TOWN MEETING — MARCH 13, 1962

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Town of Nelson

The meeting was called to order at 1:15 p. m. by the Moderator who then read the Town Warrant and the following articles were voted on.

Article I—To choose all necessary town officers:

The following were nominated for the office of Selectman to serve for 3 years:

Mr. Arnold Miner

Mr. Donald Bennett

A total of 61 votes were cast making 31 necessary for choice. Mr. Miner received 29, Mr. Balch received 1, and Mr. Bennett received 31. Mr. Bennett having been elected was duly sworn in by the moderator.

A motion was made and seconded that all Town Officers be sworn into their respective offices at one time following nominations.

The following officers were elected and duly sworn into office by the Moderator.

Road Agent—Clyde Hutchins

Constable—Mr. Frank Upton, Jr.

Police Officer—Mr. Bernie Pierce

Fire Chief—Mr. Alden Wilder

Civil Defense Director—Mr. Kenneth Balch

Trustee of Trust Funds (3 yrs.)

—Mrs. Dorothy French

Sexton—Mr. Winston French

Trustee of Library (3 yrs.)—Mrs. Janet Tolman

Auditor—Mr. Everett Martin

Article II—The amount of \$13,755.00 was raised to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Article III—The amount of \$415.27 was raised as the Town's share of T.R.A. construction costs, the State's share being \$2,768.44.

The road going up the hill by the Nelson Cemetery was given by the Selectmen as a possible site for use of T.R.A. in 1962. It was stated that unless this road was hard-topped it would be useless. There was no opposition to this.

Article IV—The amount of \$12,000.00 was raised for the repair of highways and bridges, \$5,000.00 of which will be for summer maintenance and \$7,000.00 for winter maintenance. A letter was read from Mr. W. E. Williams thanking Town for care of his road.

Article V—Article was amended to read as follows: That the sum of \$100.00 for Old Home Day be reduced to \$50.00. Passed by voice vote.

It was voted to raise the amount of \$50.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Old Home Day and \$50.00 for the same purpose for Memorial Day, 1962.

Article VI—It was voted to raise the amount of \$197.00 as its fair share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital.

Article VII—The raising of the amount of \$128.00 for the support of Monadnock Region Association was defeated by voice vote. Moderator called for a rising vote. The motion prevailed and the article passed as read.

Article VIII—Article was amended "to reduce the sum of \$250.00 for Civil Defense to \$100.00." The amendment was defeated and the amount of \$250.00 was raised for Civil Defense purposes.

Article IX—Article was amended to read "To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for the construction and maintenance of fire trials and water holes instead of \$700.00"

Amendment was adopted as read.

Article X—It was moved and seconded that this article asking for \$200.00 to be used in conjunction with State and Federal Funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust within the confines of the Town, be passed over.

A standing vote was called for.

Yes—26

No—33

Motion did not prevail.

A motion was made that article be amended to read “the sum of \$100.00”

Amendment was adopted as read.

Article was defeated by a standing vote.

Article XI—The amount of \$1,000.00 was raised for the maintenance of the Fire Department.

Article XII—Article was amended to read “that the sum of \$550.00 be reduced to \$225.00 for purchase of Fire Hose in the interest of economy”.

Amendment was defeated and article passed as read.

Article XIII—It was voted to raise the amount of \$480.00 for the purchase and installation of a “Tone System” for the Nelson Fire Department.

Article XIV—Article was amended to read “that the sum of \$200.00 for the further repair and renovation of the interior of the Town Hall be reduced to \$100.00 in the interest of economy”.

Report was read by Mrs. Janet Tolman.

The amendment was adopted and passed as read.

Article XV—The amount of \$100.00 was raised for the support of the Town Library.

Article XVI—It was voted to raise the sum of \$500.00 to be added to the Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawal may be made except by vote of the Town for the purchase of road equipment.

Article XVII—A motion was made to amend article to strike out word “building”. The amendment was defeated and article was passed as follows:

It was voted that the Town authorize the Trustees of the Trust Funds to pay to the Town Treasurer from the Reserve Fund, an amount to be determined by the Board of Selectmen, said amount not to exceed \$4000.00, and further authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply as much of said amount as is necessary, together with the International Tractor currently owned by the Town, toward the purchase of a more efficient piece of road building equipment.

