All dogs have to have their rabies shots before getting a license. Then the owner should take their rabies shot certificates to the town clerk and get the license through the months of April and May. After July 1, all dogs without a license will have to be done away with.

466:31 Dogs as a Menance.

1. Any person who considers a dog to be causing a nuisance or to be a menance to persons or property may make complaint to any law enforcement officer or to the selectmen of the town in which such dog is kept, and such officers shall, within three days after the receipt of such complaint, investigate the case, and if the complaint is sustained, shall forthwith order the owner or keeper of such dog to abate the nuisance. Service of such order shall be made upon the owner or keeper of such dog by causing a certified copy of such order to be delivered to him. Any owner or keeper upon whom notice of such order has been served, may, within ten days thereafter, bring a petition in the municipal or district court for the town or city, as the case may be, praying that the order be reviewed by the court. After notice to the investigating officers, and upon hearing the court shall affirm, modify or dismiss such order, as justice may require. During the pendency of such action and the order of the justice of the court, the owner or keeper of such dog shall restrain such dog from running at large. Any person who neglects to restrain such dog from running at large, in compliance with orders hereunder shall be fined not more than twenty-five dollars, the dog taken into custody by the police of the city or constable of the town and such disposition made of the dog as the court may order.

II. Under this section, a dog is causing a nuisance or is a menace to persons or property under any of the following condition: (a) if it barks continuosly for sustained periods of time; (b) while it runs at large on the streets or on property other than its owner's, it turns over garbage cans or waste containers, or otherwise causes garbage or waste to be scattered in yards or on streets or sidewalks; (c) while it runs at large it barks at or snaps at or runs after persons walking on sidewalks or streets, or at persons riding bicycles on sidewalks or streets; (d) while it runs at large it barks at or runs after motor vehicles being driven along the streets; (e) while it runs at large it gathers in packs with other dogs and runs with the pack after game, domestic animals, or human beings; (f) while running at large it digs or scratches in gardens or around cultivated areas, so as to uproot or destroy the growing plants, shrubs, or trees; (g) while in heat is unconfined.

466:36 Killing Dogs.

Any conservation officer may kill any dog found in the act of maiming or in close pursuit of deer, moose, caribou, sheep, cattle, swine or poultry. No civil action for recovery of damages shall lie against any conservation officer while acting under authority granted herein. The owner or owners of any dog or dogs caught in the act of maiming or in close pursuit of deer, moose, caribou, sheep, cattle, swine or poultry, may be fined not more than three hundred dollars.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

This year on instruction from the Tax Commission it was necessary for the Selectmen to revise the records of all taxable property in Town, listing acreage and buildings according to what and how much every taxpayer owned on each side of every highway in town. The extra work this entailed is reflected in an overdraft in Town Officers Salaries, shown under the Comparative Statement of Appropriations on other pages of the Town Report.

Early this spring the clogging of culverts with ice was particularly bad and considerable damage was done to the roads by washouts. It was impossible to borrow or hire a steamer for thawing out the culverts, so a new one was purchased using funds out of Capital Reserve and out of the Highway appropriation. Having this piece of equipment on hand when needed will result in considerable savings in road repairs in future years.

In accordance with the vote of the Town the Oshkosh truck was traded in and a new International four wheel-drive truck was bought. Delivery of the new truck was slow and most of the highway summer work was done without it. However, it arrived in time to be used for plowing in the heavy snows that came early this winter.

Because of the shortage of labor it was thought advisable to buy a riding tractor mower for the Cemetery Department. A Bolens tractor and mower was purchased and the work in the cemeteries was completed quickly and efficiently.

The Tax Commission's assessors started the Town's reassessment in September, but because of snow had to postpone completion of the work till next spring. Assessments for 1969 will be the new values.

Duncan Fund money was used to correct the bad situation that existed at the corner of the Clark Camp Road and the East Road, and also to widen and straighten the road leading from Route 120 to this corner.

TRA funds were used for tarring the Dingleton Hill Road and the Meriden Stage Road.

We regret deeply the loss of two long time residents and town officials.

Charles Sullivan resigned from the Board of Selectmen because of ill health in March and passed away in June. Besides being a Selectman and a successful farmer with a large herd of registered Jerseys, he was well known and active in the Soil Conservation work of Sullivan County.

Carroll Kenyon was elected to the Board of Selectmen last spring. He had been Selectman and Tax Collector in the past and filled the post of Moderator both of the Town and the School District for many years up to the time of his death.

We wish to express our appreciation for the cooperation and help we have received from the other town officials during this difficult year.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, toegether with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Association.

- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for use in the operation and planning of the Lebanon Regional Airport.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to require that any dog or dogs owned or kept in the Town of Cornish shall at all times when within the limits of said town, and not upon or within the premises or property of its owner or keeper, be restrained from running at large.

Any owner or keeper of a dog found in violation of this by-law shall for each violation thereof forfeit ten dollars to the Town, and said penalty may be recovered on complaint before a Municipal Court.

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to require that artificial flowers when in movable pots only, be permitted on Cemetery lots. No ruling on the use of natural flowers.
- 7. (By request) To see if the Town will vote to purchase a Police Radio and raise and appropriate the necessary sum for this purpose.
- 8. To vote by ballot on the Zoning Ordinance and the Building Regulations proposed by the Planning Board.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to amend the vote taken under Article 19 at the March meeting of 1966, to include one representative from each organization in Town to help make arrangements for Memorial Day.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money, if necessary, in anticipation of taxes.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell or otherwise administer property acquired through tax sales and liens.
- 11a. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,200 to finish paying for reappraisal of the Town by the State Tax Commission.
- 12. (By request) To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road leading from Route 120 past buildings now belonging to Earle Carpenter.

- 13. To hear the reports of Officers, Agents, Auditors, and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN & DISTRICT CHIEF REPORT

People cause fires. Our records show that the number of fires increase in an area as the population increases and our state is growing tremendously. This means that we all must be aware of fire causes and do our best to prevent their occurrence.

When we are very young the lighted matches are an adventure, burnt fingers and a dropped match is another fire. A little older we like to have a woodland cookout, or go out by ourselves for a smoke but fire and forests get together for another statistic. We adults like to clean up in the spring, burn the old debris and the dead grass, result — escaped fires and much personal expense.

With new homes and summer cottages located in woodlands and with abandoned fields and forests crowding the back yard of our villages' streets, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the fire season, which comes with the disappearance of the snow, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following action will help:

- 1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.
- 2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you
 must burn
 - a. you need a written permit from the town fire warden for all

debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fireplaces or in charcoal brasiers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.

- b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on grass by householders between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.
- c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire before you light the match.
- 4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column and save your tax dollars for useful purposes.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

l am most pleased to report a greater increase of loaned books over last year. More and more readers are patronizing our Library.

This past year my records show 1,263 persons borrowed our books. The State Library loaned us 189 childrens books, 151 non-fiction and 224 fiction or 564 totaled. Our own books loaned out totaled 5,347, an increase of 995 over last year. They were as follows: 512 childrens loaned, 892 magazines, 94 to local teachers, and 3,797 by students and local adults.

The High School room was used the most again this year, and we purchased several new reference books, hoping to meet their needs. We now have \$3.62 petty cash on hand received by fines on overdue books.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board held eleven meetings during 1968, and each meeting was well attended by the members. Among the Board's activities were the following:

- 1. Charles Hutcheon was appointed to the Board of Adjustment by the Town Moderator and the Board.
- 2. The continuing need for a new zoning ordinance and building regulations was given extensive review, and the Board concluded that it should recommend their enactment at the next Town Meeting. A report was mailed to all Cornish voters explaining why the Board believes that an improved zoning ordinance is necessary for the orderly future growth of the town. Public hearings on the proposed new ordinance will be held in January and February.
- 3. The Board has studied the preparation and issuance of a Town Directory. This directory would include a listing of community organizations with their meeting dates and officers, a listing of town officers, information needed in order to contact police and fire department, a directory of business establishments, etc. It is expected that work on this directory will proceed in 1969.
- 4. The Board, in cooperation with the Selectmen, plans to prepare and erect signes identifying the roads in the town.
- 5. The Board has met with representatives of the U.S. Department of Agriculture to discuss the preparation of a comprehensive survey of the town. We were informed that Cornish is scheduled to be the first community in Sullivan to be surveyed by the Department.
- 6. The Board was represented at a hearing called by the State Public Service Commission to discuss an improvement of the telephone service for Cornish residents by an expansion of the local area.
- 7. The Chairman of the Board attended a meeting at which the subject of the proposed Connecticut River National Recreational Area Study was discussed.

SCHOOL WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Cornish qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said district, on the eighth day of March, 1969, at ten o'clock in the morning to act on Article 1; the remaining articles will be acted upon at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon. Polls will close at 7:00 P.M.

- 1. To choose a Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and Auditors for the ensuing year and a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 2. To determine and fix the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 3. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4. To choose Agents and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
- 5. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 6. To see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the U.S. Government and/or state agencies. Further, to see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.
- 7. To see if the district will authorize the school board to appropriate receipts from federal lunch reimbursements, tuition, gifts and any other receipts from miscellaneous sources in addition to the original appropriation for 1969-70, for the lunch program, general expenses, equipment and improvements.
- 8. To see if the District will raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the school's hot lunch program.
- 9. To see if the District will raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of a remedial summer school.

