TO THE CITIZENS OF CENTER HARBOR:

There has been a substantial influx of people to New Hampshire in the past few years, and this trend seems to be increasing. Not merely summer residents or people desiring the use of our natural recreation facilities, are flocking to our territory, but year-round residents who enjoy the beauty of our State and all that it has to offer. It is predicted that our State in the next 10 or 20 years will be much more heavily populated than it is today. This, of course, will mean that more industry and commercial businesses will be coming to our vicinity.

It is a concern to all of us as to how we wish Center Harbor to expand in the future. At present the Planning Board feels that it is safe to assume that Center Harbor is primarily a residential and agricultural community, wherein is located Belkmap College. It is the desire of the Planning Board to ascertain whether or not the citizens of the town wish the community to remain in its present state and would favor the Town's being zoned primarily as a residential-agricultural community.

Summer before last the Planning Board circulated a questionnaire seeking the answer to this question from Center Harbor residents. The response, though highly indicative, was so small that it could not be considered reliable. The Board wishes to act in accordance with the desires of the majority of the townspeople.

Therefore, we would greatly appreciate your showing your preference in this matter by marking the desired box below, and returning this paper to the Planning Board either at the Town Meeting on March 10th, or by mail 10 The Planning Board, Center Harbor, N. H.



To the inhabitants of the Town of Center Harbor in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Nichols Memorial Library in said Center Harbor on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at two of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Highway Department which includes care and maintenance of Sidewalks, Wharf Area and Fountain.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$4,700.00 for the maintenance of the Center Harbor Volunteer Fireman's Association.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in the amount of \$2,000.00 for Welfare and Town Poor.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for Parks and Playgrounds, including Band Concerts and Hiring of a qualified Life Guard at the Town Beach, and if so, how much.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Assistance for Class V Roads, the Town to raise \$353.29 and the State will contribute \$2,355.28.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in the amount of \$100.00 for aid to the Family Service Association.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for aid to the Laconia Hospital and if so, how much.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$124.64 which is 1/2,000th of 1% of the net valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region. (By Request.)
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the care of Shade Trees.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the use of Civil Defense.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on taxes paid in full within 15 days after the issue of the tax bills by the Collector.
- 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to negotiate for the purchase of a new Town Truck at a cost of not more than \$3,300.00.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to purchase and erect street and road signs throughout the Town. (By Request)
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 needed to complete payment of contract for construction of new Municipal Building.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 to hire the State Tax Commission to reappraise taxable property in the Town. (By Request.)
- 18. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan service in any class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint an official Town Historian. (By Request)

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to establish a public cemetery on land owned by the Town, located at the north end of the Drake Field, so called, on Route 25B. Subject to the provisions of Chater 289, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Parks and Playgrounds Commission whose duty shall be, under the supervision and control of the Selectmen, to maintain, preserve and care for the Town Parks and Playgrounds; and to make rules and regulations for the use therof.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by the Tax Collector's Deed.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to furnish ambulance service to the Town.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in Anticipation of Taxes.
- 25. To choose agents or committees in relation to any articles of the Warrant and hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen.
- 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of the Planning Board

Town of Center Harbor

Members:

Center Harbor's seven-member Planning Board was essentially unchanged during 1969 except for the resignation of Mrs. James de Sousa, Secretary, early in the year and the expiration of the term of Mrs. Orion Bickford (see 1968 Report, page 47, Annual Report, Town of Center Harbor). The selectmen appointed Mr. Philip Bartlett to replace Mrs. Bickford, and Mr. Edward Dane was appointed to the unexpired term of Mrs. Louise de Sousa. Mrs. de Sousa rendered valuable service to the Board from the time of her appointment in May, 1966. She served as Secretary from April, 1967, until her resignation in January, 1969.

Present members of the Board (December, 1969) are us follows:

Philip H. Bartlett Edward Dane (Secretary) Mrs. Roger A. Kelley Rob Roy MacGregor (Chairman) Carl R. Marshall Aaron C. Smith (Selectman) Lewis E. Woodaman, Jr.

Meetings:

The Planning Board held 24 regular meetings during 1969, and also joint meetings with Meredith and Moultonboro in April and May. Mr. William B. S. Leong of the firm of Alonzo B. Reed, Inc., Planning Consultants, attended the January 19th meeting.

Two hearings were held, one on July 9th and one on August 6th. A Special Town Meeting was held on August 27th. Two meetings were held with representatives of firms seeking development of land on Squam Lake. Over thirty letters were written in answer to inquiries and on other business.

The Chairman attended meetings of the Lakes Region Planning Commission, the Lakes Region Clean Water Association, and other groups.

1969 Activities:

Activity of the Planning Board in 1969 centered on three principal areas: furthering the Town's Comprehensive Plan (commonly called "701" after the federal law authorizing aid for this), initiating modified zoning in the Town, and deciding on subdivision requests that came before the Board.

Comprehensive Planning:

Work on the Town's long-range plan has been delayed by scarcity of federal funds for this. In March, 1968, the Town appropriated \$5,000 as its share for hiring a planning consultant to develop a plan for the Town, and application was immediately made to the State for federal participation in the amount of \$10,000. Federal funds have not been sufficient to allocate this, and the Town has no choice but to await its turn as designated by the State Department of Resources and Economic Development (DRED). Meanwhile, a consultant has been chosen, the firm of Alonzo B. Reed. Inc., of Boston, Mass., and Manchester, N. H.: a program has been set up; and work will begin immediately on receipt of federal funds. In January, 1970, the Board received word from Mary Louise Hancock, State Planning Director, that DRED is again making request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for funds, specifically including the appropriation for Center Harbor. It is hoped that a beginning on the Plan will be made by the middle of 1970.

Zoning:

The Board has long recognized the Town's need for at least the "machinery" to provide zoning. In April, 1962, the Planning Board presented a zoning ordinance to the Town that was rejected by the voters at a special town meeting. Since 1967 the Board has sought ways to keep the control of the Town's development in the hands of its residents, and no method can achieve this end, under State law, other than zoning. Zoning will be one of the areas in the Town's longrange plan to be studied by the consultant.

Because our long-range plan has been delayed, the Board drew up a modified "zoning" ordinance and presented it to the townspeople at the two hearings in July and August. This ordinance was patterned almost exactly on the one enacted in March by the Town of Sandwich. At a Special Town Meeting August 26th the ordinance was passed and three important ends achieved: 1) the Town now has a legal instrument for zoning which can be amended is necessary to control unforeseen development that would be objectionable to a majority of the residents; 2) limitations have been set on buildings; and 3) specifications have been set for signs. The primary purpose of these controls is to preserve the rural and scenic appearance of the Town, to keep it attractive to residents and visitors alike. A Board of Adjustment has been appointed by the Selectmen so that variances may be granted when justified.

The Planning Board hopes that the Town will cooperate with it in working out further suitable land-use patterns in the Town. A separate letter on this is included in the Town's Annual Report.

Subdivision:

Two applications for development on Squam Lake came before the Board in 1969. One developer proposed an area of one-half-acre lots on Dog Cove. The other sought development of lots varying in size from three-fourths-acre to two acres on Sturtevant Bay.

The major problem in approving any subdivision in this area is the eventual effect of sewage on the quality of lake water, especially where development is adjacent to a lake. Use of the septic tank and leach field method was inherent in the plan of one developer, and the use of chemical toilets and holding tanks would have been required of homeowners by the other. Both applications were refused because the Board considered lot sizes too small for installing effective leach fields in the one case and in the other a costly policing problem would result if holding tanks were permitted.

The subdivision regulations of the Town expressly state that lot size where public sewage is not available shall be adequate for the operation of onlot sewerage systems (Sec. 5:20, Land Subdivision Regulations of the Town of Center Harbor) and that the soils map of the Town, made by the U. S. Soil Conservation Service, shall be used as a guide. Large parts of both areas are unsuitable both for homesites and for the use of the septic tank method of sewage disposal because of extremely adverse soil conditions. In the remainder of the areas, soils suitable for homesites are not capable of use for the septic tank method of sewage disposal and soils suitable for septic tanks are unsuited to use as homesites. After much consultation with the Soils Conservation Service, the Board concluded that no development should be allowed on swampy, poorly drained (Ridgebury) soils in areas within 1,000 feet of the lake shore and that at least two-acre lots should be required on the slightly higher, somewhat better drained (Acton) soils in these areas. Inquiry determined that holding tanks are not acceptable in Massachusetts by the State Department of Public Health except as a temporary expedient and that allowance of this method would involve the Town in a continual policing problem.

For these reasons, and to deal equitably with all persons, the Board is proposing to amend its subdivision regulations to restrict development on shorelines of public bodies of water within the boundaries of the Town to definite lot sizes dependent on soil type. A hearing will be held in late March to explain this to the voters. Pollution is a major problem, and in the long run it will be far cheaper to control it by curtailing over-development than by trying to clean it up after it occurs.

The Outlook for 1970:

Again, in 1970, the Planning Board is hopeful of getting a start on its Long-Range Comprehensive Plan. The availability of funds for this now looks promising. The plan should greatly assist in guiding Center Harbor's growth in a manner that will make it a more pleasing place for all in which to live.

The residents should be aware of many other problems which affect Center Harbor and concern the Board. Proper maintenance of the Town beach and bath house has been one, and it is hoped that a new recreation commission to be chosen by the Selectmen can handle this. A plan still needs to be made for the replacement of the Town's elm trees that have been lost from blight. The future of Center Harbor's elementary school is of immediate concern. Further work on zoning, already mentioned, is urgently needed. Much remains to be done on an open-space and conservation plan for the Town.

Some of our problems are of a regional nature. The Town should be aware that studies are underway for an East-West highway between Maine and New York State that may very well pass through Center Harbor. A transportation plan is urgently needed if any influence on route location is desired. Further work with the Lakes Region Planning Commission is desirable so that town plans are well coordinated with those of neighboring communities.

In conclusion, the Chairman wishes to acknowledge the generous aid of Belknap College in providing the materials and stenographic help for mimeographing the various copies of the zoning ordinance last August. The cooperation and aid of the Laconia Office of the Soils Conservation Service has been invaluable. In addition to carrying out detailed mapping of soils in some areas, the SCS has provided the Town with photographic slides of its soils maps and given other planning information at no cost. The willing support of all members of the Board is much appreciated, as is Mr. Philip Bartlett's help in acting as Secretary Pro Tem.

All residents are again reminded that Board meetings are held semi-monthly on Sunday evenings at Nichols Library. These are open to all; and your interest and help are most welcome.

Report of the Forest Fire Warden And District Chief

The 1969 fire season was a quiet one in this area. Frequent rains kept the danger to a minimum and there were few violations. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area: Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Penalties

- 1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- 2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland maximum fine of \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free of smokes in 1970.
