKLING OF STREETS AND HIGHWAYS, THE LAYING OF DUST AND THE REMOVAL OF SNOW.
 - (h) THE MAINTENANCE OF PARKS, COMMONS AND PLAYGROUNDS.
 - (i) THE CARE OF CEMETERIES.
 - (j) THE LETTERING, MAKING AND PERFORMANCE OF ALL CONTRACT FOR WORK DONE FOR THE TOWN.

IN MUNICIPALITIES ADOPTING THE PROVISIONS HEREOF, THE TOWN MANAGER SHALL SUPERSEDE ANY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OR OTHER SUPERVISORY OFFICER OR OFFICERS PREVIOUSLY ESTABLISHED, ELECTED OR APPOINTED TO HAVE SUPERINTENDENCE OF ANY OF THE MATTERS SPECIFIED IN THE FOREGOING PARAGRAPHS (a) TO (j) INCLUSIVE; EXCEPT THAT HE\SHE SHALL NOT SUPERSEDE, NOR SHALL ADOPTION OF THIS CHAPTER IN ANY WAY IMPAIR THE AUTHORITY AND DUTIES OF, FIRE ENGINEERS, THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HISHWAYS AND HIS ASSISTANTS, OR ANY POLICE COMMISSION CREATED BY ACT OF LEGISLATURE.

- VIII.TO ADMINISTER THE POOR RELIEF OF THE TOWN, EITHER DIRECTLY OR THROUGH A PERSON OR PERSONS APPOINTED BY HIM/HER AND UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE SELECTMEN.
- IX. TO PERFORM SUCH OTHER DUTIES, CONSISTENT WITH HIS\HER OFFICE, AS MAY BE REQUIRED OF HIM\HER BY VOTE OF THE SELECTMEN.

RSA 37:7

APPROVAL OF VOUCHERS: THE TOWN MANAGER MAY APPROVE VOUCHERS FOR OBLIGATIONS INCURRED BY ANY DEPARTMENT OF WHICH HE\SHE HAS SUPERVISION, AND, EXCEPT DURING HIS\HER ABSENCE OR DISABILITY, THE SELECTMEN SHALL NOT DRAW ORDERS FOR THE PAYMENT OF SUCH OBLIGATIONS WITHOUT SUCH APPROVAL. THE SELECTMEN MAY THEMSELVES APPROVE SUCH VOUCHERS, OR AUTHORIZE THEIR APPROVAL BY SOME OTHER PERSON, IN THE EVENT OF THE ABSENCE OR DISABILITY OF THE TOWN MANAGER.

REPORT OF THE TOWN MANAGER

THE ECONOMIC TIMES HAVE BEEN HARD ON COLEBROOK AS IN OTHER AREAS OF THE COUNTRY. THE CLOSING OF BOSE WAS A REAL TRAGEDY FOR US. THERE IS A COMMITTEE OF SEVERAL CONCERNED INDIVIDUALS IN THE AREA THAT ARE SEARCHING FOR INDUSTRY AND I SINCERELY HOPE THEY WILL BE SUCCESSFUL AS COLEBROOK NEEDS INDUSTRY.

THIS YEAR WE WERE INFORMED THAT OUR LANDFILL WILL FACE CLOSURE EARLIER THEN WE HAD ANTICIPATED. FURTHER MONITORING WELLS WILL HAVE TO DE DRILLED AND SAMPLES TAKEN QUARTERLY DUE TO HIGH CONCENTRATIONS OF VOC*S, OCTOBER 3, 1993 IS THE DEADLINE CLOSURE DATE BEFORE MORE RIDGED ENFORCEMENT FOR CLOSURES ARE IMPOSED BY THE EPA, SEVERAL OPTIONS ARE BEING CONSIDERED AND A TRANSFER STATION IS ONE OF OUR SOLUTIONS.

