

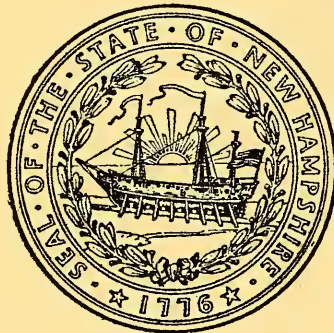

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Groton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Groton on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at three o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To chose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same in accordance with the budget herewith attached.
3. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount for prompt payment of taxes.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell or dispose of all snow removal equipment, including truck, and contract out snow removal.
6. To see if the Town will vote to continue plowing driveways.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the total appropriations for Selectmens' salary to \$700.00, \$300.00 of which shall be paid to Chairman, and \$200.00 per person other Selectmen.
8. To see if the Town will vote to put supervisors on \$30.00 a year salary.
9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of or administer any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.

10. To see if the Town will vote to use \$600 of the total highway appropriation to contract for tarring and sealing the unfinished portion of the Cheever Road.

Other Articles may be added before Warrant is posted.

PUBLIC HEALTH REPORT

The following is a report of the activities of the N. H. Department of Health, Bureau of Public Health Nursing, for the year January 1960 to January 1961.

Home visits were made in the town on mothers, babies and preschool age children and assistance and advice given as necessary.

The children and adults were welcome to attend a Salk Vaccine Clinic held at Bristol in January, 1960 and several took advantage of the opportunity to receive the Salk Vaccine protection against polio.

The Tuberculosis program is now covered by the Grafton County Nurse of the N. H. Department of Health in cooperation with the N. H. Tuberculosis Assoc. Chest X-Ray clinics are held in Plymouth three times a year and residents of Groton are welcome to attend. Following the clinic a report will be sent to the patient attending.

The nurse is glad to render services to the mothers and children in the town of Groton. Please feel free to contact her if she can be of help.

PREVENTION IS YOUR BUSINESS

This represents 5 percent of our nation's woodlands being wasted each year. Every fire takes its toll. Floods follow; stream flow is affected; timber, buildings, grazing and wildlife are destroyed - all because *many* are *careless* with fire in and near woodland. This can be remedied. *You* can put an end to this shameful waste! *Prevention is your business!*

You, whether *you* be a farmer, homemaker, business or professional man or woman, municipal, state or federal official, clerk or woodsman can play an important part in the continuing and vital prevention program.

First - by setting a good example *yourself*-being sensible and complying with the necessary laws and regulations governing the use of fire in and near woodlands.

Second - by using *your* individual influence in your community and valued council with others in insisting and encouraging them to do likewise.

1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden - the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning - don't leave it.
3. Make certain your fire, camp or debris, is *dead out* before leaving it.
4. Don't throw down lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes or from moving vehicles - make sure they are out - use your ash tray.
5. Don't burn at home - use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.
