

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Fitzwilliam School Board :

I submit at this time my thirteenth annual report as Superintendent of Schools, this being the thirty-first in the series under union supervision.

Several changes in the teaching force were necessitated by resignations and transfers at the close of the school year last June.

Miss Adams resigned her position as assistant in the Junior High school in April, and the work was carried on during the remainder of the school year by Miss Pauline Wight, a cadet teacher from Keene Normal school.

For the present school year Miss Ruth E. Cowdrey of Townsend, Mass., a graduate of Framingham Normal school was secured.

Mrs. Marian (Wentworth) Holman was transferred at her own request from the Village Intermediate to the Columbian Intermediate.

Miss Lillian V. Firth, a graduate of Worcester Normal school was secured for the Village intermediate grades.

Miss Marion Flanders and Miss Vivian Johnson, teachers at the Columbian school were released to accept positions in Lexington, Mass., and Miss Elina Heikkila at State Line was released to accept a position in Wellesley, Mass.

For the Columbian primary grades Miss Evelyn Barton, a graduate of Keene Normal school was secured, and for State Line Miss Gretchen H. Yoffa of Gardner, Mass., was elected. Like Miss Heikkila she is a graduate of Fitchburg Normal school.

Mr. Wetmore, Miss Kimball, Miss Blodgett, and Mrs. Whitcomb, supervisor of music, were retained in the positions they held last year.

The Junior High school shows an increased enrollment, having 49 pupils, where last year 44 were enrolled. The total enrollment for the town shows a decrease of 13 from the school year 1929-30.

A study of the enrollment of the several schools for the past ten years may be of interest at this time, and I submit a table giving the figures for that period.

The enrollment of the Junior High has more than doubled during the past ten years, and has not varied greatly from the average of 47 since the increased membership shown during the school year 1921-22.

The Village schools reached their highest enrollment of 69 in the school year 1923-24, the year that the high total for the town reached 228. The highest enrollment for the Columbian schools was 62 during the school year 1920-21. For last year the enrollment of these schools was 49, and for the fall term of 1930 it fell to 38.

The two rural schools showed a combined enrollment of 45 in 1920-21, and increased to 59 during the year 1923-24. Since that time the number has gradually dropped until the school year 1929-30 showed 38, and the fall term of 1930 showed a further drop to 28.

The total enrollment for the first twelve weeks of the present school year of 160, will, in all probability number nearly or quite 170 before the close of the year.

During the summer vacation extensive repairs and alterations were made at the Village school. The windows on the easterly side were enlarged, increasing the lighting surface to comply with modern school requirements. The roof was shingled and the building and fences painted.

The Fitzwilliam schools have been doing very satisfactory work during the past year. The report of the annual inspection of the Junior High school was very creditable to the school, and the large percentage of pupils going from this school to Keene and Murdock High schools indicates the sustained interest of our boys and girls as well as their parents in securing advanced education.

Present conditions necessitate most careful planning of school expenses. Salaries, while not as high as in many towns in the state, have reached a point where they cannot well be increased, and doubtless new teachers for another year will be willing to accept somewhat less than the minimum salary that has usually been offered.

The close of each school year brings to the attention of school officials certain necessary repairs, but beyond such necessary repairs it would seem wise to postpone work involving much expense for at least another year.

At this time I desire to express my thanks and appreciation to all who have co-operated in advancing the work of our schools during the past year.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Fitzwilliam on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To hear and act upon reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofor choosen.

Art. 2. To allow accounts against the town.

Art. 3. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year; to choose one Trustee to have charge of the Trust fund.

Art. 4. To elect one Selectman for three years.

Art. 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 7. To see what action the town will take in regard to lighting the streets and raise and appropriate money therefor.

Art. 8. To raise and appropriate money for repairs of town highways and bridges and determine the amount.

Art. 9 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,650.00 for Trunk Line maintenance, the state to give \$4,950.00.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for State Aid maintenance, the state to give \$450.00.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,423.50, the state to give \$2,846.00, for State Aid construction.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the old road leading from the site of the old No. 7 school house easterly nearly to the north end of Laurel Lake, then turning northerly and ending at the old James Holman place.

Art. 13. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars, the same to be used for construction of a road beginning at a point on the upper Troy road on the property of L. D. Barnes, thence westerly to the top of the Pinnacle. Land for this road to be given to the town by the owner.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to establish salary of the following town officers: Moderator, Auditor, Supervisors of the Checklist and Election Officers, and submit the same to the vote of the citizens at the next annual Town Meeting.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to discontinue two parts of the westerly half of the highway from Fitzwilliam Depot to Howeville, on the easterly side of South Pond or Laurel Lake, as laid out in 1853 and recorded in Town Record Book 4, Page 89; and accept from Walter G. Perry and Josie K. Webb deeds of land on the easterly side of said highway as laid out, to be used for highway purposes instead of the parts discontinued.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to sell or otherwise store the hearse, to sell, tear down or move the present hearse house or build a suitable tool house to keep cemetery equipment and tools and raise a sum of money to defray the expense or take any action thereon.

Art. 17. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for general care and improvement of the old cemetery not provided for from Trust Funds and determine the amount. This money to be expended under the direction of the Supt. of Cemeteries.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to install lightning rods on the Town Hall building.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to dispose of the horse sheds in the rear of the Town Hall, or take any action thereon.

Art. 20. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 per annum for five years to be expended in behalf of rural extension electric lines to District No. 4 and District No. 10. Each District to receive one-half of the cost of the line to that District, or take any action thereon.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 to buy a snow plow; or take any action thereon.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to help maintain a District Nurse for the ensuing year, the same to be expended under the direction of the sub-committee of the Fitzwilliam District Nursing Association.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the use of the Fitzwilliam Village Precinct in care of the Common and sidewalks.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and maintenance of the Fitzwilliam Town Library and determine the amount.

Art. 25. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 in excess of the amount required by law, for the purchase of books for the Fitzwilliam Town Library.