Article XVIII—It was voted to accept from the Elizabeth Bergh Estate the sum of \$5000.00 as a Trust Fund, the interest therefrom to be used for the maintenance and improvement of the Cemetery in accordance with the terms of the bequest.

Article XIX—A motion was made to amend article to read “that the sum of \$600.00 be reduced to \$200.00”. After a discussion the amendment was withdrawn. It was voted to raise the sum of \$600.00 for the maintenance and improvement of the Cemetery.

Article XX—It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

Article XXI—It was voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell at public auction to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by Tax Collector’s or other deeds, and to execute, acknowledge and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.

Article XXII—It was moved and seconded that the article calling for \$200.00 for the erection of street lights in Munsonville be passed over.

Mrs. Lois Forssen was opposed to street lights.

Total votes cast 59 making 30 necessary for choice.

Yes—35

No—24

Article was defeated.

Article XXIII—A motion was made to pass over article. After considerable discussion, motion was defeated.

It was voted to accept from the Society for the Preservation of New Hampshire Forests a tract of 11 acres more or

less, the same being located at the top of City Hill, to be used as as a Town Forest.

Article XXIV—It was voted to authorize the Nelson Fire Department to sell or trade, at no expense to the Town, one of the pieces of fire apparatus now owned by the Town, such sale or trade to be toward the purchase of a new piece of equipment approved by the New Hampshire Board of Fire Underwriters. Sale and purchase to be approved by the Board of Selectmen.

Article XXV—"Other Business"

A motion was made to see if the voters of the Town will vote to instruct the Board of Selectmen to call future Town Meetings after the hour of 6 in the afternoon commencing with the year 1963.

Mrs. Janet Tolman was opposed to motion.

Number of votes cast 63 making 32 necessary for choice.

Yes—25

No—38

Motion was defeated.

A motion was made that the Town Report be mailed to every legal voter before Town Meeting in 1963. Motion was defeated by voice vote.

A motion was made that the Town will vote not to use Town road equipment for private work except for plowing private driveways.

Number of votes cast 56 making 29 necessary for choice.

Yes—10

No—46

Motion was defeated.

It was moved and seconded that a rising vote of thanks be given to Mr. Robert Hatch and Mr. Sidney Partridge for their service to the Town.

Meeting was adjourned at 3:45 P. M.

MINUTES OF SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

Friday, December 14, 1962

The meeting opened at 7:35 P. M. and the Warrant was read by the Moderator.

Article 1—To see if the Town will give the Board of Selectmen permission to borrow on the credit of the Town, a sum not to exceed Eighteen Thousand One Hundred Seventy Five (\$18,175.00) Dollars for the purchase of a new grader.

It was moved and seconded that the article be accepted as read.

The following bids were presented:

1. Chadwick Ba Ross Co. (Austin-Western)
New 1960 Pacer (Used 30 hours for demonstration)
with a 6 months new factory guarantee. They
would allow \$2,000.00 for old grader plus \$460.98
credit on repair bill.
Total Price—\$18,175.00 Immediate delivery
2. R. C. Hazelton Co.
1954 machine \$9,000.00 10 day delivery
3. Mingolla Machinery
1958 machine \$11,000.00

It was decided to accept the bid from the Chadwick Ba Ross Co. and a written ballot was called for.

Number of ballots cast 46 and necessary for vote 31.

No—5

Yes—41

Motion prevails and article was accepted as read.

Article 2—To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

The Board of Selectmen asked for the opinion of the Town as to the method of paying off the loan.

The following plans were offered:

Plan A—\$18,000.00 at 3%. First payment in December of 1965 and the final payment in December 1970.

Total interest \$2,970.00. This would add twenty three cents (.23) approximately to the tax rate exclusive of interest.

Plan B—To pay \$9,000.00 for two successive years. Total interest \$810.00. This would add sixty eight cents (.68) approximately to the tax rate exclusive of interest.

It was moved and seconded that it is the opinion of this group that Plan B be adopted. This motion withdrawn.

Motion: That the Town adopt Plan C introduced by Mr. Sidney Partridge to pay off the note over a period of four years starting this coming year.

Motion defeated by voice vote.

It was moved and seconded that the Town adopt Plan A. The motion passed by voice vote.

