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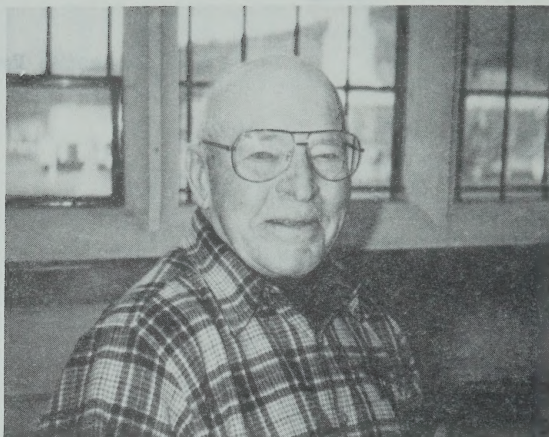

FRANCIS C. GUTOSKI

June 30, 1930 - December 15, 1988

Francis C. Gutoski was born in Ashuelot on June 7, 1930, the son of Vincent P. and Sophie (Salinski) Gutoski. He attended schools in Ashuelot and Winchester, graduated in 1948 from Thayer High School in Winchester, and was a lifelong resident of the Winchester area.

He served in the 101st Airborne for 37 months, including service in Germany, and was a member of Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 3968 in Winchester.

Mr. Gutoski owned and operated a wholesale and retail business in Winchester the past 34 years. He was general manager of Winchester Paper Company's converting division before becoming a self-employed real estate broker. He also owned Swanzey Merchandise Company.

Mr. Gutoski had been a two-term Winchester selectmen, a Winchester School Board member, a Cheshire County commissioner and a state legislator. In 1965, he chaired the Winchester Town Beach Development Committee. Mr. Gutoski was an active member of the Winchester Industrial Development Committee.

For 23 years, he also headed the Ashuelot Christmas Tree, a program for the economically disadvantaged.

Mr. Gutoski was a very active member in the community and will long be remembered.

SELECTMEN'S MESSAGE

Dear Community,

On a cold, wet, and very windy day in late October, the Selectmen drove to the Town of Warwick, Massachusetts and started a project that was over due by nearly twenty years. Perambulation of the town lines, as required by state law. As the weekend walks progressed, a sense of scale was developed among us, as to the size of Winchester. It is geographically the largest community in Cheshire County, and as one walks the distance, a person begins to feel very small in comparison.

Winchester's land area has rewards and drawbacks to it. The town is very spread out population-wise and thus, the problem of sewerage disposal has been thrust upon us. The Federal Clean Water Act has manifested into a very expensive sewer line and pumping stations planned for the village of Ashuelot. Although we are under a state administrative order for compliance, diligence and patience has paid off. The project will be mostly funded by Federal and State sources, and hopefully will break ground shortly after our 1989 Town Meeting. The planned completion date is for September 1990.


The available land space has become a magnet for large tract developers. Though our land mass can easily accomodate vast amounts of activity, our municipal services and obligations are becoming severely strained. The lack of classroom space, sewerage capacity in question, emergency services consisting of police, fire, ambulance, and civil defense being stretched, landfill problems soaring, highway maintenance costs running away, larger welfare rolls, and the ever present need for a pure water supply, all play a major part in the burden of taxation. We hope the residents of Winchester will be supportive on these issues and will contribute their constructive criticisms and positive input openly.


The Board of Selectmen with other industrious members of the community has begun to deal with what is probably our most pressing issue...solid waste. To combat the shrinking usable area of the landfill, a very extensive recycling program shall be instituted later in the year. We are optimistic that in working with the regional coordinator from our district, that a figure between 40 and 50% of the current trash being buried can be excluded and removed to other reception centers. Please help us with your cooperation.

At present time, there seems to be a prevailing attitude from town officials and private citizens, that we must increase the value of our tax base. One of the most beneficial aspects in this quest could be the development of a variety of small, light, clean industries. The Industrial Development Board recognizes this fact and is aggressively pursuing all leads available to them. In support of this, the Community Development Committee contracted for a feasibility study to be done concerning the Elm Street area and the industrial potential for the future. There are many devoted volunteers serving on these boards. We thank them for their effort.

There are many day to day happenings that are too routine to mention in the course of our report. As with other towns all over the State of New Hampshire, Winchester has ups and downs. We must keep in mind that the values and determination of the people living here will shape our collective future, and that we must rely on each other for strength in the face of adversity. Thank you.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT - 1989

The Board of Selectmen wish to thank all the taxpayers and town officers for their cooperation during the past year. Selectmen meet every Wednesday at 7:00 P.M. Other times may be arranged by calling 239-4951 if these hours are not convenient. The selectmen's office is now open Monday through Friday from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.

We again call your attention to the numerous forms available in the selectmen's office to be used by the taxpayers for property taxation. The only form that is mailed out is the Inventory of Taxable Property. All other forms must be obtained at the selectmen's office. The law states that an Inventory Form must be filled in, signed and returned to the selectmen's office on or before April 15th. If an Inventory Form is not filed, there is no legal basis for the Board of Land and Tax Appeals or the Court to consider an application for abatement. Also, a late return of the Inventory Form will be assessed a penalty.

