TOWN OF LINCOLN ANNUAL TOWN MEETING March 8, 1966

Meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by George McGee who read the articles as set forth in the Warrant. Mr. Waldo called the moderator's attention to the fact that Article 12 was omitted in the reading of the Warrant. A short recess was called to allow the Clerk to deliver the ballots to the Committee.

ARTICLE 1—To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

ARTICLE 2—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing

year and make appropriation of the same.

Budget Committee recommended that the following amounts be appropriated: \$5,250 — Salaries, \$5,000 — Expenses, \$400 — Registration Expenses; Motion made by Mae Tardiff, Seconded by James MacDonald that the sum of \$10,650 be appropriated for the above expenses. Mr. McGee questioned the increased budget and Mr. Waldo explained that the principal item of expense was for necessary trips of town officials in connection with the pollution program. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 3—How much money will be raised for the Police Department.

Budget Committee recommended \$7,500. Motion made by Mr. Sargent, seconded by Glen Stevens. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 4—How much money will be raised for the Fire Department.

Budget Committee recommended \$4,500, a \$1,000 increase over the previous year to cover charges for changing obsolete equipment and an additional portable pump. Motion made by Kenneth McGinnis, seconded by Glen Stevens. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 5—How much money will be raised for the Public Health Department.

Budget Committee recommended \$4,650, same as for previous year. Motion made by Mr. Sargent, seconded by Glen Stevens. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 6—How much money will be raised for Town Maintenance.

Two items, Amounting to \$3,000, not covered by Warrant — new equipment and sewage construction. Motion made by James MacDonald, seconded by Louis Corbeil that Town appropriate \$21,000 for Town Maintenance.

ARTICLE 7—How much money will be raised for Street Lighting.

Budget Committee recommended \$5,500, a \$500 increase over previous year.

Motion made by Edward Clark, seconded by James MacDonald. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 8—How much money will be raised for Cemeteries.

Budget Committee recommended \$1,500, an increase of \$500 over previous year. Motion made by Roland Bourassa, seconded by K. McGinnis. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 9—How much money will be raised for the Public Library.

Budget Committee recommended \$6,800, an increase of \$4,000 over previous year to cover alterations. Motion made by Blanche Haley, seconded by Miss Hanson. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 10—How much money will be raised for Support of Town Poor.

Budget Committee recommended \$4,000, same as previous year. Motion made by James MacDonald, seconded by Mae Tardiff. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 11—How much money will be raised for Old Age Assistance.

Budget Committee recommended \$1,500, same as previous year. Motion made by James MacDonald, seconded by Les Sargent. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 12—How much money will be raised for Maintenance of Water Department.

Recommended: \$5,000 for maintenance, \$2,000 for construction. Motion made by Henry Waldo, seconded by Bob Russell. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 13—How much money will be raised for White Mts. Region Association.

Recommended: \$537.54. Motion made by Henry Waldo, seconded by William Hogan. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 14—How much money will be raised for the Lincoln-Woodstock Chamber of Commerce.

Recommendation: \$400, include \$200 for I-93 Association. Motion made by George Hooker, seconded by Jimmie McLaughlin. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 15—To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,200.00 and Interest to take up Fire Truck note due March 1, 1967.

Motion made by James MacDonald, seconded by Arthur Asselin. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 16—To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,400.00 and Interest to take up Payloader note due March 1, 1967.

Motion made by Edward Clark, seconded by Arthur Asselin. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 17—To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 and Interest to take up Town Road Construction note due Oct. 1, 1966.

Motion made by Roland Bourassa, seconded by James MacDonald. Motion also made by James Mac-Donald, seconded by Henry Waldo that an additional \$1,350 be raised to take up two notes to October 1, 1966. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 18—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Motion made by Bob Russell, seconded by Loretta Russell. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 19—To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for Civil Defense.

Recommended \$300, same as previous year. Motion made by James MacDonald, seconded by Arthur Asselin. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 20—To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Town Dump.

Recommended: \$1,400.00. Motion made by Bob Russell, seconded by Kenneth McGinnis. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 21—To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 for rent of the Lincoln Garage Building.

Motion made by Edward Clark, seconded by James MacDonald. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 22—To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Lincoln Day Camp.

Recommended: \$2,000. Motion made by Bob Russell, seconded by Mrs. Branscombe. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 23—To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Kancamagus Ski Club.

Recommended: \$500.00. Motion made by Roland Bourassa, seconded by George Hooker. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 24—To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$94.21 the State to contribute \$628.04 for T. R. A.

