#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Campton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Campton on Tuesday the twelfth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the ensuing year for the maintenance of its highways and bridges and make appropriation of the same.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for Campton Cemetery, also to clean up and fence other cemeteries in Town.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Memorial Day.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the White Mountain Region Association.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$975.00 to reimburse the Campton Village Precinct for rent of use of hydrants in the Campton Village.
- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control.
- 11. To see if 'the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for the use of the Campton Volunteer Fire Department.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Municipal Court in the Town of Campton. (by petition)
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of agents and officers heretofore chosen.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Campton, N. H., qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said district on the seventh day of March, 1957 at eight o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said ap-

propriation of such sums as are estimated to be rereceived from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or offers for educational purposes which now or hereafter may be forthcoming from the State of New Hampshire and/or United States.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to elect its School District Officers by an official ballot and to adopt the nonpartisan ballot system as provided in sections 77, 79-86 of Chapter 59 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, for such elections.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to elect at this meeting a special committee consisting of two members of 'the School Board, one member of the Board of Selectmen, and four other voters of the Campton School District to study the advisability of constructing a central elementary school to replace the existing schools; to recommend a suitable site or sites and to acquire an option or options thereon, to select an architect for preliminary studies; to have sketches drawn of such proposed building; to report back to an adjourned meeting making such recommendations with respect to the above matters as the committee may determine; and to see if the district will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed five hundred dollars for the use of the committee in meeting its expenses and for the purchase of an option or options.
- 12. To see if the district will vote to construct and equip a central elementary school.

- 13. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one hundred fifty-five thousand (\$155,000.00) dollars for the construction of a central elementary school, including the cost of site and preparation thereof, architect's fees, and furniture, furnishings and equipment, and in order to provide such funds, to authorize the School Board to borrow the amount voted and to issue serial notes or bonds in the name and on the credit of the district, and to fix the time and place of payment, rate of interest, 'terms, maturities, and provide for the sale thereof, all in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, known as the "Municipal Finance Act," and any amendments applicable thereto. (Requires two-thirds vote by ballot)
- 14. If the district votes to construct a central elementary school, to see if the district will elect a building committee consisting of five voters of the Campton School District authorized to select a site for the construction of a central elementary school, and to assist the school board in the planning and construction of such school, provided that the selection of the site for the new school and plans and specifications therefor shall finally be approved by the school board acting alone as required by law, and to formally authorize the school board to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary in connection with the construction and equipping of such school.
- 15. To see if the district will vote to enlarge two of the one-room school buildings (Livermore & Blair), and install running water, modern plumbing, heating and lighting facilities.
- 16. To see if 'the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding twenty thousand (\$20,000.00) dollars 'to carry out any vote taken under Article 15, and authorize the School Board to borrow the amount voted and to issue serial notes or bonds in the name and on 'the credit of the district, and to fix the

time and place of payment, rate of interest, terms and maturities, and provide for the sale thereof, all in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, known as the Municipal Finance Act, and any amendment applicable thereto.

- 17. To see if the district will vote to elect or appoint an advisory committee consisting of four voters of the Campton School District to assist the School Board in carrying out any vote which may be taken under Article 15.
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Articles 11 through 17 have been inserted in the above warrant by petitions properly signed and presented to the School Board for said insertion.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

#### TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OF CAMPTON

There were few changes in the Campton Schools when school began this year. Mrs. Hutchinson, who was teaching the upper grades in Beebe River, resigned very suddenly during the latter part of August because of the transfer of her husband and we were fortunate in securing Miss Corinne Beauchemin to replace her. Miss Beauchemin came to us after one year of successful teaching in Nashua and has done fine work in a multiple grade situation. Mrs. Fisher returned as school nurse and upon the resignation of Mr. Malfa as music supervisor, Mrs. Arline Wilson accepted the position. We were fortunate in securing such a well qualified music person. She has been a very successful supervisor of music in New Jersey for several years and although rural music education is new to her, she is doing an outstanding job.

A good part of the book budget this year was expended to supply teachers in the lower grades with supplementary reading materials and to extend our basal reading program into Grades 5 and 6 where new text books are now available. It had been intended that more social studies and science books be purchased that would more nearly conform to the new Curriculum Guides for New Hampshire Elementary Schools. Social studies and science will have priority this year.

The handwriting workbooks that were tried for the last half year a year ago worked out very satisfactorily and are again being used. From evidence collected there is no doubt but that generally the quality of handwriting throughout the system was improved. The testing program is now an adequate one. For the first time a definite program of achievement tests are being scheduled in the fall for diagnostic purposes and in the spring for evaluation. Also readiness tests in grade one and mental ability tests in Grades 1, 3, 5, and 7 are being administered with a folder containing test results being maintained for each child. Present and future teachers of your children should have concrete evidence of their abilities and skills.

It is very encouraging at this writing to find so much interest in the Campton Schools. If I can be of any assistance for information or professional guidance, please do not hesitate to contact me.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the school board, teachers, and parents for their coopera-

tion and courtesy during the past year.

# EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent as per the following quotation:

"REPORTS. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report showing the total salary paid to the superintendent, which report shall show in detail the amount derived from the per capita tax and the amount paid directly by each school district in the union.

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union No. 48 during 1955-1956 received a salary of \$6050 which was made up as follows: \$2500 paid from the per capita tax and \$3550 pro-rated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$850 for travel within the union was also pro-rated as stated above.

The table below shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.

Superintendent's salary for 1955-1956 based on the above figure is reconciled as follows: \$3550 paid by the various districts, plus \$2500 received from State per capita tax, equals \$6050 Superintendent's basic salary. This, plus \$850 travel allowance allocated as indicated above, totals \$6900—amount received from State Treasurer for salary and travel of the Superintendent of Schools.

#### THE MUSIC PROGRAM IN CAMPTON

This program is planned with two major purposes in mind: first, to have each child enjoy music and second, to have children increase their knowledge in order to develop a better understanding and appreciation of good music.

Songs are selected from traditional, classic, and modern folk and art songs. Through this material we develop good tone quality, better sense of rhythm, ability to read music, and knowledge of composers. Wherever possible, music is integrated with other subjects.

In developing better rhythm, the lower grades start with rhythm band, singing games and simple steps such as marching, skipping, sliding, and galloping. As the children progress these simple steps become more intricate and are combined to make a dance. The dancing is limited to square and folk dances of this and other countries which are a part of our musical heritage.

The listening program at the present time is limited because of the lack of good recordings. The children learn to listen for enjoyment of the entire selection, themes, rhythmic patterns, instruments, harmonies and mood.
