Looking west, up the hill from the Oval. The Coach and Four is just east of the present flagpole. Can you recognize the following?

On the left of the road

At the top of the picture — the former Town Hall situated where the Pillsbury house now stands, beside the old Common.

Just below the Town Hall — the United States Store, later the Appleton House Hotel, and later the Leffingwell House, on the site where the Ackermann-Burnett house now stands.

Bottom left — the Chamberlain house, a revolutionary dwelling, later made into two houses of which the present Lehmann house is one.

On the right of the road

At the top of the picture — the Unitarian Church, torn down after only 35 years - too cold up there - on the site of the present Kennelly house, facing the former Town Hall across the Common.

Below it — the brick Trinitarian Church, where the Tuttle house now stands. Below that — the present Yankee building

Below that — the Dublin Store — used to sell dry goods and had a soda fountain.

Bottom right — the present Norman Wight house, at the time of the picture run as an inn by the Chamberlain family and located where the present Community Church now stands. When the church was built, the Chamberlain inn had to move over.

ABSTRACT OF THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

held at the Dublin Consolidated School Dublin, N.H., Tuesday, March 4, 1975 C. Robertson Trowbridge, Moderator, presiding

Polls opened at 12:00 Noon to 7:00 p.m., as advertised.

7:30 p.m. - Meeting called to order. Motion carried to count ballots at end of business meeting. Motion carried to waive reading of Warrant Articles before proceeding.

Pledge of Allegiance led by Selectperson Lucille A. McDonald.

2:00 a.m. - Results announced. Oaths of office administered.

Findings of Articles follow in order.

Article 1. Officers Elected: Town Treasurer, 1 year, Nellie A. Crossley; Selectman, 1 year, Edward F. Whitney; Selectman, 3 years, Lucille A. McDonald; Highway Agent, 1 year, Gordon R. Knight; Trustee of Trust Funds, 3 years, Ralph Perkins, Jr.; Library Trustee, 3 years, P. Albert Rajaniemi; Water Commissioner, 3 years, William Gnade; Member Cemetery Committee, 3 years, Richard B. Scribner; Member Planning Board, 3 years, Gordon R. Knight; Member Planning Board, 5 years, Richard B. Schaal; Member Board of Adjustment, 5 years, Allan J. Fox; Members Conservation Commission, 3 years, Marsha M.W. Niemela and Barbara H. Schaal.

Article 2. Ballot Question - Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendments as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town Zoning Ordinance. Adopted with votes as follows:

Amendment No. 1; 152 Yes, 102 No Amendment No. 2; 193 Yes, 57 No. Amendment No. 3 ; 199 Yes, 33 No. Amendment No. 4; 151 Yes, 66 No. Amendment No. 5; 179 Yes, 48 No.

Article 3. Ballot Question - Do you approve of having two (2) sessions for the Annual Town Meeting in this town, the first session, for choice of town officers elected by an official ballot and other action required to be inserted on said official ballot, and the second session, on a date set by the Selectmen, for transaction of other business? Adopted. 202 Yes, 68 No.

Article 4. Officers Chosen: Measurer of Wood & Bark, Andrew Elder; Memorial Day Committee, Brian Barden, Robert Blanchette and Kenneth Clukay.

Article 5. Moved that the Reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees be

accepted as printed, except that in Detail 4, page 30, payment to the Community Church be corrected to read \$348.20. Carried.

Article 6. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Carried.

Article 7. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any Real Estate acquired by tax deed. Carried.

Article 8. Moved that the Town accept certain Trust Funds, as follows:

1. Ruth Brening Memorial Fund in the amount of \$600. The income of this fund is to be administered by the Town of Dublin Fire Company for the benefit of the children at the Dublin Consolidated School.

2. A contribution to the Ruth Brening Memorial Fund in the amount of \$100 from Fred C. Brening.

3. For Perpetual Care of Cemetery Lots

Brening Lot \$100

Ivanov-Rinov Lot 200

Amendment to the Motion moved to include under Section 3

Henry Allison Lot \$200

Motion carried as amended.

Article 9. Moved that the Town accept the Budget as printed on pages 15,16, and 17 of the 1974 Annual Report, and raise and appropriate the necessary sums therefor.

Motion amended to increase Budget Item for Planning & Zoning from \$1,000 to \$1,400. Carried.

Motion amended to increase Selectmen's salaries to \$600 per year each, thereby increasing Budget Item from \$5,300 to \$5,610. Carried.

Motion amended to decrease Budget Item Advertising and Regional Associations from \$691 to \$300. Failed.

Budget, as amended, increasing total amount by \$710, carried.

Article 10. Moved that the Town discontinue, subject to gates and bars, the present Old Common Road from its point of junction with Old Pound Road to the easterly boundary of property owned by Charlotte Young (Map 15, Lot 14), in accordance with R.S.A. 238:2, and that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$650 for the construction of suitable gates to bar the discontinued portion of the road. Carried.

Article 11. Moved that the Town adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law in accordance with Chapter 32 of the R.S.A., and that the Moderator be authorized to appoint six (6) Members-at-large, and that the Selectmen shall designate one Selectman, to constitute a seven (7) member Budget Committee to serve until the 1976 Annual Meeting. At that Annual Meeting six (6) Members-at-large shall be elected by ballot, two for one year terms, two for two year terms, and two for three year terms. Thereafter, as terms expire Members-at-large shall be elected by ballot at succeeding Annual Meetings for three year terms. The member designated by the Selectmen shall hold office for one year and until a successor is designated.

