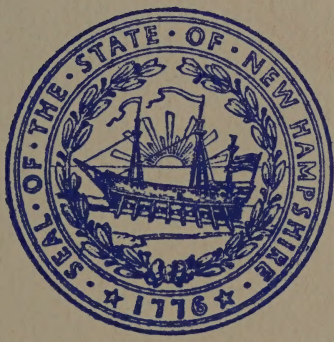


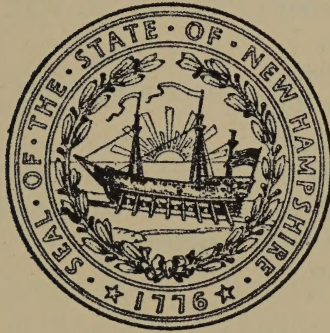

TOWN WARRANT**The State of New Hampshire**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next at twelve of the clock, noon, the polls to close not later than the end of the transacting of business on said day.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Business meeting on all other articles to begin at 8:00 P.M.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs and maintenance of Highways and Bridges.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$867.40 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute the sum of \$5,782.68.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance and tarring of Class V Roads.
6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract for the purchase of a Hough 60 Pay Loader at a gross purchase price not to exceed the sum of \$25,030.00 and to further see if the Town will vote to trade the TD 6 Int. tractor and Walter Truck as down payment on said equipment, the balance of \$15,030.00 to be defrayed in five annual payments of \$3,006.00 plus accrued interest.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,762.50 for the payment of principal and interest on the Fire Truck note.
8. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new truck, applying an old truck towards the cost of the new one, and raise and appropriate \$4,500.00 for the same.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the repair of bridges.
10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Cemeteries.
14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the village cemetery.
15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of hospitals.
17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, \$200.00 for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.
18. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue, subject to gate and bars, a portion of the Old Bristol Road from Maurice Daniels to Wine Brook.

19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for placing street and highway markers under the supervision of the Historical Society.
20. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue, subject to gate and bars, the road behind the Church beginning at Church boundary running East to route 3B.
21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to repair and surface the sidewalk from Robert Main to Post Office.
22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Community Center.
23. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Hampton qualified to vote in District Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community School in said District on the eighth day of March 1963, at 8 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see if the District will vote to approve the recommendation of the Supervisory Union Board that the name of the position Teacher Consultant be changed to

Assistant Superintendent and any such action as may be voted by the Supervisory Union Board is hereby approved.

10. To see if the New Hampton School District will vote to petition the State Board of Education to become a member of a cooperative school district as provided in New Hampshire RSA 195:3, which may include, in addition to this district, the following School Districts, namely: Alexandria, Bridgewater, Bristol, Danbury, Groton, Hebron.
11. To elect two representatives to serve with representatives from the other districts on an interim school board which shall prepare a financial budget for the operation of the proposed cooperative district.
12. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICES REPORT**New Hampton Community School****1961 - 1962**

The necessary routine examinations were performed. Eight defects were found and corrected.

Vision tests completed - 155 and 25 defects were found. Twenty-five were treated and corrected by the family doctor.

Hearing tests completed - 172 and 9 defects were found. Eight had more complete examinations by their own physicians.

Heights and weights recorded both Fall and Spring for all students.

First aid and health equipment maintained.

The P.T.A. sponsored in January a Sodium Fluoride Clinic — 126 pupils had four applications; in May a Restoration Clinic — 22 children had 3 extractions and 55 fillings.

Pre-school registration in May was attended by 15 children.

Through the efforts of local civic organizations and the N. H. State Department of Health and Welfare one child spent four weeks at Camp Lincoln.

Home and social welfare conferences held were forty.

My sincere appreciation to the New Hampton Community School staff, the P.T.A. and parents whose cooperation has made this year's program so successful.

I herewith submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools:

Personnel

School opened this Fall with the same staff as last year. The following shows the assignment of teachers for the 1962-1963 school year:

The above enrollment gave us a total of 134 pupils beginning this school year.

Curriculum

We are continuing the use of Educational Television from the University of New Hampshire to supplement our own educational program. This facility is a very useful supplement to our program.

Our reading program is still being emphasized. Mrs. Bicknell and Mrs. Tatham attended summer school taking a course in reading. As a follow-up of this course, we are using a strong phonetic approach as a basic part of our reading instruction. At this time it is felt that this will add more strength to our reading program.

In the mathematics program we have been trying a modern mathematics approach at the Junior High School level. This approach holds promise of enabling our students

to better understand our number system as well as gain more competence in its use.

Budget

The budget is up \$11,069.99 over last year. The largest increase is \$4,787 due to the increased cost in tuition payments for our pupils attending high school. The teachers' salary account is up \$4,700 due to placing Mrs. Dupuis on full time to enable us to effectively operate our French program and salary increases for teachers. Transportation has increased \$754 and the balance of \$629 is distributed in small amounts over other accounts in the budget.

I would like to express my appreciation for the support given our school system this year by the School Board and the citizens of New Hampton.
