## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the eighth (8th) day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects (Polls to close at 6 P. M.):

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for interest on the same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Northwood Public Libraries.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for the care of cemeteries.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1400.00 for Street Lighting.

7. To see if the town will accept State aid for the construction of Class 2 roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 therefor, \$4500.00 of this amount to be raised by property taxes, the balance to be taken from Capital Reserve funds and from cash surplus.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town highways.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$100 to Merrimack Valley Regional Ass'n., for the purpose of publicising and promoting the natural resources and advantages of the town. (Considered and entered by Budget Committee, without recommendation)

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for use of the Concord Hospitals. (Considered and entered by Budget Committee, without recommendation)

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$456.75 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State's share to be \$3,044.97.

13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Cemetery Trustees, to give deeds to Lots 11 and 12, Pine Grove Cemetery, to Everett J. Bourdon Post 73, American Legion, on such terms as the Cemetery Trustees shall determine.

14. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

## NORTHWOOD ROAD COMMITTEE

1954-55 Report of Town Road Committee to the Selectmen and Budget Committee of the Town of Northwood.

Good roads, primary, secondary, and town, are essential to the development of any area for recreational, agricultural, residential, service, and manufacturing uses. The Town of Northwood is fortunately located with respect to principal cities in southeastern New Hampshire which furnish employment opportunities to many of its inhabitants and potential markets for farm products, services, and goods. It is endowed with altitude, lakes, streams, and scenery, making its recreational possibilities better than most towns in the immediate vicinity. Main highways passing through Northwood, or to be constructed, connect it directly with the Seacoast and White Mountain areas, and with Concord, Manchester, Dover, Rochester, Portsmouth, and Massachusetts points.

The primary and secondary road system serving Northwood is the general responsibility of the State. While the town road system of Northwood compares favorably with most towns of comparable population, it has not been developed in such a manner as will enable the Town to realize its potentialities. This is admittedly a long-range program, but its attainment is dependent upon a systematic and progressive approach.

In formulating a long-range policy for town roads, the Committee is mindful that any such program must not impose an undue tax burden in its early years against the present taxable property. It also recognizes roads as but one of the responsibilities of Town Government. Road improvement will eventually add to the taxable base as more people are attracted, farms and businesses grow, and recreational and residential areas are made more accessible. Adoption now of a progressive program relative to town roads is not in-



compatible with sound town finances. For the first few years, the Committee recommends a pay-as-you-go policy, recognizing that at some future date the Town may wish to consider a bond issue for a stepped-up program.

The Committee feels that it is not yet in a position to recommend appropriations and construction priorities for years beyond the next one or two. Circumstances may be greatly different by that time, and any long-range program, while adhering to general objectives, needs periodic review relative to the details and means of accomplishment. Therefore, the Town Road Committee submits the following recommendations applicable to the immediate future.

1. The state has asked the Town to raise the balance of their share of the Mountain Aveune road. The Town has already appropriated and bought bonds to the amount of \$9516.00 which leaves a balance of \$10,000.00 to raise this year.

2. Appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for special town road construction in 1955. This is the same amount raised in 1954 for such purpose. It should be continued from year-to-year.

3. In 1955, apply the special construction money for tarring and to finish up the specified distance on Blakes' Hill, (the oak tree). The Committee believes that Jenness Pond road, should rank at the top of the list for the next application of T.R.A. and special construction money.

4. The Town should accept as new Town roads anywhere it is apparent that the maintenance cost to the Town would not exceed the cost to the Town under present arrangements, and where deeds to such roadways can be obtained voluntarily. There do not appear to be any roads presently meeting these conditions.

