

TOWN MEETING—MARCH 12, 1963
Minutes of the Annual Town Meeting of the Town of Nelson
March 12, 1963

The meeting was called to order at 1:40 p.m. by the Moderator who then read the Town Warrant and the following articles were voted on.

ARTICLE 1—To choose all necessary town officers.

1. Mrs. Maxine Dobson was elected Town Clerk and sworn in by Moderator.

It was moved and seconded that a rising vote of thanks be given to Mr. Kenneth Corey for his service as Selectman.

ALL OFFICERS PRESENT WERE SWORN IN BY THE MODERATOR.

ARTICLE 2—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,065.00 to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 3—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$414.87 as its share of T.R.A. construction costs, the State's share being \$2,765.79.

Mr. Balch stated that there was \$1,400.00 coming to the

Town from last years T.R.A. money that has to be used before July 1, 1963 and that it was the opinion of the Selectmen that Lead Mine Road should be black topped. When asked where the T.R.A. money would be used in 1963, he stated that no decision had been made but that it might be used on the Munsonville side of Town but that decision would be up to the State.

Mr. Arthur Iselin stated that all people living on that road under question were opposed to blacktop.

Mrs. Mildred Quigley stated her desire and reasons to see the road black topped.

Mrs. Hallie Robinson read the motion passed at Town Meeting in 1958 concerning black topping of roads in Nelson.

After much discussion pro and con the Petition that was signed by residents and non-residents was read by Mrs. Cornelia Iselin.

MOTION BY MR. ISELIN: I move that the petition and opinions expressed by a majority of the abutters on the Lead Mine and Roxbury roads in opposition to bituminous surfacing be taken into consideration by the townspeople in keeping with the Resolution passed at Town Meeting in 1958 and that the Selectmen shall therefore not blacktop the cemetery hill.

A vote by ballot was asked for.

Total number of votes cast 58, necessary for vote 30.

MOTION WAS DEFEATED.

RESOLUTION BY MR. RAYMOND HUBER: That the ordinance pertaining to black topping of Town roads which was passed in 1958 be hereby rescinded.

A vote by ballot was asked for.

Total number of votes cast 54, necessary for vote 28.

MOTION PREVAILS.

ARTICLE 4—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 for the repair of highways and bridges, \$5,000.00 of which will be used for summer maintenance and \$7,000.00 for winter maintenance.

ARTICLE 5—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for the purchase of calcium chloride.

ARTICLE 6—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the purchase of culverts.

ARTICLE 7—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Old Home Day, and \$50.00 for the same purpose for Memorial Day.

ARTICLE 8—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$204.00 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Elliot Community Hospital.

ARTICLE 9—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association.

ARTICLE 10—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Civil Defense purposes.

ARTICLE 11—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for the construction of and maintenance of fire trails and water holes.

ARTICLE 12—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 to be used in conjunction with State and Federal Funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust within the confines of the town.

ARTICLE 13—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the maintenance of the Fire Department.

ARTICLE 14—It was voted that the Town ratify, approve, and confirm the action of our Fire Department in joining our Town to the Southwestern District Fire Mutual Aid System in 1958 and in agreeing that our Fire Department may give and receive outside aid as provided in RSA—154 as amended.

ARTICLE 15—Article was amended to read: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$67.44 for the installation and maintenance of two street lights, one at the center of Munsonville and one at the Munsonville school house.

A written ballot was called for.

Total number of votes cast 51, necessary for vote 26.

Yes—34

No—17

MOTION PREVAILS.

ARTICLE 16—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Town Library.

ARTICLE 17—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the further repair and maintenance of the interior of the Town Hall.

A report of the work done by the committee was read by Mrs. Hallie Robinson.

ARTICLE 18—A report was given by Mr. Raymond Huber and Mr. Barry Tolman on the trade-in set up used by the State on road equipment and a suggestion that the amount of money appropriated for the Reserve Fund be increased so that the Town will have monies available when new equipment is needed.

It was moved and seconded that the article be amended to read: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to be added to the Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawal may be made from this fund except by vote of the Town for the purchase of road equipment.

A written ballot was called for.

Total number of votes cast 48, necessary for vote 25.

Standing vote on the motion.

Total number of votes cast 42, necessary for vote 22.