Motion amended to have the Budget Committee appointed instead of elected, failed.

Original Motion carried by Yes - No ballot. 88 Yes 48 No.

Article 12. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$675 for the purchase of five (5) Tone Control Monitors for the Fire Department. Carried.

Article 13. Moved that the Town accept a 1952 Military Dodge Powerwagon from the Dublin Fire Company for use in brush and forest fire fighting. Carried.

Article 14. Moved that the Town donate the 1932 Ford firetruck and related equipment to the Dublin Fire Company. This vehicle will eventually be restored at the expense of the Fire Company, and used as a parade vehicle and kept for its historic value, the registration and insurance expense to be the responsibility of the Fire Company. Carried.

Article 15. Moved that the Town continue the present full tax exemption on the assessed value of dormitories, dining rooms and kitchens of the Dublin School and the Dublin Christian Academy, in accordance with the provisions of R.S.A. 72:23 IV, until otherwise voted at a future Annual Meeting. Carried.

Article 16. Moved that the Town establish a Recreation Commission, the members of which shall be appointed by the Board of Selectmen and shall consist of five (5) members who must be residents of the Town of Dublin.

The Commission shall be charged with the control, development, management, operation, and maintenance of a system of public parks, forestry, and recreational areas and facilities, and shall be charged with the supervison and maintenance of playgrounds, play fields, bathing beaches, swimming pools, recreation centers, and other recreation and park areas and facilities. It shall have the power to expend any funds appropriated by Dublin for such purposes and any funds donated or bequeathed for recreation and - or park purposes by private individuals or organizations.

It shall be charged with the responsibility of providing an adequate and wholesome recreation program for all people of both sexes and all ages. It shall fulfill other responsibilities as specified in the New Hampshire R.S.A., Chapter 31:44 through 31:50A as amended. Carried.

Article 17. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,900 to establish and administer a recreation program for the residents of Dublin. Carried.

Article 18. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Heavy Highway Equipment account of the Capital Reserve the sum of \$3,000, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,800 through issuance

of long term notes to supplement the Capital Reserve funds withdrawn, for the purchase of a Chevrolet Series 65, 18,500 lb. truck with Howe-Coleman front wheel drive,9'x7' dump body, snow tires all around, reinforced L-type frame, power steering, and equipped with snow plow frame, high-lift wing and wing box, to replace the 1963 FWD truck, said FWD to be sold to the highest bidder and proceeds of sale to be used to reduce the amount to be raised.

Motion amended to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Heavy Highway Equipment account of the Capital Reserve the sum of \$3,000 for use in the rental of trucks for the Highway Department. Carried.

Original Motion failed by standing vote. 43 Yes 69 No.

Article 19. Moved that the Town accept the provisions of Sections 1 to 10 inclusive of Chapter 53 B, R.S.A. providing for the establishment of a Regional Refuse Disposal District, together with the towns of Harrisville, Marlborough, and Nelson, and the construction, maintenance, and operation of a Regional Refuse Disposal facility by said District, in accordance with the provisions of a proposed Agreement filed with the Selectmen.

Motion amended to pass over this Article and that discussion of its provisions, or of any other proposed action to be taken by the Town of Dublin to comply with legal requirements relative to the elimination of air pollution caused by burning dumps be taken up at a Special Town Meeting on Thursday, August 21, 1975 at 7:30 p.m. at the Town Hall. Carried.

Article 20. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Solid Waste Disposal account in the Capital Reserve such sums as are necessary to cover the costs of investigating methods of complying with the directions of the State of New Hampshire, Dept. of Health & Welfare, relative to the closing of burning dumps, up to the total on hand of \$13,672.17, no final plan to be adopted without vote of the Town. Carried.

Article 21. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to cover the costs of running a water pipe from the fire station water pump under Route 101, connecting to the Library and the Town Hall to replace the present source of supply.

Motion amended to raise and appropriate \$5,500 instead of \$1,000. Failed.

Original Motion failed.

It was explained that both the Library and the Town Hall presently are supplied water from the Community Church parsonage. The Church agreed to continue this supply for another year while alternate sources are investigated.

Article 22. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to cover the cost of installing two recirculating, flushing toilets in the Town

Hall and one in the Library, connected to a common holding tank, in order to provide an adequate sewage system for the two buildings. Carried.

It was explained that this type of toilet will require less water from the Parsonage supply.

Article 23. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Bicentennial Committee of five members, and that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 to cover its 1975 expenses. Carried.

Article 24. Moved that the Town appropriate the sum of \$300 to complete repairs on the 1952 Military Dodge Powerwagon, and authorize the Selectmen to withdraw that amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972. Carried.

Article 25. Moved that the Town authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund the balance available after other authorized withdrawals in 1975, for use as set-off against budgeted appropriations for Town Maintenance Summer and Town Maintenance Winter. Carried.

Article 26. Moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,000 to be placed in Capital Reserve, \$6,000 for Heavy Highway Equipment and \$3,000 for Fire Trucks.

Motion amended to raise \$13,000 for above purposes, \$10,000 for Heavy Highway Equipment and \$3,000 for Fire Trucks. Failed.