VETERAN'S EXEMPTION

Permanent applications are available in the selectmen's office. We call to your attention that, if a person eligible for exemption changes his domicile, or a veteran's wife becomes a widow during the year, a new permanent application must be filed with the assessing officials.

EXEMPTIONS FOR CERTAIN ELDERLY PEOPLE (C.E.P.)

These forms are for persons who qualify for reduction in their tax bills. These forms must be completed and in the selectmen's office on or before April 15, 1989. If there is no completed form on file, we cannot grant the Elderly Exemption. As of April 1, 1989, the three categories of exemptions are from ages 65 to 75, 75 to 79, and age 80 and over. It is your responsibility to complete a new exemption form if you change categories.

INTENT TO CUT TIMBER

Every owner, including state, county or municipality or public agency, shall prior to each cutting operation, file with the selectmen a Notice of Intent to Cut.

ASSESSMENT OF OPEN SPACE

No owner of land shall be entitled to have a particular parcel of his land classified for any tax year under the provisions of this chapter unless he shall have applied to the assessing officials on the form approved by the Board and provided by the Tax Commission.

PERMITS

Any person, firm, corporation, municipality, public agency or institution desiring to operate, maintain, offer for rent, lease or tenancy a site, lot, field, tract of ground for location of any new building, trailer park, trailers or mobile homes or other similar conveyance, or place of abode for shelter shall obtain a written operating permit from the Board of Selectmen. Where applicable, it would be necessary to have received and to show proof of having received approval for construction granted by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission for construction of any septic tank system before a building permit or permit to park a trailer or mobile home shall be issued.

HOUSE TRAILERS

Whenever a person moves a house trailer or mobile home into a city or town for the

purpose of establishing a residence in said city, or town, or whenever a person purchases an existing house trailer or mobile home with the intent of residing in the same at the existing location, he shall within fifteen (15) days of placement of the trailer, register with the assessors of the city or the selectmen of the town where he shall reside. Whoever fails to comply with the provisions of this section shall be guilty of violation 72:7B (1973:152).

STREET NUMBERING

In 1987 all streets and roads in the Town of Winchester were assigned names, and street numbers were issued to each home. Prior to this project, many streets and roads were known by several names, which caused problems for emergency personnel as well as other people looking for a certain address. Our Postmaster Richard E. Whipple put in many hours of work to design and put this numbering system into effect. We would appreciate having every house marked with the assigned number, as well as all mailboxes. If you are not sure of your number, please call Mr. Whipple at the post office or call the selectmen's office. Your cooperation in this endeavor will help everyone.

WATER DEPARTMENT POLICY WINCHESTER, NEW HAMPSHIRE

LARGE CONSUMERS

Including hotels, motels, stores, markets, barber shops, restaurants, laundries, greenhouses, manufacturers, commercial industries, car wash services, farms, and building purposes, etc., rates by meter or special written agreement.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Service pipes will be introduced into the premises of all persons making written application therefore to the selectmen, providing said premises are located on some main, or distribution main of the system. The entire expense of a water line, including all pipes, curb boxes and other necessary materials and all expense of laying the water line shall be paid for by the applicant. The Water Department shall be responsible for any repairs made from the main line to the curb box; all repairs made after the curb box shall be the responsibility of the property owner. All valves are to be of rubber compression type.
2. All applications for the use of the water must be made in writing to the selectmen (or their authorized agents) by the owner of the premises or authorized agents, and the various uses to which the water is to be applied must be fully stated. It shall not be used for any other purpose without previous notice to the selectmen.
3. All persons taking water must keep their pipes and fixtures in good repair and protect them from frost to the service box at their own expense. They will be held liable for all damage resulting from their failure to do so.
4. They shall prevent all unnecessary waste, and water shall not be left running to prevent freezing without prior authorization from the Town.