A motion was made to reconsider the article by a voter in the majority.

MOTION PREVAILED BY VOICE VOTE

A motion was made that the Article be taken up in its original form.

Amendment: That the sum of \$500.00 be changed to \$2,000.00.

It was then asked as to whether or not this money could be used to pay off part of the present loan on the Grader.

It was moved and seconded that this article be temporarily passed over and legal counsel sought by the Selectmen.

Temporarily passed over Article 19.

ARTICLE 20—It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the maintenance and improvement of the Cemetery; this amount to be paid to the treasurer of the Cemetery Board on or before May 1, 1963.

ARTICLE 21—It was voted to accept \$200.00 as a Trust Fund from Robbins Milbank, the interest therefrom to be used toward the perpetual care of four lots in the Cemetery.

ARTICLE 22—It was voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 23—It was voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell at public auction to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by tax collector's or other deeds, and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.

Mr. Jack Sherrard spoke briefly.

ARTICLE 24—A standing vote was requested on this article and the article was defeated.

Mr. Arnold Miner was sworn in as Selectman for 3 years by Moderator.

ARTICLE 19—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the payment of legal fees and expenses incurred in defending the suit brought against the Town by the Nature Conservancy of New Hampshire.

Letters were read by the Moderator from Mr. Winthrop P. Hersey and Mr. Richard Bennik.

Mr. Sidney Partridge took exception to the point of order raised by Mr. Newton Tolman at the Special Town Meeting on Dec. 14, 1962.

It was stated by the Selectmen that if this case is lost by the Town there will be a tax loss of \$2,369.00.

It was suggested that a compromise be reached with Nature Conservancy.

Amendment—that article be amended to read: legal fees and expenses which may be incurred.

Amendment was adopted.

Motion was adopted by voice vote.

ARTICLE 18 was re-opened: To raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the Reserve Fund.

It was moved and seconded that we defer action on Article 18 until the Town can seek advice of Town Counsel.

It has been moved and seconded that this meeting be adjourned to Saturday March 23, 1963 at 8:00 o'clock in the Afternoon. Unanimous.

Meeting adjourned at 6:30 p.m.

ADJOURNED TOWN MEETING NELSON, N. H.

March 23, 1963

The meeting was opened by the Moderator who then explained the status of Article 18 when the meeting was adjourned on March 12, 1963. A letter was read by Mr. Donald Bennett from Mr. James Davis, Town Counsel, concerning the legality of using money raised under the Reserve Fund for future payments on any road equipment. His opinion was, that if voted by the Town, it was legal.

Mr. Raymond Huber and Mr. Barry Tolman presented 2 plans for raising money for Town road equipment.

Plan A—To raise \$2,000.00 per year for the Reserve Fund—the money would be available when the equipment needs to be replaced.

Plan B—Proceed as in the past.

ARTICLE 18—Original Motion: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be added to the Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawal be made from this fund except by vote of the Town for the purchase of road equipment.

AMENDMENT: That the sum of \$500.00 be changed to \$2,000.00. After much discussion a motion was made and seconded to pass over Article 18 at this time and reconsider the vote adopting Article 2.

The reconsideration prevailed by voice vote.

ARTICLE 2—It was moved and seconded to raise and appropriate an additional \$2,000.00 to defray cost of the Grader this year; to be paid off on note as soon as arrangements can be made with the Bank.

Request for vote by ballot.

A vote of thanks was given to the present committee.

ARTICLE 25—New Business: The following Resolution was presented.

Whereas we, as resident tax payers of the Town of Nelson have no representative in the 1963 session of the House of Representatives, and

Whereas, owing to constantly rising real estate taxes caused by sharp increases in the expenses incurred in providing adequate education for our children, and for the year-round maintenance of our town roads, on which depends the economic welfare of our Town,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we do hereby petition the General Court to give serious consideration to the enactment of some form of legislation, during the current session, which might afford some relief to said burdensome real estate taxes now afflicting residents of many of the smaller New Hampshire communities, and be it further

RESOLVED, that a copy of these resolutions be sent to the President of the Senate and to the Speaker of the House of the New Hampshire General Court.

Resolution unanimously adopted at the continuation of the Annual Town Meeting in Nelson, New Hampshire.