ANOTHER AREA THAT A GREAT DEAL OF TIME HAS BEEN SPENT IS A SECONDARY SOURCE OF WATER FOR COLEBROOK, AT PRESENT WE ONLY HAVE ONE WELL IN THE MUNICIPAL PARKING LOT AND IF THIS FAILED OR BECAME CONTAMINATED WE WOULD HAVE TO USE THE RESERVOIR UNTIL IT BECAME EMPTY THEN THERE WOULD BE NO WATER SUPPLY AND THIS WOULD EFFECT ALL AREAS SUCH AS SCHOOLS, HOSPITAL AND OTHER ESSENTIAL AREAS.

THE FABRIC ROAD PROJECTS WERE CONTINUED THIS YEAR, INCLUDED WERE SECTIONS OF EAST COLEBROOK, TITUS HILL, PIPER HILL, STEVENS/BELOIN AND FISH HATCHERY ROADS. AT THIS TIME I WISH TO EXPRESS MY APPRECIATION TO DR. AND MRS. BRUCE KATZ FOR THEIR COOPERATION AND PATIENCE WHEN THE FISH HATCHERY PROJECT WAS UNDER CONSTRUCTION.

A NEW EJECTOR PIT WAS INSTALLED ON COOPER HILL AT THE END OF EDWARDS STREET. THE COMPLETE COST OF \$19,800.00 WAS TAKEN CARE OF UNDER FUNDS RAISED IN THIS YEARS BUDGET FIGURES AND RATES. USERS AND TAXPAYERS WERE NOT IMPOSED WITH AN INCREASE OF RATES OR TAXES FROM 1991 OR 1992.

THE AUDITORS HAD A FEW RECOMMENDATIONS WHICH HAVE BEEN ADDRESSED.

- A) EACH DOCUMENT HAS BEEN EFFECTIVELY CANCELED.
- B) WATER DEPARTMENT CUSTOMER DEPOSITS HAVE BEEN PLACED IN THE METER FUND SAVINGS ACCOUNT FOR THE FUTURE PURCHASE OF METERS.
- C) AN EMPLOYEES PERSONNEL MANUAL HAS BEEN ADOPTED BY THE BOARD AND THERE HAS BEEN A POLICY REGARDING ALL VACATION AND SICK PAY INCLUDED IN THE SAME.
- D) SEPERATE WARRANTS FOR THE ADDED TAXES ARE DRAWN AND INSERTED IN THE WARRANT BOOKS AFTER THE ORIGINAL WARRANTS.

E) THE CREDIT BALANCE ON THE YEAR END PROPERTY TAX RECEIVABLE LISTS COULD NOT BE ELIMINATED BECAUSE OF OUR COMPUTER PROGRAM.

WELFARE GUIDELINES AND A WORKFARE PROGRAM WERE ADOPTED BY THE TOWN. THROUGH THESE GUIDELINES PEOPLE ELIGIBLE ARE COVERED, BUT MUST WORK FOR THE AMOUNT OF MONIES REQUESTED. NEW GUIDELINES WILL NOW ALLOW THE TOWN TO PLACE AUTHORIZED MONIES ONTO DELINQUENT TAX, WATER OR SEWER ACCOUNTS ONCE THE INDIVIDUAL REQUESTING ASSISTANCE HAS COMPLIED WITH THE GUIDELINES. OUR BUDGET FOR 1993 WAS \$30,800.00 OUR EXPENDITURES WERE \$5,656.87 A SAVINGS OF \$24,343.13. LAST YEAR BEFORE THESE POLICIES WERE IMPLEMENTED OUR EXPENDITURES WERE \$23,258.53.

IN CLOSING MAY I EXPRESS MY APPRECIATION TO THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN FOR THEIR CONTINUED LEADERSHIP, TOWN OFFICERS, DEPARTMENT HEADS AND EMPLOYEES FOR THEIR DEDICATED SERVICES AND THE CITIZENS FOR THEIR COOPERATION.

