TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the county of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday the fourteenth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects: The polls not to close before six P. M.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. (No recommendation necessary).

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. (Recommend approval of Budget as printed).

3. To see if the town wishes to change the hour of Town Meeting or take any other action relating thereto. (No recommendation necessary).

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate (seven hundred ninety eight dollars and fifty four cents) \$798.54 as our share of the T.R.A. program or take any other action relating thereto. (Recommend favorable action).

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to purchase new equipment for the highway department or take any other action relating thereto. (We recognize the need of new equipment, but not sufficient information is provided as to cost.)

6. To see if the town will vote to withdraw the fire hose reserve fund to purchase fire hose, and to withdraw the highway equipment reserve fund to purchase highway equipment or take any other action relating thereto. a. (Recommend favorable action). b. (Recommend favorable action if equipment is purchased).

7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate (two thousand dollars) \$2,000.00 for the highway equipment reserve and (one

thousand dollars) \$1,000.00 for the fire truck reserve funds or take any other action relating thereto. (Recommend favorable action).

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500.00 for trimming of, treatment of, or removal of trees on main street and the common or take any other action relating thereto. (Recommend favorable action).

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate (four hundred dollars) \$400.00 for Old Home Day or take any other action relating thereto. (Recommend favorable action).

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for a police radio for the Chief of Police or take any other action relating thereto. (Recommend \$250.00 be raised and appropriated).

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate (one thousand dollars) to fix the road in Hillside Cemetery or take any other action relating thereto. (Recommend \$250.00 be raised and appropriated).

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to rebuild the Mill Pond Dam or take any other action relating thereto. (Recommend appropriation of \$500.00).

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for extra street lights, at a cost of (twenty-five dollars and forty four cents) \$25.44 per light or take any other action relating thereto. (Recommend further study).

14. To see if the town wishes to recind the motion made at town meeting last year (Article No. 19), which was that the town raise and appropriate (two hundred seventy four dollars and fifty cents) \$274.50 each year for the town library or take any other action relating thereto. (Recommend the \$274.50 be paid by the Library Trustees.)

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate (one hundred fifty six dollars) \$156.00 for the Monadnock Region Association or take any other action relating thereto. (Recommend \$125.00 be raised and appropriated.)

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (five hundred dollars) \$500.00 to re-locate or remove the

fire hydrant on Old Dublin Road at the foot of Sheldon's drive, then widen Old Dublin Road at that point or take any other action relating thereto.

(Recommend favorable action).

17. To see if the town wishes to accept the proposed Dam on Priest Brook as designed by the State Engineers of the Fish and Game Dept. or take any other action relating thereto.

18. To see if the town will vote to adopt the names of the roads in Hancock as designated by the Fire Dept. and the Selectmen, or take any other action relating thereto.

19. To see what action the town wishes to take in regard to plowing driveways.

20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes or take any other action relating thereto.

21. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of 1% on property taxes if paid within 30 days after date of bill or take any other action relating thereto.

22. To see if the town will accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the town or take any other action relating thereto.

23. To hear the reports of auditors and committees heretofore chosen or take any other action relating thereto.

24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

HANCOCK 1960

Every decade census figures tell something about our Town that is reassuringly official. Al Dillon, whose daughter won a prize this year at the Manchester Art Festival, going from house to house, counted us at 722, up 110 from 1950. The gain includes a full share of children which bodes well for our future. There were 87 additional voters added to the check list.

As if revivified a little by this lowering of the age level a group of, let us say, mature citizens took to an ancient sport. Like as not Dr. Eustis and I. B. Hitchings would be up in front. Of a Saturday (with sandwiches in their pockets and some coffee awaiting their return) 15 to 30 followed old trails and wood roads, aided by near perfect snow conditions all the way from the 2nd of January to two weeks after Town Meeting.

The deep snow furnished an impressive backdrop for the many photos taken on the day we settle our Town affairs. The picture taking was professional: the results to be used abroad as an example of democracy in the U.S.A. Having foreign students with us is now almost a regular part of a Hancock Town Meeting. This being a presidential year preferential primaries were held. Senator English, as a Nixon delegate to the Chicago convention, headed the delegate poll in the second congressional district. Incidentally, the meeting-day photos which Karl Upton now has will probably later be turned over to the Historical Society.

Why shouldn't our next official history of the Town be pictorial?

It could include another current sport —jallopy racing on ice and it could feature pictures of Bud Wilder, Lloyd Thompson, Forest Weston, David Luster, Richard Hostetler, and Phil Avery. They have themselves a big time,mostly on Contoocook Lake in Jaffrey spraying up clouds of chain-chewed ice.

