5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500.00 to purchase approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land from Fred A. Gleason, adjoining present highway property or take any other action relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (four hundred dollars) \$400.00 for Old Home Day or take any action relating thereto.

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook — yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carlessness — our carelessness. This, we — you — and I can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-of-doors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high fire danger or set up regulations — hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you -

- 1. Follow the warden's directions.
- 2. Secure the required burning permit.
- 3. Keep your fires under control.
- 4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
- 5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

Everyone will benefit by it.

REPORT OF PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD

The Planning Board voted to present a Zoning Ordinance to the voters again this year. Our regular meetings have, therefore, been occupied with discussion of the plans already drawn up and study of neighboring ordinances for possible improvement or clarifying of our articles.

As requested at last Town Meeting we have worked with the Public Service Co. as to the betterment of our street lighting. We had two meetings with officials of the company going over the survey and master plan which they drew up for our immediate and future improvement.

Our two public hearings presented both the Ordinance and the Street Lighting plans. A few changes resulting from these meetings were made in the Ordinance which makes us feel that we are now presenting a most careful safeguard for the Community's growth.

On the question of street lighting we prefer to postpone any changes.

HANCOCK TOWN LIBRARY TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR 1961

Many repairs and improvements were made to your library building to restore it to good condition and to help reduce the costs of operation. Details are listed herewith for your information.

1. The cellar windows were replaced with new ones and their frames were cemented in place.

2. The bulkhead door was repaired and the inside cellar door frame was cemented in place.

3. The oil burner was serviced.

4. The insides of all window sashes were painted.

5. The roofing in the valley between the old and new parts of the library were replaced. Thus we eliminated the need for shoveling off snow after each storm to prevent water leaking into the building. Also the slate roofing on part of the old building was replaced by asphalt shingles.

6. The outside of the windows and frames were painted with non-chalking paint to prevent discoloration of the brick walls beneath the windows.

7. Storm windows were installed on all windows. Five of them were combination windows to provide for ventilation. These windows are part of your program to reduce the cost of heating the building.

8. The front door was changed to swing outward to conform to the law for a public building. The door was also painted.

9. The outside lanterns were repaired and painted.

10. The handrails on the front steps were repaired and painted.

11. New lamps were installed at the librarian's desk.

12. 100-watt bulbs were installed in the table-lamps to improve the lighting.

13. Rubber matting was installed between the front door and the librarian's desk to provide a more durable floor covering.

14. Windows were washed inside and out prior to the installation of the storm windiws.

15. The floors were machine-cleaned and waxed.

16. New file boxes were provided for the charging of books on loan.

Only a beginning was made in the improvement of our book inventory.

To further our progress toward our objective of cutting the costs of operation we joined with the Church and the School to obtain a contract price for fuel oil. As a result the Library will save approximately \$50.00 on the cost of oil for the heating season of 1961-1962.

We have also saved \$43.00 by subscribing to magazines for multiple years instead of for single-year terms.

As a member of the Book-of-the-Month Club we have obtained many of our books at a low average cost because of its quantity purchases, book dividends, and five per cent credits for advance deposits on purchases. We earned \$2.50 in credit in five months.

The Library Trustees recommended to the Trustees of Trust Funds of the town that certain changes be made in some of the Trust Funds of the library and thereby increase the income to the library between \$100.00 and \$175.00 yearly.

The Trustees want to thank all persons who have contributed books and periodicals during the year. They also want to invite all Hancock people to present any suggestions which will help to make the library a better servant to you all. Send your ideas to any one of the Trustees.

We're continually described as a picturesque New New Hampshire town and it doesn't bother most of us a bit. Some sociologist might say (not ever having chatted with people on our lovely main street) that we are behind the times, outmoded. With no all night public washer and dryer, with no half acre size supermarket and no parking meters we are a shade different. Only a few of us live suffused in Hi Fi music. Ripe for exploitation some city real estate developer might say, licking his lips.

But there are some vigorous defenders of our way of life and some of them are responsible for getting the Nature Conservancy to acquire half of the so-called island in Nubanusit which will be called the Louis Cabot Preserve after Dr. Lloyd Briggs' grandfather. Sailing and canoeing are increasing with David and Toppy Bott, Tony and Peg Brown, Betsy Sheldon, Max Troesch and others active. Every year people keep their houses a little trimmer. And no thanks, if you please, to road salt eating holes in the body, the family car is a later model than some of us might otherwise own.

Things continue to cost more but in most cases we have more, John F. Kennedy and Democrats notwithstanding. We take the good with the bad, Charlie Adams might say. We also keep tension on the purse strings at Town Meeting as one of our distinguished observers from Japan, Professor Osumi, who was a guest of the Merwins, noted. Frugal as a result of the coldest January (without even one thaw), the deep snow cover and freezing water pipes? No. Just careful, according to new Selectman Valentine Gerrish.