5. The selectmen and their authorized agents shall have free access to all premises supplied with water to ascertain the quantity of water used, the manner of its use, and whether there is any unnecessary waste; also, to examine the apparatus. If any pipes or fixtures are not found in good order, they will be immediately repaired at the expense of the owner. If repairs are not made within two days after notice, the water will be shut off until such repairs are made.
6. The water rents shall be due and payable quarterly in advance and payable, at the office of the tax collector on the fifteenth day of February, May, August and November of each year, and pro rata to those dates. In all cases of non-payment of the water rents within fifteen days after the same are due, the water shall be shut off until all charges are paid. The property owner will in all cases be held liable for water rents.
7. All parties using water in stables will be charged schedule rates for the same whether it is carried by hand or through a hose.
8. The selectmen reserve the right to put in a meter at the expense of the water user, in any case, and charge for water rates corresponding to meter rates charged by works of a similar class. When water passes through a meter it may be used for any and all purposes. No person except an employee of the Water Department will be allowed to take off water meters, or tap the mains.
9. No abatement of water rents will be made by reason of disuse or diminished use unless the water has been turned off at the curb stop by the Water Department. No abatements can be made without written authority of the Board of Selectmen.
10. Owners of water takers shall also promptly give notice when the use of fixtures has been resumed or tenement re-occupied.
11. SHUTTING OFF WATER: The selectmen reserve the right to shut off the water for the purpose of making alterations or necessary repairs; and they will also restrict the use of water in case of shortage, especially in the case of large consumers and garden hose; also, they will shut off the water from any person who will disregard these rules or neglect to pay the water rents when due.
12. When a water use ban is in effect, violators will have their water turned off and the water will not be turned back on until the sum of \$20.00 has been paid (\$10.00 turn-off, \$10.00 turn-on).
13. No person shall be entitled to damages, nor to have any portion of a payment refunded for any stoppage of water for the purpose of additions or repairs, nor any stoppage for violation of these rules, nor for any purpose whatever, which in the opinion of the selectmen may be deemed necessary.
14. LETTING ON WATER: When the water has been shut off for violation of any of these rules, for non-payment of rents, or for repairs for consumer, it shall not be turned on again until the selectmen are satisfied that there will be no further cause for complaint, and the sum of \$10.00 shall have been paid for shutting off and \$10.00 for turning on the water. There shall be a \$10.00 turn-on and \$10.00 turn-off fee for seasonal usage.
15. The selectmen reserve the right to establish such rules, regulations and rates from time to time, as they may think expedient for the introduction and use of water. Water will be supplied only to such parties as conform to the rules and regulations of the selectmen.

16. If in any case it becomes necessary to shut off water from any distribution main or branch pipe, reasonable notice will be given whenever possible and in such manner as practicable. However, in the cases of emergency, notice of water stoppage will not necessarily be given.
17. No person shall in any case be allowed to open a fire hydrant except by a written permit from the selectmen, but the engineers of the Fire Department shall in all cases have control of hydrants at fires.
18. ANY person, corporation, or other entity who damages any part of the water system will be held liable for all costs of repair.
19. Water takers shall not allow persons not taking water to obtain water from their fixtures without a written permit from the selectmen.

If any water taker permits another, not a patron of the water works, to obtain a supply of water, the taker so permitting shall be charged double the regular rate for a full quarter and longer if said person continues to furnish water contrary to this rule.
20. No person shall park a vehicle so as to obstruct a fire hydrant or place or cause to be placed, any building material, earth, snow or other obstruction in the way of its free use by the firemen (within four feet of hydrant on all sides).
21. Consumers leaving their premises unoccupied for any length of time are especially warned to close the main house shutoff, as water is liable to escape by accident or otherwise.
22. We recommend service pipe to be three quarter inch copper K water pipe and brass or copper pipe fittings. Any non-conforming pipe, such as plastic or PVC, shall be laid on a base of six inches of fine, stone free sand, and with a minimum of twelve inches of stone free sand placed over and above the pipe. All water lines shall be inspected by the selectmen or their authorized agent, during installation. Standards for plastic or PVC pipe and fittings must conform to a minimum of one-hundred sixty pounds per square inch test or 200 lb. PSI copper tube size.
23. All new mains installed by applicants must be of ductile iron type pipe (Class 52) and accessories. No asbestos cement or transite lines shall be connected to the water system. All new mains installed by land developers must be shown on a map drawn to scale and supply necessary information such as location of mains, hydrants, corporations and curb boxes, with detailed measurements of curb boxes and corporations. A copy of scale drawings shall be submitted to the selectmen. All new water systems will be subject to inspection by the selectmen or their authorized agent during installation. All gate valves shall be resilient seat type and mechanical joints.
24. All new fire hydrants shall be installed with a shut off which will be located four feet from the hydrant. All new hydrants shall be Dresser 929. Installation of hydrants shall be inspected by the selectmen or their authorized agent during installation.
25. No person shall turn on, turn off or otherwise tamper with curb boxes without the written consent of the selectmen or their authorized agent.
26. Each individual dwelling, business, etc., must have a separate connection to the main and separate curb boxes.
27. All connections to the water system are to be done by the Water Department with proper notice given to the selectmen.

28. No connections will be made by the Water Department after the month of October, through the month of April, unless authorized by the selectmen.
29. No person shall fill a swimming pool from a hydrant, unless authorized and supervised by the selectmen or their authorized agent.

(Where Applicable)

Next 10,000 Cubic Feet - \$.35 per Cubic Foot
\$35.00 per 100 Cubic Feet

NON-METERED USERS: \$25.00 per quarter per household unit.

SEASONAL (UP TO 6 MONTHS): \$50.00 per year.

SPRINKLER SYSTEMS: \$75.00 per quarter.

Water line repairs will be charged to consumer.

Prior to the water being turned on at a use, all requirements of the Town of Winchester must be met (i.e., septic approval, permit to move, driveway permits, etc.).

