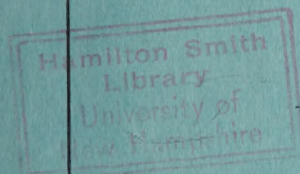

TOWN WARRANTTHE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Lisbon, in the county of Grafton and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to make appropriations for the same.

Art. 3. To see if the town will fix and determine the compensation to be paid each of the town officers.

Art. 4. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and special committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

Art. 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how the same shall be divided.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to discount all taxes paid on or before such time as the town may vote.

Art. 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries in the town of Lisbon.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200 for the Pine Blister Rust control.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to light the streets of Lisbon Village District all night during the entire year; Sugar Hill from the dwelling of H. J. Field to Hotel Lookoff, from the Baptist church through Lovers' Lane to the Franconia line, from the Goodnow school house to the Homestead, and from the Lisbon and Franconia town line to the dwelling of Joseph Pelletier; Sugar Hill and vicinity to be lighted the entire year until midnight, and from 5 a. m. until daylight, excepting the lights from the Homestead to Hotel Lookoff for six months of the year; all the above premises to be lighted with electricity, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nursing Association.

Art. 12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Art. 13. To see if the town will accept State Aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$973.37.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to plow the town roads, and if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to oil such roads in the town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to construct and repair cement and other sidewalks at Sugar Hill, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the purpose of advertising the town of Lisbon.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to aid in the construction and maintenance of a community skating rink for use during the winter season of 1941-1942; the money, if raised, to be expended by a committee of three appointed by the moderator.

Art. 19. To see how much money the town will raise for the support of the poor, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 20. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance, and to appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate not exceeding \$150 for the purpose of holding band concerts.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to improve the road from the Jameson property to the Hamilton property.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to improve the road leading from the old school house in Center District, past Ora Jesseman's.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums as they deem necessary, in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Direct relief expenditures for town cases showed a decrease in 1941 of \$465.16 under that of the preceding year. There was a corresponding increase of \$921.33 in the amount expended for county cases. This slight shift of the burden of cost of relief from town to county can probably be attributed to the operation of our 1933 Settlement Law which makes it easier to lose a town settlement, and this trend will probably continue. The total cost of Direct Relief in the town of Lisbon, for both town and county cases, was \$456.17 higher in 1940 than in 1939.

The town's contribution to Old Age Assistance grants (25 percent of such grants) was only \$59.85 greater in 1940 than in 1939. This is rather surprising in view of the relaxation in the eligibility requirements for applicants. There should be somewhat of an increase in this category for 1941, but after that this figure should remain fairly constant.

Report of the Librarian of**THE LISBON PUBLIC LIBRARY**

The circulation of books at the library for 1940 was 21,984. This was some less than for the previous year. It is probably due in part to the fact that more people have been employed during the year and partly to the fact that the North Country now has a Bookmobile making regular trips to a number of the outlying sections that formerly came to the village library for its reading. Much reference work has been done in the library itself but this does not show in the circulation, as only the books which are taken from the library are recorded.

Eighty-eight books have been borrowed from the New Hampshire State Library and four from a library in Texas. These were largely for geneological and other research work, the material for which could not be supplied here. The librarian is always glad to try to secure for you, either from the Library Commission or from the State library, any books that you may desire. It is also possible now to borrow phonograph records from Concord by paying the transportation. A catalogue of these records can be consulted at the Lisbon library.

The library has bought during the year 194 adult books and 110 junior books. Of these 98 were non-fiction. The Encyclopedia Americana has been added to the reference room and fills a need long felt for an adequate adult encyclopedia. As a supplement to this

publication is issued each year, it can, for a small sum, be kept up to date even in the fast-changing world of today.

A rack for magazines has been placed in the reading room and on it and on an adjoining shelf can now be found all periodicals that are ready for circulation. The current issues only are kept on the table. This saves much confusion and makes it much easier to find the numbers that may be taken from the library.

A number of books from the estate of Mrs. Alice B. Oliver have been given to the library by her daughters, Mrs. English and Mrs. Sawyer. This gift adds much especially to the list of non-fiction, and is greatly appreciated. Books have also been given by Mr. Morgan, Mrs. Stiles and Mrs. Porter; magazines by Mrs. H. B. Moulton, Mrs. Raymond Lang, Mrs. B. S. Webb, Mrs. S. J. Sharpless, Mrs. Chandler Aldrich and the D. A. R.

It was found that some from outside the village could not conveniently reach the library before eight, so the closing time has been extended to eight-thirty.
