**TOWN WARRANT
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Durham in the County of Strafford, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said New Durham on Tuesday, the fourth (4th) day of March, next at twelve of the clock, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing and to vote on the proposed amendments to the Zoning and Land Use Ordinance and Zoning Map for the Town of New Durham, N. H.

And you are hereby further notified to meet at said Town Hall in said New Durham at seven-thirty (7:30) o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 2. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the road to the George R. Miller Subdivision when it meets town specifications.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$4,000.00 to a Capital Reserve Fund toward a Town Revaluation and vote to authorize the withdrawal of \$4,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Funds Savings Account established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-off against this appropriation and vote to raise and appropriate a like amount each year until enough is raised to pay for same.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$902.00 from the Shirley Timber Fund for the Visiting Nurse (RDHC).

ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000.00 to a Capital Reserve Fund for a Tax Map and vote to authorize the withdrawal of \$5,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Funds Savings Account established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-off against this appropriation and vote to raise and appropriate a like amount each year until enough is raised to pay for same, and further authorize the Selectmen to contract with a firm to prepare a Tax Map and spend said funds as they become available, withdrawing same from Capital Reserve Fund.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to sell to Mr. S. Aubrey Crawford, Old Route #11, the former Wilkins Lot for \$250.00. (BY REQUEST)

ARTICLE 8. To see if the town will vote to increase the Library Trustees from 3 to 6. (BY REQUEST)

ARTICLE 9. To see if the town will vote to rescind previous action taken regarding Non-Partisan Ballot and reinstate the Australian Ballot System. (BY REQUEST)

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 from Surplus to continue work on Shirley Cemetery.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 from Revenue Sharing Funds Savings Account toward the new dump and vote to withdraw the Capital Reserve Funds established for this purpose.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 from Surplus for another Road Sander.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 from Surplus to purchase a typewriter and adding machine.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the town will vote to increase the Conservation Commission from 3 to 6 members.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the town will vote to abolish the office of Constable.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the town will vote to pay the bookkeeper of the Trustees of Trust Funds a salary of \$100.00 per year.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as are necessary to defray the expenses of town government for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money for necessary widening, grading, drainage, placing of gravel and paving of the remainder of the South Shore Road at Merrymeeting Lake (approx. 0.8 miles). (BY REQUEST)

ARTICLE 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money for necessary gravel, grading and paving to complete a ½ mile section of the North Shore Road at Merrymeeting Lake. (BY REQUEST)

ARTICLE 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

New Durham Public Library

The past year has shown progress in several ways — small perhaps, but contributing to the smooth running of the Library.

The circulation of books is, of course, the main function, but we feel that other related activities make the Library a more interesting and meaningful place. Exhibits, especially those of historical material, have been received with great interest and have evoked many compliments.

We were sorry that Mrs. Alma Jacklin did not wish to continue as a trustee, but her place has been ably filled by Mrs. Elaine Scott.

Though our town appropriation is among the smallest per capita in the State, we manage to meet the requirements as determined by the N. H. State Library, due in great measure to the contributions, both personal and financial, of the Friends of the Library. Volunteers staff the Library two days a week and work on cataloging and other records when needed. The group raises money and responds most generously to requests of the trustees. This year they have supplied a book truck, a rack for paperbacks and a step stool. The Friends sponsored a reprinting of the *History of New Durham* which was compiled in 1962 and long out of print. The monthly meetings of the Friends offer programs of interest in various fields, and are well attended. Officers this year are Mrs. Alice McKee, president; Mr. Richard Jones, vice-president; Mrs. Janet Berry, secretary and Mrs. Jean Johnson, treasurer. All townspeople are welcome to join.

Childrens Day at the Library will be on a weekly basis this year, with several teams of mothers to manage

children in grades one through six.

We had the services of members of the Neighborhood Youth Corps last summer, but it was less than successful, and the adult volunteers who had been released from summer duty had to return.

Memorial gifts of books have been made by Mrs. Florence Rand, in memory of her husband, Dorra Rand; by Mr. Harry Merritt in memory of his grandmother, Mrs. Annie Miller; and by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Nystedt of South Hamilton in memory of Mrs. Dorothy Johnson of England.

Our Librarian, Mrs. Doris Rollins, continues to serve our patrons with friendly courtesy. In the spring of 1974, she attended a 10-weeks course in library technique and found it most interesting.

The State Library Bookmobile called twice this year, and we took out a total of 1182 books.

Under the guidance of the present board of trustees and with the aid and approval of the Selectmen, there will be organized and set up a department of local history and geneology, to be housed, temporarily, in the Library. Old original town records, school reports, records of local industries, churches, stores, and copies of family records will be properly indexed and filed, to be available to responsible researchers. We would be very happy to receive any material of this kind, whether original or copies, old families or new.

REPORT OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

**Health and Welfare

January 1, 1974 to December 31, 1974

During 1974, in performance of their duties, the officers worked 3,800 hours and traveled 36,100 miles. 92% of their time was on police, 2% on health and 6% welfare.

Of this, 66% was spent on patrol, 11% in office, 2% in court, 6% on special details, 2% on aids rendered, 7% on complaint investigations, 1% on accident investigations and 5% on criminal investigations.

