COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

To the Citizens of Belknap County:

In compliance with the laws of the State of New Hampshire, the commissioners of Belknap County herewith present the annual report of the County Commissioners, Treasurer, Superintendent of the Farm and House of Correction, Clerk of Superior Court, Sheriff, Solicitor, Farm Physician, Chaplain and Auditors for the year ending December 31, 1930.

Unemployment and part time employment of family men have presented a problem to the County which has been solved in part by providing work at the Farm for those willing and able to earn a living for their families.

An increase in hospital cases and the care of dependent children under the supervision of the State Board of Public Welfare has added materially to the expenses.

The House of Correction, Jail, and men's and women's wards at the Farm have been painted; the bathrooms refinished; a shower-bath installed and sanitary conditions greatly improved. Fire escapes and exits have been provided for the third floor.

At the court house, doors leading to the court room have been changed to comply with State laws, and plans have been formulated to make a similar change in the main entrance.

The Overseer of the Poor of Laconia, the Selectmen of the towns, and other officials have co-operated with us in our efforts to care for the poor.

We desire to extend to them and also Superintendent and Mrs. Magill, Chaplain and Mrs. Jones, and all others who have contributed to the comfort, entertainment and spiritual welfare of the people under our supervision and care, our sincere thanks.

To the Commissioners of Belknap County :

As Solicitor of Belknap County, I beg to herewith submit by report for the past year. The Criminal Docket in the Superior Court has been greatly reduced and but very few cases now remain to be disposed of. The prosecution of liquor cases throughout the County in the Municipal Courts of Laconia, Tilton and Alton have taken considerable time and attention and it is my opinion that the prohibitory law is working out well. At the present time the consideration of pauper cases and the determination of questions of settlements of applicants for county aid demands a great deal of time as many of the questions presented are extremely complicated. The usual run of routine work covering complaints for non-support, child welfare cases and all other matters pertaining to the office of Solicitor have been strictly attended to. Advice to the County Commissioners has been furnished on many cases relating to county questions and several consultations have been had with the Selectmen of the Towns in the County relative to Town and County matters.
