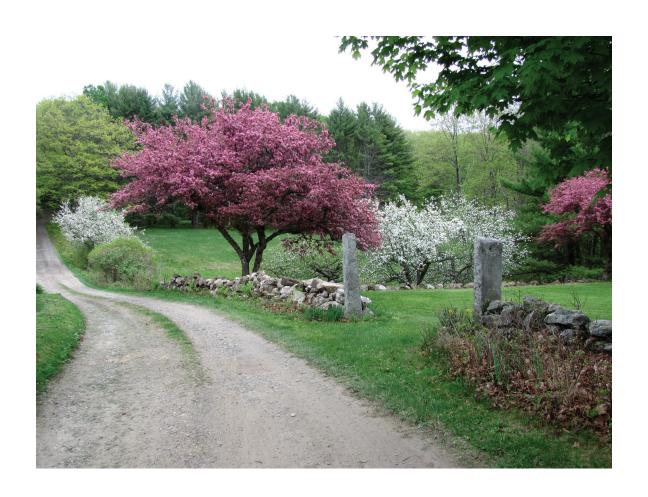

You are hereby notified to meet at **The Roxbury Meeting House** in said **Town** on **Tuesday, the fourteenth (14th) day of March, 2017** at **7:00** PM, to act upon the following subjects:

#### **Article 1:**

To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year:

Selectman (3 years) Fire Chief (1 year)

Treasurer (1 year)

Tax Collector (1 year)

Town Clerk (1 year)

Planning Board (3 years)

Planning Board (2 years)

Auditor (1 year) Trustee of Trust Funds (3 years)

Sexton (1 year) Zoning Board of Adjustment (3 years)

#### **Article 2:**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55,180 for General Government.

#### **Article 3:**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$26,294 for salaries and expenses of the **Police Department**.

#### Article 4:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,794 for the purpose of compensating the Roxbury Police Department for summer patrols at Otter Brook Park. These funds for expenditure are designated to the town through the US Army Corps of Engineers. The appropriation does not affect the Town's tax rate, but to be properly expended a vote is required

#### **Article 5:**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for the salaries and expenses of the Fire Department.

#### **Article 6:**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,251 for the Town's shared cost of the Fire Mutual Aid System.

#### **Article 7:**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,296 as its fair share of stand-by costs for the use of the City of Keene's ambulance service.

#### **Article 8:**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$122,500 for Summer and Winter road maintenance.

#### Article 9:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,907 for highway construction and reconstruction. Selectmen's comment: Some of these funds for expenditure may be designated to the Town through the Highway Block Grant Fund.

#### **Article 10:**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,500 to be paid for Solid Waste Disposal and Recycling Center privileges in the Town of Marlborough.

#### **Article 11:**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for reimbursing residents who participate in the City of Keene's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program.

#### Article 12:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the purpose of Pest Control.

#### Article 13:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1 for Town Welfare and emergency assistance to the Town Poor.

#### Article 14:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800 to support Southwestern Community Services, Home Health Care and Community Services, The Community Kitchen INC., Meals on Wheels, Monadnock Family Mental Health Services, Red Cross and Samaritans.

#### Article 15:

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to **borrow money** in anticipation of taxes and will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,100 for **interest expense**.

#### **Article 16:**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for reimbursing residents who participate to access the City of Keene's Public Library.

#### Article 17:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for general maintenance at the Roxbury Four Corners Park.

#### Article 18:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for Legal Expenses for Education.

Recommended by Selectmen

#### Article 19:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund previously established for the Town Police Vehicles. *Recommended by Selectmen* 

#### Article 20:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,500 to be added to the roads capital reserve fund, previously established.

Recommended by Selectmen

#### Article 21:

#### Selectmen's report

Roxbury's selectmen were busy in 2016 on many fronts. Administratively, they schooled themselves in the use of a new state-designed online system for filing financial information with the Department of Revenue Administration. And, following the departure of the town's part-time administrative assistant, they themselves took on the functions of that position.

In terms of policy, the selectmen conducted hearings and votes toward the adoption of (a) an expanded and detailed permit policy for certain special events on private property in town and (b) an expanded rental policy for the private use of Town Hall. They also revised the fee schedule for services provided by the town and added solar equipment installation to the town's building permit checklist.

Separately, under the direction of Selectman Tim O'Brien the selectmen worked with department heads to compile an inventory of town-owned equipment and related property.

Other activities during the year included the formation of the Roxbury Conservation Commission and the organization of a community clean-up day for the upper cemetery on Middletown Road.

The year also brought physical changes to Town Hall, most visibly the paving of the parking area near the front door to help accommodate access by wheel chairs. A window was installed in the front door of Town Hall, and, internally, the main floor and stairway were sanded. Finally, under the direction of former selectman Chip Drogue, a fully-equipped kitchen was installed on the first floor as part of an effort to qualify the Town Hall as a Red Cross Emergency Shelter.

