SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Times R-a-changing all over the Country-- with the lowering economy, the loss of jobs, the loss of income on savings and retirement funds, all because of the declining stock market that is now being blamed on the threat of war. At the same time, a lot of things are rising, such as the cost of health care, fuel oil, and property taxes, to name a few. These problems affect everyone in one way or another and all we can do is hope and pray it doesn't last too long.

On the home front, not too much change took place this past year. The highway dept. finished paving the end of Back Lake Road with the "farmer's mix" asphalt, and for the money, we are pleased with the results. We are hoping to be able to do another section of road this year if the budget allows it.

The Community Church Hall was erected in September with a full band of volunteer workers and a lot of donated material in much the same manner as the fire station was built. The time and effort of everyone involved is very much appreciated and we would like to thank everyone who participated. The Hall will get a lot of use for the receptions of weddings and funerals as well as a meeting place for the community.

Our town-wide revaluation is still underway with Avitar's data collectors checking and measuring the buildings on each parcel of land. Once the data is collected, the actual appraisals will be figured from the sales analysis of the latest sales. There continues to be a lot of transfers of properties as well as other property changes taking place which keeps our office staff busy. There are a lot of new buildings being built all over town and a lot of people wanting to own a piece of Pittsburg.

The biggest concern about the I.P. land deal is for the most part over with, but a new committee has been set up to monitor and approve of the continued use of the land. We have three people from Pittsburg on that committee including two Selectmen.

The Town received a generous gift of land from USGen which was all their land from the Mill Street Bridge to below the Bacon Bridge along the north side of the Conn. River bank which amounts to about 38 acres. Each end of this stretch of land is a historical site. The old Baldwin Lumber Mill was located at the Mill Street end and the Fletcher Grist Mill was at the Bacon Bridge end. We are planning to apply for grant money to put a walking path along the river and put up historical markers. We would like to thank Bob Ward for helping us obtain this land.

We received another Community Development Block Grant for a water improvement study and we expect to apply for another grant to rebuild our water reservoir and improve our water supply to meet the satisfaction of the Dept. of Environmental Services.

The Fire Dept. and Police Dept. continue to apply for and receive grants on their own for additional equipment for their departments. We would like to thank them and all our town employees for their continued dedication and commitment to their jobs.

TOWN OF PITTSBURG, NEW HAMPSHIRE COUNTY OF COOS

TOWN NUMBERING ORDINANCE

<u>PURPOSE</u> - The purpose of this ordinance is to provide a quick and efficient means of identifying property for the immediate response of emergency services.

NUMBER REQUIREMENTS

- 1. All primary buildings within the Town of Pittsburg shall be assigned street numbers by the Board of Selectmen or their designee.
- 2. All owners, tenants, occupants, or persons in possession of primary buildings shall display the assigned street number so as to be readily visible from the street. For primary buildings not readily visible from the street, the assigned street number shall be **conspicuously displayed** at the main vehicular access to the property so as to be visible on a **year-round** basis.
- 3. All numbers shall be of a reflective or contrasting color to the means of support, such as the primary building, mailbox, post, etc.
- All displayed street numbers shall be at least three inches (3") high by two and one-half inches (2¹/₂") wide. The size of numbers placed on mailboxes shall be in accordance with U.S. Postal Service requirements.
- 5. Street numbers shall be displayed within sixty (60) days of notification of assigned numbers.

NEW BUILDINGS & SUBDIVISIONS

- 1. Whenever a new primary building or occupied structure is to be erected, the owner must first apply at the Town Office for an assigned street number.
- 2. Any new road or access to two or more lots that comes into existence shall be named after application to the Board of Selectmen for approval. No road or access shall be named without this approval.

<u>UNAUTHORIZED</u> - The display of any street number or road name other than a townassigned street number or town-approved road name will be considered a violation of this ordianance.

PENALTY

- 1. Any property owner who fails to comply with any relevant provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a violation, and subject to a fine not to exceed \$250.
- 2. Failure to pay said fine will result in the violator being summonsed before the Colebrook District Court and subject to prosecution.

ENFORCEMENT - This ordinance shall be enforced by the Pittsburg Police Department.