Original Motion carried.

Moved to reconsider Article 9, Town Budget, and raise the sum appropriated for Town Maintenance Winter from \$15,000 to \$18,000. Failed.

Meeting adjourned at 12:00 midnight for counting of ballots, to be resumed at 7:30 p.m. August 21, 1975 for discussion of Article 19 and any other special items.

ABSTRACT OF ADJOURNED TOWN MEETING Held at Town Hall, Dublin, N.H., Thursday, August 21, 1975

7:30 p.m. Meeting called to order by C. Robertson Trowbridge, Moderator presiding.

Notice of August 5, 1975 to Voters read, warning of reconvening of Adjourned March 4, 1975 Town Meeting, to act on ARTICLE 19 of the Warrant, passed over at the March Meeting, relative to joining a Regional Refuse Disposal District.

Article 19 and Motion to pass over read.

Mr. Krogman, Selectman, advised that the latest status of New Hampshire antipollution regulations with respect to burning dumps require: Townsover 2,500 population to eliminate open burning by 7-1-76. Towns under 2,500 population to eliminate open burning by 7-1-77. All towns must file plans with the N.H. Air Pollution Board by 7-1-76 showing how they expect to meet the State regulations.

Mr. Walker, Chairman of the Dublin Solid Waste Disposal Committee, explained progress to date, employment of a dump attendant, and ideas for future improvement. Discussion followed on what the State would require.

Mr. Whitney *Moved*: That the town vote not to join a regional refuse disposal district with the towns of Harrisville, Marlborough, and Nelson at this time.

That the employment of a dump attendant be continued until the March 1976 annual meeting with salary paid out of the capital reserve solid waste disposal account.

That the solid waste disposal committee be authorized to continue negotiations with the state authorities and submit a plan, or plans, to the town at the 1976 annual town meeting which will meet the necessary state regulations.

Carried.

General discussion followed on the necessity of a dog control ordinance, Leash Law, or limited Leash Law during deer season. It was the consensus that this subject be included in the Warrant for the March 1976 Annual Town Meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 9:30 p.m.

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate thirty-six thousand nine hundred dollars (\$36,900) for a new Highway Truck, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw eight thousand one hundred dollars (\$8,100) from the Heavy Highway Equipment account of the Capital Reserve for this purpose, and to raise the balance of twenty-eight thousand eight hundred dollars (\$28,800) through the issuance of a five year note, the 1976 principal payment to be five thousand seven hundred sixty dollars (\$5,760) and the 1976 estimated interest payment to be approximately one thousand two hundred ninety-six dollars (\$1,296), or take any other action relating thereto. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to be placed in Capital Reserve, six thousand dollars (\$6,000) for Heavy Highway Equipment, three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for Fire Trucks, and one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for Police Cruiser, or take any other action relating thereto.

Recommended by the Budget Committee

Article 13. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to defray Town charges and for other purposes mentioned in the Town Budget.

Article 14. To see if the Town will discontinue the former Oxbow Road, so called, discontinued Subject to Gates and Bars at the Town Meeting of March 10, 1970, from the point of its junction with the Upper Jaffrey Road at the present Jamgochian property, to its junction with the Page Road at the present Charles Johnson property, in accordance with RSA 238.1

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following Ordinance relative to control of dogs in the Town:

"Be it ordained by the Town of Dublin, under the provisions of New Hampshire RSA 1955, Chapter 466, as amended, that the following ordiance regulating dogs is hereby enacted:

As used in this Ordinance "dog" shall be intended to mean both male and female. "Owner" shall be indended to mean any person or persons, firm, association or corporation owning, keeping or harboring a dog.

A. Running at Large Prohibited

It shall be unlawful to permit any dog to run at large. "At large" shall be intended to mean off the premises of the owner or the keeper, and not under the control of the owner or a responsible person. It shall be unlawful for any female dog in heat to run at large or be off the premises of the owner or keeper.

B. Restraint of Dogs

Dogs while confined to the owner's premises shall be kept so in a humane and safe manner, having maximum freedom and in no way to permit undue hardship on the animal, with water always available.

C. Penalties

Any owner found violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a violation and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$10.00 for such offense, and shall be fined up to \$25.00 for each such offense thereafter.

This Ordinance shall take effect April 1, 1976."

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following Ordinance relative to overnight parking of motor vehicles in the Town:

"To better facilitate the removal of snow from Town roads, the following Ordinance is enacted:

A. No overnight parking of unattended motor vehicles is permitted on any and all roads within the Town of Dublin from November 1st to April 1st of each year.

B. Any vehicle in violation will be towed at owner's expense.

C. Any Dublin Police Officer or the Dublin Highway Agent has the authority to remove any vehicle in violation.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage."

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to change the method of selecting members of the Recreation Committee, from the present one year appointment by the Selectmen, to election by ballot at the Annual Town Meeting the first such election to be at the Annual Town Meeting of 1977. At that Annual Meeting five members shall be elected by ballot, two for three year terms, two for two year terms, and one for a one year term. Thereafter, as terms expire Recreation Committee Members shall be elected by ballot at succeeding Annual Town Meetings for three year terms.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following Ordinance relative to use of the Town Dump:

"To provide for the orderly use of the Dublin Dump by Dublin residents, the following Ordinance is enacted:

A. When Permitted

Dumping shall be permitted during hours posted only

B. Restricted Entry

The Dump shall be open only to Dublin residents and taxpayers with permit stickers, and to Commercial Haulers.