Each application is considered on its own merits. The selectmen reserve the right to deny any application for use that they determine will jeopardize the safety or health of current municipal water users, or will create unsafe demand on the municipal water system.

LANDFILL-RECYCLING FACILITY

ORDINANCE

Pursuant to the authority of RSA 31:39 and RSA 147 the Town of Winchester hereby adopts the following ordinance for the operation of its public disposal facility to be known as the Landfill-Recycling Facility.

I. USE OF LANDFILL-RECYCLING FACILITY:

The Landfill-Recycling facility will be open for use by Winchester residents and non-resident property owners, and resident and non-resident property owners of such other towns as approved by the Board of Selectmen during the following days and hours and under the following conditions:

- A. Admission to the facility will be only by numbered permit issued annually by the Board of Selectmen upon application to the Selectmen by an appropriate person, business, or institution. All permits must be attached to a motor vehicle and be plainly visible.
- B. The facility will be open on the following days and hours:

9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.	Tuesday, Thursday
8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.	Saturday
8:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M.	Sunday

Closed	Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Holidays
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(The Board of Selectmen, after conducting a Public Hearing, may adjust the hours of operation)

C. Regulation for use

1. Trash and recyclables will be accepted only during scheduled hours.
2. All trash and recyclables shall be placed in designated areas.
3. Everyone using the facility shall observe posted rules and procedures.
4. Everyone using the facility shall obey attendants and comply with their direction.
5. All drivers shall obey the speed limits and and traffic signs.
6. All solid waste and recyclables shall be transported and delivered in vehicles acceptable to the Town of Winchester. Vehicles shall deposit loads safely and not to exceed design or cause overflow in the areas.
7. All vehicles shall cover their loads beginning April 1, 1989 so the material is secure. Trash may be considered covered by the utilization of plastic bags or similar cover. Uncovered loads after April 1, 1989 shall be refused admittance.
8. Any vehicle losing material at the site in an area other than the designated areas whether it be by wind, unsecured load, vehicle or driver error, the owner is responsible for a cleanup charge.
9. All vehicles and drivers entering the facility do so at their own risk and are liable for any and all damages. they may cause the facilities and/or personnel.

II. SEPARATION: "RECYCLING OPTION"

All material brought to the facility for disposal shall be separated into the following categories to be deposited in designated containers or locations as the Landfill-Recycling attendant directs:

A. CLEAR GLASS

SHALL MEAN EMPTY CLEAR GLASS CONTAINERS. NO CERAMICS, WINDOW GLASS OR LIGHT BULBS. LABELS DO NOT HAVE TO BE REMOVED.

- B. GREEN OR BLUE GLASS SHALL MEAN EMPTY GREEN OR BLUE GLASS CONTAINERS. NO CERAMICS, LABELS DO NOT HAVE TO BE REMOVED.
- C. BROWN GLASS SHALL MEAN EMPTY BROWN GLASS CONTAINERS. NO CERAMICS. LABELS TO NOT HAVE TO BE REMOVED.
- D. MIXED GLASS & CERAMICS SHALL MEAN WINDOW GLASS, TUMBLERS, PYREX, CERAMICS, ETC.
- E. METAL CANS & CONTAINERS SHALL MEAN EMPTY TIN OR STEEL CONTAIN OF A SIZE ONE GALLON OR SMALLER. LABELS DO NOT HAVE TO BE REMOVED.
- F. ALUMINUM CANS SHALL MEAN EMPTY ALUMINUM CANS.
- G. PAPER SHALL MEAN ALL CLEAN, DRY, PAPER SEPARATED INTO THE FOLLOWING THREE CATEGORIES:
1. Newspapers
 2. Corrugated paper, cardboard, and brown paper bags.
 3. All other paper products such as junk mail, catalogs, and magazines.
- H. PLASTICS SHALL MEAN ALL CLEAR AND COLORED PLASTIC SODA BOTTLES, MILK, CIDER, JUICE, AND WATER CONTAINERS. THEY SHALL BE SEPARATED INTO THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES:
1. Clear soda bottles, etc (P.E.T.)
 2. Colored soda bottles, etc. (P.E.T.)
 3. Mixed milk, cider, juice and water containers, etc. (H.D.P.E.)
- I. LARGE METAL OBJECTS SHALL MEAN SCRAP METAL OF ALL KINDS, i.e., PIPE, WIRE, APPLIANCES, SHEET METAL MOTORS, TOOLS, BED SPRINGS, ETC.
- J. TIRES SHALL MEAN AUTOMOBILE, MOTORCYCLE AND BICYCLE TIRES REMOVED FROM THE WHEEL OR RIM.
- K. LEAVES & CLIPPINGS SHALL MEAN ALL LAWN CLIPPINGS, GREEN AND DRY GARDEN WASTE AND MANURE (to be dumped in the mulch pile)