The following resolution was read by the Moderator:

WHEREAS an organization known as "Nature Conservancy of New Hampshire" has purchased one half of "The Island" so-called, located in Lake Nubanusit in the Town of Nelson and Hancock and

WHEREAS this organization claims to be exempt from taxation and has for two years paid under protest taxes assessed against its property and

WHEREAS it has brought suit against the Town to recover said taxes and to be declared forever exempt from taxation, therefore BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Counsel be instructed to contest this suit in the Superior Courts, and, if deemed necessary and advisable, in the Supreme Court of the State of New Hampshire, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an article be included in the warrant for the next annual Town Meeting for the purpose of raising and appropriating monies necessary for legal fees and expenses incurred as a result of the above action.

Discussion:

It was moved and seconded that the Resolution be adopted as read.

Mr. Sidney Partridge spoke as a representative of Nature Conservancy against the Town adopting the Resolution.

A point of order was raised by Mr. Newton Tolman

claiming that the land could not be turned over to the State of New Hampshire as the New Hampshire Legislature had already turned it down.

It was the opinion of Mrs. Janet Tolman that it would be many years before the Island would be turned over to anyone, but Nature Conservancy.

Mr. Raymond Huber asked that the Town Counsel be present at the caucus but was advised by Mr. Corey that this would not be proper.

Mr. Frank Upton, Jr. said that the Town should empower the Selectmen to use every means to fight the case.

It was suggested by Mr. Robert Robinson that the Resolution not bind us to using Town Counsel but to get the best lawyer available.

It was stated by Mr. Corey that the Town of Hancock would pay their share of cost in this court action.

THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED AS READ BY VOICE VOTE.

REPORT OF SELECTMEN

The third installment of \$2,000.00 due on equipment note #1 was paid together with interest amounting to \$150.00.

In accordance with action taken at the Special Town Meeting held December 14, 1962 a note in amount \$18,000.00 will be negotiated in order to pay for the new Austin-Western Grader purchased by the town. Interest at the rate of 3% will be payable semi-annually. The first payment of principal in amount \$3,000.00 will be payable December 15, 1965 and equal annual payments thereafter, the final payment falling due in 1970.

The second annual meeting for the benefit of non-resident property owners was held on the evening of August 31, 1962. It is believed that this type of meeting is of value both to the property owners and to the town officers and should be made an annual event.

In connection with the allocation of T.R.A. expenditures, some opposition to the use of "black top" paving developed. Due to this opposition the completion of the work was postponed until the spring of 1963. If the work can be completed before July 1, 1963 the cost will be borne by the State and at no cost to the Town.

The tractor owned by the town was apparently too light for the work involved and was quite expensive to maintain. A used Hough "Payloador" was purchased as a replacement and so far has proved to be very satisfactory.

It may be of interest to note that during the year prior to April 1, 1962 eight new buildings were added to assessed valuation and that there were 64 transfers or mortgages of property in the town.

It is with regret that we note the passing of a respected citizen, Frank E. Upton, Sr., whose many years of service as Tax Collector were appreciated by his fellow townsmen.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$414.87 as its share of T. R. A. construction costs, the state's share being \$2,765.79.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 for the repair of highways and bridges, \$5,000.00 of which will be for summer maintenance and \$7,000.00 for winter maintenance.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for the purchase of calcium chloride.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the purchase of culverts.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Old Home Day, and \$50.00 for the same purpose for Memorial Day.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$204.00 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Elliot Community Hospital.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Civil Defense purposes.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for the construction and maintenance of fire trails and water holes.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 to be used in conjunction with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust within the confines of the town.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for the maintenance of the Fire Department.

14. To see if the Town will ratify, approve, and confirm the action of our Fire Department in joining our Town to the Southwestern District Fire Mutual Aid System in 1958 and in agreeing that our Fire Department may give and receive outside aid as provided in RSA-154 as amended.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$90.00 annually for the installation and maintenance of three street lights, one at the center of Munsonville, one at the Fire Station and one at the Munsonville school-house.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Town Library.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the further repair and maintenance of the interior of the Town Hall.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be added to the Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawal may be made from this fund except by vote of the Town for the purchase of road equipment.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the payment of legal fees and expenses incurred in defending the suit brought against the Town by the Nature Conservancy of New Hampshire.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the maintenance and improvement of the cemetery; this amount to be paid to the treasurer of the Cemetery Board on or before May 1, 1963.

21. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$200.00 as a Trust Fund from Robbins Millbank, the interest therefrom to be used toward the perpetual care of four lots in the cemetery.

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell at public auction to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by tax collector's or other deeds, and to execute, acknowledge and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.

24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to publish in the annual Town Report the tables of Resident and Non Resident Inventories and Taxes every third year only, the next publication to be included in the Report for the year 1965.

25. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR

Another year has passed without the necessity of having to activate our local Civil Defense unit because of a national emergency.

During the trying times of the fall of 1962 the Director carefully reviewed mobilization plans and assignments of positions and functions to be covered should an emergency arise.

Procedures were followed during the annual test exercises as prescribed and it is a pleasure to report that each year the public awareness of the need for such exercises appears to increase and with it greater cooperation with personnel conducting the test.

With the cooperation of the teachers at Munsonville School and the School Board an emergency evacuation program designed to swiftly and efficiently remove the children from the school to their homes in the event of a nuclear attack warning has been established. Pupils attending the Keene Schools are covered by the Keene area coordinator and transportation arrangements have been made for them. It is the belief of your Director that, should an emergency arise, parents should remain in their homes to receive their children from the vehicles assigned to carry them and should not attempt to go to the school. An emergency situation will most certainly cause much congestion in the school area and each additional vehicle will add to the difficulty in attaining a smooth evacuation. The volunteer drivers of the vehicles assigned to transport the children are well instructed in the routes to follow and have the names of each child they are to carry. They will not leave the school until all of their riders are in

their cars and a parent picking up an individual child could cause a dangerous delay. The understanding and cooperation of all parents is most earnestly solicited.

Surplus materials having a value of \$106.58 were obtained through the state agency at a cost of \$15.80.

The usual fine cooperation of the staff of the State Civil Defense agency has again been forthcoming in 1962 and is most appreciated.

REPORT OF THE NELSON FIRE DEPARTMENT

Your Fire Department is again pleased to report no serious fires during the past year.

Among calls answered were several chimney fires, brush fires, several fires at the town dump, a furnace explosion, and a resuscitator call.

Nelson is now taking advantage of the Southwestern New Hampshire Fire Mutual Aid System with the installation of a radio unit in our fire station. The new dispatch center opened in Keene September 1, 1962 and is in operation 24 hours a day. To report a fire dial Keene EL 2-1100. Upon receipt of a call the dispatcher in Keene sounds the alarm at the Nelson fire station and by radio informs the firemen of the location of the fire. If upon arrival at the scene an ambulance or additional help is needed our firemen are able to contact the dispatcher by radio directly from the trucks. We believe this to be an invaluable service in case of any emergency where minutes are of the utmost importance.

During the past summer demonstrations were given for both residents and summer residents on the proper use of the resuscitator in the case of drowning, shock, or heart attack victims. We hope to repeat these demonstrations again this year.

Other activities included a poster contest during Fire Prevention Week and our annual supper.

Again a reminder, the number to call to report a fire on any other emergency, State Police, Sheriffs Office, ambulance, is EL 2-1100 or 352-1100.

The County Bookmobile of the Extension Division of the New Hampshire State Library visited Nelson 5 times during the year leaving a total of 1,222 books.

During National Library Week a poster contest was sponsored for the children in the school system with a great deal of interest shown by the pupils. During the summer a vacation reading club was held at the Library.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Munsonville School in said district on the 8th day of March, 1963, at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to enter into tuition contracts for the school year 1963-64 with the Union School District of Keene at the rate of five hundred thirty-dollars (\$530.00) per pupil for high school instruction and four hundred ten dollars (\$410.00) per pupil for instruction of eighth grade pupils and with other approved schools.

10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) to be used as matching funds for Federal Aid under provisions of the National Defense Education Act, for use in science and mathematics, and to approve the acceptance of federal funds.

11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) as the district's share of support for educational TV Channel WENH.

12. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE NELSON SCHOOL DISTRICT

March 9, 1962

The meeting was called to order at 8 P. M. by the Moderator, Francis W. Tolman, in the Munsonville School House.

After reading the warrant, the articles were acted upon as follows:

Article I Francis P. Tolman was elected Moderator, one vote being cast by the Clerk.