C. Permit Stickers

Permit Stickers shall be required of all residents and taxpayers using the Dump. Stickers may be obtained from the Tax Collector. The Stickers shall be affixed to the driver's side vent window or windshield. No charge shall be made for Stickers.

D. Commercial Haulers

Commercial Haulers may dump rubbish collected within the Town of Dublin only. Upon showing just cause, the Selectmen may suspend their right to use the dump.

E. Burning

There shall be positively no burning by any unauthorized persons at the dump site.

F. Shooting

No person shall discharge any firearm at the dump site. Positively no shooting is permitted.

G. Dump Attendant

Any person in the dump area for the purpose of dumping shall comply with orders or directions given by the Dump Attendant on duty. No refuse shall be dumped unless approved by the Dump Attendant.

H. Penalties

Trespassers will be prosecuted, and if convicted, shall be subject to a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the first offense, fifty dollars (\$50.00) if convicted of a second offense, and one hundred dollars (\$100) if convicted of any subsequent offense."

REPORT OF CONVAL SCHOOL BOARD REPRESENTATIVE

TOPICS:

- A) Life Education voluntary, not compulsory
- B) LKB study to save money
- C) Newsletter Personnel committee 4 times a year
- D) Dublin Consolidated new principal
- E) Reduction of staff
- F) Budget, prayer results

A comprehensive report of all the actions taken by the Conval School Board during 1975 would be too long to include in the town report. However, there are certain issues that have had an effect on each of us, and these can be summarized here.

LIFE EDUCATION:

A district wide Life Education program was instituted last September including grades one through twelve. Although I personally am opposed to the sex education portion of Life Education being taught by school personnel, from all that could be determined, a majority of the citizens of Dublin wanted this program provided it was voluntary. Because the original Life Education policy submitted to the Policy Committee by the Superintendent made the sex education portion mandatory, I worked to see that it was voluntary and that materials used would be of the highest quality. The final policy accepted by the board was indeed voluntary and totally different from the original. Parents are now notified in advance of a Life Education activity and may decide what they wish their children to participate in.

LKB: (A Long Island based computerized busing service)

A bus study was contracted last fall to more efficiently operate the transportation system for the district and thereby reduce the cost to the taxpayer. I opposed this study because, in my judgment, the service we have been receiving from the present contractors was and is excellent, and from all that I could determine, the bus study could work on paper but not necessarily in actual practice. The board voted to accept the contract with LKB, and since we have, it is my hope that we will in fact save money, but not at the expense of losing our current contractors or the outstanding service we have experienced up until now. Only time will tell.

NEWSLETTER:

The Personnel Committee, of which I am a member, has instituted a newsletter to be sent to every member of the Conval District four times each year. This letter is designed to provide you with information on what your schools are doing with your tax dollars, and to offer you an opportunity to make suggestions to the School Board. It is our hope that more can be done to open up communications between the taxpayer and the School Board.

DUBLIN CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL:

We were fortunate to have Richard Dunning take over as principal here in the elementary school in September. He has done a fine job, and the morale of the school is excellent. We have a fine staff and are working to maintain a high quality of education. The addition of a physical education program is planned for the coming year.

REDUCTION IN DCS STAFF FROM FIVE TO FOUR

From a questionnaire sent out to the town, it was clear that the vast majority of the community felt that the quality of education would be compromised with the reduction of the staff from five to four teachers. (In 1966 Dublin had about 100 students and six teachers with an 18-1 pupilteacher ratio.) We now have nearly tripled the educational costs and are being asked to accept a staff of four and a pupil-teacher ratio of 22-1 because the enrollment is projected to drop to 86 in September 1976. I have taken the following steps to remedy the situation. Because of the heavy load falling upon teaching principals in the small schools. I have asked the board to establish a new policy that would apply to all of the small elementary schools in the district, including Dublin. That policy would lower the minimum pupil-teacher ratio to 15-1 and allow a maximum of 20-1. It can be done with a minimum of added cost to the district. It would assure more stability in our small schools as they would not be so often subject to staff changes because a small class came through the school in a given year. There is general receptiveness by some members of the board, but a final decision has not been made. I will continue to work to keep the staffing level in Dublin at least as good as it was when we entered the Conval District.

QUESTIONNAIRE:

l have had a fairly good response to the questionnaire that was sent to all residents and taxpayers in the town. As of this writing the results of those who responded are as follows:

62% do not support an 8% increase in the school budget

66% do not support the reduction of the elementary school staff

80% support the state law allowing prayer and the pledge of allegiance in the elementary schools.

Many people took a great deal of time to detail their concerns and suggestions regarding our schools, and these responses have been very helpful.

For any board member to be effective there must be some means of continual dialogue with his constituents. It is my hope that we can continue to use whatever means at our disposal to keep communications open so that we may work together to build a school system that will truly provide a means of achieving the aspirations and dreams that we all have for our children.

REPORT OF SOLID WASTE COMMITTEE

The Solid Waste Committee has met on a regular basis, looking into ways and solutions to the dump's problem.