There is another factor. Hancock is a town of 722 population with 130 over 65 (and still vigorous) and only half that number under 5. That's one thing - another is that our citizens own more taxable securities. As this money comes back to Town, it allows for some luxuries and eases by some \$24,000 the real estate taxes for everyone.

So we can be gay on Old Home Day heralded by Eleanor Amidon's effective posters. And we can bask in the sun when, like this year, we had a warm September and October and forgot the USSR's 50 megaton bomb, their pressure on Berlin and our abortive attempt to curb Castra in Cuba.

We do our part to help the nation be strong. Foster Avery, John and Paul Hill built at the Hancock Tool's newly located plant on the Greenfield Road the "columns" used by the Enos space shot to guage the force of the rocket thrust. Gargarin of the USSR was the first man to orbit the earth while New Hampshire's Alan B. Shepard entered and safely returned from space.

Quite naturally when we meet we are more concerned with local affairs despite the buffeting of the national news media. We note with pleasure that Tom Burchard heads the Sharon Arts Center. The ex-president, Bill Hill, also lives in town. The president of the Monadnock Community College lives in Hancock too. Brownie leaders this year were Geraldine Ware and Pearl Pickering. George Hampson is now a director of N. H. Ball Bearings. And Fran Russ won the Woman's Club sewing contest and Marjorie Noble is still the Woman's Club State Treasurer.

These things are close to home. To go on, we applaud Jo Ann Stover's success with "If Everybody Did." And the enterprise of Joan Watson and Edith Baker in setting up as part of our summer scene the Sheldon Gallery as well as The Garden Shop. These complement rather than compete with the Wood's Flax Wheel, the Mannings' The Ivy Shop, Reaveley's Gift Shop and Pat Holsaert's decorating shop.

Week by week these doings and many others are chronicled by Nancy West who adds depth to her news items to the Concord Monitor and other papers by reminding us of significant events of the past such as the Stoddard-Marlow fire of 20 years ago, a year that included the nearer conflagration on Skatutakee. Anita Chace sends her interesting gleanings to the Transcript.

Thus we keep track of such events as St. Patrick's Church talent program which included appreciated offerings by Quinns (who lost their barn in the only fire of the year), Almon Senechal, Noralie Sysyn, Dorothy Clark, Catharine Stahl and a duet by Virginia and Regina Kelleher. We don't just live in Hancock, we're part of it.

There was, to bring to a close an eventful year, an incredibly beautiful Christmas with a foot and a half of fluffy snow. As Kay Flindell noted, our roads are walled with green in summer, gold in autumn, grey in winter but this Christmas there was a pure white curtain hung behind the plowed snow by the side of the road.

D. REPORT OF DISTRICT CLERK

Hancock School District Meeting March 11, 1961

The annual Hancock District School Meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Robert English, at 4 p.m. on March 11, 1961. After the Moderator read the Warrant, a vote was taken to recess the meeting until 8 p.m. at which time Articles 5 through 10 would be considered. The Moderator then declared the polls open for voters to cast their ballots for School District Officers — Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and a Member of the School Board for three years — covered by the first four Articles.

Mrs. Alice M. Brown and Mrs. Pauline Crowell acted as ballot clerks.

At 8 o'clock the polls were declared closed by the Moderator who then read Articles 5 through 10 of the warrant. Voting was as follows:

Article 5. Motion by Arthur Tremblay of the School Board.

I move that the salaries of the district officers for the ensuing year be as follows: Chairman of the school board \$75.00, each other member \$50,00, treasurer \$40.00, clerk \$15.00, moderator \$10.00, ballot clerks \$1.00 per hour each, auditors \$1.00 per hour each. This motion passed.

Article 6. Motion by Mrs. Mary Garland of the School Board.

I move that the reports as printed be accepted and placed on file with the clerk. The motion passed.

Article 7. Nelson Gay, and Valentine W. Gerrish were reelected as Auditors.

Article 8. Motion by Arthur Tremblay.

Moved that the school district raise and appropriate \$52,117.00 and to authorize and direct the school board to apply against said appropriation such income as is estimated by the school board exclusive of state aid, and upon the determination of the amount of state aid to be received by the school district during the next fiscal year, to authorize and direct the school board to apply against such appropriation the sum to be received from state aid and with the school district clerk certify to the selectmen the balance as an assessment to be raised by the town for school purposes.

Otis Wilder questioned the Contingency Fund increase. It was explained that this seems necessary so that there won't be any possibility of a deficit next year.

Although Supt. Lewis Foote was prepared with figures to answer all questions, his right to speak was challenged by Warren Pierce and the members of the school board did the explaining.

Karl Upton and Gaius Merwin asked for information regarding the \$4000 increase in tuition. At this point Mr. Foote gave the per pupil costs and the added number of tuition pupils which account for the increase over last year.

Otis Wilder and Julius Pickering questioned the town's having to pay for the fifth grade attending Sargent Camp for a week. Mrs. Garland gave a clear picture of the advantages of attending the camp and of how their teacher correlates the knowledge gained there with their regular school work. Mrs. Garland said that the school board considers this a valid educational expense. Mr. Dillon explained that the PTA helped out on this project at first but they consider it a town responsibility now. The vote in favor of this motion was unanimous.

