## **The Gift that Keeps on Giving: Investment of Conservative Forces in Renewable Energy Technology**

Completed for Professor Robin Sheriff's course ANTH 611: History of Anthropological Theory, this analysis focuses on current trends of investments in renewable energy by major oil firms and their subsidiaries. This discussion is based on the writing of Leslie White, who postulates that cultural evolution is a result of shifts in how human harness energy. Ultimately, I illustrate how these investment trends are working to maintain our current global socio-economic system.