A dump attendant was employed to make sure that trash was put in the proper place near or over the embankment, instead of just anywhere. This has helped so much that the highway crew does not have to spend half the time pushing over and cleaning up as before. Also, with the attendant on duty, we have eliminated out-of-town rubbish, both from commercial haulers and non-residents just stopping by because it was convenient. This has cut down on the amount of trash and build-up of our dump.

We feel that at present Dublin can best be served by a land fill. To do this, the parcel of land in the rear of the present dump would take care of the town for 15 to 18 years, at present rate of growth. In order to do this we must comply with State law, so we have been negotiating with the State, digging test holes, pumping, checking water levels, and possible drainage of the area. Late in the fall the committee felt that this site would be a good one. We met with the selectmen and invited Senator Trowbridge to the meeting. We emerged from this meeting with a plan to take to Concord. Several members of the committee, two members of the Board of Selectmen and Mr. Trowbridge took the plan to Mr. Sweeney, who represents the State. He thought this might be feasible but would like two more test borings done. At this time we are waiting to have these borings made. If this site is approved there appears to be enough in the solid waste fund to prepare the new site and set it up for operation.

The Committee has also talked with several other towns about regional land fills and recycling programs.

In closing, the Committee feels, if approved, the Dublin site would be both economical and accessible to Dublin residents.

The Committee would like to thank Selectman Robert Krogman for his help in doing the drawing for this plan.

REPORT OF THE BICENTENNIAL COMMITTEE

The Dublin Bicentennial Committee was formed by the selectmen after the 1975 Town Meeting in order to formulate plans for Dublin to celebrate our country's birthday in a proper manner and to involve as many people in town in this celebration as possible. Our Committee was unfortunate in losing two of our very good members to sickness and accident, Mrs. Norman Ballou and Mrs. William Faulkner — Mrs. Faulkner, our chairman, worked with us for most of the year, and we hope to have her back with us as soon as health permits.

The Committee decided to break down the plans for the Bicentennial year into three sections, as follows: Honoring the Past, Celebrating the Present, and preparing Lasting Memorials for the Future. We will list these plans in this report to a greater degree than usual in order to inform the townspeople well in advance.

In honoring our past, we decided that the placing of brass grave markers on the graves of our Revolutionary Soldiers in the Dublin cemetery would make a fitting memorial. These will be placed on Memorial Day, 1976, with appropriate ceremony to be planned by the Memorial Day Committee working with the Bicentennial Committee. We will also include markers for the veterans of the French and Indian War, the War of 1812, and the Civil War. Meeting with members of the Cemetery Committee, we were in agreement that several of these old gravestones needed repairs, and that Committee will undertake to have the work done.

Last July, a special program was held in order to reactivate the Dublin Historical Society and assess the interest of the townspeople in this project. A program of Stephen Foster music was researched from old manuscripts and narrated by Elliott Allison. Local musicians played this concert, a meeting was held, and refreshments were served on the lawn of the Historical Society Building. The building was cleaned, and exhibits were refurbished for the occasion by members of the Committee and a group of young people from the town. As this building is an historic old school house, attended years ago by many of the older people in town, we were most distressed to see the condition it is in. Much needs to be done in order to save this building for future generations, inasmuch as it is also used to house many interesting relics from Dublin's past. We are applying for funds to the State Bicentennial Committee for the partial restoration of this building.

In order to involve our young people, we are planning an essay contest for the students of the Consolidated School, and, later in the spring, a poster contest is proposed.

Other plans to celebrate the birthday of our country are exhibits in the town library of old Dublin photos, an art exhibit of Dublin-based artists, an exhibit of Colonial furniture in conjunction with the Dublin Garden Club, and on-going exhibits in the Dublin Historical Society. This brings us to the 4th of July weekend. That weekend will begin with a Colonial Country Dance at the Town Hall on Friday, the 2nd sponsored by the Women's Club. On Saturday the 3rd, there will be a Dublin Home-Coming Day sponsored by the Recreation Committee. The day will include picnicking, a costume parade, old fashioned games led by the Youth Group, and a band concert, topped off by a grand fireworks display sponsored by the Dublin Lake Club. On Sunday, the 4th of July, we are planning a short church service, followed by the reading of the Declaration of Independence on the steps of the Community Church and the ringing of the church bells.

I would like to add that the cooperation of all town committees and organizations we have contacted, has been splendid, and with a spirit such as they have shown, we should be guaranteed a great Bicentennial Year for Dublin.

REPORT OF THE DUBLIN ADVISORY BOARD ON MARATHON HOUSE

In response to concern expressed by a number of residents of Dublin during the spring and summer of 1975. Marathon House invited six town residents to form an Advisory Board which would meet with members of the staff and residents of the House in order that the town would have a better idea as to the philosophy and practices of the House, and that the House would benefit from a better understanding of the concerns of its neighbors. The Board has met now on several occasions since August, and would like to present its findings to the Town through you, its selectmen.

Our report will not attempt to be an exhaustive study of conditions and procedures at Marathon House. The composition of the Board, the time available to us, and other factors make such a report unfeasible. We will concentrate instead on those aspects of Marathon House which we feel to be of most concern to the Town, and which the people at Marathon House would like to have clarified for the town:

a) Purpose and history of Marathon House in Dublin;

- b) Procedures now governing the admission of residents;
- c) Staff;
- d) Recommendations.

Our recommendations will suggest possible improvements in communication between the Town and the House.

