SCHOOL REPORT.

To the Inhabitants of School District of Haverhill:

We herewith present the fifth annual report of the schools in said district for the school year ending February 28, 1891.

For convenience, the District was divided as follows: Districts Nos. 1, 2, 9, 10, 15 and 17, to W. F. Westgate. Districts 3, 4, 5, 12 and 19, to E. R. Weeks. Districts 6, 8, 14, 18 and 20, to W. F. True.

DISTRICTS NOS. 1 AND 17.

These districts are connected with Haverhill Academy, under a business arrangement with the trustees.

PRIMARY DEPARTMENT.

The Winter term of this department was under the management of Miss Addie J. Tromblee. The school was fortunate in securing the services of Miss Tromblee, who has worked unceasingly to interest and instruct the children under her charge. Miss Tromblee has all the qualifications of a good teacher. The scholars were all interested, the order

and department were good and the term a pleasant and profitable one. This department should be removed from the Academy building, and the little ones should be in a building by themselves.

INTERMEDIATE DEPARTMENT.

Miss May M. Weeks taught the Spring term and gave satisfaction to all.

Teacher of the Winter term, Miss Cora A. Jeffers. Everything connected with this term has been satisfactory. Great improvement has been made in order, department and in recitations. The teacher has worked hard and been faithful. The scholars have learned well, the parents are all satisfied, and not one word of complaint have we heard from any one. A good teacher makes a good school.

DISTRICT NO. 2.

Spring and Fall terms taught by Miss Caroline H. Lang, and with good success. The first part of the Winter term was taught by Wm. H. Langmaid. Mr. Langmaid showed himself a natural teacher. Good order and thoroughness in recitations characterized the school while under his management. After teaching seven weeks he was taken ill and Miss Lillie M. Wilson taught the remainder of the term. Everything went well until the last week, when some of the larger boys became noisy and unruly.

DISTRICT NO. 3.

(North Haverhill.)

The Grammar school was taught by Miss Ona Lane, the entire year; the Primary by Miss Emma C. Weeks, the entire year. They are experienced teachers, and nothing need be said, only in their praise.

DISTRICT NO. 4.

(Pine Woods.)

The Spring term was taught by Miss Emma Carbee of Bath, a teacher of large experience, and gave good satisfaction. The Fall term was taught by Miss Edith Bailey. A

little more interest in the school would make her a successful teacher. Winter term taught by Miss Jennie Glines. Her school was small, but she gave good satisfaction to parents and pupils.

DISTRICT NO. 5.

(Brier Hill.)

The spring term was taught by Miss Etta Thayer of Bath. At the beginning of the school, order was lacking, but later she improved in order and the small scholars learned remarkably well. The Fall and Winter terms were taught by Miss Mariam Brown. At the examination the scholars hesitated about answering the questions. Miss Brown is a faithful teacher and works hard for the success of her school.

DISTRICT NO. 6.

This school has been taught the entire year by Miss Nellie A. Bard, in a most satisfactory manner. We are sorry to say that some of the parents did not appreciate the teacher's earnest and faithful efforts to instruct their children.

DISTRICT NO. 7.

This district was under the supervision of the school board of Piermont.

DISTRICT NO. 8.

The Spring term was taught by Miss M. E. Harris, and was a model for order and deportment. Fall term taught by Miss Blanche Quimby, who, like her predecessor, did not have the co-operation of the parents, and thus failed to accomplish what they might otherwise have done. Winter term taught by Norman J. Page. This was Mr. Page's first school, and proved very satisfactory, he having many of the qualifications necessary for a successful teacher.

DISTRICTS NOS. 9 AND 15.

Summer and Fall terms taught by Miss Cora M. Burnham. Summer term was satisfactory in every way, but a

little lack of order towards the close of Fall term. Winter term taught by Mr. Albert F. Kimball; school still in session.

DISTRICT NO. 10.

Summer and Fall terms taught by Miss Hattie A. Bailey. Although her first attempt at teaching, she gave good satisfaction to the committee, and taught a good school. Winter term was taught by Miss Blanche L. Quimby. The Winter term of this school was one of the best in town; scholars all interested, order perfect, and the advancement quite marked.

DISTRICT NO. 12.

(Horse Meadow.)

The Spring and Fall terms were taught by Miss Mamie Lang of Orford. She worked hard for the success of her school and gave good satisfaction. Winter term taught by Miss May M. Weeks, with usual good success, and the scholars made good improvement.

DISTRICT NO. 14.

Spring term taught by Miss Hattie M. Sherman. The order was not quite what it ought to have been, but the teacher won the good will of the scholars, and by so doing kept a satisfactory term. The Fall term was taught by Miss Jennie Glines, and in some respects was quite successful. Winter term taught by Miss Mabel Kimball, who proved a competent, energetic and thorough teacher; hence a very successful term of school.

DISTRICT NO. 18.

Spring term taught by Miss Blanche L. Quimby; Fall term by Miss Alta M. Worthen. Both teachers had good success in gaining the confidence of their scholars, and good progress was made. No school in the winter, owing to the poor condition of the school house, which is a disgrace to the town.