5. Reclassify from Class VI to Class V any roads or portions thereof where it appears that maintenance

of such roads or portions thereof would be in the best interests of the Town from the standpoints of future primary or secondary construction, or from enhancement of the taxable value of the bordering property, or the convenience of regular or seasonal residents or visitors, or to make available sand and gravel for Town use. The Committee, in view of the directness of the route to Deerfield over Blakes' Hill and Deerfield's maintenance of their end of this road as Class V, and because of the existence of substantial gravel deposits near the Deerfield line, recommended that the Blakes' Hill Road beyond Glenn Hoadley's driveway be reclassified as Class V. This stretch of road need not be kept open in the winter beyond the last inhabited dwelling. This was recommended to the Selectmen and it has been presented to the State for their approval, which we feel, with no doubt, that they will accept.

6. Appropriate action should be taken at the 1955 Town Meeting to continue the Town Road Committee for at least another year. The Committee feels it can make a further contribution in the areas on which it has made recommendations above, as well as in advising the Selectmen of current problems and making recommendations thereon. Membership of the 1955 Committee should be revised. Those who have displayed an interest in the work of the Committee, or who have found the time to be active participants, as measured by attendance records, should be asked by the Moderator to serve another year. The remaining posts should be filled by the Moderator with new appointees. This will help provide a carryover of experience from one year to another and at the same time keep Committee posts filled with interested and active members.

This is an increase of 7.7% over last year.

Northwood district tuition pupils attending Coe-Brown Northwood Academy are distributed as follows: 11 in Grade IX, 11 in X, 16 in XI, 6 in XII, Total 44. The total of all pupils at the Academy is 74. Northwood also has one high school tuition pupil in Grade IX at Dover High School and one in Grade XII in Pittsfield, as well as two elementary pupils attending in Deerfield. Two Epsom district tuition pupils are attending elementary schools in Northwood.

Musical instruction in the schools has been extended to include instrumental activities in Grades IV to VIII. Mr. Frederick A. Johnson, music teacher, was engaged for one full school day per week, instead of one half day. Miss Gladys Gardner's kindergarten room was made available in the afternoon for these music lessons. Pupils rent instruments with a view to purchase, if they so desire. It is hoped that this

program will lead to advanced opportunities in high school and a continuing musical interest in adult life, both in the home and in the community.

At the annual school district meeting in Strafford last March, at which it was decided to defer the proposed construction of a centralized elementary school in that town, a long-range planning committee was appointed, under the chairmanship of Professor Austin L. Olney of the University of New Hampshire. This committee has developed an interest in the possibility of establishing a Cooperative District, at least for elementary schools, to include the present districts of Barnstead, Northwood, and Strafford. As none of these three towns have yet entered into a centralized building program, it would be comparatively simple for them to join in a common project, as Durham, Madbury, and Lee have done. Among the advantages claimed for such an arrangement are improved instruction through the reduction of the number of grades per room, an integrated and more efficient staff, wider availability of supplementary materials such as reference books and visual equipment, provision for such simple conveniences as running hot and cold water, flush toilets, and automatic heat, and economical addition of such facilities as a lunch kitchen, room for health examinations, gymnasium, and adequate playground. As these three towns are located in proximity to each other, it should not be difficult to find some site of convenient access to all, provided the state's program of road improvement is continued. Although such a development may seem remote at present, it is hoped that interested officials and citizens will take advantage of opportunities to meet groups from the other towns, in order to understand the issues involved.

The annual report of Miss Myrtle Fletcher, school Nurse-Teacher, shows, in addition to individual examinations throughout the school, special services such as re-testing of certain eye and ear cases, securing com-

pliance with the vaccination law, keeping growth records, watching communicable disease situations, and referrals to various clinics, — dental, orthopedic, and mental hygiene. Closely associated with health is the school lunch program, which continues as a cold-weather project in Northwood. This activity depends on the devotion of a number of people who keep records, collect money, plan, prepare, distribute, and serve meals, and clear up after them, as well as the assistance furnished by district appropriations, in addition to federal aid in cash and commodities.

Under the sponsorship of the Americanism Committee of the Harvey Lake Women's Club and with the approval of the School Board, school children contributed pennies toward the restoration of Independence Hall in Philadelphia. In compliance with a proclamation of President Eisenhower, the words "under God" were introduced in the Pledge of Allegiance regularly given in schools.