History and Purpose

Marathon House had its origins in a movement that sought to apply some of the techniques found successful in other circumstances, such as the treatment of alcoholics, to the new and burgeoning problems in drug abuse this country experienced following World War II. It is basically a self-help community where people are afforded the chance to break free from the conditions which have rendered them incapable of dealing with life without the use of drugs. A person seeking treatment at such a center must face a radical change in both behavior and attitude. The methods employed, while extreme to the casual observer at times, are designed to make such a break with his past a more permanent and productive one for the resident by the time he has completed his stay at the House. The board is not in a position to offer an opinion as to the validity of the theory underlying the therapy at the House, nor on the efficacy and consistency with which the theory is put into practice. The Board concurs, however, that difficult problems often require drastic measures, and was pleased to learn that there have been a number of successes at Marathon House.

Admissions

The board examined the written procedures now in use in admitting new

residents to Marathon House, and found them to be in keeping with Federal guidelines. Moreover, Marathon House now specifically excludes people with a history involving crimes of violence, sexual offenses, arson, or genuine suicidal tendencies. The procedure for admission now involves interviews with the candidate outside and again within Marathon House, a physical examination of all previous psychiatric, psychological, and criminal records. The Board recognized that it would be impossible to avoid all incomplete or inaccurate records given the myriad of agencies that must be dealt with and the complexities posed by current legal standards of confidentiality. We recommend that Marathon House maintain the strongest vigilance, however, and inform their referral agencies of the importance of complete and candid records on their referrals.

The Board examined the nature of the arrangement between Marathon House and the Chief of Police of Dublin. We feel it inappropriate for the Chief to be required to pass judgment on who should and who should not be admitted to Marathon House. It is our recommendation that the State authority responsible for referrals within New Hampshire be made aware that the Police Chief's role should be advisory only. It is our feeling that the administrators at Marathon House should bear final responsibility for the admission of residents to the program at Marathon House. However, we also urge that the Police Chief be kept informed of the records of all final candidates to the program, and that should someone leave the program without permission the Chief be informed immediately as to the relevant information on that individual to the full extent permitted by State and Federal law. The Board supports the Governor's directive giving the Chief the right to veto individual candidates for acceptance to Marathon House.

The Board notes that these laws limit the kind of information that can be released about a resident of Marathon House, especially a juvenile resident, and respects the concern these laws demonstrate for the rights of the individual. Where such information would be of assistance in protecting the safety of persons and property of residents of Dublin and surrounding towns, however, we urge that such information be made available to the Police to the fullest degree consistent with the law.

Staff

The Committee is favorably impressed with the quality of the staff and their dedication. The machinery of academia has not yet caught up with the kind of training required for dealing with such problems, and necessarily the staff have limited formal education in their trade. On-the-job experience seems much more appropriate, however, and here the staff seems adequately prepared. The staff maintains 24 hour supervision of the residents of the program, but since the facility is not enclosed or secure, it is impossible to require the staff to eliminate the possibility of walk-aways. It is the Staff's policy to notify the Chief of Police as soon as possible when someone does "split."

Recommendations

The Board is aware and approves of Marathon House's heightened efforts to keep the town and its officials better informed of its program and day to day activities. We join with members of the Marathon House in giving priority to improving the exchange of information and opinion between the town and the House, and would urge the Selectmen give serious consideration to creating a permanent committee to carry on the work of this ad hoc committee, though in a inevitably altered format. There is considerable merit to the possibility of having a member of the Marathon House Board of Directors an appointee of the Selectmen or elected by the Board from residents of the Town.

This department is not always busy making arrests, stopping fights, shooting it out with robbers, or rescuing maidens in distress. We do, however, handle and solve many difficult assignments. Our work requires an officer to have an even temperament, tolerance, and understanding. An officer present and seen in a community such as ours actually helps to keep the peace and protects life and property. Hopefully, the criminal will seek a soft and unprotected area.

Our community this past year has not been exempt from the problems such as the County and the rest of the State have experienced. We have had 11 Burglaries and an Armed Robbery, several of which have been solved while the remainder are still being investigated by State and Local Police.

We presently have two cases pending action in the April Superior Court Term; one involving burglary and one theft, totaling 6 persons. We have also arrested and prosecuted 37 criminal cases in the Jaffrey District Court; 19 D.W.I., 3 Reckless Operation, 1 Operating Under Suspension, 1 disorderly Conduct, 1 Criminal Mischief, 7 Theft By Unauthorized Taking, 1 Arson, and 4 Criminal Trespass. Plus 22 Intoxication Classified as a violation.

The Police Department has also prosecuted over 215 Traffic Violators this year, including 101 Speeders, 30 Solid Line Violators, 8 Stop Sign, 2 Unregistered Vehicles, 2 Towing Improperly, 7 Operating Without License, 10 Uninspected Motor Vehicle, 4 Unreasonable Speed, and etc. We have also apprehended persons wanted by other Police Agencies.

On September 11th, Dublin had more Police in the community than ever in its history with the Presidential Visit. On this date, there were State Police, Secret Service Agents, and a contingency of 32 Local Municipal Police Officers.

We have had 56 traffic accidents this year, with eight involving bodily injury and I'm very sorry to report one fatality. Through the past year we have responded to a number of other emergencies including rescues on Mt. Monadnock, First Aid, Trespassers, lost dogs and cats, and a report that someone had stolen all of the water out of Dublin Lake. I would like to express my appreciation to my Officers, the Town and State Agencies, the numerous individuals, and Mr. & Mrs. Allison who have assisted the Department over the past 12 months.

