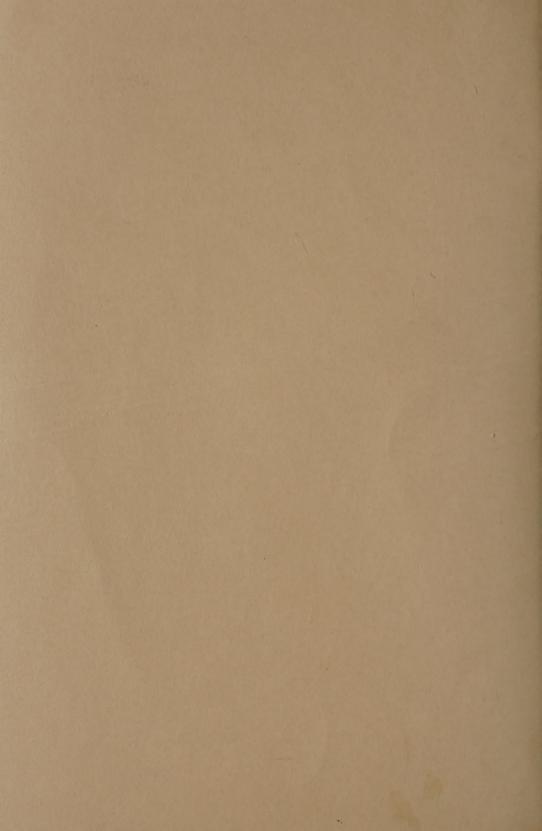

Article 3. To see what sum of money, in addition to the amount already appropriated under Article 2 of this Warrant, the Town will raise and appropriate to defray Town Charges.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate, to be used together with and in addition to the Class V Allotment, \$3,389.26 (Duncan Money, so-called), for the summer maintenance of highways and bridges.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the winter maintenance of highways and bridges.

Article 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$529.41 and apply for Class V Assistance, TRA, so-called. The State of New Hampshire to furnish \$3,529.43.

Article 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the use of the Alstead Dump for the year ensuing.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to help support the Sullivan County Community Service.

Article 9. By Petition. To see if the Town will vote to pay a salary of \$400.00 to the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen, and \$300.00 to each of the other Selectmen.

Article 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$112.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

Article 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 12. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund already established for the purchase of fire equipment.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Library Trustees to close the Langdon Public Library effective April 1 next, Said Trustees to dispose of all property in the best way possible, all monies received to revert to the General Fund after all necessary expenses have been paid.

Article 14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for the Visiting Nurse Association.

Article 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to be matched by the State of New Hampshire to be used for opening back roads and trails.

Article 16. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept all Trust Funds for the perpetual care of cemetery lots.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.

Article 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Article 21. To allow accounts.

#### REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

People cause fires. Our records show that the number of fires increase in an area as the population increases and our state is growing tremendously. This means that we all must be aware of fire causes and do our best to prevent their occurrence.

When we are very young the lighted match is an adventure, burnt fingers and a dropped match is another fire. A little older we like to have a woodland cookout, or go out by ourselves for a smoke but fire and forests get together for another statistic. We adults like to clean up in the spring, burn the old debris and the dead grass, result—escaped fires and much personal expense.

With new homes and summer cottages located in woodlands and with abandoned fields and forests crowding the back yard of of our villages' streets, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the fire season, which comes with the disappearance of the snow, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following action will help:

- 1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.
- 2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- 3. To safely dispose of rubbish, preferably at the town dump. If you must burn
  - a. You need a written permit from the town fire warden for all debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fireplaces or in charcoal brasiers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.
  - b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on grass by householders between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.
  - c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire before you light the match.
- 4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column and save your tax dollars for useful purposes.

#### **REPORT OF FIRE WARDEN**

The importance of extreme care in dry weather was brought out with sharp and painful impact this last year. There were three woods fires all caused by inexcusable carelessness. This cost the tax payers \$517.33. These fires were collectible which means that those who caused the fires were liable for the expense; but there was insufficient evidence to obtain conviction.

Other than this, the Town's people were most careful in an extremenly hazardous period, or the result would have been worse.

You are all urged to continue the good record of the past several years—other than 1968. Be super-careful with out-door fires and smoking. Be sure and obtain a permit for all out-door fires including incinerators.

#### **REPORT OF THE FIRE CHIEF**

We were very fortunate last year in not having any serious fires. There were no chimney fires, either.

This might be classed as the year of the JEEP PUMPER. The Langdon Department assisted at three out of town fires. Each time the tanker was sent and each time the jeep was set up at the water source to refill the Mutual Aid tankers. At the Welch fire the conditions were severe. Low temperature and a snowstorm and darkness were bad enough, but the truck had to buck through 100 yards of deep snow to reach the river. The boys stayed with it refilling tankers until 2 A.M. It should be realized also that this work is volunteer with no expense to the tax payer. Not all the work is done at the time of the emergency. The labor involved in maintenance of equipment is a big and continuous item. Some of the dedicated personnel made as many as 100 separate fire duty dates during 1968. It should also be noted that in fire emergency many citizens contribute trucks, cars, and machinery at no expense to the town.

Another out of town service was rendered to North Walpole during last spring's high water.

During the summer 8 classes on pump operation were held under the State Training Program. This also causes no town expense. Fourteen graduated from the course, the third held in Langdon.

George L. Porter attended 7 sessions of the Advisory Board on Fireman's Training held in Concord, 7 Meetings of the State Fire Control Board, 6 Mutual Aid Meetings and multiple town fire drills at Marlow and Chester. Members of the department also attended the mutual aid meeting and multiple drills. The jeep was taken over to Bellows Balls for a Fire Department parade.

One piece of equipment wa sadded this year; a canvas 1,000 gallon folding water tank. This is used at the fire scene as a reservoir for tankers to unload quickly. It was used on the Tory Hill fire. Two new sets of boots, coats, helmets and gloves were also purchased, making 6 now in all. Citizens band radio was requested from Walpole during the Tory Hill fire, and it was a tremendous help. This could have been used also on the tanker refill job at the three bridges. We are thinking seriously of obtaining 3 radio sets of this type for Civilian Defense using Civilian Defense funds. It could be properly used in any emergency; and would not interfere with Mutual Aid Communications.

From our experience this year it seems plain that a short wheel base four wheel drive truck with a front end pump similiar to our jeep is the prime item of equipment for this town. Its maneuverability is far superior to the standard large fire truck. It can be put into operation at locations that a conventional truck cannot reach. For this reason it supplements the mutual aid equipment in the area. Instead of adding just another fire truck, it is specialized equipment, and thus supplements the other area equipment. Since our jeep was secondhand when we bought it in 1950, it also speaks well for the maintenance that keeps it still operating efficiently.