L.	TREE LIMBS & BRUSH	SHALL MEAN ALL TREE LIMBS AND BRUSH NOT EXCEEDING FIVE (5) INCHES IN DIAMETER (to be deposited in the burn pile)
M.	BUILDING MATERIAL	SHALL MEAN THE REFUSE FROM DEMOLISHED BUILDING (The material shall be separated into their appropriate categories)
N.	DEAD ANIMALS	<u>BY SPECIAL ARRANGEMENT ONLY</u>
O.	USED MOTOR OIL	<u>BY SPECIAL ARRANGEMENT ONLY</u>
P.	GARBARGE	SHALL MEAN ANY OTHER RESIDENTIAL WASTE WHICH IS NOT LISTED ABOVE.
Q.	INDUSTRIAL WASTE	SHALL MEAN ANY WASTE FROM ANY PROCESS OR INDUSTRY, MANUFACTURING, TRADE OR BUSINESS. <u>BY SPECIAL ARRANGEMENT ONLY</u>

ANY SUCH WASTE NOT FALLING WITHIN THE ABOVE CATEGORIES BY SPECIAL ARRANGEMENT ONLY.

III. UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS:

These materials shall not be disposed of at the Winchester Solid Waste Transfer Station.

1. Explosives, such as dynamite and ammunition.
2. Gas, oil, turpentine, paints, liquid asphalt, pesticides, herbicides or their products.
3. Stumps and lot clearing materials.
4. Highly volatile products.
5. Motor vehicles, boats and parts thereof.
(Cars, trucks, motorcycles, busses, trailers, etc.)
6. Asbestos waste.
7. Batteries other than vehicle batteries
(Flashlight and game)
8. Hazardous waste- Residential, Commercial and Industrial.

9. Any material, which in the opinion of the Town personnel constitutes a serious hazard to other users, to the property of the Town or to the employees, will not be accepted.
10. Hospital, nursing home and veterinarian materials and waste. These materials will not be received unless prior permission and arrangements have been made.
11. Any material listed in the New Hampshire RSAs or the Solid Waste Division Administrative Rules.
12. Any material listed on the Transfer Station operation permit.
A hazardous waste drop-off center may be established by the Town of Winchester where materials listed in Items #2, 4, 7, and 8 can be collected.

Anyone wanting to dispose of the materials listed above should seek guidance from the State Department of Environmental Services.

IV. SUPERVISION:

The Landfill-Recycling Attendant shall have the right to refuse the use of the Facility to any person, corporation, or other user who is misusing the Facility, or is violating this Ordinance, or who does not have the proper permit, or the necessary tickets to cover the costs incurred under the Unrecycled Waste Option. Any such user who refuses to obey the legitimate orders of the Attendant shall be guilty of a violation of this Ordinance.

V. BURNING:

No burning shall be allowed at the Facility except at the direction and supervision of the District Fire Warden and the Town Selectmen.

VI. FIREARMS:

The discharge of firearms is prohibited at the Facility.

VII. ORIGIN OF MATERIAL DISPOSED OF AT FACILITY:

Only material collected within the limits of the Town of Winchester or such other Towns as approved by the Selectmen, shall be disposed of at the Landfill-Recycling Facility.

VIII. COMMERCIAL HAULERS:

A commercial hauler shall mean anyone who hauls materials to the disposal facility for others for a fee. All persons or corporations engaged in the commercial hauling of rubbish materials, etc., must first obtain a permit from the Board of Selectmen after payment of a permit fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per year and also furnish to the Town of Winchester a Five Thousand Dollar (\$5,000.00) Surety Bond or a deposit of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) cash to ensure the compliance with the terms of this Ordinance. A copy of the permit shall be kept in the commercial vehicles at all times.

IX. TRESPASS:

The gate will be locked at all times when the Landfill-Recycling Facility is not open to the public. Anyone entering the Landfill-Recycling Facility when the gate is locked is guilty of trespass and shall be charged with violating the terms of this Ordinance.

X. UNRECYCLED WASTE:

The Town is aware that some persons and business will find it difficult, if not impossible, to recycle waste material.

- A. Taking the above fact into consideration, together with the evidence that such unrecycled waste material will create additional expense for the Town in recycling or removing said material from the Landfill-Recycling Facility, the following fees will be assessed by the Town against the registered holder of the numbered permit attached to the motor vehicle at the facility, for unsorted material brought to the facility in that vehicle.
1. \$10.00 per trip for any passenger vehicles (Sedans, convertibles, station wagons)
 2. \$20.00 per trip for any trucks, vans, and trailers to two and one-half tons capacity.
 3. \$50.00 per trip for any trucks, vans and trailers of over two and one-half tons capacity (excluding commercial packers).
 4. \$6.00 per cubic yard for commercial packers and roll off containers based on rated unit capacity.

- B. The Board of Selectmen, after conducting a public hearing, may adjust said Landfill fees to reasonably reflect the actual cost to the Town of handling and disposing of unrecycled waste material.

