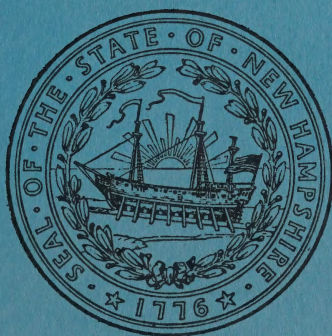


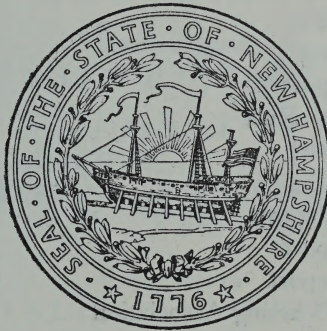

County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote
in Town Affairs

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House
in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the tenth of March

6:00 P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the
year ensuing.
2. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Conven-
tion.
3. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstake tickets
be sold in this town?
BUSINESS MEETING AT, 8 P.M.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary
to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and
make appropriations of the same.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to
raise and appropriate for the repair of Highways
and Bridges.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-
priate the sum of \$863.11 for Town Road Aid, the
State to contribute the sum of \$5,754.06.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote
to raise and appropriate for the maintenance and
tarring of Class V Roads.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,675.00 for the payment of principal and interest on the Fire Truck note.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,532.05 for principal and interest on Hough Payloader note.
10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Cemeteries.
14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the village cemetery.
15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of hospitals.
17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money \$200.00 for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.
18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Community Center.

19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of \$25.00 for placing street and highway markers under the supervision of the Historical Society.
20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Planning and Zoning.
21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate to lease or buy land suitable for a town dump.

NOTE: The Fire Department account was transferred on June 14, 1963 from Plymouth to Bristol. The balance at that time was \$444.67. This appears on the Fire Department books as a payment and again as a receipt. It is not included in this report as it does not represent a true receipt or expense but is in fact a book-keeping entry.

FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American traditions of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience — a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump—it's safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a

year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.

4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Let's all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

New Hampton Community School

1962 - 1963

Dr. William Walsh, School Physician, examined 69 pupils, 24 defects found; all possible corrections were taken care of by the parents or through P. T. A. Dental Clinic. One hundred thirty Sterneedle tests were administered by Dr. Walsh. Three had a follow-up X-Ray.

All routine inspections were carried out during the year. Heights and weights recorded.

Ninety-one hearing tests - 147 vision tests - 17 defects were found and all were corrected.

First aid and health equipment maintained.

Four cases of infectious disease reported.

Clinic referrals: One to Pediatric Diagnostic Clinic; 1 to Hitchcock Clinic; 1 family to Tuberculosis Nurse.

The P. T. A. financed both a Sodium Fluoride Application and Restorative Clinic. Eighteen received Sodium Fluoride Treatments for prevention of decay; 29 received restorations.

Fourteen attended Pre-school Registration.

Fifty-one home, health and Social Welfare conferences were held.

Total days worked 51.

My sincere appreciation to all for their cooperation in making the above report possible.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Board of Education and Citizens of the New Hampton School District:

I herewith submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

Personnel:

Mr. Frank Finley, Principal of the Community School, left at the end of the 1962-1963 school year to become a full time Principal of the elementary school in Peterboro, New Hampshire.

Replacing Mr. Finley as principal is Mrs. Ruth Joyce a member of our faculty for several years. To replace the teaching time of Mr. Finley, two part time teachers have been engaged. Mrs. Eleanor Nudd from Sanbornton to teach English and Mr. Maurice Smith to teach Science.

Also, leaving at the close of last year was Miss Jeanne LaChance to join the Peace Corp. Miss Viola Huntoon from Franklin replaced Miss LaChance in grade three.

All other members of the staff are the same as last year.

Curriculum:

We are continuing the emphasis on our reading program, conversational French and the use of Educational Television to supplement our class work.

The program of modern mathematics that we tried in grades seven and eight has now been extended to include grades four through six.

I believe we have a very sound and effective program of instruction at our elementary school.

New Union :

Since New Hampton will be joining other towns in an Area School District, this will be my final report as your Superintendent of Schools. I would like to express my appreciation to all the people of New Hampton for the support they have given our school system. Also, I would like to express my personal appreciation for the very pleasant working atmosphere extended me during the past five years.
