THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. to 6:30 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Barnstead in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Barnstead Town Hall in said Barnstead on Tuesday, the 13th (Thirteenth) day of March, next at 10:00 a.m. of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. The second session for purpose of discussing and voting upon the Articles of the Town Warrant shall be held on Saturday, March 17, 1990 at 1:00 P.M. at the Barnstead Elementary School, and for all other business to come before the Meeting. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for, receive and expend federal or state grants, which may become available during the course of the year, and also to accept and expend money from any other governmental unit or private source to be used for purposes for which the town may legally appropriate money, provided: (1) that such grants and other monies do not require the expenditure of other town funds, (2) that a public hearing shall be held by the Selectmen prior to the receipt and expenditure of such grants and monies; and (3) that such items shall be exempt from all provision of RSA:32 relative to limitation and expenditure of town monies, all as provided by RSA 31:95b.
5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of Fifteen Thousand and no/100 Dollars, \$15,000.00, to purchase 1.4 acres of land surrounding the present Town Garage on Beauty Hill Rd.
6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of Twenty Thousand and no/100 Dollars, (\$20,000.00), to establish a new Capital Reserve Fund to be called the Bosco Bell Bridge Capital Reserve Fund.

7. To see if the Town will vote on the following:
"Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:28, V and VI for an optional veterans' exemption and an expanded qualifying war service for veterans seeking the exemption? The optional veterans' exemption is \$100, rather than \$50." (To be voted on by Ballot).
8. To see if the Town will vote on the following:
"Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:35, IV for an optional property tax exemption on residential property for a service-connected total disability? The optional disability exemption is \$1,400, rather than \$700." (To be voted on by Ballot).
9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of Eighteen Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$18,000.00), and put same in the Town Hall Restoration Capital Reserve Fund.
10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of Five Thousand Five Hundred and no/100 Dollars, (\$5,500.00), for the Lease/Purchase of a 4x4 vehicle for use of the Police Department.
11. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw the sum of Six Thousand Three Hundred and no/100 Dollars, (\$6,300.00), from the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund, and vote to appropriate and raise the sum of Eight Thousand Seven Hundred and no/100 Dollars, (\$8,700.00), by taxation for the purchase of a new Police Cruiser.
12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Welch Road Bridge Capital Reserve Account created in 1988. This account was created in error. Said funds, with accumulated interest to date of withdrawal, to be transferred to the town's general fund. (Majority Vote Required).
13. To see if the Town will vote to create an expandable general fund trust fund under the provisions of RSA 31:19-a, to be known as the Welch Road Bridge Maintenance Fund, for the purpose of repairing and maintaining the Welch Road Bridge and to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Eight Hundred and no/100 Dollars, (\$1,800.00), toward this purpose. (Majority Vote Required).
14. To see if the Town of Barnstead will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,541.65 for the Youth Services Bureau's Court Diversion services for first offenders (an effective alternative to the juvenile court system) and other youth oriented programs, i.e. The Challenge Course, the Youth Companion Program and short-term counseling, (by Petition).
15. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of Two Hundred and no/100 Dollars, (\$200.00), from William Crossett with the interest to be used for the upkeep of the Mahala Holmes Cemetery.

16. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of Two Hundred and no/100 Dollars, (\$200.00), from Susan Sanborn Wheeler and Robert S. Wheeler Jr., with the interest to be used for the upkeep of the Norris Cemetery.

17. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of Two Hundred and no/100 Dollars, (\$200.00), from the estate of Melvin C. Bunker with the interest to be used for the upkeep of the Captain Daniel Bunker Cemetery.

18. To see if the Town will vote to sell at Public Auction, any and all property acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's Deed, with the right to accept or refuse any or all bids. The proceeds to go into an escrow account towards the construction of a new Town Shed.

19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following Town Ordinances. These ordinances have been accepted by the Selectmen since 1987. To be upheld in Court a Ballot vote is required.

- Ordinance #11-87.1 Relative to Licensing
- Ordinance #21-87.2 Relative to Unnecessary Noises
- Ordinance #31-87.3 Relative to Street Regualtions
- Ordinance #31A-87.4 Relative to Load Limits on Town Roads, Streets and Bridges

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

They cut bushes and mowed grass and brush along sides of roads. They steam cleaned the grader, loader and sanders.

The Highway Department cold patched the tar roads and graded roads. They also rock raked the roads which they graded. They cleaned out and made ditches along sides of roads. They hauled gravel on various roads and cleaned out culverts. The Highway Dept. put up street signs. They cleaned out Beaver dams. They put in culverts on roads.

The Highway Department hauled crushed gravel on various roads to improve conditions on those roads.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

During calendar year 1989, the State of New Hampshire experienced an average number of wildfires. The three leading causes of these wildfires were fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden, children and debris burning fires that escaped control. All of these causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. By New Hampshire State law (RSA 224:27), no person, firm or corporation shall kindle or cause to be kindled any fire, except when the ground is covered with snow, without first obtaining a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden of the town where the burning is to be done.

In order to eliminate false alarms, it is advisable to notify your local fire department whenever you intend to do any outdoor burning.

Violations of RSA 224:27 are a misdemeanor and you are also liable for paying all fire suppression costs (RSA 224:28 and RSA 224:36).

The State of New Hampshire, Division of Forests and Lands assisted many towns in wildland fire suppression during 1989 including several large fires in the Concord and Chesterfield areas, as well as the 100 acre fire on Mt. Belknap in Gilford, New Hampshire.

REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

In the spring of 1989 the Commission had a suitable sign made and erected on the land given to the Town by Mrs. Ellen Grau in memory of her late husband Henry Grau. The Commission has called on the Extension Service and Soil Conservation Service to provide management assistance for said property. A land management plan has been developed by these agencies and submitted to the Commission. As a first step, the Commission will be retracing and marking the boundry lines this year.

As a result of the 1989 Town Meeting the Town approved the purchase of the Stevens property. LCIP funds were approved for this purchase. A management plan must be developed. The Commission will either work closely with the LCIP Committee or undertake this project to complete the plan.

For some time now there has been minimal contact between the Conservation Commission and the Planning Board. During the past year an alternate slot has been established on the Planning Board for a Conservation Commission member. This line of communication should insure that environmental impacts from proposed subdivisions will be more fully assessed.

The Town recreation area on Suncook Pond is more heavily patronized each year and we urge our fellow citizens to help us maintain it.

REPORT OF THE BARNSTEAD PLANNING BOARD

In 1989 the Planning Board realized their goal set in 1988 to have the Master Plan as well as the Capital Improvement Plan written. Both are in final draft form at this time.

The Transportation Improvement Plan has been completed and is in the discussion stage. The Board hopes to have this in final draft form in March.

The Water Resource Management Program has been written, presented in rough draft and is currently being printed in final draft form.

All of the above plans are necessary tools for the Board to have in determining the effect a proposed subdivision will have on the Town of Barnstead in addition to determining the impact fees developers will have to pay if the Impact Fee Bill currently under consideration in Concord is passed.

In May of 1989 the Board revised the Subdivision Regulations and has proposed seven revisions to the Zoning Ordinance which appear on this year's ballot as well as adoption of the BOCA Building Code which also appears on the ballot this year.

During the coming year the Board will be proposing additional changes to the Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision Regulations based on the new Master Plan and Capital Improvements Plan after their adoption.

The Board will be holding required public hearings on RSA 155:E to adopt an earth excavation ordinance late in the spring of 1990. Adoption of the ordinance was mandated by the State Legislature during the 1989 session and must occur between August 1, 1989, and August 1, 1990.

The Board has been meeting two nights a month to hear subdivision applications, conduct site plan reviews, and look at lot line adjustments. The Board has also been meeting one night a month to conduct work sessions and one or two nights a month to work on the Master Plan, Capital Improvements Plan, Transportation Improvement Plan, and Water Resource Management Plan. In addition many members of the Board have gone to classes and seminars on planning, land use, and soil sciences in addition to a series of law lectures. It has been a very busy year for all the members of the Board.

The Committee of Municipal and County Government received the normal assignment of 100 bills for the session.

I received assignment on committee of interim study with two bills, and Chairmanship of H.B. 190 relating to conflict between Municipal Budget Law and Collective Bargaining Negotiations with a financial impact of bottom line budget appropriations.

Due to the complexity of labor negotiations and Municipal Budget Law, H.B. 190 was recommitted to interim study.

The system seems rather complex, time consuming, and mind bog-gling, however, the end result is a justifiable decision acceptable to all concerned parties.

The Battle of the Budget is always a paramount issue, and each session seems to address unforeseen or unimaginable avenues.

Attendance to House and Committee registered 100% with a 94% voting average in the House, with 60% being excused.

The Suncook Valley Ambulance Service, Inc. was formed on April 1, 1989 to "Carry on the tradition" of a well-trained professional ambulance service available to the local area communities, after Center Barnstead Fire Department Ambulance dissolved March 31, after thirty years.

In the best business interest of the company, we physically located our service on Route 28N in Chichester beside Clarks Grain Store. We started with two town contracts, Barnstead and Epsom.

With a roster of 23 employees, 6 dispatchers and 17 emergency medical technicians with advanced skill certifications in defibrillation, I.V. therapy, and esophageal obturator airway management, we provided service to approximately 450 patients in our first 9 months in business. On February 10, 1990, we hired our first paramedic, which gives us the ability to provide LIFE-SAVING cardiac and respiratory drugs in the field. Our goal for 1991 is to have the availability of 24 hour paramedic skills. We provide service 24 hours per day, 365 days per year, therefore our operating costs are incredible.

Emergency medical costs are no exception to the escalating tax dollar. We HAVE made every effort to tame the extreme, by accepting approved Medicare and Medicaid payments of residents of the contracted communities. NO ONE HAS BEEN OR WILL BE DENIED EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE BECAUSE OF HIS OR HER ABILITY TO PAY.

We would like to express our sincere thanks to all those individuals, that have continually shown support to our cause in one manner or another.

We will PLEDGE our organization to provide continued, DEDICATION, PROFESSIONALISM, AND MOST OF ALL, THE BEST EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE.

The Lakes Region Community Health Agency provides a range of "in home" health care services including Visiting Nurse, Physical Therapy, Home Health Aide, Homemaker, Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Early Intervention/Family Support services for families with a child birth to three with a developmental delay. The services are provided on a sliding scale for people without insurance.

In 1988-89 the Agency provided 579 visits to 30 residents of Barnstead: Nursing 101 visits; Physical Therapy 49 visits; Speech/Occupational Therapy 10 visits; Home Health Aide 109 visits; Homemaker 156 visits; Early Intervention 156 visits; and Private Aide 4 visits.

The people seen are primarily elderly Barnstead residents who need help remaining independent at home.
