To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March, next at seven of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To vote on the following question: shall sweepstakes be sold in this Town.
- 4. To vote on the following question: shall the provisions of Chapter 171A of the revised Laws relative to the playing games of beano be adopted in this Town, in accordance with the provisions of the Session Laws of 1949.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Snow Removal for the ensuing year, and make appropriations of the same.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Dollars and Thirty-Three Cents (\$400.33) for T.R.A. so called.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of public landings.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Police Department for the ensuing year.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Ninety-Three Dollars (\$193.00) in support of the operating costs of the Elliot Community Hospital for the year 1970.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars (\$266.00) for the Monadnock Region Association.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights for the ensuing year.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Public Library.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Dump.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to take any action on having a Reappraisal of land and buildings made, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, or take any action thereon.
- 21. To see if the Town will take any action on restraining dogs.
 - 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate

the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for the forthcoming Bi-Centennial, said sum to be placed in a Savings Bank, and the money made available for any preliminary expenses incurred by the Bi-Centennial Committee. Also, to see if the Town will vote to release from the General Fund, the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) which was appropriated last year for the Bi-Centennial, and that this money also be placed in a Savings Bank for use by the Committee.

- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$43.00, to support the services of the Community Health Clinic of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.
- 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

As reported at last year's Town Meeting, we were trying to locate a new Town Dump.

A representative of the State Health Department came to Stoddard to meet with us, and we spent the day going around and investigating locations for a new dump site. Unfortunately, we were unable to find a suitable spot to buy or lease, and no one would lease or sell any land for this purpose.

Therefore, we cleaned up the present dump, drew in many yards of gravel to cover it with, and installed a new set of gates at the entrance, in hopes that the present owner would not force us out.

During this past winter, we have met with a representative of Mr. Williams, and have made an arrangement to rent the old dump on a year to year basis.

However, in the very near future, all of the small towns will be forced to have an incinerator, or make some other arrangements to dispose of their refuse.

We still see need in the very near future, to have the entire town reappraised, in order to keep the assessment on an equal basis, as assessments are bound to get out of line over the years, no matter whom the assessing officials are.

NORTH CHESHIRE COUNTY HOME HEALTH SERVICE

A new health service is now available to the townspeople of Gilsum, Marlow, Stoddard, Sullivan and Surry. This service has in its employ a registered professional nurse, Mrs. Edith Hasbrouck, and on a part-time basis, Miss Adelaide Berdeen, a qualified physical therapist.

The purpose of the Health Service is to provide nursing care ordered by your physician and to teach a member of the family to carry out the needed care after the nurse has left. The nurse will visit mothers of new babies, to aid and assist in the instruction and care for the new-born.

Other services supplied will be free clinics held throughout the year such as the measles clinic held November 6, 1969 at the Gilsum Elementary School.

People insured under the Medicare Program will be eligible for the nursing care under that program, others will be charged a fee of \$3.00 which can be scaled downward in case of need. NO ONE will be refused care because of inability to pay. To help support this service a membership drive was held in the five towns and will be done annually.

The North Cheshire County Home Health Service office is housed in the Gilsum Fire Station and the nurse is available to you from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The phone number of the service office is 357-0969 and calls should be made between 9:00 and 9:30 a.m.

If you should have any questions about the service, contact your physician, Department of Public Health & Welfare, or your local board member.

ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The Sixties in all their acclaim - good and bad - had their affect on schools as they did all other segments of our society. And as people look to the Seventies for some encouragement for things in general, so do those of us in schools. It is easy, as one reflects on what has transpired in recent years to become somewhat pessimistic and hold out little hope for the future of public schools. One merely needs to quickly list such things as student unrest, teacher militancy, inflation, increasing standards for schools, narcotics, etc. to easily see why such an attitude could prevail. Yet, to quickly relegate all to the pessimistic heap is to ignore the good that has been done and what, with reasoned effort, can take place in the future. The increasing efforts of teachers to develop better ways of meeting the educational requirements of their students, the improved quality of some of the materials now available to us, and the willingness to face up to the challenge to our school system tends to ward off feelings of pessimism and bring about a feeling of accomplishment.

I am tempted to relate to you the kinds of things we are doing that I feel hold promise for the years to come. No doubt I will slip a little in that direction, but for the major part of this report I would like to direct my efforts to an overall discussion of some of the ideas that will lead us into the Seventies. Often times we are accused of overworking the idea that what we need is for the good of the students when we are attempting to get a budget or a program passed. And although at times this tack is overplayed, it nonetheless should be a basic motivating purpose to what it is we are attempting to accomplish. Schools are a part of the society and they serve the needs of society. This is a responsibility we recognize. Yet, they directly serve the needs of the young people who attend and who, in

time, will make up our society through not only being around, but more so in the way they go about fulfilling their responsibilities as members of the society. And it is this ultimate consideration that must be kept in mind as we go about the business of developing the school system.