XI. COLLECTION OF LANDFILL FEES:

- A. Landfill Permits - All Landfill Permits will be numbered by the Board of Selectmen and issued to a specific individual, company or institution. Each permit must be attached to a motor vehicle and must be plainly visible.
- B. Landfill Tickets 1.) The Registered holder of the Landfill permit agrees to purchase the necessary tickets from the Selectmen's Office to cover the costs incurred by the Town if said holder chooses the "Unrecycled Waste Option" over the "Recycling Option". The Landfill Attendant shall collect the tickets from said registered holder equal to the fee schedule in Section 10 of this Ordinance. 2.) Tickets shall be purchased for the following items. The fees shall be as shown and subject to revision by the Town Selectmen.

SEPARATION OF GOODS:

1. White Goods (household goods must be kept separate from all other waste. An additional fee of \$10.00 per large appliance will be charged.
2. Hard Metals (steel shafting, castings, etc.) must be kept separate from all other waste. An additional fee of \$10.00 per truck load will be charged.
3. Tires and Heavy Rubber Goods must be kept separate from all other waste. An additional fee of \$2.00 per car tire and \$5.00 per truck tire will be charged.

XII. EXEMPTION:

In special circumstances the fees may be waived by the Board of Selectmen.

XIII. PENALTY:

Any person or Corporation convicted of violating any provision of this Ordinance or the directives of the Landfill-Recycling Attendant may have their privilege of Landfill-Recycling use revoked, as determined by special hearing with the Town Selectmen.

XIV. SEPARABILITY:

The invalidity of any provision of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other provision nor the validity of the Ordinance as a whole.



We have examined the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire for the year ended June 30, 1988 and have issued our report thereon dated November 10, 1988. As part of our examination, we made a study and evaluation of the internal accounting control of the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire to the extent we considered necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted auditing standards and standards for financial compliance audits contained in the U.S. General Accounting Office Standards for Audit of Governmental Organizations, Programs, Activities and Functions. For the purpose of this report we have classified the significant internal accounting controls in the following categories:

ACCOUNTING APPLICATIONS

Billing
Receivables
Purchasing and Receiving
Accounts Payable
Cash Disbursements
Payroll

The purpose of our study and evaluation was to determine the nature, timing, and extent of the auditing procedures necessary for expressing an opinion on the entity's financial statements. Our study and evaluation was more limited than would be necessary to express an opinion on the system of internal accounting control taken as a whole.

The management of the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire is responsible for establishing and maintaining a system of internal accounting control. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgments by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of control procedures. The objectives of a system are to provide management with reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that assets are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and

recorded properly to permit the preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Because of the inherent limitations in any system of internal accounting control, errors or irregularities may nevertheless occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of the system to future periods is subject to the risk that procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the degree of compliance with procedures may deteriorate.

Our study and evaluation made for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph would not necessarily disclose all material weaknesses in the system. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the system of internal accounting control of the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire taken as a whole.

However, our study and evaluation disclosed no conditions that we believe to be a material weakness.

This report is intended solely for the use of management and cognizant agent and should not be used for any other purpose. This restriction is not to limit the distribution of this report which, upon acceptance by the Town of Winchester, New Hampshire is a matter of public record.

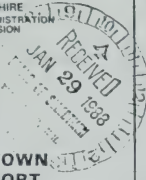

During my absence, which encompasses most of the time-span of this report, the library was very well managed by my staff under the direction of Jennie Lu Hill. I cannot express enough gratitude to Jennie, Dot Doolittle and Mary Weiner for their untiring efforts to maintain continued service to our townspeople.

Jennie conducted the Summer Reading Program using the U.S. Constitution as the general theme. About thirty children completed the requirements.

During a few days the first part of September, we were closed so that Mr. Fissette of Westmoreland could resurface our floors. On September 19th we held Open House in honor of Constitution Day. We staged a Quilt Show featuring about thirty quilts loaned by local people. Many people came to admire these creations of our ancestors and others which had more recently been made. The Historical Rooms upstairs were open and many people had a chance to see our collection of Winchester artifacts.

A dehumidifier was placed in the basement to help absorb the moisture that collects in basements such as ours. It has helped greatly. In December Joe Norton refinished the original shutters and replaced them in the Historical Rooms upstairs. From March 14 to around the first of April the library was closed so that the Staff could take inventory of the Non-Fiction collection.

The Winchester District Nursing Association presented us with a collection of books on Family Issues and Home Health Care. We are grateful to them for this gift.

DIRECTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT

1988

The 1987 Annual Report for the E.L.M. Community Center listed some 50 activities at the Center which involved over 2,000 people using our facilities during peak months. This year we are offering over 50 activities and serving many more people, both youth and adults. We welcome to the Center, the Winchester J.C.'s, Arlington Grange, and the Catholic Church's Bingo every Tuesday.

Three big projects were completed this year: The bowling alleys were refurbished; a new furnace was installed to replace two extremely old ones under the alleys; the interior of the auditorium was repaired and painted.