REPORT OF DIRECTOR OF CIVIL DEFENSE

George E. McAvoy has replaced Maj. Gen. F.B. McSwiney as Director of New Hampshire Civil Defense Agency. E. George Moses continues in the position of Deputy Director.

A seminar for local officials in Civil Preparedness will be offered at the Center for Emergency Planning at the University of New Hampshire on 19 -21 March 1976. Free courses of instruction for Civil Defense personnel are scheduled at the University in January and September.

At the request of Dublin Highway Agent, formal application for a 6 x 6 truck or similar vehicle under the Surplus Property Program was prepared and forwarded to the Deputy Director. Justification for this vehicle includes the requirement to sand icy roads to permit the emergency evacuation of families in the event of a disaster. Similar applications for such a vehicle made by the previous Director were unsuccessful.

There has been no change in the Basic Emergency Operation Plan for Dublin.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

The usual plowing, sanding and snow removal was done through February. My first project, in March, was the removal of dead trees along the roads as well as ice and snow removal. As soon as the pot holes dried we spent several weeks putting out cold patch. We hauled crushed gravel to Old Marlborough Road, Mossey Road, Troy Road and Cherry Hill. After the mud season we cleaned leaves and shaped the roads for summer.

We spent two weeks on the Old Marlborough Road on culvert work. We relayed six culverts and replaced two. Two were relayed on Page Road, one on Wind Mill Hill Road and one on Snow Hill. There still remain seven culverts to be relayed and some to be replaced. This needs to be done this next year along with the cleaning of many others. The box culvert on Charcoal Road by the golf course needs to be replaced with a larger one. It is greatly deteriorated. The headers have fallen off and the under side is bad. This has been a problem in the past as the culvert is not large enough to take the water when we get heavy rains. The result is that the road washes out. (Twice last year).

During the summer we were busy repairing the washouts from the heavy rains. Portions of Parsons Road, Cobb Meadow Road and Old Troy Road were completely washed out and required a great deal of fill. In addition, the bridge abutment on Mountain Brook was washed out and had to be replaced.

Last Summer, the oiled roads had to be patched two more times. We spent a total of 21 days patching which is too much time. This is why I am recommending a program for the oiling of the roads. Some of the roads have not been oiled in 12 years and are greatly deteriorated. If not oiled soon they will revert back to dirt. There are 21.5 miles of oiled roads. The cost will be approximately \$43,000.00 to be done in a 4 year period. I am asking for \$11,000.00 in this year's budget and recommending \$11,000.00 each additional year so the ¹/₄ of the roads can be oiled each year.

On the Gold Mine Road, the reverse curve in front of the Coutu property was straightened out, the fill was put in place and the gravel base was layed, topped by crushed. The road was left to settle through the winter and in the Spring will be shaped, oiled and finished.

The Town Road Aid project was the widening of Wind Mill Hill Road. This has greatly improved the road and the hill. It should be oiled this year.

We had a late fall and were able to clean most of the leaves on the dirt roads and shape them for Winter. We also ditched Upper Jaffrey Rd. except the portion from Rte. 101 to Church St., Lake Road from 101 to the Outlet, Upper Harrisville Road and Valley Road, Church Street and the worst part of Charcoal Road. There is still ditching to be done on the remaining oiled roads. Also, brush must be cut on several roads, mainly Stone Pond and Page Roads. In early Spring, a survey was made to determine where road signs were needed. They arrived in August and were placed about. Unfortunately, shortly afterward several were removed and stolen. The glass was replaced on the old street lights and we also installed the guard rail in the parking area between the Town Hall and the Library.

During the first snow storm, the FWD broke down; the same old problem of the transfer case. It has not been fixed as it will cost more than the truck is worth and the parts are not available and would have to be ordered and made. On December 27, the engine in the 6 yr. old Chevrolet truck tired and we were without a truck for five days. We found a new engine, installed it and got the truck back in service for the next snow storm. There is a definite need for a new truck.

My thanks and appreciation to all the road crew and everyone that has been such a great help this year.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

The community was invited to a coffee hour following the Memorial Day services, to meet Miss Marcia McKenna of Dublin and Conway, and to view her exhibit of fascinating paintings, precisely framed. Over two hundred people visited the exhibit in June.

One of our patrons is enjoying the use of "talking books" supplied by a division of the State Library funded by state and federal money. It is a service for partially blind, blind, and the physically handicapped. It lends spoken word recordings of books and magazines, classical and country music. A patron may borrow up to eight articles at a time, plus both a talking machine and a cassette player, all postage free. If a machine breaks down a replacement is sent immediately. If you know anyone who is eligible, won't you please tell us or them about this service through our library?

The Office of Comprehensive Planning has reported Dublin's population at 1072. This is the census we must use in the Statewide Library Development Program to determine the hours we must stay open weekly. By approval of the trustees and without extra cost in wages, Beth Elder, my library aide, and I have reshuffled hours to keep open 17 hours, two of these days to include evening hours:

Monday 2:30 to 8 p.m Wednesday 10 to 12 p.m. and 2:30 to 8 p.m. Saturday 9 to 1 p.m.