IN PLANNING AND PERFORMING OUR AUDIT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OF THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK, NEW HAMPSHIRE FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1991 WE CONSIDERED THE TOWN'S INTERNAL CONTROL STRUCTURE TO DETERMINE OUR AUDITING PROCEDURES FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXPRESSING AN OPINION ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND NOT TO PROVIDE ASSURANCE OF THE INTERNAL CONTROL STRUCTURE.

HOWEVER, DURING OUR AUDIT WE BECAME AWARE OF SEVERAL MATTERS THAT ARE OPPORTUNITIES FOR STRENGTHENING INTERNAL CONTROLS AND OPERATING EFFICIENCY. THIS LETTER DOES NOT AFFECT OUR REPORT DATED JUNE 2, 1992 ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OF THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK, NEW HAMPSHIRE.

OUR FOLLOWING REMARKS ARE BEING MADE IN THE HOPE THAT THEY WILL IMPROVE EXISTING PROCEDURES AND ARE IN NO WAY A CRITICISM OF TOWN PERSONNEL.

SEPARATE WARRANT FOR ADDED TAXES
 ADDED TAXES WERE INCLUDED IN THE ORIGINAL WARRANTS.

RECOMMENDATION

ADDED TAXES SHOULD NOT BE ENTERED ON THE ORIGINAL WARRANT LIST. ADDED TAXES SHOULD BE INSERTED IN THE WARRANT BOOKS AFTER THE ORIGINAL WARRANTS.

CREDIT BALANCE ON THE YEAR END PROPERTY TAX RECEIVABLE LISTS
THE TOWN'S YEAR-END ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE LIST SHOWS CREDIT
BALANCES FOR OVERPAYMENTS; THIS CAUSES A COMPLEX AND
INACCURATE TAX COLLECTOR'S REPORT.

RECOMMENDATION

THE TOWN CAN GENERATE A MORE ACCURATE TAX COLLECTOR REPORT BY ELIMINATING THE MATERIAL CREDIT BALANCES FROM THE PROPERTY TAX RECEIVABLE LIST.

3. CASH ACCOUNTS FOR LIBRARY FUND

THE LIBRARY FUND MAINTAINS SEVERAL CASH SAVINGS AND CHECKING ACCOUNTS WHICH REQUIRE A DUPLICATE BOOKKEEPING EFFORT.

RECOMMENDATION

EXCESS CASH ACCOUNTS SHOULD BE CONSOLIDATED INTO A COUPLE OF BANK ACCOUNTS TO ELIMINATE ADDITIONAL RECORD KEEPING.

WE EXTEND OUR THANKS TO THE OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK FOR THEIR ASSISTANCE DURING THE COURSE OF OUR AUDIT.

IT IS OUR OPINION THAT THE SELECTMEN, TOWN MANAGER AND STAFF ARE DOING AN EXCELLENT JOB ADMINISTERING THE TOWN OF COLEBROOK.

THE LIBRARY CONTINUES TO GROW....IN NUMBER OF BOOKS AND MATERIALS, IN THE SERVICES IT PROVIDES, IN CIRCULATION, AND IN THE NUMBER OF REGISTERED PATRONS. MANY PEOPLE HAVE EXPRESSED HOW FORTUNATE THIS COMMUNITY IS TO HAVE A LIBRARY OF THIS SIZE AND QUALITY.

WE ARE CONTINUING THE "READ TO ME" PROJECT STARTED WITH A GRANT FROM THE NORTHERN NEW HAMPSHIRE FOUNDATION. EVERY MOTHER WHO HAS A CHILD BORN AT THE UCV HOSPITAL RECEIVES A FREE PACKET FROM THE LIBRARY WHICH INCLUDES A BOOK, A T-SHIRT WHICH SAYS ON IT, "READ TO ME", A CERTIFICATE TO RECEIVE ANOTHER FREE BOOK WHEN THE CHILD IS OME YEAR OLD, AND A BROCHURE TELLING ABOUT BOOKS AVAILABLE AT THE LIBRARY FOR CHILDREN AND ON PARENTING. OUR LIBRARY WAS ONE OF FOUR IN THE STATE WHICH RECEIVED A \$50.00 PRIZE FOR AN INNOVATIVE PROGRAM TO PROMOTE READING.