Another internal improvement resulted from a gift of a painting to the town by Sandy (Fifield) Tacy. The painting, a faithful image of the former Town Hall in Roxbury Center by artist Jane (Russell Streeter) Capone, is prominently displayed on the main floor of Town Hall.

Among personnel changes during the year, Tim O'Brien succeeded Karen Cota as selectman; Chip Drogue succeeded Fred White as Emergency Management Director; and Tim Mason succeeded Allan LaPlante as Fire Chief.

In other business, the selectmen were asked by the city of Keene to conduct police patrol services on its watershed lands in town. A formal agreement was worked out and will be implemented in 2017.

Jacob Johnson, a Roxbury resident and member of Boy Scout Troop 311 conducted a litter pickup along the Davis Road; he was thanked for his services. The selectmen were also heartened by citizen initiative behind the organization of the second annual Halloween Party in Town Hall

Among other activities, the selectmen accepted the terms of an Emergency Management Performance Grant in the amount of \$15,657 to be used toward the purchase of emergency communications and computer-related equipment.

#### **Roxbury Police Department Report**

Community policing continues to be a priority, and I encourage my officers to be highly visible. Please let us know of any areas of town you would like patrolled or areas where suspicious activity may be occurring.

The Otter Brook Dam patrols were covered with funding provided by the Army Corps of Engineers. In addition regular patrols covered Babbidge Dam, Otter Brook Dam, Woodward Pond Dam and several class VI roads. An agreement with the City of Keene for watershed patrols was accepted, and I hope to have officers patrolling these areas with the ATV. Extra patrol shifts were assigned to the Granite Gorge Ski area during special events and regular weekend hours. Additional radar was enforced on Route 9 near the ski area to slow vehicles down on this stretch of roadway.

It is important to report any crime or suspicious activity without delay. The faster Cheshire County Dispatch is aware of a problem the quicker a Roxbury Police Officer or mutual aid agency can be dispatched.

The Roxbury Officers work different shifts, which allows more coverage to handle calls during the day and night. As Chief, I'm on call for most of this time frame. **To contact a police officer during an emergency call 911.** For non-emergencies dial Cheshire County Dispatch at 355-2000. If a Roxbury officer is unavailable the dispatch center will contact NH State Police Troop C or the Cheshire County Sheriff's office. The Roxbury Police Department will complete a follow up after an incident occurs in town.

I was able to hire Matthew Willis as a part-time officer. Matt currently works full-time as a Lieutenant for the Cheshire County House of Corrections. Matt is enrolled for the NH Police Standards and Training part-time police academy which begins in February of 2017.

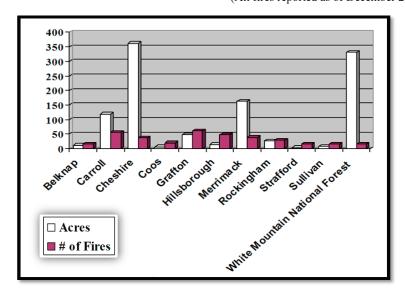
Over the past two years, New Hampshire has experienced its busiest fire seasons since 1989. 1,090 acres burned during the 2016 season. Fires falling under state jurisdiction burned 759 acres, with the largest fire of 199 acres occurring in Stoddard. The extremely dry summer led to a busy fall fire season with large fires occurring into mid-November. Drought conditions hampered fire suppression efforts and extended the time needed to extinguish fires. Your local fire departments and the Division of Forests and Lands worked tirelessly throughout the year to protect homes and the forests. The statewide system of 16 fire lookout towers continues to operate on high fire danger days. Our fire lookouts are credited with keeping many fires small due to their quick and accurate spotting capabilities.

Many homes in New Hampshire are located in the wildland urban interface, which is the area where homes and flammable wildland fuels intermix. Several of the fires during the 2016 season threatened structures, and a few structures were burned, a constant reminder that forest fires burn more than just trees. Homeowners should take measures to prevent a wildland fire from spreading to their home. Precautions include keeping your roof and gutters clear of leaves and pine needles, and maintaining adequate green space around your home free of flammable materials. As we prepare for the 2017 fire season, please remember to contact your local Forest Fire Warden or Fire Department to determine if a fire permit is required before doing <u>ANY</u> outside burning. Under State law (RSA 227-L:17) a fire permit is required for all outside burning, unless the ground is completely covered with snow. Fire permits are also available online in most towns and may be obtained by visiting <u>www. NHfirepermit.com</u>. The burning of household waste is prohibited by the Air Resources Division of the Department of Environmental Services (DES).