Motion made by James MacDonald, seconded by Henry Waldo. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 25—To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,000.00 for Social Security Taxes. This is an increase over the previous year due to increase in rates.

Motion made by Edward Clark, seconded by Arthur Asselin. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 26—To see what action the Town will take in regard to Street Lighting of the D. W. Highway.

Chair ruled for discussion before motion. It was recommended by Jimmie McLaughlin that the present system be replaced with a new one in which at least 150 candle power lights would be used. Motion made by Jeanne Hogan, seconded by Lena Bouchard that the Selectmen be authorized to put up lights on the highway if they can do so without showing a deficit figure in the appropriated budget. Les Sargent raised question as to whether this meant that a sum up to \$9,000 could be used for this purpose. Question moved by Bob Russell. Vote in the affirmative.

ARTICLE 27—To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to establish and operate an ambulance service in the name of the Town of Lincoln.

Recommended: \$1,000.00. Motion made by James MacDonald, seconded by Henry Waldo to see what action Town will take to authorize the Selectmen to establish an ambulance service and set any regulations and charges that they may deem necessary as payment for the use of said service. Also, that revenue derived from charges for said service shall be deposited in a separate account to be known as the ambulance fund and which shall be non-taxable. Also to authorize the Selectmen to spend such sums of money from said fund as they deem necessary to defray the cost of operating said ambulance service.

Nina Hooker recommended that Roger Thompson and others who assisted in the ambulance service be given a rising vote of thanks by the meeting. ARTICLE 28—To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Livermore Falls Dam and appropriate such monies as may be necessary. The foregoing article having been read by the Acting Moderator, George McGee, Henry Waldo offered the following motion:

"WHEREAS we the voters of the Town of Lincoln in Town Meeting assembled this eighth day of March, 1966, hold that the construction of the Livermore Falls Dam would result in irreparable injury to the economy of this town and since alternate sites are available for water storage adequate to secure necessary down stream benefits and

WHEREAS the prompt construction of Interstate Route #93 is of estimable benefit to the well-being of this Town, therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Town of Lincoln restate its firm opposition to the construction of the Livermore Falls Dam, and be it further RESOLVED that the State of New Hampshire proceed to the final construction of said Route #93 as presently proposed by the Department of Public Works and Highways without any extension in the time schedule as presently provided by the Congress and the Bureau of Public Roads."

The motion was seconded by Francis Savoy. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 29—To see what action the Town will take to authorize the Selectmen to lay out and construct a water line on Loon Mountain Recreational Area and in order to carry the foregoing into effect to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$5,000.00 and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the same by issuing notes in the name of the Town.

Motion made by George McGee, seconded by William Hogan. Mr. Hooker raised the question of the \$2,000 appropriated under article 12 for miscellaneous water line construction. This brings the total to \$7,000. Vote in the affirmative.

ARTICLE 30—To see if the Town will ratify the conveyance by deed by the Selectmen to James F. Maguire of a triangular parcel of land situated southerly of the old high school having no width on Maple Street and being Thirty-Seven feet wide on the back, which bound is on the boundary of the High School tract as determined by the March, 1965, Town Meeting. This deed is part being necessary to clear said Maguire's title to his lot occupied as a residence and store which was erroneously made in the survey by M. H. Churchill in Sept., 1946.

Motion made by James MacDonald, seconded by Henry Waldo. Voted unanimously.

ARTICLE 31—To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions in the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 252, relative to Sidewalks and Sewers and to ratify all action at any time taken by the Town and its Selectmen and Agents relative to Sidewalks and Sewers.

Motion made by Henry Waldo, seconded by Arthur Asselin. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 32—To see if the Town will ratify the conveyance by the Selectmen of Lot No. 188 as shown on a "plan of house lots and numbers in the village of Lincoln" drawn by M. H. Churchill dated November 22 1946, to Franconia Paper Corporation in consideration of the conveyance by Franconia Paper Corporation to the Town of a tract of land between the South Side of the Kancamagus Highway and the northerly bank of the East Branch of the Pemigewasset River and a second tract on the southerly side of the East Branch of the Pemigewasset River, the two tracts comprising approaches to a bridge to be constructed across the East Branch of the Pemigewasset River.