I have approached numerous townspeople who were either born here or have lived here many years, to write sketches, or do a tape, to recapture the mood and the character of the town as they remember it. To date some of the most delightful and informative papers have been written by Mrs. Lilian Chapin, Mrs. Louise Kelly, Mr. Harold Clukay and Mr. Hildreth Allison. Others have promised to add to this collection. Will you be willing to write a sketch, do a tape, share pictures, post cards, or newspaper clippings to help with this living history?

I recommend that the dirt road which existed for years on town land behind the town hall and library be rebuilt as inexpensively as possible. There is a need for trucks to travel for service needs to the library on this route. Years ago all coal was brought into the library this way. I believe it is discriminatory to have events in the Gowing room and not have direct access to it for those who cannot do the stairs. The lower entrance is one step up from the ground, and is wide enough to accommodate a walker and a house wheelchair. Any library in the United States today using federal funds to help build it or renovate it, must consider the needs of the handicapped. Were we to create the Gowing room from the basement today instead of 1968 this would be mandatory, and rightly so.

Mr. Hildreth Allison of Washington, D.C. and Dublin, has compiled an

article called Service Records of the Veteran Soldiers of the American Revolution buried in the Dublin Cemetery. DUBLIN PLANNING BOARD 1975

Minor amendments to the Dublin Zoning Ordinance and Land Use Regulations were approved by ballot at the March 4th Town Meeting. During the year the Board approved four subdivisions and one scenic road improvement. The first application for a Discretionary Easement resulted in a tie vote. In October, Sharron Monaghan replaced former Chairman, Gordon Knight who resigned.

The Planning Board felt the need for action on a town plan because of recent State Land Use Legislation. We voted to use the services of the Monadnock Region Studies to expedite this information gathering effort which will be coordinated with input from local citizens. The data gathered will be used as a base for the town to develop its plan.

The Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission has again this year been extremely helpful to the Planning Board. Thomas P. Wright and Betty Woodward are Dublin's representatives and Tom is serving as Chairman of the Commission.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION REPORT - 1975

Seventeen meetings of the Commission were held in 1975, regularly scheduled for the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month. Selectmen Robert Krogman served as the Planning Board representative to the Commission. Visitors and guests on various occasions included the Recreation Committee, Ted Walski of N.H. Fish & Game, Ron King and Ashton Hallett of the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forest, Lucia Kittredge, planner for the Monadnock - Sunapee greenway trail, John Kulish of Hancock, Mr. Elliott Allison, Ken Fox and Dan Knight. Three special events took place to which the public was especially invited: February 13th on the benefits of preserving Mud Pond as a wildlife marsh; May 23rd, a film showing of "The Way of the Trout" and "The Flooding River"; August 14th on the Conservation Trust Program for property easements and restrictions. The annual roadside clean-up was held on Saturday, May 10th.

The cost of \$138.00 to send Dan Knight and Ken Fox to Spruce Pond nature camp for a week in June was underwritten by the Commission and the boys later reported in person on their experience in thoughtful detail. Gifts of a magazine subscription, "Ranger Rick" was made to the Dublin Consolidated School and of the National Audubon Society's magazine to the Dublin Public Library. A contribution of \$80.00, or \$5.00 per head, was made towards the amount needed to send Dublin 6th graders to Camp Union for ecology study during the fall. A second Newsletter was published and mailed to everyone in Dublin in April.

Throughout the year different members attended meetings and hearings on a variety of pertinent subjects as follows: The Planning Board, Zoning Board of Adjustments, Southwestern N.H. Regional Planning Commission, Water Supply and Polution Control Commission in Concord, proposed Walpole pulp mill, Sargent Camp Trails workshop, proposed changes to Windmill Hill Rd. (scenic) and the Beech Hill super sewage plant.

Included herewith is a report from Mrs. Peg French who diligently supervised the newspaper collection station until its unfortunate demise:

Because it was vandalized for a second time the paper shed behind the Dublin Community Church was regretfully closed. The proceeds from the sale of the bundled newspapers collected over the last 4 years has benefited the several Dublin groups who have loaded approximately 35 tons of paper on to trucks.

Although the price of paper for recycling fluctuates, the money from its sale is appreciated and recycled paper is used. A recent article points out that "in 1975 22 percent of all paper manufactured in the United States was of the recycled variety".

The Monadnock Workshop, High St., Peterborough, accepts paper which they shred and sell for packing. The Dump in West Swanzey has a recycling plant. The public at large is invited to use these facilities for clean paper (not trash), bottles and cans. It is open on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. So think before you throw out.

LISTING OF RESIDENT TAX PAYERS of the TOWN OF DUBLIN NEW HAMPSHIRE

Taxes Taken April 1, 1975

In 1971 the Legislature passed a "Resident" tax bill under which a \$10.00 "Resident Tax" replaced the former Poll Tax and Special Head Tax which had totaled \$7.00.

Under the new law (RSA 72 and 76, as amended by Chapter 476, laws of 1971), as amended, a tax of ten dollars (10.00), known as the "Resident Tax", shall be assessed on every individual, resident in the Town, who was at least eighteen years of age but not yet sixty-five years old as of April 1, 1975. Widows of veterans are exempt from this tax regardless of age. Veterans are not exempt.

Payment of this tax is due before registering a car or getting a fishing, hunting, or driver's license, unless the tax has been legally abated.