It was our concern for the type of educational opportunity we were offering our young people that prompted the development of the CAPE Project. The acceptance of this program by all concerned has resulted in a new concern for what it is we do for children. For those teachers directly involved in the project a renewed vigor has been created. Within many of our schools we have committees studying the reading programs we now have in a concerted effort to bring about greater coordination, a more unified program, a program that will eliminate those gaps that cause many of the child's reading difficulties and explore the utilization of some of the new programs developed for teaching children how to read. This represents an ambitious undertaking, but if we are to do the job in reading as we should then it is a high priority item. CAPE has also seen the attempts of teachers to try new approaches in other areas. Most noteworthy is the process of team teaching that has been tried this year. This is simply an effort by a group of teachers to use their talents to the best advantage in planning an educational program for the children in a certain grade or subject area. Also, a number of new materials have been made available through the CAPE Project for classroom trial. Rather than base materials selection on the plaudites of advertising companies, we are trying these items out in actual practice. We hope that this will lead us to making better choices in the types of materials we use for instructional purposes.

The coming year will see a concentration by CAPE in the areas of vocational education. With the apparent inbalance in our curriculum in programs for students with various needs and abilities, the importance of a good and relevant program in the vocational area ranks high in importance.

The new Elementary Standards are going to pose a number of dilemmas for our area. For each community it will re-

quire a thorough examination of its elementary program, and the development of a plan that will provide for meeting the requirements that are part of the new standards. Briefly scanning the list of requirements we note:

- 1. New services such as guidance, library facilities and materials, health and special education.
- 2. Subjects offered to include in addition to usual things physical education, art, and music.
- 3. Facilities to house those required programs, if not currently available.
- 4. And then a number of related items such as class size, inservice education, school philosophy and adequate staff and administration.

Obviously we have much to do. At this point we have developed a survey form to determine how our schools stand in relation to these standards. From this we will prepare recommendations as to how we may best approach this problem. Although we have not completed our work as yet it seems reasonable to say that our thought will be to develop a phased program that will space itself out over a period of time rather than to attempt a crash program that will yield little and cost much.

Now to look ahead with a one man brainstorming session. The preceding topics are with us. They are fact. Yet the methods of achieving some of our needs is a point requiring much thought. I know that if I were to mention the word cooperative it would raise some eyebrows. Yet for some, this still may be the avenue of approach. Be that as it may, the fact still remains that because each of our districts are small we must pursue a course that will allow us to provide a reasonable program at a cost that is not prohibitive. One approach that seems worthy of consideration at this juncture is shared services. By this I simply mean the sharing of programs and services by the districts within this Union. The first example of this is the preposed sharing of a program of special education for the mentally retarded child by all the communities in this Union. This proposal is something upon which you will be asked to vote at your Annual Meeting. It is this kind of approach that may help us to meet some of our needs in lieu of other ways. Let me suggest some other areas in which the idea of shared services may be explored.

First, we all share a vital concern about many apparent problems we have in reading. We hear much about the need for a remedial reading teacher. I submit that the need for such a highly specialized person is not as great as is the need for a person who has the expertise to develop and supervise a sound reading program that will meet the needs of all concerned. Such a person would be expensive for one community, but might be something on a shared basis that could help us in this area.

A second area is that of vocational education and/or related programs. We now have a tremendous duplication of facilities among our schools as well as a concern that what our programs are providing may not be as relevant to our students' needs as they should be. Thus, the idea to perhaps share facilities and personnel. That is, each school might offer different programs, and for a certain part of a day students could attend the program they have elected in the school where it is available. This, obviously, would require considerable study. The CAPE committee this year will address itself to this as well as other topics on this subject.

Finally we are rapidly approaching the era (for lack of a better word) of the extensive use of audio-visual materials. These are rather expensive items — both the teaching materials and the equipment with which to use them. At the same time the preparation of materials that fit into our programs and the technical use of some of the equipment requires time and training that we do not have an abundant supply of. Here again we see an area of possible shared effort something on the order of Instructional Materials Center in Hampton, N. H., where we could produce materials, have a distribution center for various items and have a person with the technical know how to assist teachers in the use of this material.

The point of these thoughts is to say to you that with the costs of education being what they are, and the relatively small size of our school systems it seems logical to explore ways in which we can still provide a sound program and yet not become economically inefficient in so doing. You will hear more from us on this topic in the near future.

Our intent is to develop the kind of school system that will do the best possible for each child in it. This idealistic statement is really what it is all about. The moment we lose sight of it, then any of the recommendations we put forth will lose a great deal of their meaning and significance. We believe in the individual child and much of our direction is aimed at meeting his particular needs. He needs discipline, but he also needs compassion and understanding. It is towards this degree of understanding that we are moving. For some reason schools seem to lag. We are trying to overcome that lag through a reasoned approach.

