

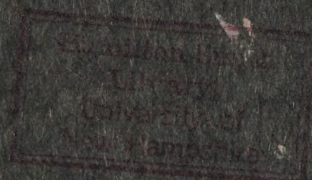

## **TOWN WARRANT**

---

### **THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sutton, in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Pillsbury Memorial Hall in said Sutton, on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under Chapter 99, Laws of 1933.
4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways and bridges.
5. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid and raise and appropriate money for the same.



6. To see what action the town will take in regard to the overdraft on state road construction and on maintenance of town highways and raise and appropriate money for the same.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting.

8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Old Home Day.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day celebration.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

11. To see what action the town will take in regard to the purchase of new equipment for snow removal and raise and appropriate money for the same.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for a Sutton free bed in the New London Hospital. The same to be used on the advice and consent of the selectmen.

13. To see what action the town will take in regard to discontinuing the road through Wadleigh Park.

14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

15. To see if the town will vote to accept the bequest under the will of the late Fred A. Felch.

16. To see if the town will vote to accept the bequest under the will of the late Sarah J. Davis.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Sutton, qualified to vote in district affairs;

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said district on the thirteenth day of March, 1934, at two o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

---

### To the Citizens of Sutton:

This, my first report as your superintendent, deals with the following topics:

- (1) Our reorganized supervisory union.
- (2) Statistics of our schools.
- (3) A new school at South Sutton.
- (4) Music education.
- (5) Health of school children.

### Our Reorganized Supervisory Union

In accordance with an economy measure enacted into law at the last session of the General Court, the school districts of the State have been rearranged, for purposes of school supervision, into larger unions, in order to dispense with the services of five superintendents.

The Warner union, No. 61, of which Sutton was a part, was one of the smaller unions in the State, and was dissolved last July by action of the State Board of Education. Sutton is included in the Hopkinton union, No. 26, which now comprises six districts—Hopkinton, Henniker, Bradford, Dunbarton, Newbury and Sutton.

You will note from the foregoing table that in length of school year, percent of attendance, and number of tardinesses per pupil, Sutton has a creditable record as compared with the State as a whole. Special mention should be made of the low record of tardinesses at the South Sutton School, and the high attendance record at Sutton Mills.

### A New School at South Sutton

The enrollment at South Sutton was larger than usual when school opened in September, and continued to increase until it reached 34. With so large a group, including all grades, the teacher could not give the individual attention required. It was evident that the desirable thing to do was to divide the school into a primary and grammar room.



A request was made for an increase in our allowance of State aid to pay the salary of another teacher, and this request was granted. We have rented the building formerly used as a store, put in a partition and one window, built some steps in front, painted the interior, and have made a very pleasant schoolroom at small cost. We expect that the salary of the teacher and practically all the expense of maintaining the school will be cared for by an increased allowance from the State equalization fund, so the actual cost to the district of this new primary school is the expense of providing a suitable room and equipment.

The enrollment in the two schools here has decreased somewhat since December, and it may not be necessary to continue the present arrangement for another year.

### **Music Education**

We have found a way to provide the services of a music supervisor one day each week. Her work of teaching and providing definite assignments for each week's music study is helping to overcome the handicap that most rural children have when they wish to join glee clubs or choirs during high school or in later years.

### **Health of School Children**

Mrs. Constance Allen, who served us very faithfully as school nurse last year, has left town and Mrs. Frances Beatty has been appointed in her place. Mrs. Beatty has made the annual examination and reported to the parents the needed correction of eyes, teeth, etc. An audiometer test has also been given in all the schools. This is an accurate method of determining how well a child can hear. A few defective ears were found, and steps are being taken to correct these wherever possible.

## Conclusion

The short time that I have been working in Sutton has been very enjoyable. Our schools owe much to the leadership and effective work of my predecessor, Mr. Sinclair. The earnest efforts of the teachers, and the willing co-operation of parents and citizens, deserve gratitude. Let us continue to work together for the good of the children.
