TOWN WARRANT

SHARON, NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sharon, N.H. in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Brick Schoolhouse on Tuesday the 2nd of March, 1976 at 7:30 in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year, specifically, Town Clerk, 1 year; Selectman, 3 years; Tax Collector, 1 year; Highway Agent, 1 year; Treasurer, 1 year; Trustee of Trust Funds, 1 year.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to establish the amounts which shall be paid the Town Officers for their services, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 3. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for Town Officers expenses, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to have the Audit made by the Department of Revenue Administration and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to cover the expense of the same.

Article 5. To raise and appropriate the following sums of money for the purposes specified:

Article 6. To raise and appropriate \$112.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.

Article 7. To raise and appropriate \$199.00 for the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurse Association.

Article 8. To raise and appropriate \$75.00 for the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$12,000.00 in anticipation of taxes or take any action relative thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the William Leroy Young Trust Fund \$55.00 interest for maintenance of the Brick Schoolhe ise.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$1,462.00 which is restricted to the maintenance of Class V highways.

Article 12. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for oiling Town roads, where needed, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 13. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for summer maintenance of Town roads and the sum of \$2,500.00 for winter maintenance or take any action relative thereto.

Article 14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$238.40 for Town Road Aid and the State will allot the Town the sum of \$1,589.36.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budget Appropriations in the amount indicated; and further authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or take any other action relative thereto.

Appropriation Fire Protection

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the regional planning commission, now organized and named the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$104.04 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to deed a right-of-way located on the West side of Route 123 to Mrs. John Bross in exchange for a deed to a parcel of land containing about 6 acres located on the North side of Jarmany Hill Road.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to name the land deeded to the Town by Mrs. John Bross as the "Robert P. Bass Memorial Forest" in memory of her father.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$200.00 to cover the expenses of a Bicentennial project or take any action relative thereto.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make selective cuttings on Town land under the direction of a duly registered forester or take any action relative thereto.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to establish a fund from proceeds of selective cuttings from which the Selectmen may withdraw a specified amount subject to approval at Town Meeting or take any action relative thereto.

Article 23. To choose one member for the Board of Adjustment for 5 years.

Article 24. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, and Officers heretofor chosen and pass any vote relative thereto.

Article 25. To see if the Town will transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The Selectmen gratefully acknowledge the gift of a Town Seal from Mrs. James Perry of Jaffrey. This seal shows the correct year of incorporation of the Town. Several attempts were made at incorporation. The last in 1791 was successful. Mrs. Perry is a native of Sharon and has many close ties with Sharon.

The Craig Armstrong family has donated a Bicentennial flag to be flown on the

Schoolhouse flagpole.

The Selectmen recommend that the Town join the Southwestern Regional Planning Commission. The cost is figured on a per capita basis of 68 cents. The Town is in desperate need of a Master Plan and this agency is well qualified to aid

the Town in reaching this important goal.

The Town has acquired 659 acres from Mrs. John Bross under the B.O.R. Land and Water Conservation program. She has also donated an additional 129 acres adjoining the large tract as an outright gift. Mrs. Bross would like to trade a narrow section of property some 1700 feet in length located between the Brown and Vogeler homes for a right-of-way adjacent to the Day property on Route 123. The Selectmen feel that this would be a fair exchange in that the Town will have access to the 788 acre Town land from the South on Jarmany Hill Road.

It is a wish of Mrs. Bross that the newly acquired property be named in memory

of her father, the late Gov. Robert P. Bass.

We have been in touch with the County Forester in regard to sound forestry practice on the above land. He has recommended that the land be put under a progressive program of selective cutting so that the considerable amount of wood on the property will not fall victim to old age or dicease. The timber should provide a source of income for many years and also renew itself at the same time.

We hope that the Town will see fit to establish a fund from the sale of the timber

so that each year the Town will be able to draw upon it to reduce taxes.

The Selectmen wish to take the opportunity to publicly thank the Sharon Arts Center for providing telephone answering service during the recent appraisal.

The Selectmen are pleased with the results of the recent reappraisal as done by the Department of Revenue Administration. The results seem to be very well

accepted.

The work scheduled for the cemetery addition in 1975 was not done due to several reasons. The Selectmen are asking the voters to approve an additional \$1,000.00 at the 1976 Town Meeting so that the 1975 funds added to the above sum will result in surface leveling, raking, loaming, seeding and a start on graveling a roadway. We also hope to remove some dead trees from the existing cemetery.

The exterior of the Schoolhouse is in need of brick repointing and trim painting. The Selectmen have been in touch with the New Hampshire Army National Guard to make arrangements to have the Peterborough unit furnish the labor as a training exercise at no cost to the Town. The local unit has participated in a

project at the Arts Center on a similar basis with excellent results.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Sharon for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1975, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audit reports must be given to the Town Clerk to be retained as part of the permanent Town records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustee of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

General Fund:

Comparative Balance Sheets December 31, 1974 and December 31, 1975: Exhibit A-1

Comparative Balance Sheets of the General Fund as of December 31, 1974 and December 31, 1975 are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the current surplus of the Town increased by \$254 during 1975, from \$729 as of December 31, 1974 to \$983 as of December 31, 1975.

Analysis of Change in Current Financial Condition Exhibit A-2

An analysis of change in the current financial condition of the Town during the fiscal year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures Estimated and Actual Revenues Exhibits A-3 and A-4

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1975 are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$781 less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$150, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$631.

TREASURER

General Fund:

Classified Statement of Receipts and Expenditures Exhibit B-1

A classified statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1975, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts is included in Exhibit B-1.

Revenue Sharing Fund Exhibit B-2

The fiscal activity in the Revenue Sharing Fund account during the year is disclosed in Exhibit B-2. As stated therein, entitlement payments of \$918 and interest earnings of \$21 were received during 1975. Expenditures of \$700 were incurred. Available funds at December 31, 1975 totaled \$239.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Tax Collector's records. Consequently, the amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 71-A, Section 21, require that the auditors' summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town. Publication of the Exhibits contained in this audit report is optional at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen. This letter, however, must be published in its entirety.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Sharon for their assistance during the course of the audit.
