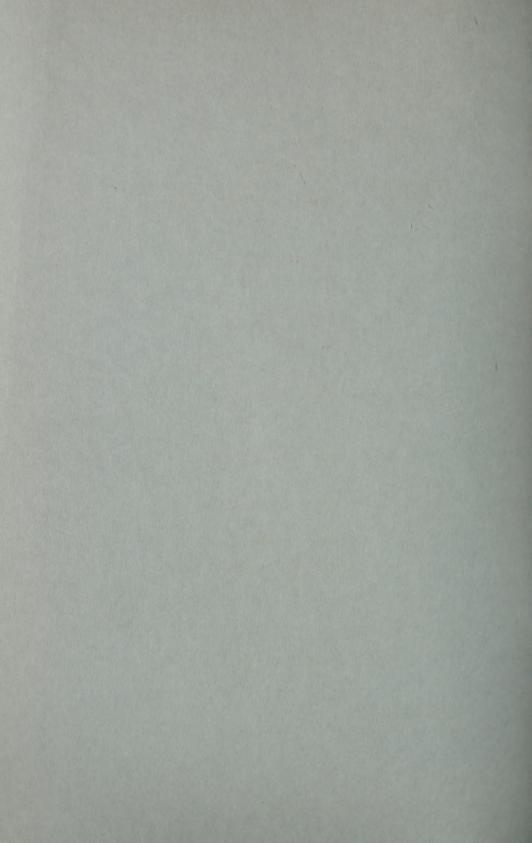

TENTATIVE WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Madison in the County of Carroll in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madison on Tuesday, March 10, 1964 at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same, as follows:

Town Officers Salaries Town Officers Expenses Election and Registration Town Hall and Recreation Hall Employees Retirement and Soc. Sec. Police Department Fire Department Insurance Damage and Legal Expense Old Home Week Health Department & Hospital Vital Statistics Town Dump and Garbage Removal Town Highway Maintenance - Summer Town Highway Maintenance - Winter General Expense, Highway Department Town Road Aid Library Town Street Lighting

- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$186.89 which is 1/100'th of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town, for the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 4. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for running Town lines.
- 5. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$662.85 which is towns share of Town Road Aid. State Share is \$4419.03.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to expend the T.R.A. funds this year on the Will Moore road as suggested by the State.
- 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for Tarring.
 - 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the

Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum, or sums, not exceeding in the aggregate of \$25,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year and to issue in the name, and on the credit of the Town, negotiable notes therefore, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year from taxes collected within said current municipal year.

- 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the necessary sum to widen and improve the upper half (about $\frac{1}{4}$ miles) of Tasker Hill Road, which is a mail route, in order to provide adequate ditching, width and visibility from the top of the hill to it's foct.
- 10. To transact any further business which may legally come before this meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Town Hall Foundation

Unexpected trouble with soil under the footings made it necessary to place a new drainage field under the foundation and also a new drainage field for the septic tank system.

We suggest that the Town Hall be painted and repairs be made to the porch and entrance.

We suggest that the T.R.A. money be expended this year to further complete the Will Moore road which was started last year.

Madison Shores development has thirty or more cottages, some used year round. Pea Porridge Pond development has nine cottages to date. These are welcome additions to the Town, but of course require additional expenditures for roads and snow plowing. This is largely the reason for the increase in Highway budget requests and will, no doubt, require further increases in the future.

Town Records:

There should be, in the Selectmen's office, a card file of each property in town giving a complete description of the property. This should be kept up to date as to any changes made in the buildings or ownership. Most towns have such records. The State Tax Commission is equipped to institute this system at a cost of about \$7.00 per building or tract. Madison has about 400 parcels, including summer property. The Select-

men do not have the time to do this as it would take four to six weeks of intensive full time work.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience - - a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

- 1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
- 2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump its safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
 - 3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match.

Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.

4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Lets all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

- 8. To see if the district will vote to send pupils of Grades 7-8 to Conway as tuition pupils.
- 9. If the vote on the preceding article is in the affirmative, to see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate to meet the tuition charges.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00, said sum to be placed with the trustee of trust funds to create a reserve to be available towards a replacement bus when needed.

- 11. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such items as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes of the town.
- 12. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and accept in the name of the school district for educational purposes such funds or grants-in-aid as may be obtainable from the State or Federal Government or any department or agency thereof, or any other source.
- 13. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to accept gifts in the name of and in behalf of the school district.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Madison:

The State Board of Education, during the current year, revised the existing Supervisory Unions in the area. The Interim Commission in its report to the 1963 session of the General Court recommended reducing the number of Supervisory Unions. The second recommendation dependent on the first was that the size of the Unions should be increased. As a result of these recommendations and the formation of the Governor Wentworth Regional School District -Union No. 36 was dissolved. Madison has been placed in Supervisory Union No. 9. As of July 1, 1964 the Conway Union includes in addition to Madison-Freedom and Tamworth of the old Union No. 36. This will result certainly in some changes in program. The students will now be attending a High School within the same Union. This means that the elementary program can be planned to correlate more closely with the High School program than was possible where two Unions were involved.

The problems of education in our complex society are difficult of solution. One of the problems that is compounded every passing year is the amount of knowledge available. The vast store of information now available makes coverage impossible. One of the problems facing the educator in view of this fact is the selection of and organizing of content materials. Once this problem is attacked satisfactorily the problem of organizing the curriculum to encompass the body of knowledge selected so that the student advances in continuous spiral of difficulty to the level expected of him in the school program. These two problems

are not easy to solve and are not solved permanently at any time. Change of content and curriculum reorganization are constants. This must be so if our schools are to meet the challenge of the many problems in this changing world.

The problem of covering the immense volume of knowledge can be partially solved by utilizing as many of the modern devices as possible. The use of various visual media—globes, charts, maps and the many and varied types of projectors—opaque, overhead, micro, film strip and motion picture all have specific uses. The facilities of WENH-T are being expanded so that greater use may be made of educational television in the not too distant future. All of these media can enable the schools to present greater amounts of factual information in a shorter period of time. In addition to these media involving the visual sense there are many developments in auditory equipment that can be intensely valuable in the learning process. This equipment can be valuable in speech therapy, foreign language instruction and the music field.

The teaching machine, so called, with programmed material is a teaching device and technique that is designed to promote more intensive as well as more extensive learning. In addition other techniques that are being used for the same reason are team learning and team teaching. The Library in the school is also being developed to a greater extent to make the educative process more efficient.

The availability of these machines, visual, auditory and teaching devices will enable schools to give a broader education and yet provide greater depth to learning. As the district can, it should provide as

many of these tools of learning as teachers can use advantageously.

The attitude and cooperation evidenced by the School Board and the Community make the task of working to provide the best education possible a pleasurable one. I appreciate the opportunity of working under such conditions.