EFFECTIVE DATE - This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Bremer Pond Auditorium in said Town of Pittsburg on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of one Moderator for one year; one Selectman for three years; one Town Clerk for one year; one Town Treasurer for three years; one Road Agent for one year; one Trustee of Trust Funds for one year; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Library Trustee for three years; one Overseer of Welfare for one year.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) for Avitar Associates of N.E., Inc. to continue the revaluation work necessary for certification of property tax assessments for the year 2004 as required by the Dept. of Revenue Administration. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nine thousand dollars (\$9,000) to be added to the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to be added to the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund previously established. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to purchase a new ambulance and to authorize the withdrawal of that sum from the Gayle S. Carr Trust Fund created for that purpose. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of thirty-nine thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$39,250) to be added to the Ambulance and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund previously established. The sum of twenty-nine thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$29,250) is to come from Pittsburg's share of the U.C.V.H. Ambulance Fund. The balance of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to be raised from taxation. (Recommended by the Selectmen)

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell the 1991 ambulance and use the proceeds toward new ambulance equipment. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 8. (By Petition) "The Health Care for New Hampshire Resolution That we, the citizens of Pittsburg, New Hampshire, call on our elected officials from all levels of government, and those seeking office, to work with consumers, businesses, and health care providers to ensure that: Everyone, including the self-employed, unemployed, un-- and underinsured, and small business owners has access to an affordable basic health plan similar to what federal employees receive; Everyone, including employers, consumers, and the state, local and federal government makes a responsible and fair contribution to finance the health care system; Everyone receives high quality care that is cost efficient and medically effective; and That these efforts help control the skyrocketing cost of health care." "This resolution is non-binding and represents no fiscal impact."
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the "Town Numbering Ordinance" as written on page <u>4</u> of this Town Report. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred eighteen thousand six hundred sixty-seven dollars (\$818,667) which represents the operating budget. Said sum does not include special articles addressed. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Polls will not close before 6:00 P.M.

AUDITORS' REPORT

TRANSMITTAL AND COMMENTARY LETTER

To the Board of Selectmen. Pittsburg, New Hampshire:

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements of the Town of Pittsburg, New Hampshire for the year ended December 31, 2001, we considered the Town's internal control structure to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the financial statements and not to provide assurance on the internal control structure.

However, during our audit we became aware of one matter that provides an opportunity to strengthen internal controls and operating efficiencies. This letter does not affect our report dated May 1, 2002, on the Town's financial statements. The comment below is being made in hope that it will improve existing procedures and is not intended to criticize Town personnel.

Condition

The Ambulance and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund listed on the Trustees of the Trust Funds report consists of this capital reserve account in addition to the Gayle S. Carr Expendable Trust Fund. In 1998, Coös County Probate Court requested that the Trustees of the Trust Funds physically segregate the Gayle S. Carr Trust Fund from the Ambulance and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund.

Recommendation

We recommend that the Trustees delineate these funds effective January 1, 2002, based on the allocated balances shown in the notes to the accompanying financial statements.

We extend our thanks to the officials and employees of the Town for their assistance during the course of our audit. We appreciate the opportunity to serve the Town of Pittsburg.

POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

In the year 2002, the Pittsburg Police investigated over 100 criminal cases, ranging from camp breaks to domestic violence cases. We covered 114 accidents, including 66 that involved collisions with moose and deer. We issued nearly 200 court summonses including speeding, open container violations, DWIs, and other traffic violations. We handled several dog complaints. I urge each of you to make sure that you license your dog and also to attach their license tag to their collars. I remind all of you that Pittsburg does have a leash law. We sponsor a Rabies Clinic every spring to assist you in getting your pets their rabies shots. Even though your cat is not required to be licensed, the law does require them to be vaccinated for rabies.

We were able to obtain another grant from the Coos County Incentive Funds to aid in the summer youth recreation/employment projects. It is hoped that this program will continue to grow, helping our youths to learn job place responsibilities as well as giving them some constructive activities during the summer months. We received another Highway Safety Grant for bicycle helmets and were able once again, to take this program to St. Alberts and the Stewartstown Community School.

Through the efforts of our COPS Grant, we were able to give the townspeople more coverage. We try to have an officer on duty at least eight hours per day for most of the year. When this is not possible due to work commitments, we try to have at least one officer available for call out. Our goal is, and will continue to be, to make ourselves as available to you as much as we can. I remind you that if anyone has any problems, concerns, or questions about the department, feel free to call me and I will be glad to make myself available to discuss them with you. We are here to Serve and Protect.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Pittsburg Fire Department has a business meeting on the second Wednesday of every month. The members have work details on all other Wednesdays and one of these is a training session consisting of rescues, EMS, fire safety, and risk management. Some members have traveled to Portland Me., Vermont, and the NH Fire Academy to learn new ideas and safety to better serve you.

The Firefighter's Assistance Grant was fulfilled during the summer of 2002. New helmets, some bunker gear, cold weather suits and helmets, gloves, and fireboots have been purchased. Sixteen new self-contained breathing apparatus and spare bottles were also purchased. EMS jackets for the ambulance personnel and first responders were also purchased for protection and safety. This Personnel Protective Equipment had a cost of \$115,200. \$103,680 was paid for by the grant and the balance was picked up by the Fire Department budget, Pittsburg NH Firefighters Assoc. And the Pittsburg Ambulance Corp. At the school on Town Meeting Day, there will be a display of some of the items purchased.