A pictorial history could also show some of the many new homes: the Norman Phelps', Howard and Daisy Chase's with its interesting stone chimney, and Bob and Anita Chace's with electronic devices, and there would be others newly built or substantially renovated within and without. It might also show some of our jet flying younger generation, Bill Bradley or Howard Weston, and might include missile-man, Bill Eva. In fact there would be a lot of things it could show that wouldn't be read if written in a bulging volume.

And some of the old high school photos could be added. Our attics must contain pictures which would record Hancock's appearance in the gay nineties, gatherings by the old band stand, Old Home Days over the years, snaps of World Wars I and II, as well as other varied facets of an active Town. Some current shots could be included like Hal Fuller being honored after many years as Administrator of the Monadnock Community Hospital.

For many years we have wound our way up the narrow inside steps in the vestry. This year the Guild, assisted by the Sewing Circle, did something about it. Tommy Manning and Eleanor Amidon report that Peter Garland drew the plans and Perley Dunbar did the work of improving the stairways.

Weatherwise it was a most satisfactory year, drawing to a close with a brilliant and extended color season, an unusually fine November, and early snows in December to help deer hunters like William Weston, Sr. and Roy Finan and to assure an extra white Christmas for everyone.

D. REPORT OF DISTRICT CLERK

Hancock School District Meeting March 5, 1960

At 4 p. m., March 5, 1960, the Annual School District Meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Robert English. After the reading of the warrant, a motion was passed to close the polls at 8 o'clock to permit consideration of the last five articles in the warrant. Voters then proceeded to cast their ballots for Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and a Member of the School Board for three years.

Mrs. Bessie Hanson, and Mrs. Alice M. Brown acted as ballot clerks.

At 8 p. m., the Moderator called the meeting to order and declared that the polls would remain open another 10 minutes to allow anyone who might have been delayed by poor driving conditions to vote.

The remaining Articles were discussed, voted upon as follows: Article 5. Motion by Otis H. Wilder.

I move that the salaries of the district officers for the ensuing year be as follows: Chairman of the school board \$75.00 each other member \$50.00, treasurer \$40.00, clerk \$15.00, moderator \$10.00, ballot clerks \$1.00 per hour each, auditors \$1.00 per hour each. The motion passed.

Article 6. Motion by Mrs. Mary Garland.

I move that the reports as printed be accepted and placed on file with the clerk. The motion passed.

Article 7. William Brown nominated Nelson Gay and Valentine W. Gerrish as Auditors. There being no further nominations, Mr. Gay and Mr. Gerrish were elected.

Article 8. Motion by Arthur Tremblay:

Moved that the school district raise and appropriate \$45,476. and to authorize and direct the school board to apply against said appropriation such income as is estimated by the school board exclusive of state aid, and upon the determination of the amount of state aid to be received by the school district during the next fiscal year, to authorize and direct the school board to apply against such appropriation the sum to be received from state aid and with the school district clerk certify to the selectmen the balance as an assessment to be raised by the town for school purposes.

Mr. Hitchings asked for information as to the per pupil cost of both the high and elementary schools. Mr. Foote explained that each high school pupil will pay, next year, \$399 which is the state average. He further stated that the Hancock elementary per pupil cost is about \$60 over the state average. The very commendable reason for this is that there are fewer pupils for each teacher. This motion passed.

Article 9. Motion by Otis H. Wilder.

I move that the school board be authorized to make application for and to accept on behalf of the district such sums of monies as may be made available under the National Defense Education Act, Public Law 85-864 (for purposes outlined under Titles III, V, and VIII thereof), and that the district appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for said purpose(s), \$200.00 of which amount shall be raised as an assessment by the town, and a like amount to be received from federal sources.

Mr. Cowan and Mr. Pickering asked for more information regarding this motion. Mr. Foote explained that if this money is needed it will be used for science equipment. The motion passed.

Mr. B. T. Manning, Jr., asked what the average raise for elementary school teachers is to be next year. It was explained that this could not be answered as the school board will not determine exact salaries until after the election today decides who the third member of the board is to be. The total raise in the estimated budget is about \$1,000.

The meeting recessed at 8:30 p. m. until the ballots were counted.

There were 205 ballots cast for Hancock School District officers with the following results:

For Moderator, Robert English, 115 votes.

For Clerk, Adella C. Eva, 198 votes.

For Treasurer, William Brown, 66 votes.

For School Board Member for 3 years: George Hampson, 103 votes; Otis H. Wilder, 100 votes. Mr. Hampson was declared elected.

After the moderator had administered the necessary oaths of office, the meeting was adjourned at 9:20 p. m.

SCHOOL WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Hancock qualified to vote in the district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 11th day of March, 1961 at 4:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years. 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subjects embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see what sum the district will raise and appropriate for the purposes outlined under Titles III, V, or VIII, or any combination thereof, of the National Defense Education Act, Public Law 85-864, and to authorize the school board to make application for, to accept on behalf of the district, and to apply against this appropriation any or all grants or other funds which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire under the provisions of the National Defense Education Act.

10. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate to meet certain unanticipated tuition charges for the current year, such funds to be made available to the Treasurer of the School District prior to June 15, 1961.

There were two changes in the teaching staff this year. Mr. Ernest O. Gendron replaced Mr. John Gallagher as principal and teacher of Grades 7 and 8 and Mr. Fosco Picchi replaced Mr. Ormsby Buck as Art Supervisor.

B. SCHOOL PROGRAM

School opened on September 7, 1960 with an enrollment of 89, a slight increase over the previous year. Mr. Ernest Gendron of Bristol, N. H., replaced Mr. John Gallagher as Teaching-Principal and Mr. Fosco Picchi replaced Mr. Ormsby Buck as Art Supervisor. The building was given its regular summer cleaning and minor repair and painting jobs were completed.

During the summer Mrs. Edna Howard and Mrs. Elizabeth Weston attended a three-week course in Spalding Phonics held at Jaffrey. In September Mrs. Edna Howard attended the New England Reading Association Conference at Manchester, Vermont. The work and study of these teachers has been of great value in implementing the current reading program in grades 1-6 based on the Spalding system of phonics.

The fifth and sixth grades with Mrs. Edna Howard spent the week of October 24-28, 1960 at Sargent Camp. The theme for this outdoor educational experience at the camp was "A Study of the Life in the Forest." This experience was again a success due to intensive pre-planning, community interest and cooperation, and follow-up discussions. Parents' Night at the camp found an excellent representation of the Hancock campers' parents and friends in attendance.

The annual Halloween Parade of the school children through the village was held as usual followed by parties in the various rooms. Open House was held at the school during National Education Week in cooperation with the Parent Teachers' Association. At this time appointments for parent-teacher conferences were made and pupil work was displayed. Interest and attendance at this program was gratifying.

Christmas was observed by all the town children at the Town Hall, sponsored by the Guild of the Hancock Congregational Church. Each room presented a playlet and carols were sung by the entire school. The orchestra and chorus of grades five through eight, directed by Mrs. Edna Howard, also performed separately.

Pupils of all grades make regular trips to the library where they are cordially received and assisted by Mrs. Richardson. The pupils have also taken advantage of the services of the N.H. State Library Bookmobile.

The testing program has progressed with grades one, three, and five being given the S.R.A. Intelligence tests in the fall. Grades seven and eight were given the Metropolitan Achievement and Pitner General Ability tests at this time. Achievement tests will again be administered in the spring. Some individual diagnostic testing has been done with the assistance and cooperation of Mr. Ronald Scott, Helping Teacher. The purposes behind the testing program are twofold,—first, to measure the group progress in each subject matter field, and, secondly, to measure the achievement of the pupils in terms of their aptitudes. The teachers and staff are giving proper consideration to these factors and are adjusting and adapting the individual pupil programs accordingly.

The form of the report card was changed throughout the union this year. This new card was explained at an early PTA meeting at which time the teachers were available to answer questions relating to this new form for reporting pupil progress and growth.

Under the National Defense Education Act the provisions of which provide matching funds for apparatus and equipment in science, mathematics, and foreign languages the school is experimenting with a television set. If results are satisfactory this will be used to supplement the present science and social studies program at the school. Under this act we have also acquired some needed science equipment.

Plans for the future include the further development of the reading program, concentrated efforts to up-grade science instruction, and the development of an in-school library.

PART VI. AUXILIARY ACTIVITIES AND SPECIAL REPORTS

A. HEALTH

During April and May of last spring a dental clinic, sponsored by the P.T.A., was held. Five families sent eight children, six of them attending twice, for a total of nine hours of dental work. I am most grateful, as are these families, for this care, and to the parents who helped with the transportation.

In June the school physician held the preschool clinic. Eight prospective first graders were examined and found to be ready for school in the fall. It is customary at this time to have these young pupils-to-be welcomed by the first-grade teacher and pupils. They are allowed to "color" and take home a bit of "school work." The youngsters are really impressed with school.

School opened September 7th with a total of 89 pupils.

The first health service was the weighing and measuring of all pupils. It was interesting to observe the reactions of the children to the increases in weights and heights found over the previous year.

During October, Dr. Wiederhold the school doctor, visited school two mornings and examined a total of 78 pupils. Existing physical conditions or defects were then reported to the parents; many of these health problems were corrected or improved by the parents. Some parents consulted the school nurse, and she assisted when possible.

In November and December eye tests were the major health services at the school. Sixty pupils were tested and the remaining pupils were examined in January. Thirteen children were found to have some difficulty with vision, and notices were sent home to the parents of these children.