Work done on the alleys includes the resurfacing of the approaches and lanes; installation of new ball returns, scoring tables, bench seats; and replacing parts and updating the pinsetters. Sanday Francis is in charge of the alleys full time, now. She has a Sunday Night Couple's League and a Monday morning Special Ed class from the Elementary School. Monday night is Teen Open Bowling, on Tuesday morning is a Ladies League, Tuesday night is a Mixed League, Wednesday night another Ladies League, Thursday night the VFW League, and on Friday morning the Special Ed class from Thayer High School comes down. Open bowling follows the leagues on Monday and Wednesday (around 8:30) til 10:00 p.m., and on Friday from 7:00 - 10:00 p.m. Saturday bowling is available by appointment. (Have you thought of having a BIRTHDAY PARTY at the alleys on a Saturday?)

The arcades are open on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 7:00 - 10:00 p.m. in the auditorium, where teenagers in town find a place to meet and play video games, pool, and enjoy the juke box. Bowling is also available after the leagues.

Winter school vacation week (February 22 - 26) produced a good turn-out. Daily attendance averaged 25 students at the arcades, 21 for the free movies, 10 for the open bowling, and 5 - 10 on the ice rink. Spring vacation week (April 25 - 29) saw an average of 48 students here each day. The outdoor basketball court continues to be very popular as weather permits. (Have you tried the new HORSESHOE PITS next to the rifle range, which Kiwanis installed?)

"THE CENTER OF ATTRACTIONS"


Day Camp for 1988 was the biggest ever. There were 100 campers each day for the six weeks of activities. There were three paid staff and eight volunteer adults helping out. Two swimming sessions were offered at Forest Lake daily. The campers put the flag up at 9:00 a.m. and took it down at 3:00 p.m. Some of the highlights of the summer were: field games, tennis and archery lessons, arts and crafts, gymnastics, and nature walks. There were Special Event Days like Tie Day, Hat Day, Puppet Show, Aquatics Day, Carnival Day with a real clown, and the Haunted House. The summer Haunted House went over so well, another one was created for Halloween, along with a party for the Elementary School. Many "Thanks" to all who helped this summer program run so well, but especially to Chris Leville, assistant camp director, and Julie "Cookie" Corey, our waterfront director, and to Ed Bergeron for his fine care of the grounds and buildings.

To help commemorate our fiftieth anniversary, an attractive new sign was put up on our Main Street. In May United Way informed us we will receive a grant of \$3,000.00 to help pay for the new furnace. The flag pole was painted, new pulley and rope put in and a spot light installed. The Girl Scouts donated a clock for the Senior Citizen Room. A new fire door has been installed next to the stage; fire escape repairs are under way. Our fourth annual Flea Market ran every Saturday as weather permitted, and again was a great success. Two more dug-outs were put up on the far field. A girl's softball team was established, thanks to the efforts of Iggy Warren.

Some areas which need attention in the future are: exterior repairs and painting to the auditorium and alleys; storm windows for the alleys to save on fuel; renovation and construction of the room under the auditorium so that the arcades can be moved downstairs, releasing the upper hall for other activities.

If you would like to know more about the Community Center, please drop by for a tour. And if you have never tried our bowling alleys, remember, "the First String is on the house."

FINANCIAL REPORT

The actual cost of all services provided in 1988 with all funding sources is projected to be \$75,697.00.

These services have been supported to the greatest extent possible by Medicare, Medicaid, other insurances, grants and patient fees. Services that were not covered by other funding have been supported by your town. In 1988, town support is projected to be \$31,070.00 for home care services and \$3,687.00 for the Meals-On-Wheels Program.

We recommend an appropriation of \$31,070.00 to continue home care services and \$3,687.00 for the Meals-On-Wheels Program to continue services at the current level.

WINCHESTER POLICE DEPARTMENT
ANNUAL REPORT, 1988

At the beginning of this year, 1989, we should review our accomplishments during this past decade and set our goals for the upcoming year.

Over the past nine years, we have remained a constant threat to lawbreakers, who commit crimes within the Town of Winchester and neighboring towns as well, and we have done this without a significant increase in personnel.

Our greatest achievement has been the safeguarding of Winchester's homes and businesses from unauthorized entries. More homes and businesses were broken into and vandalized during 1977, 1978 and 1979 than the period 1980 through 1988.

Criminal Mischief Cases which used to cost property owners thousands of dollars annually, has decreased and vandals, when apprehended, are required to pay restitution.

Serious crimes involving violence still occur, but not very often. Sexual assaults, robberies and serious physical assaults are not occurring in Winchester as frequently as in other areas of the State.

On our highways, where traffic has increased to approximately 5,000 vehicles a day on Route 10, the last two years have been fatal free.

The above achievements did not just happen, by working together (the Community, Town Officials and the Police Department) we made them happen.