They received 2,281 calls for services, investigated 18 accidents, checked 5,361 buildings, summoned or arrested 55 of which 51 were found guilty.

Construction was down as only 23 sewage systems were inspected. For the people who qualify they picked up and delivered surplus food until July. Now we take them down to qualify for food stamps and pick up the stamps if they have no transportation. We handled 17 cases on Public Welfare.

**REPORT OF
NEW DURHAM FIRE DEPARTMENT
New Durham, New Hampshire**

New Durham voters accepted two significant articles in last years warrant.

1. To purchase a new Class A Pumper to supplement our 1957 model.
2. To have the Fire Department join the "Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Association, Inc."

In May the selectmen signed a contract to purchase the new pumper from Pierce Manufacturing, Inc. The expected delivery date is to be one year to fifteen months.

Radio receivers to be placed in the firemen's homes and a mobile radio set for the pumper for communications with Lakes Region Fire Association were ordered. After the radios arrived in July the fire department immediately began a house to house distribution of telephone stickers with the Fire Dispatch Center number which is 1-524-1545. This is the number to be called to report a fire. If anyone did not receive a sticker at this time, please contact your fire chief at 859-2772.

In May the Insurance Services Office of New Hampshire recognized our new status as a mutual aid member with a Central Dispatch Center. Fire Insurance Companies were notified that insurance premiums should be reduced to correspond to the new five mile limit as

opposed to the previous three mile limit. This should amount to a substantial saving to those involved. Fire insurance rates are based on the quality of the fire department and water systems. There are no pressure hydrants in town; therefore, we have to maintain the quality of the fire department to keep this status.

Currently the fire fighters are involved in a basic fire fighting course. This is forty hours of instruction by State Training officers. This course was offered four years ago and is now being repeated to update the experienced men and to instruct new members. Specialized courses will be offered in the future.

Alterations to the Fire Station were completed. This gives a spacious, well lighted equipment bay ready to receive the new truck.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Report to Towns

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 Forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodlands closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.

**RURAL DISTRICT HEALTH COUNCIL, INC.
ANNUAL REPORT**

January 1, 1974 – December 31, 1974

The Rural District Health Council has experienced another year of growth and reorganization in 1974. The continued success of this program lies in the dedication of the agency personnel, and the capable professional staff assures the availability of quality care.

Skilled nursing service is still the major part of the program, and as more people become aware of the value of home care, demands for the service increase. These services are provided by Mrs. Barbara Drew, R.N. of Farmington, Mrs. Myrtle Walsh, R.N. of Milton and Mrs. Lucy Myers, R.N., B.S. of Deerfield. Mrs. Evelyn Therrien, R.N. of Barrington has also been working on a part-time basis. Mrs. Kathleen Hansen, RPT of Epping continues to provide physical therapy when ordered.

Mrs. Ardala Houle, R.N. of Rochester has been the Agency Coordinator and Clinic Supervisor. In this capacity she is the liason between the Rural District Health Council, area hospitals and other community health agencies. She is also the leader of the clinic team.

As a result of the increased interest and services in the Maternal and Child Health Program, Miss Arlene Thorne, R.N. of Strafford is now employed full time as the agency Maternal and Child Health nurse, ensuring more continuity of care in this specialty. Mrs. Bernadette Cameron, R.N. of Deerfield, a new member of our staff, has been organizing prenatal and parenting discussions which are conducted at each clinic. The Rural District Health Council works in cooperation with the N. H. State Department of Public Health in offering Well Child clinics for children from 0-6 years. Again this year, through the cooperation of the N. H. Bureau of Dental Public Health, a dental clinic was held for the children from 3-6 years who are enrolled in the Well Child Program. The agency has also worked cooperatively with the school nurses in the member towns to assure that the immunizations of all students are updated. The Rural District Health Council is an active participant in

the Maternal and Infant Care program of the Strafford County Prenatal and Family Planning Association. The agency also works closely with the Exeter Area Family Planning Association. As a result of these changes, a more comprehensive program is now being offered by the Council.

Early in the year, the Rural District Health Council was approached by the Senior Citizen group in Farmington requesting an ongoing screening for its members. As a result, two times each month, agency nurses are present at the Senior Citizen Meeting Room in the Farmington Town Hall to check blood pressure, pulse, respiration, height, weight, urine and hemoglobin, and to do nutrition counseling. This has been greatly appreciated by the participating members. A similar program is being initiated in Northwood through the cooperation of the Northwood Plus 55 Club.

During October and November, successful Adult Screening clinics were held in Farmington and Northwood in cooperation with the Special Services of the Department of Public Health, local organizations, American Cancer Society, Portsmouth Rehabilitation Center, and Health professionals. These were open to any area person wishing to attend.

The office procedures of the Rural District Health Council are ably handled by Mrs. Norma Davis, Bookkeeper, and Mrs. Eleanor Eaton, Secretary, both of Farmington.

The Rural District Health Council is supported by the funds contributed by the member towns at an annual rate of \$1.00 per capita, state grants and fees for service. Anyone interested in the program or needing service is asked to contact the office in Farmington, P. O. Box 563, 6 South Main Street, Telephone 755-2989.