Article 9. Motion by George Hampson of the School Board. I move that the school board be authorized to make application for and to accept on behalf of the district such sums of monies as may be made available under the National Defense Education Act, Public Law 85-864 (for purposes outlined under Titles III, V, and VIII thereof), and that the district appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for said purpose(s), \$200.00 of which amount shall be raised as an assessment by the town, and a like amount to be received from federal sources.

Arthur Tremblay said that a TV has been purchased for educational purposes at the school using part of the amount voted last year (said amount matched by state). This motion passed. Article 10. Motion by Mrs. Mary Garland.

I move that the district raise and appropriate the sum of \$504.40 as a deficiency appropriation to be made available for current expenses prior to June 15, 1961. The motion passed unanimously.

The Moderator then declared the meeting recessed to count the votes on the 82 ballots cast. Results were as follows:

For Moderator, Robert English, 59 votes

For Clerk, Adella C. Eva, 54 votes

For Treasurer, William W. Brown, 42 votes

For School Board Member for 3 years, Arthur A. Tremblay, 69 votes.

The Moderator administered the oaths of office and the meeting was adjourned at 9:25 p.m.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Hancock qualified to vote in the district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 10th day of March, 1962, at 4:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subjects embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants forthcoming under Titles III, V. or VIII, or any combination thereof, of the National Defense Education Act, Public Law 85-864 or any or all grants of other funds which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire under the provisions of the National Defense Education Act.

There were three changes in the teaching staff this year. Mrs. Joyce Wilkes replaced Mrs. Edna Howard as teacher of grades five and six, Mrs. Dorothy Whippie replaced Mrs. Elizabeth M. Weston as teacher of grades three and four, and Mrs. Martha Desrochers replaced Mrs. Donna Ross in grades one and two.

B. SCHOOL PROGRAM

School opened on September 6, 1961, with an enrollment of 89. Changes in the school staff included: Mrs. Martha Desrochers, grades one and two, replacing Mrs. Donna Ross; Mrs. Dorothy Whippie, grades three and four, replacing Mrs. Elizabeth Weston; and Mrs. Joyce Wilkes, grades five and six, replacing Mrs. Edna Howard.

During the summer the building was given an excellent cleaning, and minor repair and painting jobs were completed by Robert Fish, custodian.

Educational endeavors of the staff have included: attendance of Mrs. Dorothy Whippie at the New England Reading Association Conference in October at Swampscott, Massachusetts, extension course from Boston University by Mrs. Joyce Wilkes, and extension courses and summer session at Keene Teachers College by Mr. Ernest Gendron.

In conjunction with the November meeting of the Parent-Teacher Association, National Education Week was observed, at which time the parents had an opportunity to enjoy the exhibits of pupil work and also to arrange for teacher-parent conferences. The P.T.A. also continued its support of the in-school vitamin program and the annual dental clinic. During the year membership in the group showed considerable increase.

The teaching staff has continued its intensive effort in the area of phonics. We are of the opinion that the Spalding Method, introduced two years ago, has definitely increased the reading and spelling abilities and capacities of our pupils. It is anticipated that an instructional conference will be held within this supervisory union during the coming summer.

To further the improvement in the areas of language arts, new texts have been provided in grades two through six. Renovation of a second-floor area has provided for an in-school library which in the near future should supplement the advantages and experiences gained in the frequent visits to the Town Library, where Mrs. Richardson's assistance and co-operation has been most helpful.

With funds provided under the National Defense Education Act, we have purchased and installed a portable television set. The educational programs in elementary science and in New Hampshire history are of value in providing materials not readily available in texts and reference books.

As in past years the S.R.A. intelligence tests were given during October in grades one, three, and five. The testing program for grades seven and eight took place in November and consisted of the Metropolitan Achievement Battery and the Pitner General Aibility Tests. These tests are part of a state-wide testing program for grades seven and eight and are given in conjunction with the Test Service and Advisement Center in Dunbarton. The spring testing series, to be given in March, will include the Metropolitan Achievement Tests for grades one and two and the Iowa Test of Basic Skills for grades three through six.

The annual outdoor educational experience for pupils in grades five and six for this calendar year will be held the week of May 7 at Sargent Camp. Alternate dates have been secured on an annual basis so that pupils in these grades throughout the supervisory union will have experiences at the camp both in the fall and spring on alternate years.

No report can be considered complete without mention of the Halloween Parade of grades one through four, and the individual room parties which followed. The annual Christmas program for all the children of the town was sponsored by the Sportsmen's Club. Pupils of grades one through eight presented a program of Christmas carols and choral speaking. The Town Hall was appropriately decorated for the occasion.

In conclusion may we extend our appreciation to the school board and the citizens of Hancock for their continued support of the school and its program.
