The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects (Polls to close at 6 P. M.):

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for interest on the same.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.
5. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the construction of Class 2 roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 therefor.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the care of cemeteries.
7. To see if the Town will accept the recommendation of the Committee on Street Lighting and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,450.00 for Street Lighting for 1953.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Northwood Public Libraries.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$483.78 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State's share to be \$3,225.20.
11. (By Petition) We the undersigned residents

and property owners residing on so-called "Back Road," East Northwood, wish to petition the Town of Northwood to tar this so-called "Back Road" in the year 1953. (18 signatures)

12. (By Petition) (Appears on ballot for voting) Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws, as amended in 1951, relative to playing games of Beano, be adopted in this Town?

13. To see what action the Town will take relative to the compensation of Selectmen for this and future years.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the use of New Town Cemetery Trustees to gravel drives and furnish a suitable fence including gate, in front.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Zoning Commission of three members, with duties as set forth in Chapter 51, Sections 50-71, Revised Laws of N. H., 1942, to study and recommend a special Town Meeting appropriate regulations to be enforced in the Town.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to install overhead door at Northwood Narrows Fire House.

17. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

LAWS RELATING TO TRUST FUNDS

Chapter 51, Revised Laws of New Hampshire

19. In General. Town may take and hold in trust gifts, legacies and devises made to them for the establishment, maintenance and care of libraries, reading-rooms, schools and other educational facilities, parks, cemeteries and burial lots, the planting and care of shade and ornamental trees upon their highways and other public places, and for any other public purpose that is not foreign to their institution or incompatible with the objects of their organization.

We would suggest that persons desiring to leave a sum of money, the income of which is to be used for the care of cemetery lot, should deposit at least \$200.00.

At the present rate of interest, wherever possible, those funds the principal of which is \$100.00 or less, should be increased.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Northwood:

Mrs. McKay is a graduate of Keene Teachers College, with experience in high school and upper grades. Mr. Viggiano is a graduate of the New England Conservatory of Music. His full time is given to districts in this supervisory union. He succeeded Mr. Bertram Colter, who died in the summer, after a term of service which had endeared him to all school personnel in the towns where he served. Mr. Edson Evans, janitor of Brookside School, died last November.

The report of the school nurse-teacher, Miss Myrtle Fletcher, shows 109 routine tests of vision, hearing, other health indications, including growth progress. Chicken pox and measles were prevalent. Special clinics included pre-school and toxoid, also

fluorine application for tooth preservation. Various other more or less common conditions were reported to parents and in some cases referred to physicians.

After careful consideration in the community, a unit of the state and national Congress of Parents and Teachers was organized October 9, 1952, at the Ridge School, with Mrs. David Small as president. The PTA has proved to be a very helpful group in many places throughout the country. The local association is interested in furnishing supplementary kindergarten and musical privileges for children, as well as in the ideals and practices of the regular school activities.

Studies of the educational needs of the state have resulted in the following legislative program, which all citizens should examine and support insofar as they can see their way clear to approve:

1. State Aid in the amount of \$1,230,000 to carry out the formula adopted by the 1951 legislation. This formula would have given Northwood \$2,266 this year, instead of \$1,092 as allotted.
2. Scholarship aid to enable worthy students to enter Keene and Plymouth teachers colleges, to replenish the alarmingly insufficient number of teachers available.
3. A 6-year self-liquidating building program at the teachers colleges, including a men's dormitory and an auditorium-gymnasium at Plymouth, and at Keene a classroom-laboratory building, men's dormitory, addition to the Vocational Building, and remodeling Parker Hall for a library.
4. The sum of \$2,000 for state department aid in revising the Program of Studies.
5. Re-organization of supervisory unions, re-

storing 4 to the number of unions previously decreased arranging the districts in more natural supervisory groups, and providing equalization funds so that district financial ability would no longer be the regulating factor in assigning districts to unions. This project also includes the restoration of personnel needed by the state department to carry on the duties laid upon it by the legislature.
