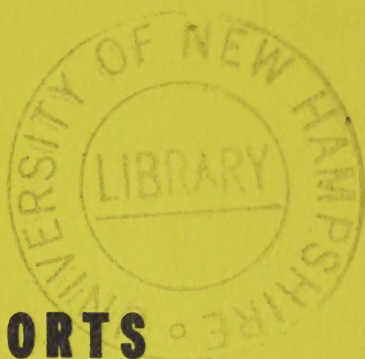

## GAFNEY LIBRARY, Inc.

Gafney Library, Inc. is a growing and vital part of your community with approximately 255 adult borrowers and 230 juvenile, plus school borrowers and the personnel and patients at Carroll County Home. Circulation continues to increase with a total for 1969 of 14,173 as compared to 12,646 for 1968.

The Book Purchasing Committee, consists of Mrs. Mildred Turner, Mrs. Lauriel Soucy, Mrs. Lydia Kennett, Mrs. Edna Manzer, Mrs. Hazel MacBrien, and Mr. Kenneth Beaupre, School Principal, meets quarterly to discuss and select new books. They endeavor to meet the varied interests and needs of the readers, and their success is indicated by the increase in circulation, as well as by favorable comments by patrons.

In 1969 new book purchases were 170, of which 37 non-fiction were purchased with State Aid Funds. In addition, 323 books were donated, making a total of 824 acquired for the year. The total number of volumes now on our shelves is 7,973. This growing collection necessitated the addition of three double bookcases and two more are on order.

The Bookmobile called four times during the year and we borrowed a total of 3110 plus 138 specially requested direct from the State Library. This made Gafney Library second in the State in usage of Bookmobile service.

Thanks to the generosity of Columbia and R.C.A. Record Companies and individual donors, Gafney now has a varied record collection totaling 210. The records are available for loan to adults on a two weeks basis similar to the book loans. 80 records were loaned in 1969.

At the September Annual Meeting the following were reelected: President, Mr. Arthur Burleigh; Vice President, Mr. Horace Richter; Treasurer, Mr. Alden Young; Secretary, Mrs. Hazel MacBrien; Directors, Mrs. Adelaide Hughes and Mr. Richard Zarse.

The Summer Storytime was omitted in 1969 as there was an excellent all day State-sponsored Recreation Program for the children of the community.

Friends of Wakefield Libraries donated \$200.00 to Gafney Library for children's books. The money was realized from the Summer Book Sale of donated books held at the Town Hall, Sanbornville. A mixture of Juvenile fiction and non-fiction was purchased, with the emphasis on "I Can Read" books for the lower grades.

During the School year the monthly visits to the library by pupils of Paul School was continued with the Librarian selecting books sent down to second and third grades in Union.

With the opening in April of the new Carroll County Home, Gafney Library changed their book service from bi-monthly to weekly. Mr. Alden Young, assisted by Mr. Walter Wentworth, delivered 30 books plus 20 paperbacks each week. They change the assortment in the four carts and return the oldest dated books to the library. Gafney's paperback supply is entirely donated, so please don't discard your paperbacks. Give them to the library to help in this worthy service. There are approximately 450 books in current use at the Carroll County Home.

An Essay Contest was sponsored by Gafney Library for Wakefield students, grades four through eight. Winners were awarded books of their choosing. They were as follows: Grade Four - Janice Glennon "My Trip to the White Mountains", Grade Five - Sally Shea "The Tennessee Walking Horse", Grade Six - tie - Cynthia Fox "A Helping Hand", Rita Hickey "A Happy Birthday", Grade Seven - Lois Zaprazalka "The Procrastinators", Grade Eight - Ricky Colbath "The Negro Ghettos". Judges were Mrs. Winnifred Whittaker, Mrs. Martha Towle and Miss Alena Wilson.

Your Librarian had to take an enforced leave of absence during the last part of May and the months of June and July. Mr. Alden Young, Trustee, was Acting Librarian Tuesday and Thursday evenings and Saturday both sessions. Mrs. Arthur Manzer and Mrs. Joseph Olimpio also donated their services, on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, Mrs. Manzer during May and June and Mrs. Olimpio in July. Mrs. Lauriel Soucy substituted when needed.

Gafney Library is open three days a week from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m., Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday. If you have not yet discovered the variety of reading pleasure available, resolve that this year you will take advantage of this abundance of free reading enjoyment.

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1969 fire season was a quiet one in this area. Frequent rains kept the danger to a minimum and there were few violations. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follows:

### Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9 a.m. and after 5 p.m.

### Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

### Penalties

1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.

3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland maximum fine of \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.

The New Hampshire State Board of Education has recently approved new minimum standards for the elementary schools of the state. This has many implications for the Wakefield School District. The local district must develop a plan for the implementation of these new standards no later than September 1, 1972. However, for districts planning a building program, this program must include spaces to meet the requirements of the standards now. If not, the State Department of Education will not approve these plans. This approval is necessary in order to make the district eligible for state building aid.

In the following paragraphs, an attempt has been made to summarize these standards in order that the Board and the District will be informed as far in advance as possible.

The pupil teacher ratio in grades 1 and 2 must be 25 to 1 or less; in grades above the first and second, 30 to 1, or less.

Each elementary school must add to its offerings, if it has not already done so, the following subjects: art, health, music, and physical education. It must also provide services in the fields of library, guidance, and health. The district must make provisions

for special education. If the district maintains a middle school or a junior high school, it must furnish opportunities in industrial arts and in home economics.

Each school must provide library services with a certified librarian available. For schools of 150 to 300 children, there must be 1,000 square feet of library space available; for enrollments of 300 to 500, it must have 2,000 square feet. The basic book collection must include 6,000 books. The annual budget must include an amount of money equal to \$5.00 per pupil to be expended annually for library purposes.

When attempting to meet the building standards for elementary schools, the following must be considered. Sites for elementary schools must be at least five acres in size, plus one acre for each 100 pupils. A 300 pupil elementary school, therefore, would require eight acres for site. Each classroom, when new construction is undertaken, must include at least 900 square feet, or 30 square feet per pupil.

In regard to the professional staff, all staff members must be certified by the teacher certification office of the State Department of Education. Other staffing requirements are as follows:

The principal must be employed on a full time basis in schools with an enrollment of 300, on a half time basis for schools with less enrollment. There must be a school secretary for schools with an enrollment of 300 or more.

The above summary, of course, does not include all the details of the newly established standards, but does indicate some of the main things which must be

considered in any long range planning. The immediate conclusion is that this will cost money for equipment, for materials, for building expansion or renovation, and for staffing.

It would seem to the undersigned that if these standards are to be met by the local districts, there must be a change in the present method of financing education in New Hampshire. It does not seem fair to add this additional burden to the presently used property tax base.

At this writing, we are planning to phase in grades 9 - 12 next September in the AREA Concept with Rochester and Wakefield. Grades 7 - 8 may have to be delayed another year due to a lack of facilities.

In closing, we would like to express our appreciation for the cooperation received from the local citizenry, School Board, and professional staff of the Wakefield School District.