As the Town grows and evolves, so does the way our Department operates, providing trainings, new equipment, budget, manpower, and the services needed. The Fire Department was awarded another grant to help purchase a new tow-behind Orion Ambulance Sled with winter and summer attachments for wilderness rescues and fires. The funds for this SLED and other winter equipment came from the Fire Department budget, Pittsburg NH Firefighters Assoc., Pittsburg Ridge Runners, 911 Demo Sponsors, and the NH Outdoor Council. A Mutual Aide Team from Colebrook, Beecher Falls, Pittsburg, and Fish and Game has been formed for cold water rescue. Four Gumby suits, ropes, and misc. equipment have been purchased, with monthly trainings in a controlled environment at the local Kids Pond in the lower village.

A new program has been added at the School. It's time for Risk Watch...an injury prevention program for children and families. This program is organized with the help of the NFPA and the NH Fire Academy through local Fire Departments. Watch for the upcoming Safety Fair at Pittsburg School. Thank you, Risk Watch Coalition Team, Staff, Instructors, and Sponsors. YOU HAVE MADE A DIFFERENCE.

As always, the Department wishes to thank the neighboring Departments, Fire, Law Enforcement, and Medical. To the Members of the Department, on behalf of the citizens of Pittsburg, I'd like to say "THANK YOU AND WELL DONE".

PITTSBURG AMBULANCE CORPS REPORT

It seems hard to believe that it has already been a year since I was writing the last annual report with much focus on the events of September 11, 2001 and the effects on EMS (Emergency Medical Services). 9/11 and it's 1st anniversary has passed but the changes it has brought to the world of our EMTs remain with us. The Pittsburg ambulance crew is still the same group of people who are your neighbors, friends, family, and co-workers but with perhaps a heightened sense of awareness and responsibility to our role as emergency responders.

With this expanded role emphasizing on the safety of ourselves and our community, we continue to fill our education schedule with courses that teach and prepare us for large scale disasters. Members of the Pittsburg Corps joined other EMTs, fire personnel and medical staff at a day-long Mass Casualty Incident fair held last fall at UCVH. Topics of the fair included bio-terrorism, incident command protocols, and a review of the New York September 11 attack which was delivered by a paramedic who was involved with the emergency operations of the Twin Tower bombings. Preparation for our work has come to include learning about specialized equipment and personal gear used in such responses to MCIs. At the end of last year, working along with our EMS coordinator and UCVH, paperwork was submitted to the State of Vermont Department of Public Safety for a grant to obtain such equipment. (EMS North Ambulance District provides services to towns of Vermont.) Also in 2002, the Corps purchased jackets in an effort to provide a safer work environment for our members.

Another topic the ambulance corps has been involved with, along with the Pittsburg Selectboard, is the future purchase of a new ambulance. Our present ambulance is 12 years old and with the advances in emergency medical care and required equipment, we have outgrown it. A committee of Corps members has spent the last 18 months researching information, as well as looking at ambulances to ensure that the replacement vehicle will not only meet our needs but carry us through the next 5-10 years. The purchase of a new ambulance will be on the Pittsburg Town Warrant list for the 2003 town meeting.

Pittsburg Ambulance Corps has experienced the usual flux in membership in 2002. At the present, we have three 1st responders, thirteen EMTBs (EMT-basic), one WEMT (Intermediate level with wilderness rescue training), and one paramedic. New members include, EMTs Stephanie Lassonde and Brenda Mullane, and new 1st responders David Parker and Bob Couture. New district representatives are Jhody Judd who replaced Dick Felone and David Parker who replaced Perry Richardson. I would like to make special note of one of our EMTs. Marjorie Straw, who has been an EMT since 1975, has received an award for community dedication from the Knights of Columbus. Kudos Marj!

Numbers of runs for the year 2002 total 121 with 61 responses for medical emergencies, 49 trauma calls including 16 snowmobile related injuries. The Corps offered assistance in 2 fire stand-bys, and 1 transfer. Eight runs were cancelled without transport of patients. I would also like to mention that many of our EMTs volunteer their time responding with our surrounding towns ambulance services when needed.

We thank the towns of our district for their support.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

Your local Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department, and the State of New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands cooperate and coordinate to reduce the risk of wildland fires in New Hampshire. To help us assist you, contact your local Forest Fire Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required before doing ALL outside burning. Fire permits are mandatory for all outside burning unless the ground where the burning is to be done (and surrounding areas) is completely covered with snow. Violations of RSA 227-L:17, the fire permit law, and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines up to \$2,000 and/or a year in jail, plus suppression cost.

A new law effective January 1, 2003 prohibits residential trash burning (RSA 125-N). Contact New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services at (800) 498-6868 or www.des.state.nh.us for more information.

Help us to protect you and our forest resources. Most New Hampshire wildfires are human caused. Homeowners can help protect their homes by maintaining adequate green space around the house and make sure that the house number is correct and visible.