It was moved and seconded that Mr. Barnabas Quigley head a committee of his own choosing and bring a further report on the Student Loan Fund to the next Annual Town Meeting.

Approved by voice vote.

It was moved and seconded that the meeting adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 10:30 p.m.

REPORT OF SELECTMEN

The annual meeting sponsored by the State Tax Commission was attended by representatives of this board and, as always, helpful information was obtained relative to the proper assessment and taxation of properties. Mr. Frank Mace of the commission has again been most helpful in aiding in the assessing of Yield Taxes due the town and assisting in the collection of same.

The fourth installment of \$2,000.00 due on equipment note No. 1 plus interest was paid on December 4th. Because of the fact that money was available your board decided to pay the balance of this note amounting to \$2,000.00 on December 31st. By so doing, this note has been retired with a saving of interest of \$53.17.

In accordance with the wishes of the town as expressed at the adjourned Town Meeting held on March 23rd, \$2,000.00 was paid on equipment note No. 2. Although regular payments on this note are not due to commence until 1965 it is the suggestion of your board that payments of \$2,000.00 plus interest be made on this note in 1964, provision having been made for this in the current budget. By so doing it will be possible to retire this note in 1968 with an appreciable saving in interest charges.

It may be of interest to the taxpayers to learn that your board, thru investigation, has learned that the town is entitled to a refund of the Federal Gas Tax. This is presently being deducted from gasoline invoices by our supplier. Coupled with the refund secured from the state this represents a return of gasolines taxes amounting to eleven cents a gallon and should net the town approximately \$500.00 yearly. As a member of the New Hampshire Municipal Association other savings are also realized, for example a recent purchase of a tire for the

loader showed a saving of \$73.00 off the list price. Economies such as these result in a better tax rate.

In another economy measure, your board, is now pleased to report that the town is enjoying the favorable interest rate of $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ on short term notes. This rate was obtained by shopping around among several lending institutions.

A review of charges made by the town for driveway plowing indicated that previous charges for this service were not sufficient to cover the cost of this work consequently an across the board increase of 50% was established this year which furnishes a more realistic return for the cost of this operation.

Article 14 in the warrant requests an appropriation of \$325.00 for the installation of a heating system in the Olivia Rodham Memorial Library. The present system, a gas floor furnace is most unsatisfactory as well as costly. An oil heating system, as recommended by heating engineers consulted, would enable the building to be maintained at an above freezing temperature at all times which in turn would do much to preserve and maintain the condition of the building as well as the books.

The third annual town meeting held for the benefit of our non resident friends was held in August with a poor attendance of those for whom it was intended. It was suggested by the board at that time that these meetings be discontinued because of the apparent lack of interest, several of those present felt that a meeting of this nature was of benefit to the non residents and that they should be continued. Help has been promised in getting a better turnout in 1964 and your board is willing to hold a meeting this year again in the hope that those for whom it is set up will realize the opportunity afforded them to be heard and to learn of the operation of the town. Of interest to some may be the fact that the 1963 meeting was written up in a publication which enjoys state wide distribution.

To help reduce your taxes your Board earnestly recommends that all Nelson residents receiving income thru the medium of dividends from stock investments or interest from savings accounts be sure that the sources of such income ap-

preciate the fact that Nelson is their legal residence and that taxes assessed on such income be credited to Nelson.

It has been ascertained that in some instances where the mailing address does not indicate Nelson that other communities are being credited with interest and dividend taxes that rightfully should be credited to Nelson.

It has been a pleasure to work in 1963 with the other members of the official town family as well as with those who hold no office. Cooperations has been excellent on all sides and it has been a pleasure to serve our town.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 for the maintenance of the Fire Department.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$125.00 for the support of the Town Library.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$325.00 for the installation of a heating system in the Town Library, it being understood that the Library Trustees will contribute the sum of \$300.00 toward this project.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 for the improvement of certain sections of Town Road No. 65 also known as Lead Mine Road.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by Tax Collector's or other deeds and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.

22. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of R.S.A. 41:38, which reads as follows: "Any collector, being authorized by vote of the Town, may appoint deputies, with the approval of the Selectmen, who shall be sworn, have the powers of collectors, may be removed at the pleasure of the collector and before entering upon the duties of his office, give bond as provided in Section 6 of this chapter".