Article II Mildred G. Quigley was elected Clerk, one vote being cast by the Moderator.

Article III Dorothy French was elected as member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Article IV Elizabeth Wilder was elected Treasurer.

Article V The motion was made and seconded that "we pass over this article as its content is considered under article 8." The motion carried.

Article VI The reports given were as follows:

Mrs. Maxine Dobson (Playground Committee) reported three bids on 120 feet of chain link fence, 4 feet high, \$300.—\$275.—\$275.

Mr. Leonard Frazier reported a bid of \$200 to cover rocks.

Mrs. Louise Bergeron (Teacher) has expressed a preference for fence.

\$207.13 reported in the treasury.

Mr. Sidney E. Partridge moved that \$207.13 be spent before June 30th, 1962, for playground purpose, said money to be spent by the playground committee under the supervision of the school board. The motion carried.

Article VII Everett Martin elected Auditor, one vote cast by the Clerk. Playground Committee elected by one vote cast by the Clerk. Playground Committee: Mrs. John Walter, Mr. Leonard Frazier, Mr. Francis Driscoll.

Article VIII Voted to invite Mr. Paul Clark and Mr. Hewitt to participate in the discussion of this article. With only five towns favoring the new district, it was considered that there was less need for a "Teacher Consultant" so this motion lost.

Rodger M. Tolman explained the budget. The motion was made and seconded that: The district will raise and appropriate the sum of thirty thousand, one hundred and fifty-seven dollars (\$30,157.00) for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town. Motion accepted as read.

Article IX Motion: That the district will authorize the School Board to enter into a tuition contract with the Keene High School at the rate of \$515.00 per pupil, or to other approved high schools. Motion accepted as read.

Article X Motion: That the district will raise the sum of \$75.00 to be used as matching funds for Federal Aid under the provisions of the National Defense Educational Act, for the use in science and mathematics, and to approve the acceptance of Federal Funds. Motion carried.

Article XI Motion: That the district will raise the sum of \$25.00 as the district's share of the support for educational TV channel WENH. Motion carried.

Article XII Motion: That the district will raise the sum of two thousand, three hundred and thirty-four dollars

(\$2,334.00) to send eighth grade pupils to the Keene Junior High School for the year 1962-1963. Motion carried.

Article XIII Motion: That the district will raise the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to be used for inside painting of the school building. Motion carried.

Article XIV Motion: That the district will raise the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for playground improvement. Motion carried.

Article XV Voted to explore the feasibility of sending 6th and 7th grades to Keene.

Voted to adjourn meeting (9:45 P. M.).

I hereby submit my first annual report.

STAFF CHANGES: The regular teaching staff remains the same. However, Mrs. Azalea G. Wilson replaces Miss Geneva Howe as music supervisor and Mrs. Maxine Dobson has assumed the duties of school nurse upon the resignation of Mrs. Mary Parker. Also, Dr. Laurence Cloud has replaced Dr. Samuel Paul as school physician.

The above figures do not take into account pupils who might move into Nelson or who might move out. Obviously, the most recent figures are the most reliable. Although the above statistics should not be used as a basis for absolute prediction, they are indicative of possible trends.

SCHOOL FACILITIES: The Munsonville School very adequately houses the pupils as they are currently enrolled. With a continued program of systematic maintenance, the safety and health of our children may be assured for many years to come.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM: The Nelson School Board and citizens of Nelson are to be commended in their efforts to provide the type of program and facilities which are so necessary in this highly complex and competitive world of today.

By sending eighth grade students to Keene on a tuition basis, an opportunity for a more comprehensive junior high program is made available. It is most desirable that this be continued.

Education is undergoing changes which make long range planning a precarious adventure. A new state-wide financial accounting system for school districts is now in effect. New state high school minimum standards will be enforced beginning September, 1963. Forthcoming changes as a result of the report of the legislature's Interim Commission are speculative. The reorganization of our own supervisory union has brought about changes which affect each district. The loss of the services of a teacher consultant is an example. Although this all serves to point up the difficulty in planning far in advance, it in no way disputes the fact that the citizens of Nelson want the best possible education for their children. The Nelson School Board shares this wish and is striving to see that it is accomplished.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, pupils and parents, the School Board and the patrons of our school for their understanding and cooperation.
