TOWN WARRANT The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Boscawen in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Boscawen on Tuesday, the 10th *** day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- a. Town Officers' Salaries
- b. Town Officers' Expenses
- c. Election & Registration
- d. Expense Town Hall & Town Buildings
- e. Employees' Social Security
- f. Police Department
- g. Fire Departments
- h. Blister Rust & Care of Trees
- i. Insurance

- k. Health Officer-Hospitals Art. 4 & 5
- l. Vital Statistics
- m. Sewer Maintenance
- n. Town Dump & Garbage Removal
- o. Highways & Bridges
- p. Street Lighting
- q. Town Road Aid

- s. Town Poor & Old Age Assistance
- t. Memorial & Old Home Days
- u. Parks & Playgrounds Art. 6, 7 & 8

*** Business meeting for Appropriations only will be called for 7:30 in the evening.

3. To see if the Town will vote to empower the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expense of the Town until the taxes are paid to the Treasurer.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Concord Hospital.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Franklin Hospital.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for use at Rolfe Park.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Penacook Youth Center.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Community Park. (Balance \$124.78)

9. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to transfer or sell property taken by Town in default of Redemption from Tax Sale.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,800 for the purchase of a new highway truck to replace the small G. M. C. and authorize the sale or trade of the truck to be replaced.

11. By Petition – To see what sum of money the Town of Boscawen will raise to provide a crossing guard for the protection of those children who walk to and from the Main Street School.

12. To appropriate a sum for the Town's share of operation of a Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,406.50 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning studies, technical assistance and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.

13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a dog ordinance, which will call for constant control of dogs by their owners at all times, either by leash, chain or enclosure, and to give the Selectmen full authority to enforce this ordinance.

14. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan service in any class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00.

15. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to transfer any unexpended balance of money from one appropriation to another.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking material and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

FIRE PERMIT

A *fire permit* is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be *prior to 9:00 a. m. and after 5:00 p. m.*

EXCEPTIONS

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Rangers Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

PENALTIES

1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.

2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.

3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving is the same penalties as in (1) above.

4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland, maximum fine is \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.

BOSCAWEN PLANNING BOARD

Two years ago the Town voted to become a member of a regional planning agency. The Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission has been formed, and Boscawen is represented by two members appointed by the Selectmen. This year's Town Meeting Warrant contains an article proposing to appropriate Boscawen's share of the budget. Thus, the voters will decide whether or not the Town will participate in this endeavor. A brief explanation follows.

The Commission will seek answers to problems which come with rapid population growth. Its work is not binding on the Town. Of immediate interest is the sewer project. Membership in the Commission will enhance the Town's eligibility for increased grant assistance under Public Law 660. Based on the Engineer's estimated costs (already 4 years old) this additional sum would be about \$50,000. This is by no means the only advantage which should come from our participation in regional planning.

The Town's share for 1970 is \$1406.50. Based on 1969 figures, when the Town rate was \$5.65 per \$100., this would increase the tax rate by about .02 per \$100. On property valued at \$8000., this would amount to about \$1.60. This looks like a good investment.

COMMISSIONERS REPORT

New construction in 1969 consisted of 558 feet of pipe on Knowlton Road, 585 ft. on Goodhue Road and 525 ft. on Martin's Avenue.

The pipe on Martin's Avenue replaced a plastic dead-end line that had given us a lot of trouble.

Our 1970 plans call for completion of the line on Goodhue Road to Route 3.

We had the Atkinson lot surveyed and title searched and everything was cleared as represented to the board so we purchased another third of the lot, per vote of the 1969 annual meeting.

All bids on painting the tank were over our appropriation so we postponed this job until this year.

Our chlorinating equipment gave us trouble all summer due to the booster pumps loss of pressure. New parts were ordered in August and delivered in late November. On December 12 the engineers were here and everything has been going good since that time. We accepted the station as of December 12, 1969.

For the 12 months ended 12/31/69, we pumped approximately 164,537,000 gallons of water.