SEVERAL KINDS OF PROGRAMS WERE OFFERED THIS PAST YEAR FOR ADULTS AND CHILDREN WHICH INCLUDE: PRESCHOOL STORY ACTIVITY HOURS. SUMMER READING PROGRAMS CHILDREN. 4 PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN TITLED "SAFE AT HOME". STORY TELLERS, THE LITTLE RED WAGON, "CONNECTIONS", A 4 SESSION LITERACY PROGRAM FOR THOSE HAVING DIFFICULTY READING. A PROGRAM ON DISADVANTAGED CHILDREN. SCHOOL ART EXHIBIT, COOS COUNTY EXTENSION COUNCIL MEETINGS. ESTATE PLANNING. NUTRITION BY SUZANNE HOLT, A N. H. RURAL ARTS INFORMATIONAL MEETING, A QUILT DISPLAY DURING THE MOOSE FESTIVAL, VOICES BY THE SOCIETY FOR THE PROTECTION OF N. H. FORESTS, DEALING WITH DIFFICULT PEOPLE BY SAM HISTORY OF HERBS BY INGRID GRAFF, "CELEBRATION OF CHILDREN" WITH STORY TELLERS, MUSIC, AND AN ART DISPLAY ORGANIZED BY CINDY KITTRIDGE. ON JULY 3 WE HAD A STORY TELLER FOR CHILDREN AND A BOOK, CRAFT, AND FOOD SALE AND FLEA MARKET. WE RECEIVED ABOUT \$1.300.00 WHICH WAS USED MOSTLY FOR BOOKS. VOLUNTEERS HAVE HELPED WITH MANY OF THESE PROGRAMS. DOMATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE TO THE LIBRARY AND SOME OF THESE WERE GIVEN IN MEMORY OF LOVED ONES.

WE CANNOT POSSIBLY PROVIDE ALL THE BOOKS AND MATERIALS
PEOPLE NEED. INTERLIBRARY LOAN HAS HELPED AND HAS
INCREASED AS MORE PEOPLE ARE BECOMING AWARE OF THIS
SERVICE. E-MAIL AND THE VAN SERVICE PROVIDED BY THE NEW
HAMPSHIRE STATE LIBRARY HAS EXPEDITED THE LENGTH OF TIME
WE RECEIVE MATERIALS FROM OTHER LIBRARIES. THE NEW
HAMPSHIRE STATE LIBRARY HAS AM 800 REFERENCE NUMBER FOR
LIBRARIES WHICH HELPS US AMSWER MOST REFERENCE QUESTIONS
WE CANNOT FIND, AND THEY PROVIDE US WITH MANY OTHER
USEFUL SERVICES.

THE LIBRARY RECEIVED A MATCHING GRANT TOWARDS A COMPUTER AND PRINTER AND THEY WILL BE PURCHASED SOON. WE HAVE APPLIED FOR A LITERACY GRANT AND A MATCHING FUNDS GRANT TO HELP FINISH THE BASEMENT OF THE NEW LIBRARY.

THE BASEMENT OF THE ORIGINAL LIBRARY (FORMERLY THE CHILDREN'S ROOM) IS NOW BEING USED BY THE ADULT TUTORIAL PROGRAM. OTHER LIBRARIES IN THE MORTH COUNTRY HAVE PROVIDED SPACE FOR THE ATP, BUT WE ARE THE ONLY ONE TO PROVIDE A ROOM. COMSEQUENTLY, MORE PEOPLE ARE GETTING THEIR GEDS. BESIDES EDNA BERUCHENIN, ATP VISTA LEADER FOR THE MORTHERN AREA, TIMA FERGUSON FROM THE MORTH COUNTRY EDUCATION FOUNDATION IN GORHAM, AND SEVERAL TUTORS HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH PEOPLE IN THIS AREA. CLAIRE OWEM IS DOING THE TESTING. SINCE SEPTEMBER, 20 PEOPLE HAVE RECEIVED THEIR GEDS AND SOME OF THESE PEOPLE ARE CONTINUING THEIR EDUCATION. THERE IS A GREAT OPPORTUNITY HERE TO FURTHER THE EDUCATION OF THE 23% OF THE POPULATION OVER 18 IN THE MORTH COUNTRY WHO DO NOT HAVE THEIR HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA.