24. To vote on the question 'Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this Town'.

In addition to the usual maintenance work at the cemetery during 1963 some improvements have been made.

REPORT OF THE CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR

The year 1963 passed uneventfully insofar as this department was concerned.

For the first time in many years there was no annual test exercise, the reason for not having this public participation drill was not given. Your director feels that by having these exercises, with all participating, enables the general public to appreciate the fact that the organization is alert and ready and capable of performing in the event of an emergency and it is strongly felt that tests should be conducted at minimum on a yearly basis, for only by so doing will the general public be aware of its responsibilities and required duties should a real emergency occur.

Participation in the surplus property distribution was not as active this year as in the past as thru this acquisition program most of our basic needs have been met. Properties with an acquisition value of \$1,025.54 were acquired by the town for an expenditure of \$32.35. The major expenditure was for a trailer which was assigned to the fire department who have mounted a 250 gallon tank on same for use in forest fire work.

As usual our friends at Civil Defense Headquarters in Concord as well as the staff at the N. H. Distributing Agency have been most cooperative and helpful and this is more than appreciated by your director.

REPORT OF THE NELSON FIRE DEPARTMENT

Your Fire Department is again pleased to report no serious fire in Nelson during the past year.

The department answered 8 calls to extinguish fires in 1963, of these 4 were brush fires, 3 at the town dump, and one for smoke caused by a playful cat and crayons. In addition the department participated in a search for lost hunters.

In 1963 the department purchased a 1942 Peter Pirsch fire engine using its own funds in the amount of \$750.00 plus the old truck. We have installed on this new truck a 500 gallon water tank and as this truck has a 750 gallon per minute pump we feel that we now have a superior piece of fire fighting equipment that will enable the Nelson Fire Department to cope with any type fire in an efficient manner. The men of the department are presently engaged in overhauling and painting the truck and we feel sure that when the work is completed we will have a first class piece of equipment in addition to a fine appearing engine.

Through the Civil Defense organization a trailer was obtained upon which we have mounted a 275 gallon tank, the trailer is also equipped to carry a portable pump. It is the intention of the department to use this unit in forest fire work.

Another project of your department was the building and maintaining a skating rink for the use of the children in town. This was set up on Martin's parking lot and has proved to be most popular with the youngsters and affords an opportunity of a safe place to skate.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the people of Nelson for their splendid cooperation during the extreme forest fire danger this last year.

REPORT OF THE POLICE OFFICER

During the year 1963 your police department spent over 200 hours in police work patrolling the roads, investigating fifteen traffic accidents, several cases of breaking and entering, and two emergency runs were made to Elliot Community Hospital. Several traffic violators were arrested and taken to Keene Municipal Court, where convictions were obtained and the violators fined.

In Nelson, this past year, there was a fifty percent increase in the number of traffic accidents over the previous year. We feel that this increase was due to the fact that too many motorists are ignoring the speed laws. Another reason is the failure of the courts to hand out stiff enough penalties to deter these motorists from speeding. The penalty the motorist fears most, is loss of license. During 1962 the State Department of Safety reviewed every case of traffic violation and conviction and then removed or suspended the licenses of these motorists for periods of from 10 days up, depending on the type of violation and previous record. This policy helped to keep the death rate on the New Hampshire Highways under the 100 mark for that year. This policy seems to have been discontinued and the results of the discontinuance are very evident. This past year one hundred forty-one persons were killed on New Hampshire highways.

The State Police do an excellent job of patrolling the highways and there is no question but what just the sight of a State Police vehicle helps slow many motorists down. Unfortunately there are not enough officers to patrol the highways and also do the other things that are required of them. More effective help is needed from the courts in the way of stiffer penalties, especially loss of license penalties, if we are to keep the accident rate down. The members of Troop C of the Department

of Safety have been most helpful and cooperative and are deserving of our thanks.

We were fortunate that, in Nelson, there were no fatal traffic accidents during 1963, and that there were only four traffic accidents involving personal injury. It should be remembered that it is the car owner who pays for these accidents through higher insurance rates, so let's keep our accident rate down by obeying the traffic laws.