- 10. To see if the District will appropriate a sum of money for constructing and equipping an addition to the Cornish Elementary School.
- 11. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of paying off the interest on the notes or bonds in the first year, as authorized under Article 10.
- 12. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of making the first principal payment on the serial notes or bonds as authorized in Article 10.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD

The Cornish School Board continues to give close attention to all aspects of local education. The Board meets frequently, in addition to the regular third Monday of each month, to perform the usual duties, to formulate and extend policies regarding school operation and transportation, to upgrade the curriculum and the music program, and to study developments in educational law and practice, local, state and national.

The Board has met with the Building Study Committee and followed carefully the proposed plans, recognizing that expansion can no longer be delayed without detriment to the education of our young citizens. The possibility of Civil Defense Building Aid has been investigated, found to be presently unavailable and doubtful in the future.

Visitors, as well as the regular school personnel, will notice painting and interior decoration which make the building brighter, easier to clean, more pleasant and sanitary.

The school lunch program continues to serve some of the finest meals in the State to an ever-increasing number of students, due to the dedicated work of Mrs. Ackerman and Mrs. Bean. A new set of dishes was received in May 1968, the generous and welcome gift of the Cornish PTA. Recently, rising costs have made it almost impossible to operate so that expenses keep within income.

The Board wishes to emphasize the quiet efficient operation of the school in spite of overcrowding, and to thank wholeheartedly every member of the staff, teaching and auxiliary, for conscientious service in this difficult period, while maintaining a friendly, cooperative rapport among themselves.

Also, the Board wishes to thank the entire staff of Supervisory Union No. 6, and particularly desires to express appreciation to Assistant Superintendent Richard F. Waldo and Teacher Consultant Anthony J. Amari for many patient hours attending to our school needs and improvements. There is a possibility that the already low tuition at Stevens High School may be reduced by funds authorized by the State Legislature.

Finally, the Board commends our Cornish high school students for their fine scholastic records. While there is room for improvement, the Board is especially impressed by the number of pupils on the Claremont and Windsor Honor Rolls. At Stevens High School about 6 percent of the students are from Cornish, but 9 percent of the students on the Honor Roll are from Cornish. At Windsor 5 percent of the students are from Cornish, but 9 percent of those on the Honor Roll are from Cornish. It can hardly be claimed that Cornish students are naturally more intelligent than those of surrounding towns and cities, and since small school graduates often have difficulty adjusting to large school

programs, the Board considers these records to be convincing proof that Cornish School is providing superior education and developing excellent attitudes of study.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of Cornish and Citizens of the town, I herewith submit my report as Superintendent of Schools.

INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF:

In this era of teacher mobility, our District can consider itself fortunate indeed that there was a change in only one position. Miss Virginia Novak, of Claremont, replaced Mr. Edward Billings, resigned.

Miss Novak received a B.A. degree in microbiology from the University of New Hampshire in 1965. She served in the Peace Corps in Brazil for two years, and has had teaching experience in the schools of Philadelphia. She prepared for her Cornish assignment by studying at Dartmouth College last summer, and our school's departmentalized science program has greatly benefited by her initiative and talents.

As the school year progressed, it became evident that a person was needed to offer small group instruction in reading to primary grade students. Mrs. Yvonne Gobin was employed for this purpose. As this report is being written, the program is well under way and accomplishing what simply wasn't possible under the student loads being carried by regular classroom teachers. Mrs. Gobin has previous experience in such supplemental programs.

SCHOOL POPULATION UP:

Last year's report stated we experienced a small decrease in enrollment,

but that many of the classes were still overcrowded. The year ended with 237 students. January, 1969, statistics found 269 children at their desks, an increase of 32 over last year. This problem of overcrowded facilities has been compounded.

A trend appears: Cornish is a growing community; we must prepare adequately to offer instruction and provide classroom space for these children.

BUILDING STUDY COMMITTEE:

Your building committee is keenly aware of the student growth factor. They have also studied ways of upgrading the total school's curriculum. These citizens of Cornish, your friends and your neighbors, present their recommendations to you in two ways: The committee report, and warrant articles for an addition to the school.

I refer you to them.

This administration enthusiastically supports these recommendations as necessary and vital if Cornish is to prepare properly its students for entrance into High School, education beyond, and ultimately, the competitive "world of work".

FEDERAL MONIES:

Federal legislation enacted in 1965 continues to support two basic needs of our school system, the Opportunity Class and the upgrading of our library resources. Both, however, have decreased in actual funding.