THE LOVERING MOUNTAIN ARTS ASSOCIATION WAS FORMED THROUGH THE LIBRARY THIS PAST YEAR AND NOW MEETS AT THE LIBRARY THE SECOND TUESDAY OF EACH MONTH. THEY HAVE SHOWN A GREAT WILLINGNESS TO HELP THE LIBRARY WITH THE \$1,000.00 GRANT THEY RECEIVED FROM THE NEW HAMPSHIRE RURAL ARTS. THEY PLAN TO SHEETROCK ONE WALL OF THE BASEMENT AND WITH THE HELP OF THE KIWANIS, MAKE A STAGE. THIS ROOM WILL BE USED FOR LARGE PROGRAMS. THE LMA WILL BE A GREAT COMMUNITY RESOURCE BECAUSE OF THE MANY AND

VARIED ARTS AND CRAFTS PEOPLE IN THIS AREA. AT CHRISTMAS
TIME THEY HELPED WITH THE "CELEBRATION OF CHILDREN" AND
PRESENTED A NATIVITY PAGEANT AT THE GYM.

THE COLEBROOK AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY MEETS AT THE LIBRARY THE SECOND THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH. THE COLEBROOK GARDEN CLUB MEETS THE FIRST MONDAY OF EACH MONTH AND HOLD SOME OF THEIR MEETINGS AT THE LIBRARY.

SOMEONE FROM "DOWN UNDER" CAME INTO THE LIBRARY ONCE AND ASKED IN A DEROGATORY MANNER, "WHAT DO YOU DO AROUND HERE FOR ENTERTAINMENT?" NO, COLEBROOK DOES NOT HAVE FANCY NIGHTCLUBS, THEATERS, OR MUSEUMS, BUT HE DO HAVE CARING PEOPLE WHO ARE INVOLVED WITH THE COMMUNITY IN VARIOUS WAYS AND WHO PROVIDE SERVICES AND ENTERTAINMENT FOR THE PEOPLE IN THIS AREA. THERE IS THE LIBRARY AND THE SCHOOLS WHO PROVIDE ALL KINDS OF SERVICES AND PROGRAMS, THE LOVERING MOUNTAIN ARTS ASSOCIATION TO PROVIDE ARTS. CRAFTS. AND CULTURAL PROGRAMS. COLEBROOK AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY TO PRESERVE HERITAGE AND PRESENT HISTORICAL PROGRAMS, THE COLEBROOK GARDEN CLUB FOR RECREATIONAL AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS. AND THE ADULT TUTORIAL PROGRAM TO PROMOTE LITERACY. THERE ARE MANY OTHER ORGANIZATIONS AND SELE-HELD GROUPS SUCH AS THE KIWANIS AND CHURCHES AND CHURCH GROUPS. WHICH WORK TO IMPROVE THE LIVES OF THE PEOPLE IN THIS AREA. WORKING TOGETHER WE CAN PROVIDE FOR THE EDUCATIONAL, INFORMATIONAL, CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL, AND SPIRITUAL NEEDS FOR THE PEOPLE OF THIS COMMUNITY.

THE STAFF, TRUSTEES, AND I WOULD LIKE TO THANK THE PATRONS AND FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY, VOLUNTEERS, AND TOWN OFFICIALS FOR THEIR SUPPORT. YOUR CONTINUED SUPPORT WILL IMSURE THAT THE COLEBROOK PUBLIC LIBRARY WILL CONTINUE TO GROW AND PROVIDE QUALITY SERVICE AND PROGRAMS FOR PEOPLE IN THE "NORTH COUNTRY".