In closing, I would like to call your attention to a small booklet published by the American Association for School Administrators entitled A Climate For Individuality. It contains much that causes one to think. Two short paragraphs that don't necessarily relate closely to this report nonetheless leave one with something to ponder. (The opening sentence refers to the book not this report.)

"Perhaps some who read this will see in it an image of a soft, 'idealistic' world where children are petted, pampered, and given too much. We are so accustomed in these days to the harsher strains of talk of forced growth, and a frenzied pressure upon youth, that anything else would be weak and mild. Many adults, frightened by a world they themselves have created in major respects, are frantically determined to set rigid patterns of content and common standards of achievement which are unsound, unrealistic, and dangerous. They seem determined to impose on the next generation rigid standards which border on a sadism born of fear and frustration.

But our image is of another sort. It is an image of a child with a secure base to operate from as he forays out into a world that may be tough, a child with an accumulating reserve of experience that carries him courageously into new and risky ventures; a child with a concept of himself that nerves him to dare. It is anything but a soft and sentimental picture. For it assumes that life takes strength, and it is based on faith that a rugged inward strength can grow to a level of power most men never know they have."

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Sometime in the long, dim distant past someone conceived the idea that the superintendent of schools should write an annual report to be published in the annual school report. The content of most of these reports has been pretty much as the term conotates i.e., a recitation of past happenings, and I don't use that term in the sense it is presently being used by some segments of our society.

I have never given it much thought, but a review of my reports, over the years, will reveal that I have ignored the strict interpretation of the word "report", but instead have spent my time gazing wistfully into the future, predicting ominous happenings — there goes that word again — and occasionally prognosticating accurately the dire consequences of procrastination.

I feel no compulsion to change my strategy as I approach the conclusion of my tenure but I will attempt to look back as I look ahead. This assumes that I will be temporarily blessed with much greater physical capabilities than Cyclops.

Education used to concern itself with the Three R's or what is now called the basics and for the agrarian society of the early days of our country the ability to read and cypher a bit was adequate. However, little by little the great strides in technical knowledge began to make life more complicated and educators, in an attempt to meet the needs of society, changed their emphasis from basic education to educating the whole child.

It was at this point where we ran into trouble. At first educational proponents of change had little trouble in selling new ideas in teaching. We dropped phonics for sight reading, we joined History, Geography and other basic courses in the social science area and taught social studies, we adopted the so-called new-math, we ungraded classes, we involved the Joplin Plan, we departmentalized our elementary schools, we instituted CBA Chemistry and PSSC Physics and made a raft of other assorted

changes in an attempt to keep abreast of the needs of mankind in this ever changing and growing complex world. As our changes were put into effect we learned at least one thing and that is that there is a great deal of truth in the old adage, "that what is good for the goose is not always good for the gander". We have known right along that all youngsters are not alike but in too many instances we tried to place them in the same program and while some youngsters profited from their new experiences an equal number suffered from them. Today we have almost as many answers to educational problems as we have educators and probably the answers are correct when we talk about a particular child or a particular group of children.

There are those who would say that educational practices have gone from slight confusion to chaos but I don't quite buy that. Educators have made a sincere effort to improve the product of their efforts but lacking specific goals and the present desires on the part of parents and student to achieve beyond their capacities to do so have confused the picture to the extent education is probably overly criticized.

It may be that educators in an attempt to solve the complexities of the learning process have taken themselves too seriously and need to go back to the basic education philosophy and used the knowledge gained during that period of "great experimentalization" when and where there is merit in doing so.

The above was written with full knowledge that in many instances that is just what we are doing. We find phonics has returned to its rightful place in the teaching of reading; we have found that the new math isn't for everyone and are adjusting to its use; we have found out that the new emphasis in several subject areas has merit for certain youngsters but that the old emphasis provided a better contribution to a sizable group. What I am saying is that educators the same as scientists have to experiment with new ideas; but unlike science which can usually be worked out by formula prior to experimentation, children are individuals and rarely react the same to the presented motivation even though often similar. Educators are not as confused as to where they are going and how they are going to get there as it sometimes may appear but are moving for-

ward even though at times it appears to be in a somewhat disorderly fashion.

If given a chance, I predict that the next twenty-five years will see great progress on the part of the educator to improve the learning process and I regret that I shall not be a part of it.

Some of the above was written with "tongue in cheek". It was an attempt to express some truths, to make light some of our experimental errors and to express confidence that education is progressing as fast as most segments of our society outside of the field of technology.

In closing, I do want to express my gratitude to the many school board members with whom I have worked; the excellent office staff, with which I have always been blessed, the hundreds of teachers with whom I have been associated, the citizens, without whose support our schools could not have operated and last, but certainly not least, Polly, who never complained once about those hundreds of evenings she spent alone while I attended meetings, for making my tenure enjoyable; a simple and sincere THANKS!

Report of the Forest Fire Warden and District Chief

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking material and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

FIRE PERMIT

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

EXCEPTIONS

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

PENALTIES

- For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
- For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland, maximum fine is \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.