In its initial year, Title I returned to us \$207.94 for each eligible youngster. This has decreased annually to the current \$129.68. It still continues to underwrite most of the expense of the activities and program carried on in the "LITTLE SCHOOL HOUSE".

Title II monies have declined more rapidly. In 1965, the allotment was \$2.27 for each Cornish student; now it has dropped to \$.97. Since the inception of this act, our school has received a total of \$1,710.76 in support of library materials.

CURRICULUM:

The principal and staff work closely with this office as a "watch dog" committee continually evaluating the present course of study and at the same time, weighing the merits of a change in programs.

This type of activity never ceases; it cannot if we are to keep abreast of changing educational patterns of content and instructional techniques.

The principal's report outlines this work during the past year.

The Achievement Testing Program has been changed from the spring term to the fall. This will assist teachers by diagnosing earlier the areas of emphasis needed by each student.

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION:

This dedicated group meets frequently to serve the needs of the School District. They have given their time and talents to assist in curriculum evaluation, planning innovation. They have conferred with consultants to get in-depth understanding of reading programs. The school plant's safety and health factors have been inspected, and the Board has made improvements in areas needing such. The transportation system has been analyzed from two points of view, the bus routes and the cost factors. Meetings have been held with parents to clarify points of misunderstanding or conflict.

The above is but a sampling of a multitude of tasks and responsibilities accepted by these individuals. Again this year, they have strived for, and achieved, quality education within the financial resources of our community.

IN RECOGNITION:

No report of this nature should be closed without recognizing the many groups which have assisted and supported the school in various capacities; yet there are so many a list would be cumbersome.

To the staff and principal, to those who service the school, to the PTA, the Building Committee, the news media, the Board of Education, and the community at large, a sincere acknowledgment of appreciation. Because of your efforts, this year has seen progress made on many fronts.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

This year, as in 1968, the emphasis is on curriculum improvement and development. Setting the pace once again, Cornish became the first of the smaller schools in the area to convert to the multi-text system of instruction for history and geography. Under the former plan, both these subjects were taught from a single social studies text. Since it was necessary many times to teach about an entire continent or more, it limited the quantity in the textbook to a minimal amount. The effect was to skim the surface of everything or to learn very little about a large number of things. This was one of the reasons that the multi-text system was introduced.

The philosophy of the multi-text system differs markedly from the previous system. The most obvious difference is the depth to which a student studies a particular country. In the third grade, where the program beings, the students gather knowledge about the history and geography of the United States from a total of seven different text books ranging from Great Explorers to Colonial America. A continuation of this process then divides the United States into four geographical regions, each with a full sized text of its own.

From the concentrated study of the United States in the third grade, the study moves outward to encompass areas of North America and South America which have been particularly significant in the development of the world community. Countries such as Canada, Mexico and Brazil are studied in depth.

And so the process continues up through the grades with ever-expanding horizons as the pupil gains more and more insight through concentration for a time on a single area.

The new reading program, initiated last year, has been continued and is functioning well. There appears to be a decided preference on the part of the students for this type of grouping, which is a large factor in its favor.

In keeping with the philosophy of constant improvement of the curriculum, we have endeavored to revise the English program. There is a more intensive study of grammar and at the same time much more emphasis is being placed on the students' ability to write and converse effectively. This part of the program, known as descriptive writing, brings into use accepted standards of grammar which are taught in the other portion of the program.

It must be mentioned that student numbers are reaching critical proportions. The enrollment at the time of this writing stands at 267. It has, however, been 270. There is an overwhelming need for additional facilities.

In conclusion I wish to express appreciation to the entire staff for their support during the year. I would also like to thank everyone in the Superintendent's office and the School Board. Both have worked to their utmost to insure an educational climate that would most benefit the student body.

SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

To the Cornish School Board and the citizens of Cornish, I herewith submit my annual report as school nurse.

Examinations given during the school year 1967-68 were as follows: Vision tests to all students of which ten were shown to need further examinations by their family eye specialist. Hearing tests were given to 134 students of which none required follow up work.

All children were weighed and measured. Head and skin checks were made at frequent intervals, for noticeable health problems.

Tuberculin Heaf Test was given to 25 first grade students with none showing a positive reaction.

Color perception test was given to 38 students.

An Immunization clinic was held in the spring. A total of 127 school and preschool children attended.

Twelve cases of chicken pox and three cases of mumps were reported to the school. No serious health problems occurred during the school year.

The excellent school lunch program continues to be well patronized and enjoyed.

Again at this time I would like to express my sincere appreciation for the cooperation and assistance given me by the school board and teaching staff at the Cornish School. It is a pleasure working with them.