By increasing patrol time in the early 80's, we greatly improved our capabilities of preventing serious crimes. Police visibility along with citizen involvement in reporting anything of a suspicious nature, helped cut burglaries, vandalism and other crimes against our citizens. We need that same citizen involvement in the future.

By funding training, vehicles and increased road patrol time, we also were able to curtail fatal accidents, which in the late 70's reached 7 deaths per year. With increased traffic, two years in a row without a fatality is a major accomplishment for our Town.

This year, we are working on increasing our intervention efforts in different areas such as, Drug/Alcohol Abuse, Child Abuse and Neglect and Domestic Violence. We are attempting to better identify the causes of and help solve the serious problems affecting our families by proper referral to appropriate agencies. Hopefully, next year, I will be able to report improvements in these areas.

If you are new in Town or have not been aware of your Police Department's accomplishments over the past ten years, take the time to visit our Library or Town Hall and look over our past activity reports. The achievement our Town has made in area of crime prevention is noteworthy and often times has been overshadowed by other local problems or conditions.

On behalf of my Department, I wish to thank the citizens of our fine Town for their continued support, as well as the Selectmen, Administrative Assistant and other Departments for their support and assistance this past year. Be proud, as I am, to be from Winchester.

July 1, 1987 to June 30, 1988 proved to be a busy time for the Winchester Ambulance Department as our total calls reached a record 340. Of this total, 21 were in Richmond and 59 resulted in no transport.

During the past year our emphasis has contined to be on training. We are finding it difficult to keep enough people on our squad to provide adequate coverage, especially during the day time when many of our members work in Keene. We are always on the lookout for new members and since we have lost Chuck Rosoff and Walt Harrison due to health reasons, we are down to only (5) EMT's and (7) Advanced First Aiders. Therefore, if you are interested, please let us know.

We are enjoying the new ambulance. It is much more comfortable for the patient and rides much smoother than our old 40A1 which was basically a truck. Winchester is very fortunate to have modern up-to-date equipment and a town that supports us - and in return we are able to deliver our patients in the best possible condition. It is far easier to provide good care when you have the best possible equipment available - and we have that.

We have been concentrating on hazzardous waste and radioactive material. We have had several training sessions and drills supervised by the State and have successfully completed these classes.

Financially we are doing well. We have not increased our request from the town for several years. We are collecting payment from Medicare and Medicaid and recoup much of our requested funds.

Once more, thank you Winchester taxpayers, for making it possible for us to have the ambulance --we will continue to provide you with our best...with the help of the police and fire department. Winchester is very lucky to have such dedicated emergency workers.


BOARD OF SEWER COMMISSIONER'S REPORT
OF
WINCHESTER WASTEWATER FACILITY

Each month we are getting closer to the construction phase of the Ashuelot Sewer Extension Project. Shovels should start digging on March 1, 1989. We'll all have to put up with some inconveniences, like one lane traffic and some delays in getting from place to place for awhile. But it will be well worth it to see the Ashuelot River free of sewage from the Town of Winchester. So please bear with us.


Also, this year we had an unexpected emergency at the Treatment Plant, which flooded with roughly 30' of raw sewage. Thanks to all the volunteers in Town, we were able to keep the plant running, getting it back into operation.

In all, the plant has been running well over the past year.

JANUARY 11, 1989

The Winchester Industrial Development Committee was reformed in August, 1988. The following individuals were appointed by the Selectmen: Charles Gratton, Francis Gutoski, Ronald Maynard, Peter Pinard, Herbert Stevens, Paul Greenleaf and Carolyn Nicholson. Charles Gratton, Francis Gutoski and Carolyn Nicholson were elected Chair, Vice-Chair and Secretary, respectively. The committee continues to meet each Tuesday evening at 7:30 PM in the Town Hall.

Among the activities pursued by the committee since August have been meetings with the New Hampshire Office of Industrial Development (NHOID) to update their data base on available land and buildings in Winchester; with the New Hampshire Office of State Planning to discuss grant assistance for industrial development; with potential developers and interested business owners, and contacts with local land owners regarding zoning changes beneficial to industrial development. The committee has been studying information available from many different resources in order to build a base of data which can be used for future marketing of Winchester as a good location of development.

With the death of Francis Gutoski and the resignation of Herbert Stevens, the committee has also been seeking out people to be appointed to the committee. Interested parties may contact the selectmen or any member of the committee to find out more about the committee's activities.

The committee has developed a set of operating procedures which describe membership and the committee's structure and functions. The committee's goals are as follows:

1. coordination and information-sharing with NHOID
2. cooperation with local land-owners and potential developers
3. promotion of Winchester as a desirable location for industrial development
4. encouragement of public policy decisions which will facilitate the committee's goal of industrial development
5. pursuit of appropriate sources of funding to encourage industrial development

Finally, the committee is actively developing a marketing plan and strategy which can be used to provide information and support to businesses which express an interest in settling in Winchester. We are interested in all aspects of the community's climate which contribute to such a decision and expect that this effort will be the primary focus of the committee's work over the next several months.