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Nelson qualified to vote in district affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Munsonville School in said district on the 6th day of March, 1964, at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to enter into tuition contracts for the school year 1964-65 with the Union School District of Keene at the rate of five hundred twenty-three dollars (\$523.00) per pupil for high school instruction and five hundred five dollars (\$505.00) per pupil for instruction of eighth grade pupils and with other approved schools.

10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.

11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) as the district's share of support for educational TV Channel WENH.

12. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING MARCH 8, 1963

The meeting was called to order at 8 p.m. by the Moderator, Frances P. Tolman, in the Munsonville School House.

After reading the warrant, the articles were acted upon as follows.

Article I Francis P. Tolman was elected Moderator, one vote being cast by the clerk.

Article II Dorna A. Riley was elected clerk, one vote being cast by the Moderator.

Article III Mildred L. Huber was elected as member of the School Board for the ensuing 3 years.

Article IV Elizabeth Wilder was elected Treasurer.

Article V The motion was made and seconded "that we pass over this article as its content is considered under Article 8" The motion carried.

Article VI The report was given as follows:

Mrs. Mildred Huber, in absence of the Playground Committee, read the report and it was decided to turn the problem of placing the chain link fence over to the School Board.

The motion carried.

Article VII Dorna A. Riley was elected Auditor, one vote cast by the Moderator.

Article VIII Voted to invite Mr. Roger Sundstrom to participate in the discussion of this article.

Mrs. Mildred L. Huber explained the budget.

The motion was made and seconded: That the district raise and appropriate the sum of thirty-six thousand, four hundred seventeen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$36,417.75) for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district

officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income: The School Board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Motion accepted as read.

Article IX Motion: "That the district will authorize the School Board to enter into tuition contracts for the school year 1963-64 with the Union School District of Keene at the rate of five hundred thirty dollars (\$530.00) per pupil for high school instruction and four hundred ten dollars (\$410.00) per pupil for instruction of eighth grade pupils and with other approved schools."

Motion accepted as read.

Article X Motion: That the district will raise and appropriate the sum of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) to be used as matching funds for Federal Aid under provisions of the National Defense Education Act, for use in science and mathematics, and to approve the acceptance of such funds.

Motion carried.

Article XI Motion: That the district will raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) as the district's share of support for educational T.V. Channel W.E.N.H.

Motion carried.

Article XII The motion was made and seconded that: Mr. Barnabas Quigley be appointed chairman of a committee to look into a student loan program.

Motion carried.

Voted to combine School Caucus and Town Caucus for the year.

Voted to adjourn meeting (9:20 p.m.).

To the School Board and Citizens of Nelson :

I hereby submit my second annual report.

STAFF CHANGES: A new teaching staff was required this year. With the transfer of Mrs. Louise Bergeron to Harrisville, Mrs. Carolyn Beard of Keene was secured to replace Mrs. Bergeron. Mrs. Beard received her Bachelor of Education Degree from Keene State College and has taught elementary grades in Laconia, Exeter, Keene and Washington, New Hampshire. Mrs. Judith K. Sargent, 1963 Keene State College graduate, also of Keene, replaces Mrs. May Brook who retired.

The statistics outlined above are based upon current information and, while they are indicative of possible trends, any absolute conclusions must be made with extreme caution. The figures do not reflect the mobility of the population nor do they attempt to predict the number who might repeat a grade. They are, rather, a projection of current census and enrollment figures.

SCHOOL FACILITIES: It is not anticipated that additional space will be required as long as our secondary pupils are educated elsewhere. By continuing the regular program of maintenance, the Munsonville School will continue to accommodate the elementary pupils in facilities which satisfy modern standards of health and safety.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM: As an educator and an administrator, it is often difficult to balance opposing factors to a degree which can be fully justified. For it is true that improved or additional educational services bring increased costs. As an educator, your superintendent is concerned with the improvement of the educational program. As an administrator, he is concerned with the value received for each tax dollar spent.

The program for educating the young people of Nelson is a good one. However, it is important that we are alert to any forthcoming educational or organizational changes in the area or the state which might affect our own program. I am confident that the citizens of Nelson and the Nelson School Board will support what is best for our youth.

In conclusion, I again wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, pupils and parents, the School Board and the patrons of our schools for their understanding and cooperation.