Motion made by George McGee, seconded by Roland Bourassa. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 33—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey two (2) certain tracts of land described in the deed of Franconia Paper Cor-

poration to the Town of Lincoln dated January 26, 1966 by deed or mortgage to the Industrial Park Authority, a corporation and agency of the State of New Hampshire, upon such terms and in such form as the Industrial Park Authority may require in connection with the use of such premises for the construction of a bridge across the East Branch of the Pemigewasset River.

Motion made by George McGee, seconded by Henry Waldo. Unanimously voted.

ARTICLE 34—To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Appointment of vacancies which exist on Budget Committee:

George Boyle, nominated by Lena Fournier seconded by Michael Savoy

Motion by Les Sargent, seconded by James Mac-Donald that nominations cease and that the Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for nominations.

New Members for Recreation Committee. Moved by Charles Rossoll, seconded by James MacDonald that the power of appointment be left to the discretion of the moderator.

George McGee offered resolution in the name of the Town of Lincoln for James Maguire as follows:

"WHEREAS God in his infinite wisdom has ended the life among us of James Maguire, one of the earliest residents of Lincoln Village as we know it today and

WHEREAS ever since his birth in 1896 he has lived most of his life here, usefully devoted to his family, his town and the affairs of his community and

WHEREAS he served the Town of Lincoln for over eight years as Town Clerk and over ten years as Moderator of the town meetings both faithfully and well

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the voters of Lincoln in Town Meeting assembled this eighth day of March in the year of our Lord 1966 express the gratitude we feel for his services to us and to our community, and the regret we feel that he has finished his work and departed from us and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this testimonial be spread upon the records of the Town and a copy of this resolution be properly inscribed and transmitted to his widow as a mark of our respect and gratitude."

Resolution unanimously adopted.

Motion made by Bob Russell, seconded by Henry Waldo that the meeting be in recess until 5:59 to take up voting.

Meeting adjourned at 8:25 p. m.

PUBLIC HEALTH AND SCHOOL NURSING SERVICE LINCOLN-WOODSTOCK AREA 1966

Total house calls—940. This number consists of the following types of visits: Communicable diseases and suspects—36, medical and injury—175, chronically ill—198, pre-natal cases—12, new mothers—15, infants under one month—24, over one month, and preschoolers—29, crippled children's service—15, unclassified, i. e. Social Service, Welfare, visits connected with Clinics—400, pre-schoolers to Diagnostic Clinics—9, under therapy—1.

Conferences with State and County Social Service case workers—20, Professional meetings attended—2, Work shops including Medicare, Cancer, Cardiac and Mental Retardation—7.

This year the Free Chest X-ray Mobile came to Lincoln and No. Woodstock. This was for those from 30 years old and over. However, several under 30 years attended, due to health conditions. Two hundred and seven from the towns attended. The X-ray Mobile was at the Franconia Paper Corp. on separate visits, at which time 310 X-rays were taken. The project is through the Communicable Disease Control Program, N. H. State Department of Health and Welfare.

A new program, Diabetis Screening, conducted through the N. H. Department of Health and Welfare, was conducted for both towns. Approximately 400 were screened. This figure includes the employees of the Franconia Paper Corp. I wish to thank the ladies of both towns who willingly helped on these clinics.

Total visits to the three schools, including home visits, in behalf of pupils—240.

Athletic physicals were done on the students of the Junior and Senior High by Dr. Ralph Parker of Fran-

conia and Dr. Charles Althoff of No. Woodstock. Nurses examinations were carried out in the Elementary grades.

The yearly Tuberculin (Heaf) test was done in grades one and four, in the Elementary schools, grades eight and eleven in High School. Questionable results are followed up by chest X-rays. Several of the school personnel took advantage of this test. These programs are sponsored by the N. H. Tuberculosis Association.

Through the sponsorship of School Health Service, N. H. State Department of Health and Welfare Booster shots for the prevention of Tetanus and Diphtheria were given again this year, to those in grades one, four, eight and twelve.

To the various organizations in the area, the Lodge of Elks and Emblem Club of Littleton, the teachers and pupils of Lin-Wood High School, I extend my sincere thanks for their assistance on the Christmas project.

In order to give Visiting Nurse services to those who come under the Medicare Program, it was necessary to form a health group or an association.

This has been accomplished and is called the Lincoln Public Health Nursing Association.

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Special Sewer Construction Fund Account, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

Financial Statements

As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$9,349.69, plus a revenue surplus of \$4,245.20, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$13,-594.89.

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1966, showing annual debt service requirements is contained in Exhibit G.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any change which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$13,574.41, from \$9,254.47 to \$22,828.88 in 1966, as shown herewith:




