WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

L. S. THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ellsworth in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the School House in said Ellsworth on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to qualify for T. R. A. and raise the necessary amount for same.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the town officers and make appropriations of the same.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to have inventory blanks distributed at the time of taking inventory.
- 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for debts.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of lands taken by tax collectors deeds.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and make an appropriation to cover cost of same.

- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate fifty dollars, to help clean and restock Ellsworth Pond.

Annual Report of the Superintendent of Schools
To the Ellsworth School Board:

An October Budget of proposed expenditures for the school year of 1945-46 was filed with the State Board of Education in the hope that the School District may receive some state aid in December of 1946. Those proposed expenditures total \$713 which is \$521.84 more than the yield of a \$5 tax on the equalized valuation of \$38,232. In order to qualify for state aid any district must appropriate an amount for the support of elementary schools at least equal to a tax of \$3.50 on the equalized valuation. The minimum appropriation for Ellsworth will be \$133.81.

I hope the School District will qualify for State Aid which will be a welcome event for the people of Ellsworth.
